PESHAWAR: Leaders of the Awami National Party have withdrawn from the Pakistan Democratic Movement after show-cause notices were issued to the party to explain their actions during the recently held Senate polls. 

Insaf mobile shops program launched

FAISALABAD: Under the vision of Punjab Chief Minister Sardar Usman Buzdar, "Insaf Sasti Mobile Shops' have been introduced to provide fruits and vegetables to the consumers at government rates, initially through more than 100 loader rickshaws will provide Fruits and vegetables are being sold at discounted rates in the streets while registration of 50 more loader rickshaws is also underway. In addition, cheap shops are being set up outside 40 mega marts of the city where besides fruits and vegetables, groceries are also being sold which would also available at controlled prices. Cases register against **SOPs violators**

'Karachi Air Quality in 2021 and Beyond' discussed

KARACHI: The U.S. Consulate General -Karachi hosted a virtual roundtable discussion on 'Karachi Air Quality in 2021 and Beyond' to promote real-time monitors to improve air quality.

The roundtable brought together policymakers, climate change experts, and diplomatic community members based in Karachi to explore the benefits of using lowcost air quality monitoring programmes to measure and track air pollutants, according to a communique.

The U.S. Department of State has installed more than 60 reference-grade air quality monitors worldwide, including four in Pakistan. Real-time outdoor air quality data from these monitors helps scientists and policymakers to address air quality around the world and is transparently available to the public.

U.S. Consul General Robert Silberstein and Murtaza Wahab, adviser to the Chief Minister of Sindh on Environment, Climate Change and Coast Development, delivered keynote remarks. Consul General Silberstein said, 'Accurate data allows us to make better decisions and to understand the problem.'

3 bodies found in Faisalabad

FAISALABAD: The police have found three bodies from different parts of Faisalabad during the past 12 hours. ISLAMABAD: The recent move by the government to make the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) autonomous is part of the IMF agenda being imposed on Pakistan as the decision lacks transparency and goes against national interest. This was the unanimous view of economic and fiscal policy experts during a webinar titled 'Understanding State Bank Amendment Bill 2021' organized by the Institute of Policy Studies (IPS). The event was chaired by Prof. Dr. Abdul Saboor, Dean Faculty of Social Sciences, PMAS Arid Agriculture University, Rawalpindi.

The speakers and discussants included IPS' Chairman Khalid Rahman, Vice Chairman Ambassador (r) Sved Abrar Hussain. Dr. Shahida Wizarat, Dean, Col-

lege of Economics and Social Development, Institute of Business Management, Karachi; Dr. Pervez Tahir, former chief economist, Planning Commission; Qanit Khalil, chartered accountant and economic policy analyst; Raja Kamran, a Karachi-based economic journalist and Amanullah Khan, former president,

Rawalpindi Chamber of Commerce & Industry (RCCI). Commenting on the proposed amendments, Dr. Pervez Tahir lamented the removal of the word 'national interest' from the preamble of the existing SBP Act and argued that the proposed bill would delineate responsibility for controlling inflation to the SBP which

has already failed in this regard. He further said controlling prices of food items is a provincial subject and has nothing to do with the SBP which can only control core inflation that has not increased substantially in recent years. He was also of the view that the

Pakistani government is giving much more than what IMF or



World Bank could actually demand from a sovereign state through the proposed amendment. Dr. Shahida Wizarat was of the view that independence of institutions can only be achieved through holistic policies. She rued Pakistan's policies are not indigenous, rather dictated, as most of the officials running important institutions are "imported" which underlines the continuation of colonial era in this part of the world. Giving absolute autonomy to the SBP, she further said, is tantamount to making Pakistan subservient to the IMF and the World Bank. Explaining the phenomenon of independence of central banks, Qanit Khalil termed the proposed autonomy to the SBP in line with the global trend. However, he argued independence does not guarantee price stability and economic growth of a country as proven by many studies.

According to data from DHA, the death toll rose to 1002 out of which 774 belonged to Rawalpindi and 228 from other districts with the addition of 9 new deaths during the last 24

The data showed that 16461 patients recovered so far and 4974 were quarantined including 2856 at home and 2118 in isolation.

The patients reported during the last 24 hours included 44 have their place to Rawal Town, 56 Potohar town, 67 Rawalpindi Cantt, 16 Gujar khan, 16 Taxila, 2 Murree, 4 Kahuta, 4 Kalar Syedan, 7 Kotli Sattian, 2 AIK, 6 Islamabad and one each from Attock, Jehlum, KPK and Pind Dadan Khan. "Presently 218 confirmed patients were admitted to various facilities of the city counting 31 in Holy Family Hospital, 32 in Benazir Bhutto Hospital, 133 in Institute of Urology, and 22 in Fauji Foundation Hospital," the report said.

Meanwhile talking to media, District Health Coordinator for C-Virus Dr Jawad Zahid said the rise in COVID-19 cases can be associated with not following COVID-SOPs such as wearing masks and maintaining social distance. He urged the people to hands frequently, cover their mouth when coughing or sneezing and keep rooms well-ventilated at home and the workplace.

ISLAMABAD: To spur innovation in its regulated sectors, the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) has announced the launch of second cohort of its Regulatory Sandbox.

The Regulatory Sandbox is a tailored regulatory environment that allows entities/ firms to conduct limited scale live tests of innovative products, services, processes, and business models in a controlled environment, said a press release issued here.

SECP had earlier last year issued the Regulatory Sandbox Guidelines 2019.

Under second cohort, the application window will be open from April 15, till May 14, for all eligible persons including registered companies, unregistered startups and FinTech firms.

The unregistered entities would have to get registered upon successful experiment. The application form,

MRAN Khan's regular telephonic conversations with citizens is a great initiative. The phone call scheme makes the Prime Minister (PM) accessible to anyone, provided they get a chance. The phone calls in the recent sessions show that the conversation between the PM and ordinary folks was organic and uncensored. Such a scheme is not something usual to see with the head of government and other representatives.

A recurring theme in the conversations was the rapid rise in prices and uncontrolled inflation. These two issues have been the common criticisms against the government's performance so far in any case. However, what was slightly disappointing was that the answers that the PM gave might increase hope, but offered little tangible in the way of policy strategies.

It would have served the government well if it had chosen this opportunity to announce some concrete measures against the rising inflation and the expected hoarding in Ramzan. Crackdown on the mafias the PM was speaking about are sorely needed; and as the ruling party, it is PTI's responsibility to alleviate these issues. The inflation in March edged up to 9.1 percent from 8.7 percent in February, according to the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS). Increasing inflation, despite the government's continuous claims to control it by one means or another, is making it difficult for people to buy even basic commodities.

While the PM wanted to satisfy the callers with positive macroeconomics indicators, the public is looking for some hardcore action from the government to control inflation. We must wait and see whether the PM's stern words will translate into action on the ground. However, all the indications hint that this Ramazan might be another one, where the prices of essential food items will skyrocket.

Halt in development

ESPITE statements proclaiming all developmental projects are 'headed towards completion on a fast pace' by the Minister for Planning and Development, Asad Umar, there seems to be a major halt on account of the government's failure to release funds. Not only is this going to jeopardise the prospects of infrastructural development but it will cause a major hold up in all four provinces.

Projects under the National Highway Authority (NHA) were promised a budget of Rs.119 billion, out of which they have only received 30 percent. Considering the sheer number of projects and their size, and that some are part of CPEC initiatives as well, the amount released is not going to be sufficient.

Large-scale development projects require an equally large pool of finances if all materials are to be bought, workers to be hired, permits to be obtained, expertise to be consulted, so on and so forth. Without funds, progress either becomes unbearably slow or contractors revert to a policy of complete abandonment. The problem is exacerbated further by the fact that recent non-payment reports for the last three months have already agitated contractors and have contributed towards causing a delay already. At this point, there is only so much that can be condoned by the authorities. There is no doubt that such developmental projects are a necessity for Pakistan. In light of this fact, it is imperative to understand that fund burnout rate is a key component that can either make or break development projects, both in the private and public sector. It is the responsibility of the government to ensure that a steady rate is maintained in regards to investing and releasing finances so that projects can be completed in their entirety without unnecessary costs brought about by delay.

RESIDENT Joe Biden has invited 40 world leaders to the 'Leaders Summit on Climate'. The two-day conference will start on 22 April - the Earth Day, and will come ahead of a major UN meeting on the crisis, scheduled for November in Glasgow, Scotland. The conference will be entirely online due to the coronavirus pandemic, and will be live streamed for public viewing. Some of the top leaders including President Xi Jinping and President Putin have been invited. Some of the most climate vulnerable countries from Asia and Africa have also been on the list of invitees. Bangladesh, Bhutan and India are from South Asia. Exclusion of Pakistan from Biden's list of invitees is a clear denial of Pakistan's vulnerability to the climate crisis. It may also be termed as the failure of Pakistan's balance of diplomacy in the recent years - the most vulnerable turn in 73 years of diplomatic relation between the US and Pakistan. A point to ponder for Pakistan to urgently review the diplomacy tracks and to take remedial steps accordingly to balance the sides. Pakistan is no longer on the priority list of the US for many years now but we had seen no tangible efforts by the country's foreign office to address the challenges. Same is the case with other long-standing friends. Pakistan has to take note of this alarming diplomacy deficit that could turn to be more vulnerable than the climate vulnerabilities the country is already confronting. Coming back to Biden's very important climate event that has given a hope to the Paris Agreement

"We know why they have given us the show-cause notice [...] [Shahid Khagan] Abbasi, [Shah Owais Ahmed] Noorani, and [Abdul Ghafoor] Haideri came to my home and we already provided them a clarification. "For them to issue a show-cause notice nonetheless, can mean only one thing: they wish to harm our reputation." Hoti said.

The ANP leader said that such a move "makes it very clear" that "two or three parties" wish to take the lead in all decision making. "They consider ANP and PPP as obstacles in their way," he added.

Hoti said that the party feels as if they have been "pushed against the wall".

"A leader's position is not one to be used to attack in such a manner," he said, referring to Fazlur Rehman. "A leader gives everyone a chance and tries to resolve all differences between parties of an alliance," Hoti added.

KIEV: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has urged NATO to speed up his country's membership plan, saying it is the only way to end a simmering conflict in the eastern Donbass region.

Ukrainian government troops have battled Russian-backed separatists in the country's eastern Donetsk and Lugansk regions, which form part of the Donbass, since the rebels seized a swathe of territory there in April 2014.

A ceasefire was agreed to last July, but fears of an escalation in hostilities have mounted in recent weeks amid reports of renewed front-line clashes and a Russian military

build-up along the shared border. Speaking on Tuesday after a phone call with NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg, Zelenskyy said a signal needed to be sent to Russia as tensions grow between the pair. He called on members of NATO, which counts Ukraine as an ally, to strengthen their military presence in the Black Sea region. Zelenskyy said such a move would

act as a "powerful deterrent" to Russia, which annexed Ukraine's southern Crimean peninsula in March 2014 after an uprising that toppled former Kremlin-friendly President Viktor Yanukovych.

"Reforms alone will not stop Russia," he said. "NATO is the only way to end the war in Donbass.' Stoltenberg said he had expressed

"serious concern about Russia's military activities in and around Ukraine" during the call with Zelenskyv. "NATO firmly supports Ukraine's sovereignty & territorial integrity. We remain committed to our close partnership," he tweeted.

Shortly afterward, Moscow, which denies being a participant in the conflict, warned that Ukraine's NATO membership would "worsen the situation" in the Donbass region. ton would be concerned by any effort by Moscow to intimidate Ukraine, whether it occurred on

Russian territory or within Ukraine. He declined to say if the US believed Russia was preparing to invade the former Soviet republic. Price's comments followed a telephone call on Friday in which US President Joe Biden reassured Zelenskyy of his 'unwavering support". UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson also spoke with Zelenskyy on Monday and expressed his support for Ukraine's "sovereignty and territorial integrity", according to his spokesperson. 'They discussed the UK's significant concerns about the recent Russian military activity on Ukraine's border and in illegally annexed Crimea," Johnson's spokesperson said. The Kremlin last week said that Russia was at liberty to move troops on its own territory.

Vietnam's Nguyen sworn in as president

HANOI: The man behind Vietnam's successful handling of the coronavirus pandemic, Nguyen Xuan Phuc, was for mally sworn in as president in Hanoi.

Phuc, 66, was Vietnam's prime minister for the last five years, a period in which the economy boomed, and his government's Covid-19 response won plaudits at home and abroad.

Following secret voting on Monday, Phuc scored the maximum votes among the almost 500-member rub ber-stamp national assembly. "This is his well-deserved award," said Nguyen Khac Giang, a Vietnamese politics expert from New Zealand's Victoria University of Wellington, Authoritarian Vietnam is run by the Communist Party and officially led by the party general secretary, president, and prime minister, with key decisions made by the 18-member politburo.

Vietnam is in the midst of its twice-a-decade leadership transition, with 76-year-old Nguyen Phu Trong re-elected in January as party general secretary, the most important of the three roles. Phuc was the only candidate nominated for president, as Trong, who had held the presidency since 2018 after the sudden death of his predecessor, stepped down. The National Assembly said earlier this was "the first time ever a prime minister was nominated to the position of the president".

Bangladesh protest over Covid curbs turns violent

DHAKA: A protest over police enforcement of coronavirus restrictions in rural Bangladesh turned violent when a mob of demonstrators at tacked a police station, resulting in at least three people being shot, police and a doctor said. The incident took place late on Monday in the central town of Saltha in the Faridpur district where, according to the police, rumours had spread about a man being injured in a police sweep of a market aimed at enforcing health measures to curb the spread of COVID.

Thousands of villagers took to the streets in anger. A group of them hurled bricks at a police station and vandalised government offices in the town, torching an officer's home and two cars belonging to government officials, police said. "Police fired in self-defence after they attacked the police station," a police spokesman in Faridpur district told AFP news agency. A second police official, Inspector Nur-a-Alam Fakir, confirmed the incident.

Police did not give any casualty figures, but Abdul Matin, a doctor at the emergency ward of the state-run Faridpur Medical College Hospital, said three people were in critical condition after suffering gunshot wounds.

Iran receives AstraZeneca doses through COVAX

FOREIGN DESK

TEHRAN: Some 700,000 doses of the Oxford-Astra-Zeneca vaccine have been delivered to Iran as part of its purchase of millions of doses through the World Health Organization's CO-VAX initiative.

As confirmed by an Iranian official and the United Nations' UNICEF, which handled delivery, the first shipment landed in Tehran's Imam Khomeini Airport Monday night and included 700,800 doses of the vaccine. The delivered doses were manufactured by South Korea's SK-Bio Institute. "By the end of May, 3.6 million doses of the 16.8 million doses purchased through COVAX will be delivered to Iran," said Kianush Janahpur, spokesman for Iran's Food and Drug Administration, in a tweet.

Iran, which previously said it purchased 4.2 million doses of the Oxford-Astra-Zeneca vaccine through the global vaccine initiative, expected them before Nowruz, the Iranian new year, on March 20.

"Achieving this important milestone aimed at ensuring the global goal of equitable distribution of COVID-19 vaccines across the world through COVAX facility is the key priority for WHO and partners," UNICEF said in a press release after delivering the vaccines.

India steps up anti-Maoist operations

NEW DELHI: Indian security forces have stepped up operations against ultra leftwing fighters deep in the forests of a mineral-rich central state after they killed 22 policemen in an ambush over the weekend, a top police officer said.

At least 30 other members of the security forces were wounded in the four-hour gun battle with Maoist rebels that took place in Chhattisgarh state on Saturits kind in four years.

"The operation will be intensified," said Om Prakash Pal, the deputy inspector general of police, who is leading the fight against the rebels in Chhattisgarh. on Monday. The Maoists, also known as Naxals, have waged an armed struggle against government forces for decades. They say they are fighting for the poor who have been left behind in India's economic boom. Chhattisgarh, one of the fastest-developing states in India, has 28 varieties of key minerals, including diamonds and gold, a government website said. It also holds 16 percent of India's coal deposits and large reserves of iron ore and bauxite.

The Maoists, considered by the government as India's biggest internal security threat, operate in mineral-rich territory in the east and south of the country known as the "red corridor, which has shrunk in recent years because of heavy op-

In the eastern West Bengal and Assam states, where the third phase of elections is under way, Modi's partv is banking on its strong Hindu nationalist ideology to draw votes.

Iran indicts 10 officials over downed Ukraine airliner

TEHRAN: A military prosecutor says indictments have been brought against "10 of the officials who had a role" in the deadly downing of a Ukraine International flight over Tehran last year.

In a ceremony on Tuesday to introduce his successor, Gholam Abbas Torki said the individuals - whom he did not name or otherwise identify - will head to court soon, though he also did not provide a timeframe.

Torki said in January 2020, shortly after Flight PS752 was downed by two missiles fired from an Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) air battery, that 10 individuals had been subject to disciplinary action including dismissals or demotions, and will soon go on trial.

On Tuesday, Shokrollah Bahrami, head of the Iranian armed forces' judicial organisation, confirmed that the military court is done with the case and indictments were signed, "Inshallah, the case will be followed up in court in the new year," he said, referring to the Iranian new year that began on March 21. - Foreign Desk

A chart filling most of a page lists 20 people, along with photos, hometowns and Facebook pages

Several actors and directors were also charged in February, but the campaign against celebrity protest supporters was stepped up last week when army-controlled Myawaddy TV broadcast a wanted list. There are now at least 60 people on such lists.

May Toe Khine, who describes herself in her Twitter profile as "Full Time Burmese Actress / Part Time Fashion Designer Student," tweeted after the TV announcement that her arrest warrant was "for simply doing my job as a civilian: using my platform to speak out the truth.

"Please always pay attention to news in Myanmar until we win,"

What appears to be a leaked document from the Information Ministry advises broadcasters and production agencies of the accusations against people in the fields of literature, film, theater arts. music and journalism. It warns them not to publish or broadcast any of their work or face prosecution themselves.

The April 4 document, which could not be authenticated by The Associated Press, was reported by Khit Thit Media and widely circulated on social media. Protests

continued around the country, but generally on a smaller scale than recently and often in ways intended to avoid confrontations. On Sunday, an "Easter Egg Strike" was held with eggs painted in support of

the protests displayed in public places and online.

În Dawei, a city in southeastern Myanmar that is a stronghold of the protest movement, a short march was accompanied by a motorcycle procession.

In Yangon, the country's biggest city, a memorial march for the dead was held by mourners clad in black. Separately, about 20 people gathered briefly on a city street and burned Chinese flags. Many protesters believe that Beijing backs the military regime with economic and political support, including the threat of a veto at the UN Security Council against international sanctions.

More flights are also planned & will be announced soon.'

The United Kingdom (UK) has added more countries including Pakistan and Bangladesh to its red list from April 9 - 2021 in order to curb the spread of COVID-19 variants interna-

The British authorities had added Pakistan, Bangladesh, the Philippines and Kenya to its red list to be effective from 4:00 am (local time) Friday, April 9 – 2021 for implementing travel bans on visitors from these countries.

Under the restrictions imposed by the UK Department for Transport, British, Irish and third-country nationals with residence rights (including long-term visa holders) would be required to self-isolate in a government-approved hotel quarantine facility for 10 days.

It said people will be allowed to bring prayer mats from home and gatherings before and after prayer should be avoided. If a mosque or Imam Bargah has an open area or garden it is preferable to conduct prayers there. The declaration said people over 60 years of age, children and patients with cough and flue should avoid coming to mosques and Imam Bargahs. Ordinary prayers and taraweeh should not be conducted on roads, footpaths

and anywhere else than the premises of mosques and Imam Bargahs. Floors of mosques and Imam Bargahs should regularly be washed with chlorinated water.

The joint declaration said there should be a threefoot distance during congregational prayers, while markers should be made on the floors of mosques and Imam Bargahs to guide people about the distance they should keep from others. It is encouraged that people should do ablution at home. People must wear face masks when coming to mosques and avoid handshakes and hugging. It said that collective Se-

har and Iftar in mosques should be avoided. Motkifeen should maintain sixfoot distance during Aitikaf. Mosque committees should be in constant contact with the provincial, district governments and police.

It was decided that the government can review this policy if it feels that the situation has gone out of control and the number of cases surge during Ramadan and SOPs are not followed in letter and spirit.

According to a private television channel report Tuesday, the Finance Ministry has started listing the recommendations for loan deferment by the G20 countries which may range from \$800 million to \$900 million.

The sources said the relief from G20 countries is likely to pour in between July to December 2021. The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has proposed to the G20 nations to put

off the loan payments. The sources said the G20 states are expected to defer loans of low-income countries, so they can tackle the situation arising out of the coronavirus pan-

Pak grieved over loss of lives in Indonesia

ISLAMABAD: has expressed profound grief and sorrow over the loss of precious lives, missing persons and destruction caused in Indonesia due to floods and landslides.

In a tweet on Tuesday, Foreign Office Spokesperson Zahid Hafeez Chaudhri said our thoughts and prayers are with the victims, their families and brotherly people of Indonesia.

At least 157 people have been killed in Indonesia and neighbouring Timor-Leste with dozens more still missing after a tropical cyclone battered the south-east Asian nations, leaving thousands homeless, authorities said on Tuesday.

Indonesia's disaster management agency said it had recorded 130 deaths in a cluster of remote islands near Timor-Leste, where another 27 have been officially listed as dead.

Iran notches new daily record of virus cases

TEHRAN: Iran Tuesday announced a new record number of daily coronavirus cases, as authorities warned of a "major increase" in infections to come as the country faces its fourth wave.

Over the past 24 hours, the Islamic republic officially recorded 17,430 cases of infection, health ministry spokesperson Sima Sadat Lari said.

The figure eclipses a previous peak in late November of 14,051 daily cases, and brings Iran's total number of cases to 1,963,394. Iran also recorded 174 ad-

ditional virus deaths, Lari said, bringing the total to 63.506.

Lari warned the population of a "major increase in infections" to come. The Islamic republic is

battling the Middle East's deadliest coronavirus outbreak, and case numbers have risen following a surge in trips during the Iranian new year holidays in recent weeks.

Iran is facing "one of the most severe waves" of its coronavirus outbreak, Health Minister Saeed Namaki had said Monday. "We've now lost the reins" of the virus, he said.

Some officials, including Namaki, have admitted in the past that the virus numbers are likely higher than official figures.

Authorities had warned of

a concerning rise in the spread of the more contagious British variant of the disease and of a "fourth wave" prior to the holidays. Dozens of towns and cities including the capital Tehran are classified as "red", the highest rating on the country's coronavirus risk scale, requiring all non-essential businesses to close. Iran has avoided imposing a full lockdown on its population of 82 million since the pandemic started. – **AFP**

CanSino vaccine: Age limit changed in Islamabad

The age limit for the CanSinoBIO's single-dose coronavirus jab has been reduced from 80 to 70 years

ISLAMABAD: The age limit for a single-dose jab of the coronavirus vaccine manufactured by China's CanSino Biologics Inc, or CanSinoBIO, has been slashed by 10 years in the federal capital, media reported.

According to the report,

the age limit for the CanSinoBIO's single-dose coronavirus jab has been reduced from 80 to 70 years, meaning that septuagenarians in Islamabad may now get themselves vaccinated. Asad Umar - the federal minister for planning and development, as well as the head of the National Command and Control Center (NCOC), Pakistan's nerve centre to monitor the coronavirus situation - said Tuesday the effects of stricter restrictions, wider lockdowns, and rig-
