The grant of US\$ 73,514 provided to LAMP will be utilized for the expansion of a primary section of the school for boys and girls in a village of Khyber district to overcome the problem of overcrowded classrooms. Currently, the school having classes from Play Group till Grade 10 has over 950 enrollment, and over 300 students sit outside their classrooms in open space because of the limited sitting capacity in the classrooms. Earlier, the school was expanded up to grade 10 with the financial assistance provided by the Government of Japan in financial year 2011 and 2015.

The grant of US\$ 64,868 provided to Friends Welfare Association will be spent for the construction of a building for primary and middle school in Torghar district of KPK. At present over 130 girls and boys use the premises of a local mosque for their classes because of the lack of availability of school building. The new school building will also be used in second shift for middle school classes for girls specifically. The project

is expected to provide a conducive environment to the students for study.

The grant of US\$ 42,818 provided to Hana Development Council will assist in installation of electricity scheme for seven communities of Mandi Bahauddin district in Punjab province where there is no facility of electricity at present. Together with a local power generation company and participation of local communities, the project will install electricity equipment - transformers, polls, electricity lines and meters and connect it with the national grid. The scheme is expected to benefit over 1650 local community members.

AHAT will spend the grant of US\$ 55,030 for the expansion of a public elementary school in Kasur district. Currently, the NGO runs the school in a rented building, which has poor infrastructure and limited capacity in the classrooms. With the construction of new school building, children will be able to continue their education in conducive environment. Over 700 boys and girls will get benefit from this project.

Ambassador of Japan to Pakistan,

MATSUDA Kuninori, congratulated the recipient organizations for winning the Japanese grant for their respective development projects. He expressed his hope that these projects will help girls and boys to have an easy access to their basic right of education and help local communities get maximum benefit from the rural electrification project. He especially added his strong desire that education will promote understanding and respect to the others and different culture, then will promote peace and stability.

Japan, sharing our experience of modernization and rapid economic growth after the WWII, has been extending assistance in the area of education in Pakistan. For those interested in Japanese experience, Embassy is happy to share this with the education institutes in Pakistan, he mentioned.

Entry of passenger buses, vans banned on motorways

ISLAMABAD: National Highways and Motorway Police on Thursday announced ban on entry passenger buses and vans in the Motorway network to make lockdown against coronavirus successful, said a press release issued here. Private vehicles with maximum two passengers giving valid reason of travelling would also be allowed to enter the network.

Reduction in POL prices widely hailed

ISLAMABAD: People from different walks of life on Thursday lauded the government decision to reduce the petroleum prices by Rs 15 per liter, hoping that it would help bring down the transportation cost of essential items, especially edibles, for benefit of the common man. They said there was economic slowdown due to the coronavirus threat in the country and termed the reduction in petroleum prices a 'timely relief' for the common man. After announcement of the relief package and subsequent notification of the Finance Ministry, the prices of Petrol, High Speed Diesel (HSD), Kerosene Oil and Light Diesel Oil (LDO) had been reduced by Rs 15 per liter. Now, the petrol was being sold at Rs96.58, the HSD at Rs107.25, the Kerosene oil at Rs77.45 and the LDO at Rs62.51 per liter at all the fuel stations.

Presidential election to decide which path US takes on Iran

W OLLOWING more primary elections last week, it appears that former Vice President Joe Biden is very likely to be the Democratic Party's nominee to compete against President Donald Trump in the November election. Recent retaliatory strikes between the US and Iran-affiliated militants in Iraq have highlighted that Iran will continue to pose a challenge for whoever is the next US president. Trump's presidency has represented a major break with previous Republican and Democratic foreign policy precedents. Biden promises an approach much more similar to that of former President Barack Obama. However, the world has changed significantly in the last four years, and even the type of centrist foreign policy experts that Biden would likely look to for advice would suggest some changes to US foreign policy.

Trump's approach toward Iran is already well known. His disdain for the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) – and for the Obama administration's negotiation of it – was clear during his campaign for president. He withdrew the US from the agreement in May 2018. His administration subsequently imposed severe sanctions on Iran, as the key element of a "maximum pressure" campaign. Under Trump, America has been more assertive toward Iran militarily while seeking to avoid an all-out war. Most notably, a US strike killed key Iranian figure Maj. Gen. Qassem Soleimani in January.


If Trump wins re-election, it is likely that his administration will continue its maximum pressure approach. The cycle of escalation and de-escalation between Iran and the US would also be likely to continue. This would raise the ongoing risk of war.

Biden has defended the JCPOA, saying that it significantly reduced the risk of Iran developing nuclear weapons and created space for diplomacy to help manage other problems related to Iran. If he became president, Biden has said that he would rejoin the JCPOA, on the condition that Iran returned to compliance with the agreement. He suggests that restarting the JCPOA would be a first step, rebuilding US credibility and re-establishing an international consensus against an Iranian nuclear weapons program. He would hope to build on that to gain other compromises from Iran and to ensure multilateral cooperation to contain Iran's regional activities. – *Arab News*

Cut in interest rate; will it serve the purpose?

N an extraordinary development, the State Bank of Pakistan announced a large cut in the discount rate equal to 1.5 percentage points. This happened in an unscheduled meeting of the monetary policy committee that was called at short notice and deliberated while the prime minister and his team in Islamabad announced the details of the trillion-rupee-plus stimulus package. It was, by all accounts, an extraordinary day, with the government coming up with a mid-year stimulus package of unprecedented size together with the central bank announcing a rate cut, which, if coupled with the previous 75bps cut a week earlier, amounts to 2.25 percentage points, probably the single largest cut in over a decade. With both these announcements, the stabilisation that began under the auspices of the IMF programme now stands terminated and the government's hand has been forced to move towards supporting growth.

Extraordinary times call for extraordinary measures. Now that the decision to move towards stimulus has been made in so comprehensive a manner, the next thing to look out for is stimulus-induced instability. An example would be the exchange rate where the effects of the rate cut have been felt right away as the rupee fell by Rs2.6 to the dollar in the interbank market the very next day. The finance team may well have placed the bet that with oil prices crashing and a large deflation about to sweep the economy with collapsing demand, there is ample room to resort to extraordinary steps like steep rate cuts and ramped-up spending. There is no reason to fault them for having made this judgement call, because these are, after all, extraordinary times. But having made the judgement call, they must now show some fortitude in the face of the market reactions that will inevitably come. The finance team, now led by the finance adviser and the State Bank governor, must make their government colleagues aware of the risks of the moves that are being made, and ensure that the authorities do not panic if the market sees sharp swings in the coming days. These swings will be there wherever the market is still operational, stock trading and the exchange rate being key. Demands for shoring up the exchange rate must now be managed, and those for a stock market bailout fund, which are sure to come at some point, must be fended off comprehensively. - Courtesy DAWN

Despite repeated requests of the government of Pakistan to lift socio-economic sanctions against Iran, the US administration seems to be not ready to give some comfort and ease to Iran government and its people to fight against COVID-19 due to which despite sincere efforts of Iranian government, the death toll is on the rise. Out of its super power "obsession" and "wise man syndrome" the US is not ready to seek guidance and help from Cuba which with joint collaboration of China has made a very effective medicine for COVID-19. So, every state of the US is going to be sieged because of the constant denial of US government and uninterrupted political inflexibility towards CUBA and China. Israel the "champion of illegal occupation" has rejected to ease out coronavirus infections and showed no intention of easing apartheid to make sure Palestinians are able to face the epidemic under more humane and suitable conditions. Despite ongoing global survival crisis in shape of coronavirus infections and "political debacle" within Israel itself, the forces of darkness and destruction are on the move to launch raids on various people and communities living in the Issawiya neighborhood in East Jerusalem and home demolitions in places like Kafr Qasim village and the destruction of crops in Bedouin communities in the Naqab desert. According to latest information (March 25, 2020), four Palestinian prisoners has been tested positive for COVID-19, the Israeli government has so far refused to heed calls to release the 5,000 Palestinians including 180 children. The Palestine authority and its people do not expect any mercy from Israel to lift the incapacitating siege on the Gaza Strip, which has annihilated its public services.

Moreover, in a political move, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has tried to exclude the mostly Palestinian Joint List from the formation of an emergency unity government to tackle the outbreak which may be taken as act of sever apartheid. On the other hand as its mentor US (China Virus rhetoric) Israel have been quick to represent Palestinians as carriers of the virus and a threat to public health.

The Palestinian Ministry of Health (PMH) announced it had confirmed the first seven cases of the coronavirus in the occupied Palestinian territory; Israeli Defense minister Naftali Bennett was quick to shut down the city of Bethlehem, where all the cases were located. On the other hand, some members of the Jewish population of Israel, out rightly refused to shut down religious schools and businesses.

It seems that apart from the century old systematic subjugation and discernment, during the COVID-19 epidemic, Palestinians will be facing another consequence of occupation and apartheid. The situation in the West Bank may seem bleak, but the one in the Gaza Strip is simply catastrophic. The United Nations announced that the strip will be unlivable by 2020. It is now 2020 and the residents of the Gaza Strip apart from inhuman living conditions - are now also facing a COVID-19 outbreak.

Occupied Kashmir is another prime example of Indian "hegemonic apartheid". Many cases of COV-ID-19 have been detected in the valley but still Indian authorities and forces are not ready to relax the lives of besieged Kashmiris. The people of occupied Kashmiris are under blockade for the last 250 days and even basic rights and necessities of life have not been in reach of them. It has now labeled as "biggest jail" of the world. It fears that without normalcy, a "human catastrophe" may outbreak in valley of beauty, Kashmir where beasts are treating the people like bandits.

Unfortunately, widespread of COVID-19 has also produced a "widening gap" between various communi-

ORONAVIRUS has now badly damaged the global economy. Fears of acute recession are haunting regional economies as well as their alliances. COVID-19 has now emerged as one of the biggest non-state actor's security threat. It has also severed regional as well as security repercussions. Although, it is a new "global leveler" because of its "immense global" reach and potential of devastations still humanity is at the mercy of elements of planned socio-economic marginalization, sanctions, political isolation, human rights violation and last but not least, perpetual apartheid.

Despite US and western media propaganda, China has merged as "hope of the last restore". China is helping out more than 100 countries around the globe to fight against ongoing uncontrollable COV-ID-19 pandemic with supply of medical staff, modern equipment, medicines and financial assistance. Right from the beginning, Palestinians have not been allowed to establish their own health system. Initial the British discouraged the formation of a Palestinian-run healthcare sector. Subsequently, the British colonialists and various Western missionaries established medical facilities in these araes. Meanwhile, the Jewish settlers were allowed to set up their own healthcare system, funded generously from abroad and run independently of the mandate.

Unfortunately, Palestinians have been at the receiving end due to which many missionaries left and closed down their clinics during World War II and after 1948, the British withdrew, leaving behind an ill-performing healthcare infrastructure. In 1949, Egypt annexed Gaza. The following year, Jordan did the same with the West Bank. Over the next 17 years, Cairo and Amman provided for the Palestinian population living under their rule, but they did not really establish a well-functioning healthcare system.

The United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA) in the Near East had to step up its services, providing primary healthcare, while the Palestinians started building a network of charitable healthcare facilities.

With just 1.23 beds per 1,000 people, 2,550 working doctors, less than 20 intensive care specialists and less than 120 ventilators in all public hospitals, the occupied West Bank is facing a public health disaster if the authorities do not contain the spread of COVID-19.

ties in the world and Pakistan is not any exception. Unsterilized Shia devotees of Pakistan returned recently from Iran have created a serious security threat in many parts of the country. Public anger is on the rise among the other local communities which may trigger ethnic chaos in the country. Uncontrolled mobilization of Tablighi Jamaat (the outreach society or the society for spreading faith) is also getting momentum in spreading COVID-19 in the country. So faith and factualism is inching towards a fatal collide in the country which may create a serious security threat in the days to come.

World and regions are now at the mercy of a global response full of solidarity against COVID-19 but it seems that world superpowers and movers and shakers are not ready to listen the weakening voices of struggling people and communities alike. They still believe in brutal persuasions of apartheid, socio-economic marginalization and last but not least, sanctions.

From Pope to Pop, from reformists to traditionalists, from communisms to communalism, socialism to capitalism every actor of the human survival on this planet is requesting for global coordination and regional collaboration against COVID-19. Let us hope against hope that doves of peace and harmony may fly high to shun horrendous crimes against struggling humanity in Palestine, Kashmir, Nagorno-Karabakh, Northern Cyprus, Syria, Yemen and Sudan because Coronavirus has become a new political leveler. It may be.

Learning from China's Exemplary Response to COVID-19

It is not without reason that international bodies such as World Health Organization (WHO) are all praise for Chinese response to COVID-19. The Chinese experience of fighting the disease tells that response against this plague would have to be timely, strong, all-around and the whole nations would have to rise to this challenge. Well done China. Now it is up to the rest of the world to play its part.

A S the whole world now deals with deadly impacts of COVID-19, time is telling that the way China dealt with the virus after its outbreak late last year was highly effective, timely, and example setting.

The global pandemic of CoronaVirus – also known as COVID-19 – has now reached almost all the parts of the world, almost half a million people are infected, and total deaths have crossed the 20000 mark at the time of writing of this piece, on March 25.

Alarmingly, this has all happened in a quick span of just a few weeks, signaling much worse to come.

While the world – Europe and the US in particular – brace for an extraordinary attack of the pandemic, China at the same time is announcing to open Wuhan, the capital of its worst infected province, Hubei. From Wednesday, March 25 onwards, intra-city restrictions are being eased and from the 8th of April, the citizens of the city would also be able to travel to the rest of the country.

With more than 80 thousands of people infected with CoronaVirus, China still tops the table of the nation with worst impact so far. However, the positive side of this picture is that more than 70 thousand people in China have been cured out of disease. The fatality rate, at over 3200, is around 3%.

By contrast, Italy has become the country with more than double the deaths recorded in China, the highest in the world. Italy fatality rate with around 7000 deaths out of 60 thousand positive cases comes to the tune of 12%, 4 times higher than in China.

The point here is not to criticize any country, much less the one facing the highest number of deaths, but to point towards the toll that pandemic has taken, correspondingly. Voices are now emerging that Italy's response was not as timely and all-around as that of China.

When China imposed strict measures to keep its citizens within homes and businesses closed all across major urban centers, it was criticized as suppression of movement and infringing upon civic rights. China not only put the whole of Wuhan city into a complete lockdown, but major cities also went through strong blockades. Businesses were kept close weeks after Chinese New Year.

Transport – road, rail, air and water borne – was closed. And Migrants workers were asked to stay at homes as factories and work places were stopped from working.

The whole world saw that these measures not only saved millions – perhaps tens of millions – from getting infected but China also provided the world with necessary time before the pandemic could strike elsewhere, if from China.

Although, it is now emerging that what is the world is seeing now did not necessarily originate inside China.

In this period, China effectively mobilized all its central and provincial resources. It built massive makeshift hospitals, deployed state-of-the-art technology, and its doctors and paramedics worked tirelessly. Chinese leadership was leading these efforts from the front, setting an example like no other.

More importantly, Chinese people paid heed to the call of their leadership and thus played their part by staying home and isolated, safeguarding themselves and others, as long as it was necessary.

China also rolled out a number of financial incentives and taxation relaxations for the businesses impacted by the lockdown, specially small and medium enterprises, so that employment and livelihoods would not be affected beyond a certain extent.

The countries that took it lightly are now suffering the most: not only Italy, but other European countries, the US and Iran are just some examples. In China, the local infections now are just next to zero, while the real danger is now coming from the 'imported' cases, which are seeing a constant rise. Even in this case, China has imposed timely restrictions and measures.

For example, every international traveler to Beijing has to undergo necessary 14 day quarantine upon arrival.

It is heartening to note that China, after by and large controlling the malaise on its soil, is now going all out to help other affected nations in a big way.

As the pandemic takes Pakistanis into its grip fastly, large scale help from China has already started to arrive. Such Chinese help is also finding ways to the developed Europe, Iran and elsewhere.

Nobody says that what China did on its soil can be replicated as it was to just about any other country or situation. However, Chinese experience tells us that this is not a pandemic to take lightly, no matter what is the level of modernizations of a country's healthcare system or resources at a government's disposal.

It is not without reason that international bodies such as World Health Organization (WHO) are all praise for Chinese response to COVID-19.

Nine doctors die from coronavirus in Philippines

MANILA: Nine doctors have died in the Philippines from the coronavirus, the country's top medical association said Thursday, as hospitals were overwhelmed and medics complained about a lack of protection on the front lines.

The announcement of the doctors' deaths heightened fears that the scale of the health crisis in the Philippines is much worse than is being officially reported, with the confirmed virus death toll at just 38.

The main island of Luzon, home to 55 million people, is in the second week of a lockdown to contain the spread of the disease, however medics are warning there is a surge in cases. The Philippine Medical Association said Thursday a ninth doctor had died of the virus, and that health workers were not getting enough protection.

"If it were up to me, test the frontliners first and test them again after seven days. Doctors could be carriers themselves," Benito Atienza, vice president of the Philippine Medical Association told AFP.

in 8 months of FY 2019-20 Agencies ISLAMABAD: The imports of medicinal products into the country during the first eight months of current financial year (2019-20) dipped by 8.82 percent as compared to the corresponding period of last year.

Pakistan imported medicinal products of worth US \$ 677.803 million during July-February (2019-20) compared to the imports of US \$ 743.353 million during July- February (2018-19), showing negative growth of 8.82 percent, according to Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS)

In terms of quantity, Pakistan imported 15,043 metric tons of medicinal products during the period under review as compared to the imports of 15,142 metric tons during corresponding period of last year, showing nominal decrease of 0.65 percent in term of quantity.

Medicinal imports dip over 8%

Meanwhile, on year-on-year basis, the medicinal imports declined by 0.29 percent in February 2020 when compared to the imports of the same month of last year. The medicinal imports during February 2020 were recorded at \$ 87.020 million against the imports of \$ 87.274 million in February

2019. On month-on-month basis, the medicinal imports however witnessed increase of 15.48 percent during February 2020 when compared to the imports of \$75.354 million in January 2019, the PBS data revealed. It is pertinent to mention

here that the country's merchandise trade deficit plunged by 26.06 percent during the first eight months of the current fiscal year (2019-20) as compared to the deficit of the same months of last year. During the period under review, the country's exports registered about 3.62 per cent growth.
