Umar, who is also the NCOC chief, said that after reviewing the COVID-19 situation in the country in detail, the forum has decided to lift all coronavirus restrictions, including protocols for indoor dining, indoor wedding events and markets, sports activities and all the other SOPs across Pakistan. Russia, Ukraine seek compromise in talks

Ukraine's President said the talks were becoming "more realistic"

KYIV/LVIV: Russia and Ukraine for compromise on Wednesday as peace talks were set to resume three weeks into a Russian assault that has so far failed to topple the Ukrainian government.

Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskiy said the talks were becoming "more realistic", while Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov said there was "some hope for compromise", with neutral status for Ukraine - a major Russian demand - now on the table.

The Kremlin said the sides were discussing status for Ukraine similar to that of Austria or Sweden, members of the European Union that are outside the NATO military alliance. Three weeks into the invasion, Russian troops have been halted at the gates of Kyiv, having taken heavy losses and failed to seize any of Ukraine's biggest cities in a war Western officials say Moscow thought it would win within days. Ukrainian officials have expressed hope this week that the war could end sooner than expected - even within weeks - as Moscow was coming to terms with a lack of

fresh troops to keep fighting. Talks were due to resume on Wednesday by video link for what would be a third straight day, the first time they have lasted more than a single day, which both sides have suggested means they have entered a more serious phase.

ISLAMABAD: Ambassador of France Nicolas Galey hosted a reception to celebrate the International Day Francophone event, at the French residence. Diplomats hailing from the French speaking countries attended the reception. Ambassador Galey delivered a short speech as well in which he welcomed the guests shed light on the importance of the day. It may be mentioned here that the Francophone area is made up of many countries. There are 300 million French speakers in 33 countries across the globe, a number that has increased by 9.6% since the last census in 2014. However, the Francophone area, as a political community, brings together 88 countries and associate, observer and member governments of the International Organisation of La Francophonie. French is the fifth most-spoken language in the world, behind Mandarin Chinese, English, Spanish and Arabic, The largest five Francophone countries population-wise are the Democratic Republic of the Congo, France, Algeria, Morocco and Côte d'Ivoire.

French is the second most-used language in diplomacy. Multilateral Francophonie, which celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2020, is an institutional

structure aiming to bring together Francophone countries in a political community. It organizes its relations between full member or associated States and Governments, which share a language, French, and motivated by the founding

Francophonie (AUF), TV5MONDE, the International Association of Francophone Mayors (AIMF) and Senghor University; The Parliamentary Assembly of La Francophonie (APF); The 16 institutional networks of La rial conferences (CONFEJES, CONFE-MEN); The Conference of INGOs of La This multilateral Francophonie con-

tributes to peace, democracy, human rights, the promotion of the French language and cultural diversity as well as the development of shared and lasting prosperity.

In 2018, at the Yerevan Summit, Louise Mushikiwabo was appointed as the new Secretary-General of La Francophonie. In her first speech, she stated her intention to place La Francophonie under the theme of living together, insisting that the OIF's action refocus on the areas "in which its added value is real. where its added value is recognized, where its action is expected", particularly the dissemination of the French language, defence of gender equality, development of digital technology and commitment to young people.

For International Francophonie Day, on 20 March 2019, Emmanuel Macron visited OIF headquarters in Paris for the first time and met with Louise Mushikiwabo, reaffirming France's commitment to multilateral Francophonie.

France is the leading contributor to the

OIF and its agencies, which reflects how important La Francophonie is as a vehicle for our diplomacy.

Freedom of expression situation in IOK worsens

ISLAMABAD: Speakers at a webinar hosted by Kashmir Institute of International Relations (KIIR) in collaboration with World Muslim Congress (WMC) have voiced grave concerns over the criminalization of dissent by Modi's racist regime in the Indian occupied territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

The webinar titled "Criminalization of freedom of expression in IoK " was held on the sidelines of 49th session of the UNHRC. Panelists hailing from different parts of the world including Ms. Mary Scully, Robert Fantina author and journalist, Barrister Tanvir Munim, Sheni Hamid, Advocate Nasir Qadri, , Ms Naila Altaf Kiyani, Prof. Dr. Shugufta Ashraf, and others, said a press release here on Wednesday. Whereas the event was moderated by the KIIR Chairman Altaf Hussain

Wani. In his initial remarks, the KIIR chief said that the right to freedom of peaceful expression was a fundamental human right of every human being. He said that this inalienable right has been enshrined in article 19 of the UN human rights bill. Along with freedom of expression, Wani said that a raft of other international treaties guarantees the right to freedom of peaceful assembly, freedom of right to expression, and opinion. These fundamental freedoms he said were central for living in an open and free society, in which people can access justice and other judicial remedies. Defending these rights, he said, have been a core part of the HR organizations. "Ironically, in today's Kashmir these essential freedoms remain largely suspended and virtually non-existent", he said. - APP

Covid claims 2 more lives, 12 new infections

RAWALPINDI, Mar 16 (APP):As many as 12 more people were tested positive for fatal coronavirus during the last 24 hours, raising the tally of confirmed cases to 46,418 in the Rawalpindi district, while two persons had lost their battle of life against the deadly disease. Pakistan earns \$1486 mln from IT services' export

ISLAMABAD: earned US \$1,486.890 million by providing different Information Technology (IT) services in various countries during the first seven months of financial year 2021-22. This shows growth of 32.63 percent as compared to US \$1,121.105 million earned through provision of services during the corresponding period of fiscal year 2020-21, Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) reported.

During July-January (2021-22), the export of computer services grew by 33.77 percent as it surged from US \$890.065 million last fiscal year to US \$1,190.600 million this year. Among the computer services, the exports of software consultancy services witnessed an increase of 44.61 percent, from US \$297.560 million to US \$430.309 million while the exports of hardware consultancy services also rose by 284.42 percent from, US \$0.353 million to US \$1.357 million.

The export and import of computer software related services also rose by 42.27 percent, from US \$218.898 million to US \$311.431 million whereas the exports of repair and maintenance services surge to \$0.770 million from \$0.299 million. In addition, the exports of other computer services increased by 19.78 percent going up from US\$ 372.955 million to US \$446.733 million. Meanwhile, the export of information services during the period under review increased by 29.05 percent by going up from US \$2.410 million to US \$3.110 million. Among the information services, the exports of news agency services increased by 61.57 percent, from US \$ 1.270 million to US \$2.052 million whereas the exports of other information services however decreased by 7.19 percent, from US \$1.140 million to US \$1.058 million. – **APP**

IHC declares LG Ord as void

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Wednesday terminated the Local Government Ordinance 2021 while declaring it as null and void.

Justice Mohsin Akhter Kayani announced the verdict which was reserved previously after listening arguments from all respondents. The petitions were filed by the Capital Development Authority (CDA)'s Mazdoor Union, Officers Association and ex-chairman of UC Sardar Mehtab challeng ing the ordinance.

The court stopped the local body elections in Islamabad and said that it couldn't be conducted under this ordi nance. The court instructed the authority to convene the elections under Local Government Act 2015.

It may be mentioned here that the petitioners had challenged the ordinance in presence of the LG act. The lawyers had adopted the stance that the Parliament's session was prorogued on November 19, while the ordinance was issued on November 23. The petitioners had also objected over limiting the role of chairman through the new law. - APP

Another king maker in the given circumstances happens to be the Balochistan Awami Party (BAP), that too is negotiating its terms of conditions with the opposition parties in order to be the part of the anti-govt alliance. The PMLQ, BAP and MQM are generally considered as the pro-establishment parties and will switch over to either govt or opposition alliances after getting nod from the establishment.

The Prime Minister must be spending sleepless nights these days as he has hitherto failed to secure a clear support even from his allied parties. A state of uncertainty continues to grip the country. The economic woes are multiplying. Price hike is taking a heavy toll on people. Stock exchange continues its downward slide thus badly shaking the confidence of the investors. It is still unclear as to how the new government will cope with the deteriorating economic situation because so far we have not heard anything from them.

CIA torture

WENTY years ago, in the wake of the September 11 terror attacks, the CIA established an international torture programme "rendering" people to secret detention facilities around the world. The full horror of what took place in these black sites is still emerging. We already know of mock executions and sexual violence; of a detainee waterboarded 83 times in a month; of a man dying during an interrogation and another of hypothermia after being left almost naked on a bare concrete floor – on top of the regular use of pain, humiliation and sleep deprivation. This week, we learned that Ammar al-Baluchi suffered brain damage when he was repeatedly slammed against a plywood wall by trainee interrogators using him as a teaching prop. They queued up to hit his head so that the instructor "could certify them on their ability to use the technique".

The details emerged in a damning report written by the CIA's own inspector general in 2008, but only now released following a court filing. The "war on terror" became an end that was used to justify any means – but never openly. Torture was rebranded as "enhanced interrogation techniques". Interrogators sought assurances that a detainee would "remain in isolation and incommunicado for the remainder of his life" before they started work. The programme was pointless as well as brutal. The inspector general noted that the detainee lied to make the torture stop – in line with the 2014 Senate intelligence committee report that found that interrogations frequently produced false testimony (while non-coercive methods elicited useful information). At least 26 of 119 detainees were wrongly held in the first place.

Mr Baluchi now faces the death penalty as one of five men at Guantanamo Bay charged with participation in the September 11 plot. The case has been in pre-trial hearings for 10 years, largely due to disputes over the admissibility of testimony obtained after torture. Last week, another Guantanamo detainee – Mohammad Ahmad al-Qahtani, who was suspected of planning to join the plot – was repatriated to Saudi Arabia for mental health treatment. The US dropped plans to try him after concluding he had been tortured at the facility.

This is not only about an injustice to individuals. The rapporteur suggests that the refusal to acknowledge what happened has helped create an environment in which there appears to be impunity for states conducting mass secret detention. An honest reckoning would help to debunk the dangerous myth that torture works and claims that national security requires unfettered powers used in secrecy. It is an essential part of ensuring such crimes are not committed again.

Ukraine may force Mid East rivals to upgrade their toolkit

TRUGGLING to remain on the sidelines of the 21st century's watershed war in Ukraine, Middle Eastern nations are discovering that they may be fighting their battles with an outdated toolkit.

As a result, the Ukraine war could saw off the legs from under the table of Middle Eastern détente that already are built on shaky ground. For the past 18 months, Middle Eastern rivals – Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Turkey, Iran, and Israel – have sought to hedge their bets by diversifying their relationships with major powers, the United States, China, and/or Russia.

Increasingly, the rivals are finding out that the Ukraine conflict threatens to narrow their ability to hedge. The conflict has, irrespective of the outcome of the war, reduced not only big power competition to a two-rather than three-horse race but also opened the door to a Cold War-style international relations based on the principle of 'you are with us or against us.'

Even if portraying the Ukraine conflict as a showdown in a titanic battle between democracy and autocracy may be misleading and/or overstated, it does not distract from the fact that the war has shaken, if not undermined, a major pillar of autocracy, Russia.

Even so, Saudi Arabia, the UAE, and Israel may privately welcome potential Russian sabotage of negotiations in Vienna to revive the 2015 Iranian nuclear agreement, given that they view it as deeply flawed. Middle Eastern states may also find that the sabotage is one of Moscow's last hurrahs as it is hit by harsh Western sanctions and drawn into what is likely to be an all-consuming quagmire. As fears grew of a Russian monkey wrench, Iranian Spiritual Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei defended Iran's support of militias in various Arab countries, including the Houthis in Yemen who have been firing missiles and drones at targets in the two countries. On Thursday, a Houthi drone attacked a refinery in Riyadh, causing a small fire.

"Our presence in regional issues is our strategic depth... (It's) a means of power," Mr. Khamenei told Iran's Council of Experts that includes the country's most powerful clerics. Turkey and Israel have so far been able to package their hedge by exploiting their close ties to both Russia and Ukraine to play the role of mediator even if mediation at this stage of the war has little if any chance of success.

By contrast, Saudi Arabia and the UAE find themselves far more exposed and in the ironic position of sharing a boat with their nemeses, Iran and its Lebanese ally, Hezbollah, as they maneuver in a geopolitical minefield. Like the conservative Gulf states, Iran too has sought to remain on the sidelines of the Ukraine conflict. More fundamentally, the conflict could upset the house of cards on which Middle Eastern détente is built. The driving principle of that détente is to kick the can down the road on significant disagreements over issues, including political Islam and Palestine in favour of closer economic, and in the case of Israel, the UAE, Saudi Arabia, and potentially Qatar, closer se-

curity cooperation.

This week, Israel Defense Forces chief Aviv Kohavi reportedly discussed military cooperation with his Qatari counterpart, Salem bin Hamad bin Mohammed bin Aqeel Al-Nabi, during an official visit to Bahrain. Unlike Bahrain and the UAE, Qatar has refused to formalize its informal relations with Israel as long as there is no settlement of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. The Russian invasion of Ukraine resonates among the Gulf's smaller states, three of which know first-hand what bullying by larger neighbours in violation of international law means.

Iran has occupied three Emirati islands in the Gulf since 1971. Iraq invaded Kuwait in 1990 while fears of a military intervention accompanied a 3.5 year-long Saudi-UAE-led economic and diplomatic boycott of Qatar.

This week, Washington Post columnist Farid Zakaria argued that the Ukraine conflict has ushered in a new era "marked by the triumph of politics over economics. For the past three decades, most countries have acted with one lodestar in mind: economic growth. They have embraced trade, technology, and domestic reforms, all to produce more growth. Those kinds of choices are possible in an atmosphere in which one does not have to worry that much about the core issue of national security."

Emirati officials insisted that the two statements were not contradictory. They said the UAE favoured a production increase but was bound by OPEC+ agreements. OPEC+ is scheduled to meet on March 31. The manoeuvre was partly an Emirati effort to cover the country's flank and partly a demonstration of the UAE's ability to help reduce prices. Oil prices dropped 13 per cent after Mr. Al-Otaiba's remarks. The influx of Russians looking for places to safely park their money and assets; leaks about real estate holding of oligarchs in Dubai, including ones belonging to now sanctioned individuals; stepped-up private aircraft traffic between Moscow and Dubai, and the sighting of Russian-owned superyachts off the UAE coast could not come at a worse time. Earlier this month, the Financial Action Task Force, a Paris-based international anti-money laundering and anti-terrorism finance watchdog, grey listed the UAE for lagging in identifying illicit funds flowing into the country. The listing that groups the UAE alongside 22 others, including Pakistan, Syria, South Sudan, Yemen, and Myanmar, dealt a blow to the country's image as a go-to global financial hub

"What separates Dubai from other traditional havens for dirty money is the amazing secrecy. As a fugitive in Dubai, you can snatch up property, stash your yachts and set up bank accounts with very few obstacles. It's also one of the few autocracies that's a destination — rather than a transit location — for illicit flows," said Jodi Vittori, who co-authored a study of Dubai's financial flows.

No-trust motion and political uncertainty in Pakistan

ECENT developments in Pakistan's polity have shown that the country's opposition parties have a consensus to oust Prime Minister Imran Khan from his office. Political parties with the least seats in National Assembly are claiming a more detrimental role. PDM Head, MaulanaFazlRehman, claims that PDM is trying to save Pakistan from

an inevitable disaster. Federal Ministers frequently appear on the different TV channels and assert that opposition would be unsuccessful in bringing 172 members into the National Assembly. However, there are some fundamental reasons to believe that this political onslaught and uncertainty would harm the country's democracy, economy, institutional development, and foreign policy. Firstly, focusing on democracy and institu-

tional development, one needs to be understood that democracy has to do more with political stability and institutions. Pakistan has spent more than 65 years in uncertainty & instability where governments came and gone in a disorganized way. No single Prime Minister could ever complete its term. This uncertainty, undoubtedly, hampers the working of Prime Ministers and the institutions within the country. Because when a public office holder is unsure about its term, he would always keep relying on some forces that help him be in power. Institutions also needed a certain amount of time to evolve and appear more substantial. Changing regimes and uncertainties do affect them. They do affect their delivery more practically. RanmaliAbeyasinghe has exemplified the relationship of democracy with sustainability and political development. The author has argued that political stability leads to institutional development and this relationship is quite interesting. Additionally, such political uncertainties and asymmetry between political forces have immense impacts on the country's foreign policy and economy. Whenever there are political upheavals, the country's economy becomes more vulnerable. ZahidHussain has noted that political stability and economy are deeply interconnected. He has argued that political unrest reduces investment and pace on the one hand and increases competition among different organs of the government on the other. The example of Vietnam is interesting in this context by considering its journey from a promising economy to distress. And this transition was the result of prolonged political unrest.

PMIK's performance can be evaluated at multiple stages. One can criticize the current government for its inefficiency or failure in sustaining the economy. But a careful examination is needed before reaching a conclusion about the factors which destabilize a country's political and economic fabric. Such political uncertainties frequently pave the way for civilian and non-civilian elites to come, intervene and claim their political space. When a country's political system is stable and governments are completing its terms, it gives much-needed strength and power to the institutions of that specific country. It invites foreign investors to come and invest.

"But at the end I think I made the right decision in right time, in right moments of the match." She said Kerber showed her a different game than she'd expected after practising with the German.

"I felt like she wanted to use her experience and kind of trick me," Swiatek said.

Swiatek next faces American Madison Keys, who beat British qualifier Harriet Dart 6-1, 6-4.

Former world number one Simona Halep of Romania, seeded 24th, swept into the quarter-finals with a 6-1, 6-4 victory over 26th-seeded compatriot Sorana Cirstea.

Halep, a two-time Grand Slam champion is in the quarters for the fifth time at Indian Wells, where she lifted the trophy in 2015. Halep will play Petra Martic for a place in the semi-finals.

Croatia's Martic beat Liudmila Samsonova 7-6 (8/6), 6-4. Sixth-seeded Maria Sakkari of Greece advanced with a victory over Australian qualifier Daria Saville, who was trailing 4-1 when she retired with a left thigh injury.

Babar continues to break numerous records

most runs by a Pakistani batter in the fourth innings. He crossed Younis Khan, who made 171* against Sri Lanka in 2015. The right-handed batsman is set to score his maiden double ton in pursuit of a record chase of 506.

Novak Djokovic expected to defend French Open title

PARIS: French Open organisers said on Wednesday that Novak Diokovic is allowed to defend his title as the tournament prepares to stage what is expected to be the first Grand Slam without any COVID-19 related restrictions since the pandemic broke two years ago. France has lifted restrictions in almost all public spac-

es - except hospitals, nursing homes and public transports - on Monday, meaning the Roland Garros stadium should be operating at full capacity with Djokovic taking it to the red dirt courts. "As things stand, nothing stands in the way of Djokovic taking part in the French Open," tournament director Amelie Mauresmo told a news conference on Wednesday. The 20-time Grand Slam winner was unable to defend his Australian Open title in January after being deported from the country in a furore after being initially admitted to the tournament despite not being vaccinated against coronavirus. The 34-year-old is also out of this month's ATP 1000 tournaments at Indian Wells and Miami, unable to enter the United States without a proof of vaccination.

While that is not required to enter France or any sporting event in the country, French tennis federation (FFT) president Gilles Moretton warned that things could change before the tournament starts on May 22. - Web Desk

Atletico eliminate Man Utd in Champions League last 16

LONDON: Atletico Madrid knocked Manchester United out of the UEFA Champions League, beating the English club 1-0 in a round of 16 second leg match Tuesday.

Brazilian defender Renan Lodi scored the winning goal for Atletico Madrid with a header in the 41st minute at Manchester's Old Trafford stadium. Thanks to his goal, the visitors bagged the quarterfinals ticket. The first leg held at Madrid's Wanda Metropolitano Stadium on Feb. 23 ended 1-1, so after their latest victory, Atletico Madrid won 2-1 on aggregate. Following the home loss, Manchester United's journey in Europe is over for the 2021-22 season.

Manchester United's title drought continues as the Red Devils have not won any trophies since 2017, when they were the champions in the second-tier UEFA Europa League. Separately, Portugal's Benfica also reserved their place in the Champions League quarterfinals.

Benfica's Uruguayan forward Darwin Nunez scored against Ajax in the 77th minute to secure a 1-0 win for the Lisbon club in Amsterdam. In this way, Benfica won 3-2 on aggregate to reach the last eight in Europe's top-tier club tournament. Ajax have been eliminated and will now focus on the



Dutch league.

Atletico Madrid, Bayern Munich, Benfica, Liverpool, Manchester City and Real Madrid were confirmed for the guarterfinalists. Two other clubs will join these six teams after Wednesday's matches. The quarterfinals draw will be held on March 18 in Nyon, Switzerland.

The 2022 Champions League final will be played at the Stade de France in Saint-Denis on May 28.

ANKARA: Turkey has displayed a clear stance in the Russia-Ukraine crisis from the very beginning and has distinctly demonstrated its balanced, objective and fair approach that favors law and justice, Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoglu said Wednesday. Ahead of his meeting with his Russian counterpart Sergev Lavrov in Moscow. the foreign minister said: "As a country with good relations with both sides (Russia and Ukraine), we continued our role as an honest mediator and facilitator despite all the difficulties.'

During a joint press conference after the talks, Çavuşoglu also said: "We have had a clear stance since the beginning of the Russia-Ukraine war. We have done what we can to open room for diplomacy. We are putting efforts into achieving a humanitarian and

permanent cease-fire. "We will continue to increase our efforts prioritizing diplomacy in this process. Without the trust of Russia and Ukraine, we would not have been able to carry out

these efforts adequately." Turkey's priority is the evacuation of its na-

tionals and civilians from the Ukrainian city of Mariupol, he underlined, calling for an "urgent" humanitarian cease-fire. The minister added that President Recep

Tayyip Erdogan may hold discussions with his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin soon to talk about the issue.

Çavuşoglu also expressed his hope that the Russian and Ukrainian leaders will meet soon and reach a permanent cease-fire to

Lavrov said that Turkey has been following a pragmatic line with a balanced approach. "We have some differences of opinion regarding Ukraine. However, Turkey's balanced stance is very valuable to us," he said. He also added that Moscow values Ankara's responsible approach to the implementa-

tion of the Montreux Convention. Earlier in the day, Lavrov said that Mos-



and Israel to resolve the crisis in Ukraine positively. Speaking in an interview with the Russian channel RBC TV. Lavrov mentioned his lat-

Baku detains suspect spying for Armenia

BAKU: Azerbaijan's State Security Service (SSS) has detained a suspect engaged in anti-Azerbaijan collaboration with Armenia, the service reported on March 16. An Azerbaijani citizen, Mammadov Emil (41), was detained as part of the initiated criminal case, the report added. Grounds for suspicion have been established as a result of the State Security Service's investigation into Mammadov's secret cooperation with Armenian special services on the territory of a third country in exchange for financial interest in order to aid them in carrying out duties that threaten Azerbaijan's sovereignty, territorial integrity, state security, and defense capabilities, the service said.

Furthermore, substantial suspicions were established that he had been instructed to collect information that could be used against state security, to act in accordance with the given instructions, and to comply with the confidentiality and conspiracy requirements with the Armenian special services. - Agencies

Belarusian volunteers head to Kyiv to fight Russia

LVIV: Foreign fighters from Belarus departed on Wednesday on their way to the Ukrainian capital Kyiv from the city of Lviv further west to fight in the ongoing war against Russia.

"We'll fight for the independence of Ukraine. Because, we know very well that if Ukraine isn't independent, Belarus won't be independent in the future,' said PavelKulazhanka, who is heading the group. Kulazhanka emphasized

that, unlike Belarusian President AleksanderLukashenko, they would stand with the Ukrainians. Donning their fatigues and weapons, the 20 fighters who came to the train station in Lviv said they were ready to fulfill the tasks the Ukrainian army would give them.- Agencies

Australia must prepare for Russian retaliation

CANBERRA: The Australian defense minister on Wednesday said his country is providing Ukraine with lethal weapons to defend itself from Russian attacks, and should therefore be prepared for Moscow's retaliation.

64 dams out of 100 completed in Baluchistan

First Fire of Bin Qasim Power Station 3 900MW Unit-1 launched

ISLAMABAD: 64 out of 100 dams have been completed so far in Balochistan while 36 are under construction, Gwadar Pro reported on Wednesday. The Government is sponsoring construction of these 100 dams in Baluchistan. The project has been prioritized and divided into 5 packages.

Package-I of the project comprising 20 dams was launched in June 2009. The project amounting Rs.2.154 billion was successfully completed in June 2015. The dams can save up to 44,438

Acre ft of water whereas can construction of 100 dams irrigate 25,850 acres of land. Package-II, comprising of 26 dams was completed in December 2019.

dams amounting Rs.4.639 billion can save up to 70,456 Acre ft of water and can irrigate 44,000 acres of land.

Package-III of the project is comprised of 20 dams, out of which 18 are completed. The cost of the dams are Rs.8.867 billion. The dams can store 158,260 Acre ft of water and can irrigate 58,500 acres of land.

Unit 1 is based on regasified liquid natural gas (RLNG), which will largely meet the power demand of Karachi, the business hub of the country. The project includes two SGT5-4000F gas turbines installed in two 450MW combined-cycle power generation units. The SGT5-4000F gas turbines are renowned for high performance and low-cost power generation.

K-Electric, the country's largest power utility, has invested in a 900 MW RLNG plant, which is an integral part of the business plan. aimed at bridging the power shortfall and providing smooth and reliable supply of power to the consumers. The 900 MW RLNG Power Plant will increase the power utility's generation capacity, efficiency, and reliability.

K-Electric's total investment for the project is \$ 650 million, K-Electric had awarded Siemens AG and China's Harbin Electric International Co., Ltd a contract to build a 900-megawatt combined cycle power plant. The work began in late 2019 which is now near its completion.

Germany sees Covid surge

BERLIN: Germany's daily coronavirus cases rose to a near-record high on Wednesday as authorities warned that a new subtype of the omicron strain is spreading quickly across the country. The Robert Koch Institute (RKI), the country's disease control agency, confirmed 262,593 new COVID-19 cases in the past 24 hours, and 269 coronavirus-related fatalities. The number of new cases was only slightly less than last Thursday's number of 262,752 infections, the highest figure so far.

The relaxation of anti-coronavirus measures month and the spread of the highly contagious omicron sub-variant BA.2 were the main factors driving the snike in cases

The new subtype, which is more transmissible than the initial omicron strain BA.1, now accounts more than 48% of sequenced coronavirus cases in the country, according to the RKI. Despite the surge in infections, the majority of omicron cases have been mild so far, not requiring hospitalization.

Taiwan question is different from Ukraine

BEIJING: The Democratic Progressive Party (DPP) authority recently has been hyping up the situation in Ukraine and the so-called threat from the Chinese mainland, deliberately increasing cross-Straits confrontation and preaching wars, which exposes their hypocricy, Taiwan Affairs Office of the State Council said on Wednesday.

On March 9, deputy regional leader of Taiwan Lai Ching-te openly said that the island "needs to have the capability to defend itself" in an interview with Yahoo TV. His remarks came after Tsai Ing-wen, the regional leader of Taiwan, threatened to not "rule out firing the first shot."

Zhu Fenglian, a spokesperson for the Taiwan Affairs Office of the State Council, on Wednesday said, "we are willing to create a broad space for peaceful reunification, but we will not leave any space for various forms of separatist activities."

Vietnam's daily Covid cases hit new record

HANOI: Vietnam reported 180,558 new COVID-19 cases on Wednesday, its new daily record, up 5,078 cases from Tuesday, according to its Ministry of Health.

The new infections, logged in 62 localities nation-wide, included 180,552 domestically transmitted and six imported.

Vietnamese capital Hanoi remained the epidemic hotspot with 26,220 cases on Wednesday, followed by central NgheAn province with 10,797 cases, and northern VinhPhuc province with 8,875 cases.

The YPG members were "neutralized" when they were in preparation for an "attack" against Turkey's Operation Euphrates Shield zone in northern Syria, the Turkish ministry tweeted.

Turkish authorities often use the term "neutralized" to imply "terrorists" killed, wounded, or captured in security operations.

Turkey's forces and the YPG members often exchange fire on the Syrian border, and the tension has increased in the region since early January after the killing of three Turkish soldiers when a bomb exploded on its border with Syria.

European leaders return after Kyiv visit

lic and Slovenia safely returned to Poland Wednesday after a visit to Kyiv intended to show support for Ukraine as it defends itself against the Russian military onslaught. The leaders met with President VolodymyrZelenskyy

on Tuesday to convey a message of solidarity with Ukraine and of support for the nation's aspirations to one day join the European Union. They went ahead with the hours-long train trip despite con-

cerns about risks to their security while traveling through a war zone. Although pronouncing their trip as an EU mission, officials in Brussels cast it as something the three leaders had undertaken on their own. Polish government spokesman Piotr Mueller said

Wednesday morning that the three had returned safely to Poland. Officials hadn't given details about their schedule for security reasons. Prime Ministers Mateusz Morawiecki of Poland, Petr-

Fiala of the Czech Republic and JanezJansa of Slovenia were joined by Poland's Deputy Prime Minister Jaroslaw Kaczynski - the chief of the ruling conservative party and the country's most powerful leader. At a news briefing late Tuesday in Kyiv, Kaczynski said he believed that a NATO peacekeeping mission is needed in Ukraine. The remark generated much discussion in Poland on Wednesday, with some commentators saying the prospect could risk drawing NATO into a war with Russia. - Agencies

Baku urges Yerevan to start result-oriented talks

BAKU: Baku has said that Armenia must show readiness to start substantive and result-oriented negotiations with Azerbaijan, the ministry reported on March 15. The Azerbaijani Foreign Ministry made the statement in response to Armenian Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan's proposals for normalizing bilateral ties

between the two nations. "If Armenia also takes the issue seriously, then it must present its concrete proposals and thus must demonstrate its readiness to start substantive and result-oriented negotiations," the ministry said. It emphasized that Azerbaijan's position on restoring relations with Armenia is clear and consistent, adding that "we do not need to repeat the position we have repeatedly stated". Azerbaijan has proposed ideas in this regard and is willing to go further in

this direction, taking into

account the importance of

normalizing relations between the two countries as well as peace-building activities in the region in the aftermath of the conflict, the ministry added. Mirzoyan told Armenian

media that both Armenia and Azerbaijan had already mutually recognized the territorial integrity and absence of territorial claims towards each other by signing the "CIS Agreement" on December 8, 1991. "For Armenia, the main and fundamental thing is to guarantee the rights and freedoms of Karabakh Armenians and the final clarification of the status of Nagorno-Karabakh. For us, the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict is not a territorial issue but a question of rights," he said. On March 14, Azerbaijan made public the five basic principles for normalizing

relations with Armenia. To recap, after submitting fundamental principles to Armenia on the normalization of relations between the two countries. Armenia turned to the OSCE Minsk talks. Foreign Minister JeyhunBayramov earlier told Anadolu news agency that Azerbaijan had sent a fivepoint proposal to Armenia to normalize relations and was awaiting a response from the opposite side. "The message is this: the

factor of occupation is gone. In this situation, the Azerbaijani side, despite all the difficulties and problems of the past, is in favor of normalizing relations with Armenia," he said. He stressed that Armenia

has not responded to Azerbaijan's proposal for almost a year. The minister described Azerbaijan's recent new proposal to Armenia as a sign of goodwill. "We have proposed to the Armenian side some fundamental principles, which include the normalization of relations between Azerbaijan and Armenia. We expressed our readiness to develop relations on the basis of certain principles. Armenia should consider this and give its answer," he said.

7.3 quake hits Japan, tsunami advisory issued

TOKYO: A powerful 7.3-mag nitude quake jolted east Japan on Wednesday night, rattling the capital Tokyo and prompting a tsunami advisory for parts of the northeast coast, the Japan Meteorological Agency said. The quake was centred off the coast of the Fukushima region at a depth of 60 kilometres and shortly after it hit at 11:36 pm (1436 GMT) an advisory for tsunami waves of one metre was issued for parts of the coast. There were no immediate reports of damage or injuries, but more than two million households were left without power, including 700,000 in Tokyo, electricity provider TEPCO said.

TEPCO also said in a tweet that it was checking operations at the Fukushima nuclear plant that went into meltdown 11 years ago after a huge 9.0-magnitude quake and tsunami hit off the eastern coast on March 11, 2011. Japan sits on the Pacific "Ring of Fire", an arc of intense seismic activity that stretches through Southeast Asia and across the Pacific basin. - Agencies

UN resolution is a great achievement

WASHINGTON: Afghan citizens living in the US with expired visas will be given temporary protected status for 18 months due to precarious conditions in their country, the Department of Homeland Security announced Wednesday. "This TPS designation will help to protect Afghan nationals who have already been living in the United States from returning to unsafe conditions," said Homeland Security Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas. DHS said Afghans face reduced security and deteriorated living conditions since the Taliban seized power last August. Special powers being given to Rangers, Police, FC: Rasheed

ISLAMABAD: Interior Minister Sheikh Rasheed Ahmed on Wednesday said special powers were being given to Police, Rangers and Frontier Constabulary (FC) in federal capital from March 20 to April 2. Talking to media persons after workshop on Anti Human Trafficking organized by the United Nations here, the minister said Police, Rangers and FC have full capability to deal with any untoward situation. He said around 1000 personnel of FC and Rangers have been summoned to Islamabad for performing security duty adding that if needed more personnel would be deployed to ensure law and order situation. Sheikh Rasheed said the government would provide full security and protection to both rallies of March 25 and March 27. Ensuring protection to lives and properties of the people were the responsibility of Interior Ministry, he added. He said if the opposition wished to hold rally on March 27 then they should meet Deputy Commissioner Islamabad for devising its modalities. The administration would provide safe passage to the opposition rally, he added. However, he reiterated that no one would be allowed to take law into their hands and violators would be dealt with iron hands. The minister said Pakistan was facing international threats of terrorism adding that maintenance of peace and countering terrorism was not only responsibility of the government but also the opposition. Regarding no confidence motion against the Prime Minister, he said there would be no assembly session on March 27 due to Sunday. - DNA
