ISLAMABAD: Minister for Information and Broadcasting Fawad Chaudhry said on Monday that even if Afganistan descended into a civil war, the government would not let the fallout affect Pakistan. ISLAMABAD: In Pakistan, 15 more people died from the global coronavirus epidemic and 1,808 new cases were reported Monday morning. According to the latest statistics by the National Command and Operation Center, 47,015 tests for coronavirus were conducted across the country in the last 24 hours, of which 1,808 people tested positive.

According to the official portal, the country's positivity rate stands at 3.84%. According to the NCOC, the number of deaths from coronavirus has risen to 22,597 across the country, while the number of people affected has reached 975,092. During the last 24 hours, the most deaths occurred in Sindh followed by Punjab. Out of the 15 deaths in the last 24 hours, nine people died on ventilators

UAF inks MoU with Xinjiang Agricultural University

FAISALABAD: The University of Agriculture Faisalabad (UAF) and Xinjiang Agricultural University China inked a memorandum of understanding (MoU) for further strengthening educational and academic ties. Shopkeepers arrested over SOPs violation

PESHAWAR: The district administration Monday arrested 52 shopkeepers from various localities over violation of coronavirus preventive standard operating procedures (SOPs).

According to an official news release issued here on Monday, the officers of district administration conducted visits to various bazaars within their areas of jurisdiction and inspected the implementation of officially announced coronavirus SOPs.

The officers also inspected various bus stations. During inspection, they collectively arrested 52 shopkeepers over violation of Corona SOPs from different localities. Deputy Commissioner (DC) Khalid Mahmood has directed the trading community for implementation of officially announced SOPs in letter and spirit and action against the violators. - APP

Another five cases of corona reported

FAISALABAD: Another five cases of coronavirus were reported in the district during the last 24 hours.

According to the health department sources, 623 tests for coronavirus were conducted in public and private sector labs during the same period. He said that total active cases in Faisalabad were 137 while 20,470 patients so far recovered. He said that 339 beds were allocated at the Allied Hospital, 133 at the DHQ Hospital and 150 at Government General Hospital Ghulam Muhammad Abad for COVID-19 patients.

At present, 32 patients were under treatment at the Allied Hospital and 7 at DHQ Hospital. He further said that 84 confirmed patients were isolated at their homes in the district. - APP

Briefs KP to propose 13 mega projects during 10th Pak-China JČC

ISLAMABAD: As the 10th meeting of China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC)'s Joint Cooperation Committee (JCC) meeting is scheduled for July 16 via video link, the northwestern province of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa expects to receive a dozen development projects that may change the fate of the people of the region, according to Gwadar Pro.

Most of the projects aim to raise living standards in the less developed areas of the province. The Government of KP will present the mega projects during the JCC meeting, officials said.

The proposed projects include five transport infrastructure projects, three projects in industrial cooperand two projects in the agriculture sector.

There is a tourism project as a sub-working group under Industrial Cooperation JWG, according to official documents. Currently, work on two mega-projects under CPEC is in progress in KP. The projects are Rashakai Special Economic Zone (RSEZ) and Hakla D.I Khan Motorway (cost Rs. 122, 181 million).

Out of 13 proposed projects, if approved, four projects will be executed in the southern district of KP to uplift the once-deprived and backward parts of the province.

The proposed projects for southern KP include Special Economic Zone-Draband, D.I. Khan, which would be set up at 3,125 acres of land. The SEZ with an estimated cost of Rs. 4.312 billion, is ex-

512,000 jobs for the locals. The second important project in southern KP is the

365-kilometer Peshawar D.I

Khan Motorway. The motorway will connect the upper parts of KP with CPEC's western alignment Hakla-D.I Khan Motorway (M-14) in the southern part of the province. Chashma Right Bank lift cum gravity Canal (CRBC) is the third proposed project for southern KP. Besides creating jobs, this agriculture project will bring 286,000 acres of arid land under irrigation. Tank Zam Dam is a forth-proposed agriculture project in southern KP that would cultivate 70,000 acres of land. The project would be completed with an estimated cost of Rs. 18 billion in a five-year period. For upper districts of the province, the provincial gov-

feasibility of nine projects. Center of Excellence for Mohmand Marble City would be developed on 350 acres of land in Mohmand tribal district. The estimated cost to develop the city is Rs. 703.94 million that would create an estimated 14,000 jobs.

Kumrat Cable Car is a tourism project of tourism that would be developed under Industrial Cooperation JWG at Upper Dir. The length of the cable car is 14 kilometers with an estimated cost of Rs. 32 billion while the setting up of tourists' facilitation at Kumrat will cost Rs. 400,000. Toren More Kari HPP Chitral is an energy project that would cost Rs. 115.962 billion. It will produce 350MW electricity and it will be completed in an estimated time of 24 months

More HPP Chitral is the second hydel power project in Chitral that would be completed with an estimated cost of Rs. 94.864 billion. The 260 MW capacity project would be completed in two years. The 500 KV Transmission Line from Chitral to Chakdara is another energy project. The 225-kilometer-long transmission line between Chitral and Chakdara will be

Sports goods exports fall 1.06% in 11 months

ISLAMABAD: The exports of sports goods have witnessed a decrease of 1.06 percent during the first eleven months of fiscal year (2020-21) as compared to the exports of corresponding period of last year. Pakistan exported sports goods worth US \$241.270 during July-May (2020-21) against the exports of \$243.853 million during July-May (2019-20), showing a decline of 1.06 percent, according to the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS).

Among the sports goods, the exports of footballs decreased by 11.86 percent as it went down from \$133.163 million last year to \$117.372 million during the fiscal year under review while the gloves exports also declined by 9.11 percent by going down from US \$ 67.519 million last year to US \$61.365 million, the PBS data revealed.

However, the exports of all other sports goods witnessed an increase of 44.85 percent by growing from US \$43.171 million to US \$62.533 million. Meanwhile, year-on-year basis, the sports goods' export rose by 41.80 percent in May 2021 as compared to the export of the same month of last year.

The sports goods' export in May 2021 were recorded at \$19.557 million against exports of \$13.792 million in May 2020. During the period under review, the footballs and gloves exports also increased by 55.22 and 0.19 percent respectively in addition the exports of all other sports products rose by 80.36 percent. Meanwhile on month-on-month basis, the exports of sports goods however decreased by 33.84 percent during May 2021, as compared to the exports of \$29.561 million in April 2021, the PBS data revealed. - APP

> shown robust growth. The seafood exports during July-May (2020-21) were recorded at \$383.088 million against the exports of \$373.382 million in July-May (2019-20), showing growth of around 2.6 percent, according to the latest data of the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS).

The export to China takes up a great proportion. Ac-

cording to data from International Trade Center(ITC), Pakistan's exports of fish and aquatic products to China accounted for 29% of Pakistan's total exports of such products in 2019.

"7-8 different types of fish are mostly consumed in China. There is a Tianjin City where our Sole Fish is very popular. Pakistan's 70% Sole Fish is consumed in that city. There is also Ribbon Fish, cuttlefish, squid, octopus, and other items that are loved by Chinese people," said SuhailFirdous. Targeting this huge market, SuhailFirdous mentioned that "from a marketing point of view, it's very easy for the export as all we need to do is to prove the quality. In the case of Europe and America, we need many cer-

tifications and audits, and

we need to pass through a difficult phase before they accept us. Pakistan enjoyed zero

duties on exports of 724 products to China under phase one of the China-Pakistan Free Trade Agreement signed in 2006. After the second pact took effect in 2019, Pakistan

COVID-19 Cases; partial lockdown on cards in ICT

ISLAMABAD: Federal Capital is facing a surge in COVID-19 cases during last a few days which has prompted its local administration to adopt some remedial measures including possibilities of imposing partial lockdown during Eid-ul-Azha holidays to curb spread of deadly virus.

Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) administration has already sealed some areas in different localities under its smart lockdown strategy as positivity rate in the capital city has touched 5 per cent mark from less than one percent a few weeks ago. "People have been showing leniency in observing the anti-coronavirus standard operating procedures (SOPs)," said Deputy Commissioner Islamabad, Hamza Shafqaat on Monday. Talking to APP, he said if the situation remained same and spread of the Delta variant would continue to rise, it would left the administration with a little option, but to impose partial lockdown. With reports of Delta variant cases, he said the district administration had stepped up efforts and launched new safety measures to prevent its further spread. "We have started imposing smart lockdown in the areas from where the new patients of this variants reported to hospitals," he added. He said the ICT admin teams in collaboration with health authorities and others had so far sealed street 13 Qurtaba Town. Khanna, Street 18 G-11/2, Street 19 F-6/3, Street 24 G-7/2, Street 29 Block H, Soan Garden, Kips Academy PWD and Islamabad Model School for Boys F-8/3. The DC maintained that strict implementation of health guidelines were being ensured in restaurants, tourist spots and public transport, adding over 25 shops including restaurants with no vaccinated staff were sealed recently. He said vaccination certificates of people coming to restaurants and shopping malls were also being checked, besides imposing heavy fines to the SOPs violators. To a query, he said over 700,000 residents in the federal capital got Covid-19 jabs while vaccination process had been expedited to achieve the target of 1 million by August this year. Meanwhile, District Health Officer (DHO), Dr. Zaeem Zia, in a COVID-19 advisory said the citizens should observe all the SOPs regarding prevention of COVID-19 during the Eid days. "Citizens should avoid crowded places as much as possible," he said while recommending shopping and sale and purchase from only those Bazaars and cattle markets which had been observing precautionary measures in the letter and spirit. - APP

Govt. releases 100% petroleum sector funds

ISLAMABAD: The government has provided 100 per cent funds, amounting to Rs1, 339.589 million, allocated under the Public Sector Development Programme (PSDP 2020-21) to execute petroleum sector projects.

According to the official data that showed a slight readjustment in funds' allocation, an amount of Rs1, 339.589 million had been authorized in the last fiscal year, which stood 100 per cent of the total allocation for the timely and smooth execution of the projects. The projects against those

funds that have been released include Expansion and Up-gradation of Pakistan Petroleum Corehouse (PETCORE), Exploration and Evaluation of coal in Nosham and Bahlol areas of Balochistan, Supply of 13.5 Million Cubic Feet per Day (MMCFD) gas to Dhabeji Special Economic Zone. Supply of 30 MMCFD gas at the doorstep (Zero Point) of Rashakai Special Economic Zone Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Up-gradation of HDIP's POL testing facilities at Islamabad, Lahore, Multan, Peshawar, Quetta and ISO Certification of Petroleum Testing Laboratory at Islamabad, Geological Mapping of 50 Toposheets (out of 354 unmapped Toposheets) of outcrop area of Balochistan and Up-gradation and ISO certification of Karachi Laboratories Complex (KLC) at HDIP Operations Office, Karachi.

Now, one and a half months later, it has been made official that Pakistani entrepreneurs will receive the opportunity to market and sell their goods on Amazon, with the first Amazon Fulfilment and Facilitation Centre (AFFC) being set up in Multan in the coming few weeks.

That this can potentially be an amazing opportunity for Pakistanis cannot be understated. Amazon has a market of over 300 million users, with 90 million users being those who spend an average of \$1,300 per year on the platform. For Small & Medium Enterprises (SME), youth and women entrepreneurs, who are often disadvantaged not just by lack of funds, but also deprived of an accessible platform to market their small businesses, this can be a big boost and provide a sustainable livelihood. Not only could it prove a source of livelihood for a big segment of the population, like tech giants like Uber or YouTube, have been, it also encourages digitalisation, unique craft and new, easy ways of doing business.

The bitter truth

NCE again, sugar is compelling people to dig far deeper into their pockets than should be the case. The price of the vital commodity has risen to Rs110 in the open market, despite the Sugar Commission set up by the government last year to investigate the problem of rising sugar prices, and the orders given by the court to keep the price of sugar at Rs85 per kg for the month of Ramazan. Even during Ramazan the price of sugar rose further, with people having no alternative but to line up for hours in order to try and purchase what sugar they could at utility stores at the set price, or sometimes a little higher. The problem remains in place. Experts talk about cartels and the manner in which they have pushed up sugar prices. Currently even Utility Stores have been forced to buy sugar at far higher rates than the price set by the government and to sell it at just under Rs100 per kilo. In other words, the Sugar Commission, the court orders, the government's promises that price would be brought down and the assurance by the prime minister that his team had done the work necessary to manage this, have all come to nothing.

It is also relevant to note, while it is true that Mian Nawaz Sharif and Asif Zardari both own sugar mills, the profits made by mills show that it is mills owned by Jehangir Tareen and Khusro Bakhtiar that seem to have pocketed the largest benefits. Quite evidently, the policies of the government have failed. This amounts to an enormous case of mismanagement, which has placed immense pressure on the shoulders of people.

Since 2018, the dramatic rise in the price of sugar is both frightening and an indictment of the government. People are the main sufferers since this concerns a commodity households cannot do without. While sugar mill owners profit, people struggle to manage budgets just to purchase the sugar, the prices of which have not come down since Ramazan last year, and have far exceeded the price of Rs85 demanded by the court and also promised by the government.

Mockery of Law: Fictitious 'Uyghur Tribunal'

ROPAGANDA, lies, falsehood and myths; in so many forms and shapes. Unabated! One of the latest moves to purposefully but baselessly vilify China on the issue of Xinjiang and its Muslim Uygur population has unfolded in the form of the so-called 'Uyghur Tribunal.' It is becoming clear that desperate West would attempt to go to every length possible when it comes to defaming China that it [the West] otherwise fails to compete with. Hence, the moves such as unfunded allegations, unjustified sanctions and now this farce, i.e., 'Uyghur Tribunal.'

That they are forced to rely on an illegitimate platform to forward their agenda makes it clear that their stance, their stories, their much talked about evidence are not worthy of being presented in front of any proper, legitimate legal forum – domestic or international. So the anti-China forces are resorting to such a fictitious court and trial.

There is a method is this madness. The same faces who we see active on this fallacious activity have a history of anti-China moves. Their previous misadventure – the fallacious 'China Tribunal' created and run on the pretext of organ transplant practices – was nothing but a self-defeating failure. The fate of 'Uyghur Tribunal' would not different either. After being created in September 2020, the fictitious court held its first hearing early in June 2021 and next one is scheduled for September. Some 30 'victims', 'witnesses' and 'experts' appeared in the first hearing. Same faces, same stories. All these people have been saying this for years and years – without any solid, tangible proof that can be presented at a meaningful legal forum – and they themselves are aware that their case is fundamentally lacking in substance.

Xinjiang and its people continue to move on; the Uyghur Autonomous Region is progressing ahead witnessing all-en-

compassing, broad-based, harmonious development shared by all its inhabitants regardless of their ethnic background and/or religion. More importantly, China's effective, comprehensive and consistent anti-terror and de-radicalization policy has ensured peace and stability in the region. Xinjiang has not recorded an major untoward incident for a long time. The benefits of Xinjiang's stability and development are now also shared by regional countries as multi-pronged connectivity infrastructure is making this frontier of China a hub of the whole central Eurasian landscape. Continuous tricks and conspiracies from anti-China forces using the name of Xinjiang must be seen in this broader picture.

A large number of International Law experts are of the view that moves such as 'Uyghur Tribunal' having no overt backing from any state or any global institution enjoy no credibility and value. Any legal sanction of their findings and acts is certainly unthinkable.

It is no secret that this initiative is funded mainly by World Uyghur Congress (WUC), which itself is funded largely by the Open Society Foundation. When those running the 'tribunal' issued a call for crowd-funding; the lukewarm response they received was telling that the move has no backing among the majority of ordinary people either. Such steps are taken by and large for vested interests of so-called experts and activists who thrive professionally and make a name through such tactics.

The open and covert backers of the Uyghur Tribunal feel that as they have a person like Mr. Geoffrey Nice chairing the 'tribunal'; he and his findings may find acceptance among a large number of Muslims of the world because of the fact that Nice was prosecutor of Slobodan Milosevic. Yet, majority of the Muslims around the world are well-aware that the happenings in Balkans in 1990s and Xinjiang of today are in

no way comparable, much less to be treated similarly. Poles apart! Moreover, several questions are also being raised on the way the trial of Milosevic was conducted.

Other members, backers and experts involved in the 'Uyghur Tribunal' are also known anti-China figures whose propaganda and falsehood on Xinjiang, Hong Kong, human rights and issues such as organ transplant has been busted time and again. And importantly, the linkages of those driving such illegitimate initiative are also being traced towards Falun Gong – the banned, dangerous Chinese outfit. Had happened in any other nation or part of the world; these same countries would be lamenting the same as support for extremism and terrorism. Western societies should pay attention that what forces they actually are encouraging in this way.

Yet, while the move is not state-backed, important question is would the Western countries and societies allow similar moves for their deeds in Afghanistan, Iraq and previously their exploitations and cruelties all across the globe during colonization? What will be the value and legitimacy of such

moves in the eyes of people of Western nations? The Western countries and societies need to realize that such moves as 'Uyghur Tribunal' do no good to international system and order. Creating such fictitious bodies would not stop China from progressing and rising continuously; it will only sow the seeds of mistrust and damage much-required spirit of global cooperation. Every sane person in the world is well-aware that misadventures such as 'Uyghur Tribunal' have no legitimacy whatsoever and make no impact except exposing the intent and ill-will of those manoeuvring the same.

Will not let Afghan war hurt **Pakistan**

From Page 01 Shahzad Akbar in Islamabad this evening, he said the entire world is appreciating Pakistan's efforts for peace in Afghanistan. He said the government is pursuing the vision of Prime Minister Imran Khan that Pakistan will be a partner in peace, but not in the conflict.

Talking about political situation in the country and ongoing election campaign in Azad Jammu and Kashmir, Chaudhry Fawad Hussain said position of Pakistan Tehreeke-Insaf is very strong in AJK, which is evident with the fact that it has fielded candidates in all the constituencies. He said Pakistan People's Party is contesting elections on just eight seats, while Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz is also not sure about its future in Azad Kashmir.

In another tweet in continuation of the previous one, the information minister recalled that Prime Minister Imran Khan had already clarified that Pakistan could be partners with the US in peace, but not in conflict. He further stated: "Pakistan's land is not being used against Afghanistan and [we] hope that Afghanistan's territory, too, will not be used against Pakistan." Chaudhry added that the political and parliamentary leadership in Pakistan had agreed on the "principle of non-interference [in case of Afghani-

stan]". The information minister's remarks are the latest in a string of statements by Pakistani authorities regarding growing concerns over rising violence in Afghanistan and its expected fallout in Pakistan, with the US drawdown in the war-torn country now in its final stages.

China military 'drove away' US warship in S China Sea

BEIJING: China's military said it "drove away" a United States warship that it said illegally entered Chinese waters near the disputed Paracel Islands on Monday, the anniversary of a landmark international court ruling that Beijing has no claim over the South China Sea.

The USS Benfold entered the waters of the Paracels without the approval of the Chinese government, seriously violating China's sovereignty and undermining the stability of the South China Sea, the People's Liberation Army's Southern Theater

Command said. "We urge the United States to immediately stop such provocative

actions," the Southern Theater Command said in a statement. In a statement, the United States Navy 7th Fleet said the Benfold had "asserted navigational rights and freedoms in the vicinity of the Paracel Islands, consistent with international law" and dismissed Chinese claims of a serious violation of its sovereignty as "false" and a misrepresentation.

It stressed that all ships have the right of "innocent passage" under international law as reflected in the Convention on the Law of the Sea and permission is not required.

The operation reflects our commitment to uphold freedom of navigation and lawful uses of the sea as a principle," the statement said. "The United States will continue to fly, sail and operate wherever international law allows, as

The Paracels, called Xisha in China, are among hundreds of islands, reefs and atolls in the resource-rich South China Sea contested by China, Vietnam, Taiwan, the Philippines, Malaysia and Brunei, with Beijing claiming historic rights to everything within its socalled nine-dash line, which covers most of the region.

China took control of the Paracels, a chain of barren islands about 250 miles (400 kilometres east of Vietnam) and 220 miles (350 kilometres) southeast of Hainan Island, in the 1970s. They are also claimed by Vietnam, which calls them Hoang Sa, as well as Taiwan. All three countries require permission or advance notification before

does not accept the ruling and has continued to expand its South China Sea presence over the past five years. In a written statement on Sunday, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said freedom of the seas was an "enduring" interest of all nations. "Nowhere is the rules-based

maritime order under greater threat than in the South China

Sea," Blinken said. "The People's Republic of China continues to coerce and intimidate Southeast Asian coastal states, threatening freedom of navigation in this critical global throughway." He also repeated a warning to China that an attack on Philippine armed forces in the South China Sea would trigger a 1951 US-Philippines mutual defence treaty.

"We call on the PRC to abide by its obligations under international law, cease its provocative behavior, and take steps to reassure the international community that it is committed to the rules-based maritime order that respects the rights of all countries, big and small," he added.

Musk defends Tesla's SolarCity deal

NEW YORK: Tesla chief Elon Musk defended the electric car maker's controversial 2016 acquisition of SolarCity Monday at the start of a trial on whether the billionaire put his own interests ahead of investors.

Musk told a Delaware

court that he was not enriched by the Tesla-Solar-City deal and that he did not inappropriately pressure fellow board members to greenlight the transaction, according to CNBC. A group of Tesla shareholders contends that Musk, who was chairman of both Tesla and SolarCity at the time of the transaction, "poisoned" Tesla's ability to fairly evaluate the purchase, wasting corporate assets in the \$2.6 billion deal and harming shareholders, according to a complaint.

The group of investors, which includes union pension funds and other institutional investors, argues that SolarCity was a failing enterprise that faced "likely bankruptcy" were it not for the actions of Musk and other Tesla board members, who also had large equity stakes in SolarCity. The plaintiffs contend Tesla's board breached their fiduciary duty to Tesla shareholders. They are seeking unspecified monetary relief in the complaint. - APP

Pfizer to meet US officials over vaccine booster

WASHINGTON: Pfizer says it plans to meet with top United States health officials on Monday to discuss the drugmaker's request for federal authorisation of a third dose of its COVID-19 vaccine, as President Joe Biden's chief medical adviser Anthony Fauci acknowledged that "it is entirely conceivable, maybe likely" that booster shots will be needed. The company said it was scheduled to have the meeting with the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and other officials on Monday, days after Pfizer asserted that booster shots would be needed within 12 months. Pfizer's Dr Mikael Dolsten told The Associated Press

last week that early data from the company's booster study suggests people's antibody levels jump five to 10-fold after a third dose, compared with their second dose months earlier - evidence it believes supports the need for a booster. On Sunday, Fauci did not rule out the possibility but said it

was too soon for the government to recommend another shot. He said the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the FDA did the right thing last week by pushing back against Pfizer's assertion with their statement that they did not view booster shots as necessary

Sydney anticipates extended lockdown

SYDNEY: Australia's largest city, Sydney, is expected to prolong its lockdown restrictions as cases spike.

Sydney is located in the state of New South Wales, which recorded 112 new coronavirus cases on Monday, the largest daily rise this year.

New South Wales Premier Gladys Berejiklian said Sunday she believes cases will continue to rise, and signaled the state may extend its lockdown beyond the current end date of July 16.

Residents of New South Wales are not allowed to leave their homes except for shopping for food or other essential goods and services. Residents can also leave their homes if they have medical appointments,

among other exceptions. Australia reported its first death of the year on Sunday from the virus. The woman who died of the illness was

in her 90s. Taiwan may soon receive 10 million doses of the BioN-Tech-Pfizer vaccine.

EU puts digital tax plan 'on hold'

BRUSSELS: The European Union's plans to unveil a new digital tax plan later this month have now been delayed, a European Commission spokesperson said on Monday.

"We have decided to put on hold our work on our new digital levy as a new EU own resource," EU commission spokesman Daniel Ferrie told reporters in Brussels. The move follows intense lobbying by the United States for the 27-member bloc to drop the levy amid fears that it will largely affect the country's tech giants.

US Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen said a draft OECD/G20 deal on a minimum global corporate tax rate of 15% includes an agreement "to dismantle existing digital taxes that the United States has regarded as discriminatory and to refrain from erecting similar

measures in the future." "So it's really up to the European Commission and the members of the European Union to decide how to proceed," she said on Sunday.

AMMAN: A Jordanian court has sentenced a former royal aide and a minor royal to 15 years in jail on charges of attempting to destabilise the monarchy.

Bassem Awadallah, who has United States citizenship and once served as a top aide to King Abdullah II, and Sharif Hassan bin Zaid, a member of the royal family, were found guilty of sedition and incitement charges on Monday.

The court said it had confirmed evidence backing the charges against the pair and that they had been determined to harm the monarchy by pushing former heir to the throne Prince Hamzah as an alternative to the king. Bin Zaid was sentenced to another year in prison and 1,000 dinars (\$1,400) for drug abuse, Petra news agency reported. The charges have exposed

rifts within the ruling Hashemite family that has been a beacon of stability in a volatile region in recent years. Awadallah, a former finance minister who was a driving force behind Jordan's liberal economic reforms, was charged with agitating to undermine the political system and committing acts that threaten public security and sowing sedition.

Tokyo enters 4th COVID-19 state of emergency

TOKYO: Tokyo begins its fourth state of emergency on Monday to contain a resurgence in COVID-19 infections, local media reported Monday.

Katsunobu Kato, the Chief Cabinet Secretary, said that the state of emergency was to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 from Tokyo during the summer break and Bon holiday period.

"We ask the people for their understanding and cooperation as the declaration this round is to make sure we prevent the nationwide explosion of infections until vaccination progresses," Kato said at a regular press conference. The fourth state of emergency in Tokyo, lasting until Aug. 22, will cover the duration of the Tokyo Olympics.

Some people expressed fear over an increase in infections in Japan even with the new state of emergency in place, "It is natural to have the games with no spectators, but I believe it would surely increase the flow of people. I'm worried that it could lead to a further rise in the number of infections," Toshihiro Numata, a worker in the city of Yokohama, told local media.

Bars and restaurants under the state of emergency are requested not to serve alcohol and are obliged to close by 8:00 p.m local time. - APP

Nepal's Supreme Court reinstates parliament

KATMANDU: Nepal's Supreme Court has reinstated its parliament, which was dissolved by caretaker Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli in May, and ordered that his rival Sher Bahadur Deuba be appointed as prime minister.

The move on Monday deals a major blow to Oli, who was unable to muster a majority in the House of Representatives and had sought to force a fresh election by dissolving parliament on May 22.

Oli's move had sparked a fresh constitutional crisis in the Himalayan nation and it marked his second attempt to dissolve parliament in recent months after an initial attempt in December 2020, following a split in his party, was reversed by the Supreme Court in February.

After Nepal's parliament had been reconstituted, Oli lost a confidence vote on May 10. Before his rivals could stake a claim, however, he advised Nepal's President Bidya Devi Bhandari to dissolve parliament, saying neither he nor opposition leader Deuba were able to muster a majority and form a new government. On Monday, Supreme Court official Debendra Dhakal said the court had ordered parliament be reconvened within seven days.

"It has also ordered that Sher Bahadur Deuba be appointed as prime minister within two days," Dhakal told Reuters news agency.

Instructions were also given to take measures to attract domestic entrepreneurs, manufacturers and exporters to participate in the planned events and to assist them in reaching appropriate agreements with potential partners from Pakistan.

The heads of commercial banks were instructed to work out opportunities for establishing direct interaction with Pakistani colleagues in order to develop specific proposals for cooperation.

NAB seeks reference against Abdul Hafeez Shaikh

KARACHI: The National Accountability Bureau's (NAB) Karachi office has requested to file a reference against former finance minister Abdul Hafeez, a spokesperson for the anti-graft watchdog said Monday.

The spokesperson said NAB Karachi's Regional Board meeting has sent requests to the central office for filing two references and decided to start proceedings in several cases.

Hafeez Shaikh - who left the ministry a few months back - and two former chairmen of the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR), Abdullah Yousuf and Salman Siggiuge, have incurred losses worth \$11 million to the national exchequer, the spokesperson said.

The board also allowed an inquiry against former deputy commissioner West Fayyaz Solangi on corruption charges, the NAB spokesperson added. Shaikh's exit as from the ministry marked the third time Prime Minister Imran Khan had changed his finance minister in the two and half years since coming to power.

Nawaz becomes 'Altaf Hussain II': Farrukh

ISLAMABAD: Minister of State for Information and Broadcasting Farrukh Habib on Monday said Chief Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) Nawaz Sharif had become 'Altaf Hussain II' (banned MQM-London founder) for saving his money amassed through corrupt practices.

In a tweet, he said Nawaz Sharif narrative's mainstay was to plunder national wealth after coming into the power, whereas corruption and money laundering were their (Sharif family) identity. He regarded PML-N Vice President Maryam Safdar as a 'certified liar' and said there was no difference between narrative of her father Nawaz Sharif and Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Kulbhushan Jadhav's arrest in Pakistan was enough to hush them up, he said. To appease Modi, he said Nawaz Sharif, being Prime Minister of Pakistan, abstained from meeting the Kashmiri Huriyat leaders when he went India to attend his oath taking ceremony, and preferred to have an audience with Indian Bollywood actors.

Anti-poverty goals: Munir calls for action

NEW YORK: The UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) President, Pakistani Ambassador Munir Akram, Monday called for "concrete actions" at all levels to advance the 2030 global development agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

"We need the ambition and concrete actions on the ground especially at the local and sub-national level, and for the United Nations, governments and private sector to work together with the local, national and the sub-national governments in the differ ent contexts and levels," he told the fourth edition of the High-Level Local and Regional Governments Forum.

The event is being held in connection with the ongoing high-level political forum on development sustainable (HLPF) under the auspices of ECOSOC. The ECOSOC chief said the nations and people of the world are currently facing the greatest socio-economic and development challenge since the creation of the United Nations stemming from the devastating coronavirus pandemic. - APP



UAE to launch digital currency within 5 years

DUBAI: The United Arab Emirates will launch its first digital currency by 2026, the central bank of the oil-rich Gulf state, which serves as the region's finan-

cial hub, said Monday. Several central banks around the world have recently announced similar plans, while criticising decentralised cryptocurrencies like bitcoin.

The Emirates central bank said its plans include "issuing a digital currency and driving digital transformation in the UAE's financial services sector, by utilising the latest artificial intelligence and big data solutions.'

The announcement is part of its "2023-2026 strategy" which aims to "position it among the world's top 10 central banks", it said according to state media.

In 2019, Saudi Arabia and the UAE announced a test phase of a common cryptocurrency for cross-border

Dr Sultan said the main cause of this surge is violation of SOPs and the new variant of coronavirus coming from India.

KSA allows entry to Pakistanis inoculated with Chinese vaccine

RIYADH: Saudi Arabia has allowed Pakistanis inoculated with Chinese vaccine against the coronavirus (COV-ID-19) to enter the Kingdom. However, authorities said, they will have to get a booster shot of Covid-19 vaccine recommended by Saudi Arabia upon arrival in the Kingdom. Beside two doses of Chinese vaccine, Pakistani nationals will be required to get a booster shot, the authorities said, adding the condition of a negative PCR test for all such travelers also remains in place.

The Kingdom has approved four Covid vaccines, including Pfizer, AstraZeneca, Moderna and Johnson and Johnson for emergency use. Earlier, the Kingdom had issued a list of recommended vaccines, which does not include vaccines manufactured in China. Most Pakistanis are being inoculated with Chinese vaccines, including Sinopharm, Sinovac and single-dose CanSino. – DNA


