World offers deepest condolences Thousands killed in Afghan earthquake

Wednesday's quake was the deadliest in Afghanistan since 2002. It struck about 44 km (27 miles) from the city of Khost

KABUL: The death toll from an earthquake in Afghanistan on Wednesday hit 1,000, disaster management officials said, with more than 600 injured and the toll expected to grow as information trickles in from remote mountain villages. Houses were reduced to rubble and bodies swathed in blankets lay on the ground, photographs on Afghan media showed Helicopters were deployed in the rescue effort to reach the injured and fly in medical supplies and food, interior ministry official Salahuddin Ayubi said. "The death toll is likely to rise as some of the villages are in remote areas in the mountains and it will take some time to collect details," he said. Wednesday's quake was the deadliest in Afghanistan since 2002. It struck about 44 km (27 miles) from the southeastern city of Khost, near the border with Pakistan, the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) said. Disaster management officials said at least 1,000 are dead and 600 injured. However, local officials put the number of injured higher. "1,000 dead, 1,500 injured, and this number might go up, many families have been lost. Injured people have been taken to Kabul and Gardez," Mohammad Amin Hozaila, information and culture director of Paktika, told Reuters. Most of the confirmed deaths were in the eastern province of Paktika, where 255 people were killed and more than 200 injured, Ayubi added. In the province of Khost, 25 were dead and 90 had been taken to hospital. Haibatullah Akhundzada, the supreme leader of the ruling Taliban, offered his condolences in a statement. Mounting a rescue operation will prove a major test for the Taliban, who took over the country

Director General (DG) of Inter Services Public Relations (ISPR) also took to Twitter and expressed "deepest condolences over tragic loss of precious lives and damage to infrastructure." Armed Forces of Pakistan are ready to provide all possible humanitarian assistance to people of Afghanistan, he said. In addition, former prime minister Imran Khan directed his KP government to facilitate medical facilities for the affected people in the neighboring country. "My condolences and prayers go to the government and people of Afghanistan for the loss of lives suffered in the earthquake," he said and added that he had asked the KP government to especially facilitate the provision of all medical assistance. Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari also expressed sorrow over

Govt defends talks with TTP

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Wednesday signed a RMB 15 billion (\$2.3 billion) loan facility agreement with a Chinese consortium of banks which is expected to aid the depleting foreign exchange reserves and depreciation of the local currency. Finance Minister Miftah Ismail announced the development on his Twitter handle, revealing that the inflows are expected within a couple of days. "We thank the Chinese government for facilitating this transaction," he said. The agreement with Chinese banks is expected to bolster the country's reserves and enable it to make import payments while lending some support to the rupee as well which has lost over 34% since the start of the outgoing fiscal year 2021-22. Taking to his Twitter, Federal Minister for Foreign Affairs Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari also acknowledged China for its support. He wrote: "Grateful to President Xi Jinping, Foreign Minister Wang Yi and the people of China." He added that the people of Pakistan are grateful for the continued support of our all-weather friends.

Possible IMF deal still weeks away: Tarin

ISLAMABAD: PTI leader and former finance minister Shaukat Tarin said on Wednesday that a potential deal with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for the revival of the extended fund facility (EFF) was still weeks away as he lashed out at the current coalition government for its economic policies. Speaking to the media in Islamabad, Tarin said: "We pray [an agreement is reached]. Because the country is ours and we are nothing without the country. We pray that they (government) agree on a deal [with the IMF] which does not burden the people." However, the former banker maintained that this was currently a work in progress.

EU GSP+ mission arrives to assess the progress

This preferential status is conditional on GSP+ countries demonstrating tangible progress on the implementation of 27 international conventions

ISLAMABAD: A European Union monitoring mission comprising officials from the European External Action Service (EEAS) and the European Commission's Directorates-General for Trade and for Employment, Social Affairs and Inclusion, arrived in Pakistan on 22 June. The mission will make an assessment of the effective implementation of 27 international conventions Pakistan is signatory to. The GSP+ (Generalised Scheme of Preferences Plus) provides wide-ranging tariff preferences for imports to the EU from vulnerable developing countries to support poverty eradication, sustainable development and their participation in the global economy as well as reinforce good governance. Eligible countries like Pakistan can export goods to the EU market at zero duties for 66% of tariff lines. This preferential status is conditional on GSP+ countries demonstrating tangible progress on the implementation of 27 international conventions on human and labour rights, environmental protection, climate change and good governance. As stated by Executive Vice-President and Commissioner for Trade Valdis Dombrovskis in 2021 "For five decades, the EU GSP has supported vulnerable countries to grow in a sustainable manner by giving them preferential access to the EU market. This

has helped beneficiary countries to diversify their economies and create jobs. It has also galvanised beneficiary countries into improving human and labour rights, the environment and good governance". As underlined by High Representative/Vice President Josep Borrell Fontelles "The GSP scheme is all about the EU's and Pakistan's joint commitment to sustainable development." GSP+ has been very beneficial for Pakistani business increasing their exports to the EU market by 65% since the country joined GSP+ in 2014. The European Single Market, with over 440 million consumers, is Pakistan's most important destination.

Govt urged to lift ban on imported items

PESHAWAR: Importers hailing from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa have urged the government to lift the ban on import items for next three months to prevent importers from huge financial and other losses and in the best interest of the country's economy. 1440 kg dead chicken seized, destroyed

FAISALABAD: Punjab Food Authority (PFA) team has seized 1,440 kilograms (kg) dead chicken from the area of Sheikhpura road. PFA spokesman said on Wednesday that PFA team nabbed two accused red handed while transporting 1,440 kg dead chicken. The accused during initial interrogation confessed that meat of these chickens was supplied to various hotels and restaurants. Later, the PFA team destroyed these dead chickens at dumping site with the help of workers of Faisalabad Waste Management Authority and the accused were locked behind bars in Balochi police station. Further investigation against them was under progress, he added. Meanwhile, PFA team also unearthed an illegal juice factory near Islam Nagar where spurious and unhygienic beverage was being prepared. The PFA team seized 1,000 liter injurious juice along with 570 liters chemical and other items and destroyed them later on. The team also confiscated juice making machines, packet sealing guns and other material from the spot while further investigation was under progress, spokesman said. - APP

KP CM launches E-summary system

PESHAWAR: The Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa has introduced a Summary Automation System (E-summary system) for provincial departments. Chief Minister Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Mahmood Khan has formally launched the newly introduced E-summary system during a ceremony held here in Chief Minister's House on Wednesday. Besides, provincial ministers Atif Khan, Taimur Salim Jhagra, Shaikat Ali Yousufzai and Special Assistant to KP CM on Information, Barrister Mohammad Ali Saif, Chief Secretary Shahzad Bangash, Principal Secretary to Chief Minister Amjad Ali Khan, administrative secretaries of concerned departments, Director Performance Management and Reforms Unit (PMRU) and other relevant officials also attended the inaugural ceremony. The participants were briefed in detail about the features, workflow and other important aspects of the newly introduced system. Briefing about the important features of the system, it was informed that all the activities related to the summaries including creation of summary, process, approval and review would be carried out through Automation System adding that a dedicated mobile app has been prepared for the purpose. It was a secure automation system as only relevant authorities would have access to the system through particular QR code. Other features of the system include Summary & Note Management, Para Management, Summary & Note Highlights, Video/Audio Highlights, Alerts and Notifications and Centralized Dashboard. The system would also have the facility of Digital Signature enabled through Pin Code. Similarly, the system has been integrated with the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa knowledge-base i.e Rules and Regulations. The participants were further informed that all provincial departments have been trained with regard to the use of this summary automation system adding that all the updates regarding the summaries in process would be available for the chief minister and chief secretary on dashboards. - APP

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister's Special Representative for Inter-faith Harmony and Middle East, Hafiz Tahir Mehmood Ashrafi has said that the Saudi government always stood by Pakistan in trying times as these ties were beyond the domestic politics. Talking to reporters of national and international media the other day, he expressed the hope that this cooperation and coordination would continue in the future with the same zeal and zest. Ashrafi, who is also the chairman

of Pakistan Ulema Council, said Pakistan and Saudi Arab relations were flourishing in the economic sectors as the Saudi business community was showing their great interest to invest in different sectors in Pakistan. He urged the stakeholders to improve the investment environment and facilitate the investors of Arab Islamic countries. To a query, he responded that the visit of crown prince Muhammad bin Salman to Egypt, Turkey and Jordan was a matter of great pleasure for the Muslim Ummah. He said the solution of all issues including Palestine and Kashmir was lying in unity and stability of the Muslim Ummah. He said at present, the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) was headed by the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and a score of expectations were pinned with the

visits of Muhammad bin Salman, which would be fulfilled. He said Pakistan wanted to see the Islamic world united and OIC stronger adding Pakistan would never support any other organization parallel to it. In response to another question, he said the stance of the Muslim Ummah on blasphemy issue was very clear and unanimous. He said the Friday sermons delivered in Harmain Al-Sharifain during last Friday's congregations had clearly expressed sentiments and pain of Muslim Ummah. - APP

Up gradation of special education centre started

ISLAMABAD: The project "Up-gradation of National Special Education Centre for Visually Handicapped Children" is started under the administrative control of Directorate General of Special Education, Ministry of Human Rights. This project is created for the diagnosis and screening of visually impaired persons through the use of advance technological services. In this project, a diagnostic/ screening unit headed by Ophthalmologist and an Optometrist carries out assessment/ screening of visually handicapped persons/ students is providing services. After visual screening and diagno-

sis, the beneficiaries are trained to use the proposed technology in National Library & Resource Centre. Two I.T Experts provide technical support in imparting these training orientations to visually impaired persons on these latest digital assistive devices which are available under this project. An inaugural ceremony of the project was held on June 22, 2022 at the National Library and Resource Center, Islamabad. Federal Minister for Human Rights Mian Riaz Hussain Pirzada was the Chief Guest of the occasion. Addressing the audience, he said that in the present age everyone is well aware of the usefulness of technology and it is impossible to deny it. Without technology, we will not be able to



make real progress, nor will we be able to compete with other nations. So everyone should use modern technology as much as possible but when we talk about visually impaired people, the assistive devices based on modern technology become a source of education and rehabilitation for them and these people pass their advanced exams and others can prepare for competitive exams and use their abilities to become important members of society. He further said that he was very happy to see the provision of sophisticated and assistive devices for the visually impaired under this project and to provide technical assistance to the visually impaired using these facilities. Training is also being provided

which will be a stepping stone for the rehabilitation and practical life of these visually impaired people in the society. Mr. Afzal Latif, Secretary, Ministry of Human Rights, Mr. Tariq Mahmood (Joint Secretary), Dr. Abdul Rahim (Director General Legal Aid & Justice Authority), and Mr. Abdul Sattar, Director General (Social Welfare) also attended the function. On this occasion Director General (Special Education) Mr. Sheikh Azhar Sajjad also gave an introductory speech highlighting the objectives of the project and introduced the latest digital assistive devices available for the visually impaired. The event was attended by a large number of dignitaries and visually impaired persons / students.

Heavy rain spells to improve aquatic life of Rawal Dam

ISLAMABAD: The recent pre-Monsoon rain spells that lashed various parts of the country and dropped mercury drastically after scorching heatwaves would help improve aquatic life of Rawal Dam as the reservoir is filled near to its maximum capacity. Rawal lake, which supplies drinking water to the city of Rawalpindi, is home of various fish species, turtles, and aquaculture that created a unique ecosystem threatened by man-made pollution in the reservoir, said an official of the Fisheries Department of the Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT). The water in the Rawal Dam was collected through the rainwater coming from the Margalla hills catchments which ultimately improves the growth of aquatic life. "The rainwater along with dust and sludge brings various nutrients, micro plant species and organisms that help the aqua culture in the reservoir improve the quality of water which in turn helps synthesis of healthy habitat for the marine life", the Fisheries Department official told APP. He said the opening of spillways of the Dam was also another challenge that poses risk to the fish that faced damage during the process. "The dam authorities are advised to avoid abrupt aperture of spillways that cause big fish to fall down rendering loss of precious species". The people used to catch the falling out fish by physically venturing into running water of the spillways which directly jeopardized those individuals' lives. However, in order to tackle this nuisance, the fisheries department has installed nets at a distance of 200-

300 feet from the spillways to avoid drifting out of fish. The Executive Engineer (XEN) of Rawal Dam Amir Mumtaz told APP that the total storage capacity of the reservoir was 1752 which was at the moment filled up till 1745.5 feet with an extra cushion of 7.5 feet storage capacity available. He said the rainwater during the monsoon downpour used to fill the reservoir to its maximum capacity whereas the rains have stopped and this water would start receding in the coming days. When contacted Deputy Director Fisheries Rawalpindi, Mir Latif, in his expert opinion, said rains used to bring nutrients and soil enriched with essential minerals that prove to be supportive for aquatic growth especially fish which are under threat during drought season. He said sudden water rise in the reservoir causes fish mortality with immediate water bed turn over. Latif said, "The rain water accumulated in the dam turns greenish due to micro-plants brought with the deluge from the catchments gives healthy habitat for the growth of fish". He said the water settles in the dam within 3-4 weeks at the same time as the aquatic life develops, however, if the thunderstorm and heavy rainfall persists then it could disturb water species synthesis. "It develops instantly in favourable conditions", he added. While commenting on the water pollution jeopardizing the water life, he said the direct flow of household or sewage waste of Lakhwal village; Bani Gala residential area and Murree Brewery were the major polluters. He said the small scale drainage of the waste is not harmful while the large scale can prove to be fatal. - APP

Police distributes Rs1 million among investigation officers

The cost of investigation has been distributed among the investigation officers in a ceremony held at the office of the DIG (Operations). DIG Operations Sohail Zafar Chatha among SSP Investigation Farhat Abbas Kazmi distributed the cheques of Rs 01 million among 33 investigation officers and this process will be continued in future as well. Rs 34.8 million were sanctioned as cost of investigation

and Rs 34.55 million have been distributed among the investigation officers. IGP Islamabad Dr. Akbar Nasir Khan said that the cost of investigation is being distributed among investigation officers timely and this process will be continued in future adding that initiative will help ensure transparency in the investigation process, end corruption and dispense justice to complainants. He hoped that the investigation officers will work diligently on their cases after getting the required expenses. "There is zero tolerance on corruption and those officials involved in corrupt practices will be dealt with iron hands", the IGP maintained. The investigation officers will submit their bills and payment will be reimbursed to them after a verification process completed by SSP Investigation.

Pre-monsoon rains bring cheers for farmers

ISLAMABAD: The much-awaited recent spell of pre-monsoon rains have brought smile on the faces of farmers who were bearing the burden of economic crisis, heatwaves, skyrocketing prices of fuel, seeds and fertilizers as it would cast positive impact on cultivation zones of the country. The farmers after the rains were hopeful for better crop yields for this season especially of sugar cane, rice, cotton and other staple crops. Muhammad Irfan, a farmer from district Muzaffargarh, talking to APP said, "Thank God for the spell of rains in the country which gave new life to our crops which were decaying before the current rains". - APP

Recent rains to reduce water scarcity: Shah

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Water Resources Syed Khurshed Ahmed Shah on Tuesday hoped that the ongoing rains would reduce the prevailing water scarcity in the country. He, chairing the meeting of a special committee on water supply to Balochistan, said the government was trying to provide equal access to water to all the provinces. Khurshed Shah said it was his top priority to provide Balochistan and Sindh their due share of water timely. He said the fact-finding committee formed to address the issue of water supply to Balochistan, visited the sites in question and reached the conclusion that Sindh was not stealing the water of Balochistan. He said Balochistan would have no complaint regarding water supply in the coming days. Khurshed Shah said a comprehensive report would be presented to the prime minister in the light this special committee's findings. In the meeting, Minister for Economic Affairs Ayaz-Sadiq, Minister for Science and Technology Agha Hassan Baloch, Member of National Assembly Khalid Hussain Magsi, Indus River System Authority (IRSA) chairman and other officials were present. The officials of Water Resources ministry and IRSA presented the report of their visit to Sindh in detail. They were of the view that Balochistan would get its due share in water in a couple of days. - APP

Coordinated efforts needed to beat challenges

ISLAMABAD, Minister for Climate Change Sherry Rehman on Wednesday stressed the need for making coordinated efforts by all the stakeholders to overcome the confrontational challenges related to the national economy, climate change, energy and depleting water resources to achieve sustainable economic growth and bringing the country out of the looming crisis. Participating in the federal budget 2022-23 debate, she said the government would have to take tough decisions to break the debt trap and bringing fundamental changes in economic model, putting it back on the right track. She apprised the House that climate change was a serious matter that required special and coordinated attention to minimize its adverse impact on local agriculture and

eco-system. Expressing concerns over the wastage of water, she said Pakistan was among the top four countries having highest per-capita water consumption. She urged rationalizing the water usage for both domestic and irrigation purposes, besides taking measures to stop polluting the water resources. Senator Sherry Rehman also expressed concern over the rising pollution of Indus-delta which threatened marine life, asking for collective efforts to overcome the challenge. Sherry Rehman said the incumbent coalition government had inherited a fragile economy, which was the result of inefficiencies and incompetence and mismanagement of the last government. While criticizing the poli-

cies of the PTI government, she said unwise and irrational commitments and agreements signed with international financial institutions had put the local economy on ventilator. She said, "the accountability government (PTI)" when came into power, the corruption index had reached 140 position from 117th, adding there were stories of corruption in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Bus Rapid Transport (BRT) system, billion trees project and other cartels including sugar, wheat and crushing of national airline. She said the previous regime had pushed the economy into a growing debt trap and agreed with International Monetary Fund on tough conditions,

adding the borrowed money had been spent on fulfilling the demands of the elite class for leading luxurious life. The common man in the country had badly affected due to the increasing prices of petroleum products and daily essential items, terming them "gifts" by the last regime that remained showed least interest in tackling such issues during his four years tenure. Despite severe fiscal constraints, she said the coalition partners had decided to sacrifice their political capital and put their image at stake and decided to bring the country out of crisis by taking unpopular decisions. She apprised the House that during last 70 years different governments negotiated about 25 IMF programs but always tried to put minimum burden on the common man. But unfortunately, she said the past regime of PTI took all decisions with a non-serious attitude bypassing the parliament, which divided the society.

PPP to transform vision of ZA Bhutto into reality: Kaira

ISLAMABAD: Special Assistant to PM on Kashmir Affairs Qamar Zaman Kaira said on Wednesday that Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) would transform the vision of Shaheed Zulfikar Ali Bhutto and Shaheed Benazir Bhutto into reality. "PPP would continue the struggle of Shaheed Zulfikar Ali Bhutto, Shaheed Mohtarma Benazir Bhutto and all other martyrs of the party to fulfill their promise and accomplish their unfinished mission", he said while speaking to Radio Pakistan's current affair programme. "PPP would use all possible resources to resolve the issues confronting the country and its people", he added. Benazir Bhutto Shaheed was not only a great leader of Pakistan and Muslim world, but also a role model for all Muslim women of the world, he mentioned. - APP

Decision to fix business hours to save energy: Rana

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Interior Rana Sanaullah on Tuesday said the decision to fix hours for commercial operations was being implemented uniformly across the country. Talking to a delegation of business community from the Federal Capital, he said the decision had been taken to conserve energy. He assured the delegation to review their new proposals, adding that the decision would be taken after consultation with the provincial governments. The minister said the government believed in providing the best opportunities to business community. "As soon as the energy shortage is resolved, business hours will be reviewed again," he said. He said practical steps were being taken to end load-shedding during the business hours. "We saved the country from load-shedding in the past too, and will overcome the crisis once again." He asked shopkeepers and restaurant owners to ensure compliance with the orders of Islamabad District Administration. He said the business culture needed to be changed to make the maximum use of daylight. - APP

Monsoon may cause widespread rainfall from June 29 office

ISLAMABAD: Most parts of the country including federal capital are expected to receive monsoon rains from June 29, Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) Director General Mehar Sahibzada Khan said on Wednesday. Heavy rainfall during monsoon may trigger flash flooding in hilly and urban areas, he said while speaking to PTV News. He said that the National and Provincial Disaster Management Authorities following the Pakistan Meteorological Department's weather alerts of torrential rains have issued directives to the departments concerned to scale up disaster management activities to cope with the impending risk of flooding in urban areas. - APP

Abu Bakr takes oath as MNA

ISLAMABAD: Speaker National Assembly Raja Perwaiz Ashraf here on Wednesday administered the oath from the newly elected member of Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P) Abu Bakr who recently won by-election from NA-240 Karachi's District Korangi. Muhammad Abu Bakar had won the by-election after securing 10,683 votes while Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP) candidate, Shahzada Shahbaz, became the runner-up after obtaining 10,618 votes. - APP

USC to

ISLAMABAD: As per the directions of the Prime Minister, the Utility Store Corporation (USC) will continue to provide subsidies on basic food items through all stores across the country. As many as 30 branded companies that supply groceries to the utility store have increased the prices of 952 branded items, said a press release issued here. With this, there has also been an increase in the prices of pulses. USC has maintained these prices from Sep/Oct 2021 after successful negotiations with the vendors, even after the price influx of these branded items in the open market during the month of March 2022, USC stayed consistent with the old prices (except for a few changes) due to Ramadan. However, with the recent increased prices of these branded items, the utility store management is compelled to increase the prices, for the availability at USC outlets. The Utility Store Corporation does not have its own manufacturing and production units and make its purchases from the open market because of which when there is an increase in the open market, the management of the utility store must increase the prices accordingly to ensure these products/brands available. Besides this increase, the utility stores are working hard to provide branded and non branded items to the public at comparatively lower prices. The prices of these items in utility stores are still less than in the retail/open market. - APP

Pakistan regaining confidence
of int'l financial institutions

ISLAMABAD: Members of the National Assembly (MNAs) on Wednesday expressed strong conviction that Pakistan would regain the confidence of international financial institutions after the incumbent government took corrective measures in the Federal Budget 2022-23 to improve the national economy. Participating in the budget debate in the National Assembly, Chaudhry Faqir Ahmed of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) said the national economy would progress in a sustainable way after the budget approval from the House. With the budget's passage, he said financial institutions like International Monetary Fund (IMF) would be extending more cooperation to Pakistan, and the health of ailing national economy would improve. Terming the budget 2022-23 'good one' in the

prevailing economic situation, he stressed the need for all institutions' full support to the government in execution of its fiscal plan to steer the country out of financial crisis. The lawmaker asked for providing improved health and education facilities across the country, suggesting provision of free medicines and transport to patients in the public sector hospitals and make education compulsory for all children up to the Matric level. He said once agriculture sector was considered backbone of the national economy and the country was self-sufficient in almost all major crops, but now there were the challenges of food security and Pakistan was importing various products. He said there were a number of research institutes to improve the agriculture sector, but it was unfortunate that not even a single new seed had been introduced since long. Waheed Alam Khan of the PML-N said his leadership was taking tough decisions to revive the na-

tional economy that was badly ruined by the past regime of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI). He criticized the previous regime of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) for adopting wrong economic policies and signing unrealistic agreements with the International Monetary Fund (IMF), which were major reasons behind the prevailing situation of inflation in the country. The MNA said it was unfortunate the PTI leadership, despite being ousted in a democratic and constitutional way, was still wanted to create chaos in the country by threatening long march against the democratic government. He said the PTI leaders were trying to hoodwink the public using the name of Islam and patriotism for personal gains. Commenting on the budgetary proposals, he said there was no mention of minimum wage of Rs25,000 per month of a labourer, and suggested providing interest-free loans to those wanted to install so-

lar panels besides gradually switching over to alternative fuel to meet energy needs. He said the size of cultivable land was decreasing in the country due to certain reasons and ensuring maximum incentives to the farming community aimed at tackling confronted food security challenges. He strongly condemned the blasphemous remarks uttered by leaders of India's Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), demanding strict action against them for hurting sentiments of the Muslim Ummah. Maulana Abdul Akbar Chitrali of Muttahida Majlis-e-Amal Pakistan (MMAP) urged for early arrest of the elements involved in carrying out terrorism activities and killers of four social activists in North Waziristan. Saira Bano of Grand Democratic Alliance (GDA) said the House was discussing the next fiscal plan and there should be maximum presence of lawmakers and their active participation in the parliamentary proceedings.

President reprimands HBL
over delay in refunding money

ISLAMABAD: President Dr. Arif Alvi on Wednesday reprimanded Habib Bank Limited (HBL) for unnecessarily delaying the matter of reimbursement of a trivial amount of Rs 39,000 to the victim of bank fraud. He directed the bank to reimburse the defrauded amount, along with the payment of transportation charges, within fifteen days to the victim and termed the action of the HBL an act of malpractice and maladministration. The president reprimanded the HBL for preferring representation before his Office against the order passed by the Banking Ombudsman in favour of the victim of the bank fraud involving a meagre amount. He observed that the transfer of

money from one account to another through cheating was a common incident of fraudulent activity, but despite the knowledge of the account where the money landed and was then withdrawn, no action was taken against the beneficiary of the transaction. The president emphasized that the bank was liable to make good the loss of their customers and advised the bank management to look into the issue and take remedial measures to safeguard the interest of its customers, especially the small depositors and account holders. The president directed the State Bank of Pakistan, being a regulatory body, to take earnest action against both the banks and their branches

by adopting regulatory and punitive action to redress the fraudulent activities which result from non-compliance with Rules and Regulations issued by the State Bank of Pakistan. According to the details, an unknown person tricked Nazeer Ahmad Bhutta to provide the last digits of his ATM card and later deprived him of his deposit. The victim preferred an appeal before the Banking Ombudsman who decided the case in favour of the victim. However, HBL, instead of implementing the decision, preferred representation to the president. The president upheld the decision of the Banking Ombudsman and directed the bank to reimburse the defrauded money to the complainant. - APP

Karot hydropower
plant put to final
pre-commissioning

ISLAMABAD: The 720 megawatts Karot hydropower plant is now a week away from starting commercial operations after it was put to 168 hours long reliability run test (RTT) on Tuesday. According to Gwadar Pro, RTT is the last test before the commissioning of the project, a senior official of Karot Power Co. told Gwadar Pro. Karot Power is a special-purpose vehicle incorporated in Pakistan for executing the project by China Three Gorges (CTG) South Asia Investment Ltd., a subsidiary of CTG. The test run was launched at 9:30 am on June 21 and will conclude on June 28, after which all four units of the plant will be ready for full-scale electricity generation, the official said. Karot is the first-ever hydropower project under China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) initiative to be completed at a cost of \$1.72 billion. The project will play a vital role in Pakistan's energy security by providing clean and affordable electricity. The run-of-river facility is already contributing electricity to the national grid free of cost. Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif said during a recent visit to Karot that the plant will provide free electricity worth Rs4 billion to the national grid as a gift to the Pakistani people until it starts commercial operations. According to the Central Power Purchasing Authority (CPPA), the project contributed 244.25 million units of free electricity to the national grid in May. The RTT is being witnessed by independent international engineers and officials of the relevant government departments, the official said. He added that before the RTT, the plant successfully went through the load rejection test at a full capacity of 720MW. This is a vital test in which load from a running unit is suddenly removed to check that if it safely shuts down without damage to electro-mechanical installations and the civil foundations in case of tripping of the power plant. The reactive capability test was also successful, the official said.

RAWALPINDI: Police have arrested two members of a gang involved in street crimes and recovered cash, gold ornaments and weapons from their possession, said the police spokesman here on Wednesday. Police have recovered Rs 24,000 cash, mobile phones, gold ornaments and weapons from the accused who have been identified as Haroon and Abbas. Police managed to recover cash, gold ornaments and weapons after identification parade. Superintendent of Police, Rawal, Babar Javed Joya appreciated the performance of Pirwadhai police adding that whoever deprives citizens of their valuable assets cannot escape the grip of law. - APP

Researchers discovered
'antioxidant activity'
in donkey meat

ISLAMABAD: Chinese and Pakistani researchers have conducted a study on "The Extracting Technology for Antioxidant Oligopeptides from Donkey Meat" which proved that donkey meat has a "good antioxidant activity", Gwadar Pro reported on Wednesday. Antioxidants are molecules/substances that fight free radicals in the body. Free radicals can cause harm if their level surges in the body; they can cause multiple illnesses including heart disease, diabetes, cancer, etc. The Chinese researchers include Lanjie Li and Guiqin Liu from Liaocheng University and Jingjing Zhang, Ruiyan Zhang, Ning Zhang, and Zixiang Wei from Liaocheng University. Pakistani researchers include Riaz Hussain Pasha, Muhammad Akram Khan, and Saif-Ur-Rehman from PMAS-Arid Agriculture University, Rawalpindi. The researchers, while using Two-Step Enzymatic Hydrolysis during the study, developed the technology of enzymatic hydrolysis for antioxidant peptides derived from donkey meat. The findings determined that at optimum

conditions, a degree of hydrolysis (DH) of 25.4%, protein recovery (PR) of 95%, DSA of 69.75% were obtained and hydrolysates (3 h) had similar molecular weight distribution (MWD) to Ejjao Oligopeptide, which had been "proved to have good antioxidant activity". "These results provide fundamental data for the application of donkey hydrolysates, such as protein supplementation in food systems," reads the findings. As per the introduction of the study, donkey is an important source of medicinal products in China. Donkey's hide could enrich the blood and enhances white blood cells and is used in adjuvant chemotherapy. Similarly, donkey meat improves liver and kidney functions, promotes blood tonic, body immunity, anti-aging, profit lung, and eyesight effects. The donkey population continues to grow at a steady speed in Pakistan. Earlier this month, Pakistan Economic Survey (PES) 2021-22 was released, showing that Pakistan's donkey population grew to 5.7 million from 5.6 million in 2020-21. - DNA

ISLAMABAD: Indus River System Authority (IRSA) Wednesday released 185100 cusecs water from various rim stations with an inflow of 173523 cases. According to the data released by IRSA, the water level in the Jhelum River at Mangla Dam was 1079.70 feet, which was 29.07 feet higher than its dead level of 1,050 feet whereas the inflow and outflow of water was recorded a 31009 and 29186 cusecs respectively. The release of water at Kalabagh, Taunsa and Sukkur was recorded as 70355 ,112425 and 59767 cases respectively. Similarly, from the Kabul River, a total of 27800 cusecs of water was released at Nowshera and 26214 cusecs released from the Chenab River at Marala. - APP

Strikes in Britain

BRITAIN faces a rolling wave of strikes over pay and conditions in the coming months. The country's railways will be effectively shut down for a week. Barristers will walk out from next Monday, stopping criminal trials in courts. Wage disputes have led to rubbish piling up in some parts of the country, while other regions have suffered late postal deliveries. Teachers and doctors are the latest professions threatening to strike if the government doesn't meet their pay demands. But the country is not heading back to the 1970s. Trade unions in Britain have lost much of their clout in the workplace. Despite the headlines, the number of days lost to strikes has collapsed. At their peak, about half of employees were union members. Now the figure is 24% and these are disproportionately found in the public sector – which is why the government is facing off against so many groups. With pay deals yet to be signed, ministers find themselves facing calls for inflation-linked wage increases for 5 million workers, including those in the NHS, the armed forces, the civil service and local government. What makes the crisis seem familiar is the sequence of an energy shock, caused by a geopolitical crisis, followed by stagnating growth and inflation hitting highs not seen for decades. It would be hard to argue that key workers' pay offers shouldn't match inflation, which is projected to reach 11% this year. The Institute for Fiscal Studies says in the public sector employees have done even worse than those in the private sector, both over the past decade and during the pandemic. Boris Johnson's government appears more interested in pushing the interests of business than that of workers. It was the Polish economist Michał Kalecki who emphasised that class conflict lay at the heart of economics. If we are dealing, as Kalecki suggested, with a power struggle between capital and labour, then workers have been comprehensively defeated. Even with inflation shooting skywards, real wages are falling while company profits are rising. Employees are forced to take what the market pays. Such an imbalance won't benefit the wider economy in the long run. Workers and bosses have a shared interest. Productivity incentives from greater employee power can boost profits as well. Without ministers stepping in on the side of workers to mediate class conflict and ensure the spoils – or the pain – of economic activity is evenly shared, Britain risks remaining trapped in a low-wage, low-growth spiral.

The World has a choice

IT is a natural human impulse, and a political one, to turn inward when threatened by a crisis that appears beyond our control. The world is facing several such forces at once: food shortages, inflation, the persistence of Covid-19 and the effects of global warming. Taken together, they threaten the stability and prosperity of nations around the world. That threat could hasten the retreat that many countries are already making away from globalization and international cooperation. The United States can help itself and the rest of the world by working with other nations – especially the countries in Africa, the Middle East and South Asia that are most at risk – to address a major impending food crisis. Shortages are already acute in parts of Africa, and some of the reasons are well known: the extreme weather of climate change, the economic ravages of Covid-19, the inequality of resources. But a new and devastating problem has been created by Russia's cruel war on Ukraine. Ukraine is the fourth-largest exporter of grain and seeds in the world, mostly corn and wheat, but with its ports either occupied or blockaded by Russia, its ability to ship its grain has been sharply reduced. It is essential to get the Ukrainian grain moving. Much of it normally goes to developing countries facing the worst food shortages, and Ukrainian silos have to be emptied to make room for grain about to be harvested. As is so often the case, it is the poorest countries that suffer the sharpest blow, and history shows that hunger can quickly turn lethal. Nigeria, Somalia, Ethiopia, Egypt and Yemen are already feeling the pain of food shortages. The Washington Post notes; rising prices have set off protests in Argentina, Indonesia, Tunisia and Sri Lanka, among other countries. What might yet work is a joint appeal to Mr. Putin by the countries that stand to be most affected by the food crisis. Mr. Putin has met separately with the leaders of Turkey, Israel and the African Union, among others, and has insisted publicly that responsibility for the emerging global food and energy crises falls entirely on Western greed and Western sanctions. He repeated that message forcefully in a speech on Friday at the St. Petersburg International Economic Forum, blaming the United States for the world's instability. But he may find it harder to brush off an appeal from nations that are threatened by hunger, especially those that have so far resisted Western pressures to join in the ostracism of Russia. The United States should encourage and support such an appeal, which would get these countries involved in a way that serves their critical interests. And if an appeal includes a proposal to provide an escort of ships flying Ukrainian flags, Ukraine might feel less distrustful. International trust and cooperation are in desperately short supply, but it's the only way out of any of these intertwined crises. The Biden administration should see this moment as a critical one for America's leadership in the world, and step up to meet it.

Iran's foreign policy and Persian Gulf States

SINCE the Shah's regime, Iran has portrayed herself as a strategic independent state in the Middle East, particularly in Persian Gulf due to her demography, strategic location, and resources. Post-Islamic Revolution Ayatullah Khomeini promoted the idea of strategically independent Iran and efficiently transformed the state from being marginalized in the region to an assertive geopolitical power. Tehran washed its hands of the Shah's foreign policy and figured out how to maintain a balance of power in the region through its engagements with Lebanon, Yemen, and Afghanistan. The Islamic Republic of Iran prioritizes its strategic independence while taking full advantages of her geographical location to increase her security and influence in the region as well as the world. It has established its own strategic policy that is in contrast to the Shah's strategic policy of gaining US support and guarantees of security in exchange for keeping watch over the Persian Gulf's security on the behalf of US. Khomeini left Iran far different as he had taken it from the Shah. It was an economically devastated and internationally isolated country. It was the country whose population experienced a 50 percent reduction in their real per capita income. The nation was exhausted from the consequences of revolution and war in a single decade. In July 1989, Ali Akbar Rafsanjani made economic reconstruction his priority and warned his headline

rivals to stop their extremism. The five year plan was for attracting foreign capital, importing technologies, increasing oil revenue, and borrowing \$27 billion on the international market. He began pursuing rapprochement with the West and improving relations with Iran's neighbors. This was a new posture after the revolution. These new directions of Iran's foreign policy were visible very soon in Persian Gulf affairs. Tehran hoped that the new policy would help to contain Iraq and succeed in rapprochement with the West. Now the champion of radical changes was advocating regional stability. This was the beginning of Iran's major role in the Persian Gulf. The 2013 presidential election was a clear vote against the previous government's policy towards its international and regional relationships. Rouhani's support for broader social freedom and the country's economic insecurity because of the imposition of sanctions by the Western world in response to Iran's nuclear program were key factors behind his victory. As a matter of fact, Rouhani did a lot to improve relations with the West. The current rapprochement with the P5+1 is the best example. Since Rouhani's regime, the Iranian foreign policy has undergone changes. The orientation of Tehran's foreign policy vindicated the activities of the new Foreign Minister of the Islamic Republic of Iran. He visited almost all the states in the region with the exception of Bahrain and Saudi Arabia. It showed the great importance of reconciliation in the Persian Gulf. In December 2013, he also met with the Prime Minister of Iraq in Tehran and both sides agreed to do their best in economic arena and regarding shared national interests. He also said that he regrets the devastating terrorist acts in Iraq and Syria because terrorism is one of the main obstacles for further Iran-Iraq relations. In March 2014, the Iran-Qatar Joint Political Committee was established in Tehran, showing the direction of Iranian foreign policy. The meeting was dedicated to the further development of relations and rapprochement. For the first time, Iran and Qatar agreed to cooperate on the matter of the humanitarian crisis in Syria, but Iran still supports the Assad regime while Qatar backs anti-Assad groups in Syria. The Syrian situation seems complicated, even Iran-Qatar cooperation might not be enough to settle the conflict. Good relations with the Persian Gulf states will be a prerequisite too and Rouhani seems to share some such point of views. In the past, Oman had good relations with Iran but during Ahmadinejad's regime and Rohani's, diplomatic relations were upgraded. On March 2014, the meeting of Rouhani and Sultan Qaboos was an example of détente in the Persian Gulf region. The Iranian President stressed the development of relations between these two countries in all fields and their interest in maintaining security in the Strait of Hormuz. Rouhani added that Iran attaches great importance to ties with Islamic countries, particularly the littoral states

of the Persian Gulf and Gulf of Oman due to the significance of the Strait of Hormuz. Iran-Oman relations have significance for both of them and the other Persian Gulf states because they jointly control Strait of Hormuz. Any serious tension between them can lead to a blockade of the maritime transport of oil in the Strait of Hormuz and an oil crisis. Iran's relations with Saudi Arabia have been strained for a long time. Political and religious issues are the main reason for their delicate relation. Iran is a Shia-dominated population while Saudi Arab is defender of Sunni Muslims. For example, Bahrain and Syria have become obstacles to Iran-Saudi competition recently. In March 2014, Rouhani tried to improve relations with Saudi Arabia. During the meeting with the new Ambassador of Saudi Arabia to Iran, Rouhani declared that the expansion of relations with regional Muslim countries, particularly with Riyadh, is a priority in Iran's foreign policy. Good relations between Iran and Saudi Arabia would halt the instability in regional countries and might prevent sectarian violence in the Persian Gulf. Lack of cooperation between these two countries will hinder any peace initiatives in the region. Tehran tried to take advantages of the Qatar-Saudi Arabia rivalry in the Gulf. Iran-Qatar rapprochement is an example of this new attitude. The above activities and initiatives by the Rouhani Government are very positive and indicative of the new Iranian foreign policy towards the Persian Gulf. Tehran's relations with Riyadh and Doha are still the biggest threat to regional cooperation and stability. Everything depends on the Shia-Sunni rivalry in the Middle East and Persian Gulf, negotiations concerning the Iranian nuclear program, and the Iran-Saudi Arabia attitude towards political and social changes in Arab States and Syria. Undoubtedly, Arab-Iran rapprochements have to be undertaken in the Persian Gulf without the earlier normalization of political relations between Iran and the West, particularly Washington. The breakthrough with regard to the P5+1 and the process and the consequences of Iran-West negotiations seem to be essential if Iran really intends to cooperate. Iran and its neighbors in the Persian Gulf have had a confused relationship since the Islamic Revolution. Having emerged isolated and scarred economically by war, Tehran immediately looked for rapprochement with its neighbors. However, rapprochement has not been easy at any stage. On the one hand, Iran sees itself in terms of its ancient history, vast terrain, long coastline, and large population. It has a sense of superiority towards its neighbors in the Persian Gulf. On the other hand, the Arab states of the Persian Gulf have been influenced by Arab nationalism and distrusted their Persian neighbor. The approach of Iranian policy towards the Arab states of the Persian Gulf is very interesting. Tehran did not like its neighbors for their support of Saddam during the war. It also took a hostile stand

when they militarily aligned with the US. The Iranian government has been worried by their alliance with the United States. Iranian policy towards the Persian Gulf states seems to be influenced by its religious ideology and national interests. Ideology and national interest continue living side by side to varying degrees. The export of revolution is not only ideological, but also a political tool. This tool may not succeed in overthrowing their government but it is not without consequences in the Arab states of the region. With the losses of war and realization that "Iran could not afford to antagonize the rest of the world, a slow shift from ideology to national interest and deliberately pragmatic foreign policy has been observed" (Shagafi-Ameri, January 29, 2009). Tehran sent envoys to neighboring countries, even Saudi delegations with Foreign Minister Saud and King Fahad also visited Tehran but this did not last for too long. Before and during the Iran-Iraq war, Iranian policy can be characterized as more unthinking than driven by any well thought-out policy toward its neighbors. After the ceasefire, Tehran openly shifted to pragmatism and developed a foreign policy for the Persian Gulf region. As the result of its Gulf policy, Oman and Qatar began talking of the inclusion of Iran into regional security arrangements. A collective security arrangement between the littoral states of the Gulf without the presence foreign forces had been at the core of Iranian policy. Tehran advocated this policy strongly after Iraq's occupation of Kuwait. During the Khatami regime, this policy became more pronounced. Tehran changed its behavior and attempted to improve relations with its neighbors in the 1990s in spite of their alliance with the United States. Iranian Persian Gulf policy is now purely pragmatic and free of any territorial ambitions. The Persian Gulf became important in its own right and Iran has been able to portray itself as the bridge between its southern and northern neighbors. Tehran's charm offensive was positively welcomed in the Persian Gulf capitals. Iran and the GGC were calling for a new era in their relationship but this did not succeed due to their different opinion on the Arab/Islamic awakening, especially the Syrian crisis and Persian Gulf states' fears of the Iranian nuclear program. The earlier development of Tehran's rapprochement with the West, particularly the US on the nuclear program, proved that it briefly managed to improve its foreign policy. To sum up the Iranian policy towards its neighbors, it moved from being ideologically driven to pragmatic and based on geopolitics ever since the Islamic Revolution of 1979. Tehran is increasingly interested in good relations with its neighbors in order to tension in the region. The main hurdle is distrust, which is difficult to overcome, but many serious efforts have been made from all sides since the revolution.

Devastations of 2005 earthquake are in our memories with exemplary response of entire nation to extend every support to the victims. Extensive mobilization of resources from tents, blankets, medicines, and prefabricated houses by local artisans to the groceries, people donated abundantly for the restoration of normal life in affected areas. The response and the recovery from the floods during 2010 exemplify innate abilities of the nation to manage crisis effectively. Managing pandemics such as dengue, covid-19 and to the extent polio are also good examples of Country's ability to successfully respond to the crisis. Pakistan has surprised the world with her abilities to counter terrorism. We suffered the most, we sacrificed the most, we lost the most but we arose as the most successful nation in combating the terrorism. Our skills, our abilities, our determination and probably above all our engagement with every component of the society from rebels to internally displaced people made it a model for other nations to follow. We achieved what remained impossible for an alliance of 30 countries.

It is because of our exceptional abilities of crisis management as a nation. Our able professionals in every sphere of life from pure sciences to administrative and management sciences have always delivered their responsibilities religiously thus leading the nation to the achievements such as recent announcements by the MoS for foreign affairs. According to Kash and Darling from University of Pittsburgh, Kansas, USA, "a crisis is defined as any unplanned event that can cause serious damage to the public; shut down the businesses; disrupt operations; cause physical or environmental calamity; or threaten financial standing or image of the nation. Crisis management is defined as a series of functions or processes to identify, study and forecast the crisis, and set forth specific ways that would enable an organization to prevent or cope with a crisis. Crisis can be managed much more effectively if we prepare for them. Most crises do not occur suddenly. The signals can usually be picked up and the symptoms checked as they emerge. People determined to address these issues realize that the real challenge is not just to recognize crises, but to recognize them in a timely fashion." Crisis management consists of four distinct stages. Identification of crisis and the preparedness, the whole life in Islam moves around the preparedness for the life hereafter, 'the unseen'. To be prepared for the unseen is exactly according to the teachings, norms and centuries of practices of followers of Islamic way of life. Identifying what can lead to bitter outcomes in the life spreads over entire body of teachings in Islam. Therefore, to identify factors which can exacerbate the experience during the times of crisis are aligned with the spirit of Islamic teachings. Then, being prepared with all known aspects and resources to handle the crisis is the essence of teachings on Islamic way of life. In today's dynamic environment despite all the efforts a country can put forth to scan the environmental issues, crises can still occur and have to be managed. Acknowledging a crisis and communicating with the stakeholders are as important as planning the prevention, diagnosis, and intervention to solve crisis situations. Mitigation and prevention of crisis, during day-to-day operations one cannot predict every unseen aspect of operations.

Management of unforeseen issues which usually lead to a crisis is mostly missing in number of organisations around the world. Sometimes, despite appropriate measures, crisis surprises organisations with new and unique dimensions. Therefore, experience curve has its place in strategic planning and management about learning from mistakes. Managerial activities such as scenario analysis, contingency planning and focusing on the negatives of risk management to bring balance have evolved in contemporary studies. Minimising the risk and zero tolerance for violation of codes needs good management and governance practices with wide-ranging command and control systems for people with authority to develop efficient communities. Response and monitoring, we are prone to sudden and extensive crises due to complex operations and technological vulnerabilities. Organisations are now equipped to precisely predict when and what types of crises are expected to face. It is important for strong communities to ensure regular evaluation to determine preparations to deal with probable devastations. Four factors including people & leadership, financial position, stakeholder support, and supply chain risk management can provide sustainable recovery and effective review of the crisis to avoid incessant shocks. An able pool of professionals and technically trained people in the country has usually proved their abilities, such as the recent FATF crisis, to prevent the nation from complete breakdown and chaos. Our leadership despite several challenges rose to the occasion on several strategic fronts. We remained fortunate to have a close liaison with key stakeholders both globally and in the region, however, we certainly failed at some key occasions. last August and have been cut off from much international assistance because of sanctions. Shaking was felt by about 119 million people in Pakistan, Afghanistan and India, the EMSC said on Twitter, but there were no immediate reports of damage or casualties in Pakistan. The EMSC put the earthquake's magnitude at 6.1, though the USGS said it was 5.9. Adding to the challenge for Afghan authorities is recent flooding in many regions, which the disaster agency said had killed 11, injured 50 and blocked stretches of highway. The disaster comes as Afghanistan grapples with a severe economic crisis since the Taliban took over as U.S.-led international forces withdrew following two decades of war. In response to the Taliban takeover, many nations imposed sanctions on Afghanistan's banking sector and cut billions of dollars worth of development aid. Humanitarian aid has continued, however, with international agencies, such as the United Nations, operating.

Pakistan exports worth EUR 5.4 billion (approx. PKR 1.2 trillion), namely garments, bedlinen, terry towels, hosiery, leather, sports and surgical goods. During the mission, meetings with the government, the UN Country Team, International Labour Organization (ILO), business and civil society representatives as well as other stakeholders will take place. The findings of the mission will be part of the next GSP report, which is due to be presented to the European Parliament and the Council towards end of 2022. The European Union continuously monitors the implementation of relevant 27 international conventions drawing inter alia on the reports and information by the UN and other international agencies that are custodian of the respective convention. The EU regularly sends monitoring missions to assess the situation on the ground and to subsequently reflect its evaluation in the publicly available report to the European Parliament and to the EU Member States in the Council. So far, three biennial reviews have been concluded in 2016, 2018 and 2020, respectively. Apart from Pakistan, the EU currently unilaterally grants GSP+ tariff concessions to Bolivia, Cabo Verde, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, the Philippines, Sri Lanka and Uzbekistan. The current GSP framework is coming to an end in December 2023. Legislative process on its successor for 2024-2033 is ongoing.

Roy's century leads England to victory in third ODI

LONDON: Jason Roy hammered 101 off 86 balls and stand-in skipper Jos Buttler blasted 86 off 64 to help England clinch a comfortable eight-wicket victory over the Netherlands to seal an emphatic 3-0 one-day international series win. Buttler deputised for injured captain Eoin Morgan, who was suffering with a groin injury, and saw the Dutch dismissed for 244 as Scott Edwards (64) top-scored. David Willey finished the pick of the attack with 4-36 before England made light work of the total in 30.1 overs as Buttler and Roy guided them home with unbeaten knocks. This was the ninth time Buttler has skippered England in ODIs and his record reads won six and lost three. Morgan's enforced absence meant he

was denied the chance to atone for two consecutive ducks in the first and second matches in Amstelveen due to injury. It will inevitably raise question marks over whether, at 35 with his form and fitness seemingly deserting him, he will continue as England captain. Irrespective, the side Morgan built in his image continued their buccaneering approach to comfortably dispose of a Dutch side ranked 14th in the world. Buttler's innings was not quite as breathtaking as his incredible 162 off 70 balls in the first ODI but it was chanceless as he and Roy took England home relatively serenely. The win gave England 10 points in the ICC Cricket World Cup Super League, as they leapfrogged Bangladesh into top spot in the competition which determines qualification for the tournament in India in 16 months' time.

Williams wins comeback match

EASTBOURNE: After nearly a year since her last competitive match and just a few weeks after many people had predicted that Serena Williams, the 23-time Grand Slam singles champion, would never play again, she made her comeback on the tennis court. Williams took centre stage at Devonshire Park, which is often the centre of the sedate Sussex beach town's cultural activity and home to a variety of theatres. On an interesting evening,

the 40-year-old American won their opening match in the Eastbourne doubles tournament alongside Ons Jabeur of Tunisia. Williams hopes to compete in the Wimbledon singles event the following week, where she has won seven of her major championships. She admitted that after the game, she "definitely" had moments of uncertainty about continuing to play. "You know what, I'm literally taking it one day at a time," she said. "I really took my time with my hamstring injury, so I'm just not making a ton of decisions after this."

Bayern complete signing of Senegal star Mane

BERLIN: Bayern Munich confirmed the signing of Sadio Mane from Liverpool on Wednesday, as the Senegal forward signed a three-year deal with the Bundesliga champions. Bayern have reportedly paid a fee which could rise to 41 million euros (\$43 million) for Mane. The 30-year-old won the Champions League, Premier League, FA Cup, League Cup and Club World Cup titles during six years on Merseyside. "My agent told me that there were also enquiries from other clubs, but for me, the feeling was right from the start when Bayern presented their plan with me," Mane told German daily Bild.

"It was the right club at the right time. "It is one of the biggest clubs in the world and the team are always fighting for all the titles." Mane added he wants to "do everything to make sure I win titles with my teammates". Bayern won a 10th straight Bundesliga title last season. Mane, voted African footballer of the year in 2019, is a versatile attacker who has spent the majority of his career on the wing but can also play through the middle. His arrival will ease the pain for Bayern if wantaway striker Robert Lewandowski leaves the club, while Serge Gnabry is also stalling over a con-

tract extension. "Sadio Mane is a global star, who underlines the appeal of Bayern and will increase the attractiveness of the Bundesliga as a whole," said Bayern president Herbert Hainer. "Fans come to the stadiums to see unique players like this." The signing of Mane takes some pressure off Bayern

sporting director Hasan Salihamidzic after Lewandowski made it clear he would not extend his contract which expires next year. Mane netted 120 goals in 269 games for Liverpool. "In Sadio Mane, a top international star is coming to FC Bayern, who has left his mark on world football," said Salihamidzic. "We're proud to have brought him to Munich. "The fact that he's joining FC Bayern shows that our club and he have big aims." Mane left Senegal at the age of 19 to join Metz and spent a season in France before joining RB Salzburg, where he learned German. He switched to the Premier

Finland hopeful of resolving problems with Türkiye

BELGRADE: Finnish Prime Minister Sanna Marin said that she believes the problem regarding Türkiye's opposition to Finland and Sweden's NATO membership will be resolved before the alliance's summit in Madrid later this month. Marin's remarks came at a joint press conference with her Croatian counterpart Andrej Plenkovic in the capital Zagreb. Marin said that NATO should be united and Finland and Sweden would make the alliance stronger in the long run. Replying to a question, she said she believed a solution would be reached to Türkiye's opposition to the two Nordic countries' NATO memberships given NATO's open-door policy. The NATO leaders' summit is scheduled to be held from June 29-30. Plenkovic for his part said Croatia supports Finland in its bid for NATO membership. "We respect Finland's decision to become a member of NATO. Finland and Sweden also want NATO's security umbrella. Croatia is aware of the importance of NATO in today's world. Finland has a border with Russia," he said. Sweden and Finland formally applied to join NATO last month, a decision spurred by Russia's war on Ukraine, which began on Feb. 24. But Türkiye, a longstanding member of the alliance, has voiced objections to the membership bids, criticizing the countries for tolerating and even supporting terrorist groups.

UK govt criticized for railway strikes

LONDON: The British government on Wednesday came under fire as the country saw the highest inflation with 9.1% and the transport across the UK is on a standstill due to railway workers' strike this week. The opposition's Labour Party leader Keir Starmer said Prime Minister Boris Johnson and Transport Minister Grants Shapps did not do enough to stop the railway strikes, biggest in the last 30 years at the House of Commons during the prime minister's questions session. Johnson responded to criticism, saying his government is doing all it can to avoid the strikes, but it is up to the rail network's managers to negotiate with the unions. Johnson said 25 MPs joined the picket lines because the Labour Party takes £10 million (\$12 million) from workers unions. The Scottish National Party (SNP) leader at Westminster, Ian Blackford, questioned why the UK was doing worse than other European economies as the inflation in the country has reached the 40-year high. Johnson said inflation has become a global problem.

Russia records 3,058 COVID-19 cases

MOSCOW: Russia's COVID-19 case tally rose by 3,058 over the past day to 18,406,485, the anti-coronavirus crisis center reported on Wednesday, TASS reports. As many as 1,282 people were hospitalized with COVID-19 in Russia over the past day, down 14.6% from a day earlier. The number of hospitalized patients increased in 28 regions, while in 47 regions the figure decreased. The situation remained unchanged in ten regions. A day earlier, 1,501 people were rushed to hospitals. Moscow's COVID-19 cases surged by 256 over the past day versus 146 cases a day earlier, reaching 2,775,497, according to the anti-coronavirus crisis center. St. Petersburg's COVID-19 cases increased by 225 over the past day versus 214 a day earlier, reaching 1,534,624.

Sabina condemns Armenian crimes

BAKU: Human Rights Commissioner (Ombudswoman) Sabina Aliyeva condemned the attack by a group of Armenians on the Azerbaijani Cultural Center in Paris, France, Azernews reports, citing the Ombudswoman's Office. "I strongly condemn criminal actions of Armenia, based on hatred against Azerbaijan, as well as members of the Azerbaijani community abroad, and call on the Armenian side to refrain from attempts that impede peace talks and to fulfill its obligations and to respect human rights and freedoms," the ombudsperson stressed. As previously reported, a group

of Armenians attacked the Cultural Center of the Azerbaijani Embassy in Paris in order to disrupt the screening of the film "The Road to Karabakh". The protestors screamed offensive slogans about Shusha and Azerbaijan's Karabakh region, assaulted citizens, and showed violence. Aytan Muradova, vice-president of the French-Azerbaijani Dialogue Association, and other attendees were hurt in the incident. The provocation was stopped when police got to the site. "We regret that in many parts of the world, Azerbaijanis who try to convey the truth of Azerbaijani culture and history to the world community using freedom of speech, opinion, and expression have been repeatedly attacked on the basis of ethnicity and hatred," Aliyeva underlined.

Pak students excited upon arrival in China

BEIJING: The first batch of 90 Pakistani students who arrived in Xi'an, China by Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) charter flight showed overriding excitement upon long awaiting their return to China, according to Gwadar Pro. Salman Ali Bettani, a Ph.D. student at SIRPA Fudan University Shanghai, told Gwadar Pro that all students of the first batch are very happy and he hopes to join the campus soon for academic activities after the quarantine in Xi'an for 14-days. "I hope all Pakistani students will resume their study here and other around 7000 Pakistani will join us soon. I thank all Pakistani and Chinese authorities who made this possible," he expressed. Rabia Zeb Khan, a Ph.D. student at Xiamen University told Gwadar Pro that she is very excited to arrive in China and hopes to enter her school soon. "I'm thankful to the Chinese and Pakistani governments to provide us opportunities that we could resume our study on campus. All the arrangements from the airport to the hotel are excellent and we don't have any difficulty here. The Chinese staff is very cooperative," she expressed. Pakistani Ambassador to China Moin ul Haque also expressed delight for the Pakistan students in China. "PIA Special Flight bringing the first batch of Pakistani students has just landed in Xi'an. Students were seen off by Minister of Education Rana Tanveer Hussain at Islamabad airport. This is the first step yet an important one to safely bring back the remaining students to China," the Pakistani ambassador tweeted. Muhammad Rehman, a student at the Southeast University of China, expressed his satisfaction with the arrangements made by the Chinese and Pakistani authorities to return to China. "All the facilities in a hotel are admirable including food and COVID-19 testing. I wish other Pakistani students to join us soon and resume their studies," he added.

UK plans to rewrite human rights law

LONDON: The British government on Wednesday unveiled plans for a Bill of Rights it says will strengthen free speech and the power of Parliament – but that critics argue will rip up human rights protections for ordinary people. The government published the bill days after courts in the UK and Europe, on human rights grounds, stopped Prime Minister Boris Johnson's Conservative administration deporting people seeking asylum in Britain to Rwanda. If approved by Parliament – where it faces a battle – the legislation will raise the bar for bringing human rights legal claims. It will reduce the ability of foreign nationals convicted of a crime in Britain to challenge deportation on the basis of their human rights. The government says the goal is to

reduce "trivial" and "frivolous" claims. The law will also give British courts the power to ignore rulings by the European Court of Human Rights, currently the ultimate arbiter of rights law for dozens of countries, including the UK. It was an ECHR judge who ruled last week that an Iraqi man should not be sent to Rwanda under the government's controversial deportation plan, a judgment that led to the flight being grounded. Justice Secretary Dominic Raab said the

bill, which would replace the UK's Human Rights Act, would "curb abuses of the system and inject a bit more common sense" into human rights law. Raab said Britain would retain its "fundamental commitment" to the European Convention on Human Rights, but its move could set it on a collision course with the Council of Europe, which oversees the Strasbourg-based rights court. The government depicted the Bill of Rights as an assertion of British sovereignty

in the wake of the country's departure from the European Union. However, the European Court of Human Rights is unconnected to the EU; it is an international tribunal supported by 46 countries. Rights groups said the government's move would remove some of the main tools the public has to hold the powerful to account. Sacha Deshmukh, chief executive of Amnesty International UK, said "the public is being stripped of its most powerful tool to challenge wrongdoing by the government and other public bodies." Stephanie Boyce, president of the Law Society of England and Wales, said the Bill of Rights was "a lurch backwards for British justice." "Authorities may begin to consider some rights violations as acceptable, because these could no longer be challenged under the bill of rights despite being against the law," she said.

Kuwait dissolves parliament

KUWAIT CITY: Kuwait decided on Wednesday to dissolve the parliament and called for general elections as per legal and constitutional guidelines, Kuwait's Crown Prince Sheikh Meshal al-Ahmad al-Sabah announced in a televised speech. The decision, made based on Article 107 of the constitution, aims to correct the political path in the country. "We have decided to dissolve the National Assembly and call for general elections... The people themselves will have the final word in rectifying the political scene by selecting those who properly represent them," Sheikh Meshal said in a speech on behalf of Kuwait's Emir Sheikh Nawaf al-Ahmad al-Jaber al-Sabah. Sheikh Meshal attributed the current situation of the political scene – which he described as one marred by disagreements and guided by personal interests – to the fractured relation between the legislative and executive authorities as well as to the former's interference in the latter's work. He also said that the executive authority has not performed its duties "properly," adding that some officials have not "committed to the pledge to work toward achieving political stability and serving the country and its people."

Early heatwaves, drought hit Europe

LONDON: Extended drought conditions in several Mediterranean countries, a heat wave last week that reached northern Germany and high fuel costs for aircraft needed to fight wildfires have heightened concerns across Europe this summer. And it's only June. "Much of the continent is in drought," said Cathelijne Stoof, an environmental science professor at the Netherlands' Wageningen University, who called the wildfire outlook "very challenging across Europe." Fires last summer blackened more than 11,000 square kilometers (4,250 square miles) of land – an area more than four times the size of Luxembourg. About half of the damage was in the European Union. And, experts say, Europe's wildfires aren't just a problem for the southern, hotter countries. "What scientists are warning us is that (fires) are obviously going north and in countries such as the U.K., in countries such as Germany as well as in Scandinavian countries, in the future, we need to expect wildfires to happen more often," said Catherine Gamper, a climate change adaptation specialist at the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development. Wildfires across Spain have destroyed tens of thousands of acres of wooded land, though a recent sharp drop in temperatures is helping firefighters contain them. Spain's problems began with the arrival in spring of the earliest heat wave in two decades. Temperatures as high as those normally recorded in August rose above 40 C (104 F) in many Spanish cities.

Hamis decides to restore Syria ties

RAMALLAH: A decade after breaking relations with Syrian President Bashar Assad and decamping from Damascus, Hamas is in talks to resume ties with Syria, according to a source in the Gaza-ruling group. "The return of relations was part of discussions that took place for years with Iran and the Lebanese Hezbollah," the Hamas source told Egyptian media. "Hamas insisted that it was neutral and did not interfere, and gave positive indications to all mediators, and also obtained positive indications from Syria," the source added. According to the source, Hamas resuming ties with Damascus is not a matter that hasn't been discussed before. Speaking under the conditions of anonymity, the source added that the decision has been made over 10 months ago.

Turkish ship leaves Mariupol after grain talks with Moscow

ISTANBUL: A Turkish cargo ship on Wednesday left Ukraine's Russian-occupied port of Mariupol after a round of "constructive" grain talks with Moscow, Turkey's defence ministry said, without specifying if it was carrying wheat. "The meeting in Moscow gave its first concrete result," the Turkish ministry said in a statement. "Just a few hours after the end of the long meeting, the Turkish dry cargo ship, which had been waiting for days, left the Ukrainian port."

The statement added that the Azov Concord became the first foreign ship to leave the port in Mariupol - a city devastated by a weeks-long siege. Ukrainian officials estimate claimed 20,000 lives - since Russia's invasion in February. Turkey has been spearheading efforts to resume grain deliveries across the Black Sea that have been stalled by minefields and a Russian military blockade of Ukrainian ports. The meeting between Turkish generals and their Russian counterparts in Moscow reached "an understanding for future negotiations between Turkey, Russia, Ukraine and the UN", the Turkish statement said. "In this context, it was decided that a four-way meeting should be held in Turkey in the coming weeks, after a meeting with the Ukrainian side and the UN," said the defence ministry.

Flood response at highest level in China's Pearl River basin

BEIJING: Flood control authority in south China's Pearl River basin activated a Level-III emergency response on Tuesday. The response was taken to the highest level as escalating torrents in Beijing and Xijiang, both main rivers of the basin, are expected to make water levels continue to rise and maintain high for a long period, according to the Ministry of Water Resources. China has a further flood-control emergency response system, with level I being the most urgent and severe. The authority asked the Guangdong provincial government to strengthen monitoring and early warning, scientifically arrange flood detention and diversion measures, safeguard reservoirs and dikes, and well implement evacuation and rescue work in a bid to ensure safety of major dikes in Beijing and Xijiang and the Pearl River Delta city cluster.

ECP decides to deploy army for NA-245 by-polls

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) Wednesday decided to deploy the Pakistan army's soldiers for the upcoming by-elections in the NA-245 constituency of Karachi. The ECP has written a letter to the Secretary of the Ministry of Defence in this regard. According to the letter, the ECP has requested to keep the Pak army's soldiers on standby from July 26-28 to ensure transparent and peaceful elections for the constituency. The army soldiers will be deployed outside the polling station on the day of polling to keep them peaceful. The ECP has made the decision in wake of an earlier by-polls in Karachi this month which turned violent with different political groups resorting to firing and violence that also led to the death of a political worker. The votes will be cast in NA-245 on July 27. The seat became vacant after the passing of the PTI's estranged MNA Aamir Liquat Hussain.

Passenger jet catches fire while landing at Miami airport

MIAMI: Investigators were headed to Miami Wednesday after a passenger jet's landing gear collapsed and it caught fire as it touched down at the US city's international airport, forcing more than 100 people to flee the burning and mangled aircraft. Three people were hospitalized after the crash of Red Air Flight 203 late Tuesday, according to Miami-Dade fire officials, but no deaths or serious injuries have been reported

among those on board. Dramatic video footage showed people being evacuated from the McDonnell Douglas MD-82 aircraft, lying askew on the runway with its nose crumpled as thick black smoke billows from its body. Red Air, a Dominican budget carrier which only launched in November last year, said the plane was arriving from Santo Domingo when it met with "technical difficulties." "Red Air #203 from Santo Domingo had its landing gear in the nose of the plane collapse, which seems

to have caused a fire," said a statement on the Miami International Airport's Twitter account.

The National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB), the US government agency in charge of probing civil aviation accidents, tweeted that its team would arrive in Miami on Wednesday. Red Air said there were 130 passengers and 10 crew on board. A Miami airport spokesman said there was "a total of 126 people on board" the plane. The reason for the discrepancy was not immediately clear.

20 killed as Russia rains rockets

KYIV: Russian forces pounded Ukraine's second largest city Kharkiv and surrounding countryside with rockets, killing at least 20 people in what Kyiv called a bid to force it to pull resources from the main battlefield to protect civilians from attack. Inside Russia, a fire tore through an oil refinery just 8 km (5 miles) from the Ukrainian border, after what the refinery described as a cross border attack by two drones. In the main battlefield city of Sievierodonetsk, where Russia has claimed to have Ukrainian forces surrounded since last week, scenes filmed by a freelance journalist made clear the battle was not over, with Ukrainian troops able to resupply their garrison by crossing a river in inflatable rafts. The Russian strikes on Kharkiv, throughout Tuesday and continuing on Wednesday morning, were the worst for weeks in the area where normal life had been returning since Ukraine pushed Russian forces back in a major counter-offensive last month. "It was shelling by Russian troops. It was probably multiple rocket launchers. And it's the missile impact, it's all the missile impact," Kharkiv prosecutor Mikhailo Maratos told Reuters amid the ruins of cottages struck on Tuesday in a rural area on the city's outskirts. Medical workers carried the body of an elderly woman out of the rubble of a burnt-out garage and into a nearby van. "She was 85 years old. A child of the war (World War Two). She survived one war, but didn't make it through this one," said her grandson Mykyta. "There is nowhere to flee to. Especially grandmother herself, she didn't want to go anywhere from here." Ukrainian authorities said 15 people were killed and 16 wounded on Tuesday in the Kharkiv region, and regional governor Oleh Sinegubov described shelling incidents on Wednesday morning that had killed at least another five. "Russian forces are now hitting the city of Kharkiv in the same way that they previously were hitting Mariupol - with the aim of terrorising the population," Ukrainian presidential adviser Oleksiy Arestovych said in a video address.

Dua's father moves SC to stop couple from leaving Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: Dua Zahra's father Mehdi Ali Kazmi has approached the Supreme Court, once again, (SC) to stop his daughter and her husband from leaving Pakistan. Zahra who had mysteriously gone missing from Karachi in April but later declared that she had run away from her home to marry 21-year-old Zaheer Ahmed. Zaheer, in an interview, had hinted about taking Zahra out of Pakistan as they have seen the entire country, while responding to the question where the couple would have a "honeymoon." However, Kazmi on Wednesday filed a petition in the SC's Karachi registry, stating "Zahra has talked about travelling out of the country." The plea requests the court to restrict Zahra from giving more interviews and going out of Pakistan. Kazmi has also requested the court to order Zahra's "recovery" and production in the court.

Covid subvariants cast shadow over European summer

PARIS: A resurgence of Covid-19 cases in Europe, this time driven by new, fast-spreading Omicron subvariants, is once again threatening to disrupt people's summer plans. Several Western European nations have recently recorded their highest daily case numbers in months, due in part to Omicron sub-variants BA.4 and BA.5. The increase in cases has spurred calls for increased vigilance across a continent that has relaxed most if not all coronavirus restrictions. The first resurgence came in May in Portugal, where BA.5 propelled a wave that hit almost 30,000 cases a day at the beginning of June.

MBS heads to Turkey as countries normalise ties

The crown prince's visit is a reminder that Saudi-Turkish relations have progressed rapidly in the last two years

ANKARA: Saudi Arabia's Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman (MBS) has travelled to Turkey for the first time in years for talks with President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, aiming to fully normalise ties that were ruptured after the 2018 killing of Saudi journalist Jamal Khashoggi at the Saudi consulate in Istanbul. The Turkish president was due to welcome the crown prince at the presidential palace in Ankara for talks on Wednesday afternoon. No public statements are expected. The visit comes as part of a tour that included stops in Egypt and Jordan earlier this week. It is expected to bring "a full normalisation and a restoration of the pre-crisis period," a senior Turkish official told Reuters. "A new era will begin." Ties between

Ankara and Riyadh took a turn for the worse after a Saudi hit squad killed and dismembered Khashoggi in October 2018. Erdogan at the time blamed it on the "highest levels" of the Saudi government. MBS has denied any involvement in the murder. However, Ankara halted its murder trial in April, after a months-long drive to mend relations. The rapprochement was marked by Ankara's approval of a request to

transfer the trial to Riyadh. Human rights groups condemned the move, saying Saudi Arabia could not be expected to hold a fair trial.

MBS has been leveraging Saudi Arabia's vast wealth and oil production capacity to soften criticism of the country's human rights record. In turn, Erdogan is seeking financial support that could help relieve Turkey's beleaguered economy ahead of tight elections for the presidency, expected in 2023. Turkish officials said agreements on

energy, economy and security would be signed during the visit, while a plan was also in the works for Saudi funds to enter capital markets in Turkey. However, negotiations on a possible currency swap line that could help restore Turkey's diminished foreign reserves were not moving "as fast as desired" and would be discussed privately between the two leaders. Turkey's economy is badly strained by a slumping lira and inflation soaring beyond 70 percent. Saudi funds and foreign currency could help Erdogan shore up support ahead of elections, analysts say. The leaders will also discuss the possible sale of Turkish armed drones to Riyadh, Turkish officials told Reuters. Egyptian President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi received MBS at the airport on Monday evening, on the first leg of a Middle East tour that comes ahead of United States President Joe Biden's trip to the region next month.
