

Govt mulls limiting the market hours

All 4 provinces agreed in principle on the proposal to close down markets by 8:30pm; according to official handout

ISLAMABAD: A proposal to shut down markets at 8:30pm in an effort to conserve energy came under discussion on Wednesday during a meeting of the freshly reconstituted National Economic Council (NEC). Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif chaired Wednesday's meeting, which was attended by the chief ministers of Sindh, Punjab and Balochistan. Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Mahmood Khan did not attend the meeting and Chief Secretary Shehzad Bangash represented the province instead. According to a handout issued after the meeting, all four provinces agreed in principle on the proposal to close down markets by 8:30pm. However, the chief ministers of Sindh, Balochistan and Punjab sought two days to consult trade bodies and business communities in their respective provinces. During the meeting, the chief ministers were consulted on the national strategy for tackling the energy crisis. The participants

was crucial to stabilizing Pakistan's economy, he added. He said Pakistan enjoyed cordial and fraternal relations with Saudi Arabia. PIA resumes operations to Kuala Lumpur

KARACHI: The national carrier, Pakistan International Airline (PIA), on Wednesday announced to restore flight operations to Kuala Lumpur. PIA had suspended flight operations to the Malaysian capital as a measure to mitigate the spread of the coronavirus pandemic. According to the national airline flag carrier spokesperson, the PIA will start operating flights to Kuala Lumpur from June 26. The first flight will take off from Lahore. In addition, the national airline has increased flights to Azerbaijan's capital Baku. As per new schedule, the Pakistan International Airline will operate four weekly flights to Baku. The flights will operate from Islamabad, Karachi and Lahore airports. Last month, Pakistan International Airlines launched direct flights to Syria's capital Damascus from Karachi's Jinnah International Airport.

Imran Khan says will give long march call soon

Khan re-elected as PTI Chairman unopposed by the PTI's National Council

ISLAMABAD: Former Prime Minister Imran Khan on Wednesday was elected Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman for another term. Khan was elected unopposed by the PTI's National Council that met Wednesday

to elect central and provincial office-bearers. Former Foreign Minister Shah Mehmood Qureshi was elected vice chairman. Asad Umar was elected secretary general. Addressing the council, Imran Khan called upon its party members to be prepared for Islamabad, "the date of which," Khan said, "would be announced very soon."

Imran Khan said the incumbent government is allegedly doing delimitations to benefit themselves in the upcoming general elections. He said the main object of elections is to elect competent people who can run the country. Democracy is based on meritocracy, not on imperialism. Pakistan's history shows the country was ruled by dictators and then by two families, he added. Criticising PPP chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari

Indian police arrest BJP youth leader over hate comments

NEW DELHI: Police in northern India arrested a youth leader from the Hindu nationalist ruling party for posting anti-Muslim comments on social media after derogatory remarks by another party official about the Holy Prophet (Peace Be Upon Him) led to a diplomatic furore, officials said on Wednesday. Harshit Srivastava, a youth leader from Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Bharatiya Janata Party, was arrested in Kanpur city following communal tensions last week during a protest by Muslims to denounce the anti-Islam comments. "We arrested the local politician for making inflammatory remarks against Muslims," said Prashant Kumar, a senior police official, adding that

at least 50 people were taken into custody following the tensions in Kanpur. Srivastava's lawyer was not available for comment. Sporadic unrest was reported in other parts of the country after the comments against the Holy Prophet (PBUH) by BJP spokeswoman Nupur Sharma during a television debate. She has been suspended from the party while another spokesman, Naveen Kumar Jindal, was expelled over comments he made about Islam on social media, the BJP has said. Domestic outrage gained fresh momentum after leaders from Muslim nations such as Qatar, Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, Oman, Indonesia, Malaysia, Pakistan, Iran and Afghanistan demanded apologies from the Indian government and summoned diplomats to protest against the anti-Islam remarks.

'Green energy for sustainable growth a must for Pakistan'

Development Communications Network (Devcom-Pakistan) organized the webinar on the subject "Pakistan's Energy Crisis: Challenges and Opportunities

ISLAMABAD: Speakers at the webinar urged the government to come up with a national green energy policy reducing reliance on fossil fuel consumption and exploring to develop solar energy financing for every household. It would reduce heavy reliance on hydropower and hydrocarbon use and centralized grid stations.

The Green CPEC Alliance is expected to boost such initiatives with local partnerships once the enabling environment is provided and the one-window system is operationalized. Government shall direct most of the investments towards green energy generation rather than exploration of oil and gas reservoirs. We hardly discovered any new oil and gas reservoirs in the two decades despite investing huge funds. Let's change the position on energy mix with the significant increase of solar and wind energy.

Development Communications Network (Devcom-Pakistan) organized the webinar on the subject "Pakistan's Energy Crisis: Challenges and Opportunities under Green CPEC Alliance" on Saturday to mark the World

Environment Day. Senate Standing Committee on Defense Production Senator Mushahid Hussain Sayed chaired the session. Well-known environment and energy expert Qaiser Aijaz was the keynote speaker. Devcom-Pakistan Executive Director Munir Ahmed, research analyst Farhat Rana, Rabia Sarwar, Ommer Kulsoom, financial expert Iftikhar Ahmed and young environmentalist Salman also spoke on the occasion.

Senator Mushahid Hussain Sayed Pakistan government shall come up immediately with the green financing of the domestic-energy use. State Bank of Pakistan shall have a green energy financing policy for domestic use at a discounted rate. The federal and provincial resources shall be allocated to develop solar and wind energy farms to increase its share to 60 percent of total energy consumption. The hydropower plants are very expensive in terms of cost and time.

He said climate disasters are increasing day by day. Over 150 incidents happened in the last one decade. Need to adopt measures. Water scarcity has increased to the red point. Immediate construction of check-dams and small dams shall be the priority.

Qaiser Aijaz said Pakistan's main challenges from energy standpoint are the huge population of 220 million, non-availability of adequate indigenous energy resources, depleting oil and gas fields, no major oil and gas discoveries for past two decades, increased energy and oil prices in the international market, COVID pandemic after-shocks, political and economic challenges, and high country risk and security factors. He said the state-owned oil and gas companies be allowed to work independently, and constitution of a federal body consisting of highly qualified professionals for selection of their top management.

We shall provide constitutional cover to the energy policies, framework and approved projects for continuity regardless of any regime expires. Adaptation of integrated approach for addressing energy issues shall be based on up-stream oil and gas exploration and production, midstream petroleum oil refineries, and down-stream oil storages, pipeline transmission and distribution networks are managed under one umbrella. Development and implementation of an integrated approach and methodology to address energy Issues is the dire need.

NA okays PMDC Bill-2022

ISLAMABAD: The National Assembly on Wednesday passed the Pakistan Medical and Dental Council Bill-2022, aimed at reforming the PMDC to make it a democratic, independent and powerful body for producing professional doctors to serve the country. The bill, moved by Dr Mahreen Razak Bhutto and Syed Agha Rafiullah, was passed after clause by clause reading with a majority vote. According to the statement

of objects and reasons of the legislation, membership of the Pakistan Medical Commission(PMC) had been given mostly to non-medical professionals and irrelevant people making policies for medical and dental professionals. "One could imagine that if law-making and judicial policies making tasks are assigned to the medical and dental or other irrelevant professionals what would be the outcome?" The statement said there were more than 150 medical colleges and dental schools in the country that produced more than 12,800 doctors and 2,100 dental surgeons every year. "Our disease pattern is different from the USA (United States of America) and the UK (United Kingdom), and our cultural and social behaviour demands a different kind of attention."

It said majority of the country's population lived in an unhealthy and toxic environment as the rural areas and massive city slums were without clean water or sewerage system. The PMC Act-2022, it said, was not well thought-out and would not be acceptable. "It is time to restore PMDC with reforms to make it a democratic, independent and powerful body that can produce professional doctors who can work for the country." - APP

NEPRA fixes tariff by Rs

ISLAMABAD: The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) has fixed the electricity tariff at Rs24.82 per unit for the fiscal year of 2022-23 after a massive hike of Rs7.91 per unit. With the new hike, the one-unit price of electrifying has gone up from Rs16.91 to Rs24.82. The depreciation of the rupee and rising oil prices in the international market have been cited as reasons for the electricity tariff hike. According to the statement, Nepra has fixed the national average tariff for the financial year 2022-23 at Rs24.82 per unit, which is Rs7.91 per unit higher than the previ-

ANF seizes 3546.783 kg drugs; arrests 44 in 56 operations

RAWALPINDI: Anti Narcotics Force (ANF) Pakistan has seized 3546.783 kg drugs, 200 Liters Acetic Anhydride Chemical, 18.830 kg suspected material & 2035 kg poppy seed worth US\$ 773.421 million internationally, arrested 44 persons including a woman and impounded 17 vehicles while conducting 56 counter narcotics operations throughout the country.

According to an ANF Headquarters spokesman, the seized drugs comprised 474.625 kg Heroin, 724.652 kg Hashish, 1498.130 kg Opium, 0.670 kg Amphetamine, 176.404 kg Methamphetamine (Ice), 672 kg Morphine, and 0.302 kg weed. ANF Balochistan recovered 2825.25 kg drugs, 200 liters acetic anhydride chemical, 1.150 kg suspected material & 2035 kg poppy seed in 10 operations while arrested two accused persons and seized two vehicles

The seized drugs comprised 418.030 kg Heroin, 106 kg Hashish, 1465 kg Opium, 0.020 kg Amphetamine, 164.200 kg Methamphetamine (Ice) and 672 kg Morphine. ANF Punjab recovered 79.963 kg drugs in eight operations while arrested three accused persons in drug smuggling and seized three vehicles.

The seized drugs comprised 7.830 kg Heroin, 69.9 kg Hashish, 1.280 kg Opium & 0.953 kg Methamphetamine (Ice). ANF KPK recovered 184.785 kg drugs in seven operations while arrested four persons in trafficking of narcotics. The seized drugs comprised 2.400 kg Heroin, 180.400 kg Hashish and 1.985 kg Methamphetamine (Ice). ANF Sindh recovered 274.946 kg drugs & 17.08 kg suspected material in 16 operations while arrested 16 accused persons in drug smuggling and seized four vehicles. The seized drugs comprised 8.770 kg Heroin, 260.690 kg Hashish, 3 kg Opium & 2.486 kg Methamphetamine (Ice). - APP

CCP conducts search & inspection of three undertakings

ISLAMABAD: As part of an ongoing investigation into the prima facie violations of Section 4 of the Competition Act 2010, the Competition Commission of Pakistan (CCP) today carried out search and inspection of the offices of three companies (undertakings) based in Lahore, engaged in the supply of steel structures to DISCOS across Pakistan, on the suspicion of facilitating a possible bid-rigging/ cartelisation in the procurement of steel structures by various power distribution companies (DISCOs).

Three different teams of duly authorized officers of the CCP entered and searched the premises of the respective undertakings and seized pertinent information.

The search and inspections were carried out under Section 34 of the Act during which the office of the undertakings fully cooperated with the CCP's search teams by handing over the documents and computer-stored information relating to the suspected role of the respective undertakings in the alleged anti-com-

petitive activities. During the investigation, the enquiry committee analyzed the five years (2015 - 2020) tender documents provided by the DISCOs which revealed that only a few companies participated in the bidding process of steel structures floated by DISCOs apparently in a collusive manner which may constitute prima facie contravention of Section 4(2) (e) of the Act.

LHC upholds death sentence of two

RAWALPINDI: The Lahore High Court (LHC) Rawalpindi bench on Wednesday upheld the death sentence awarded by a lower court in a blasphemy case to the convicts. A division bench comprising Justice Raja Shahid Mehmood Abbas and Justice Muhammad Tariq Nadeem, while rejecting the appeals of Qaiasar Avub and Amun Ayub, upheld the lower court's decision on the publication of blasphemous material on

social media. According to details, both convicts had been sentenced to death by a lower court against which the convicts had filed an appeal in the High Court Rawalpindi Bench. The division bench had reserved its judgment on March 3, 2022, after hearing the appeals announced today.

It is to be noted that case No. 105/11, dated June 9, 2011, was registered in City Talagang Police Station against the accused of publishing blasphemous material on social media. The death sentence was handed down in 2018. - APP

M Tanveer assumes charge as MD WASA

RAWALPINDI: Newly appointed Managing Director (MD), Water and Sanitation Agency (WASA) Rawalpindi, Muhammad Tanveer on Wednesday took over the charge of his post.

Mohammad Tanveer has previously served as the MD WASA Lahore, DMD WASA Lahore as well as MD, WASA Rawalpindi.

After taking over charge of his post, he directed the authorities concerned of WASA Rwp to work hard for the supply of water to the citizens and remain in constant contact with the IESCO authorities regarding power load shedding so that water supply to the citizens could be managed properly. Repair work of the faulty tube wells should be completed on a war footing and in case of malfunction, water should be supplied to the affected areas through water bowsers, he added. He also visited different

city areas and inspected the ongoing dredging and de-silting work of Nullah Lai and instructed the authorities to expedite the pace of work.

The newly appointed MD also inspected the machinery to be used during the monsoon season and inspected various wells. - APP

More Chinese investment expected in Pakistan soon: Minister

ISLAMABAD: Pakistani Federal Minister for Planning and Development Ahsan Iqbal said on that more Chinese investment was expected in Pakistan soon, according to a report published by Gwadar Pro. He mentioned that during Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's recent visit to Balochistan and his meeting with Chinese investors, the Chinese companies had shown interest in investments in Gwadar.

The minister reiterated that the government was according topmost priority to speeding up work on projects under China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

Briefing the journalists on different projects approved by Central Development Working Party (CDWP), he informed that a power project at Diamer Bhasha dam worth Pakistani Rs900 billion had also been approved. Iqbal remarked that work on water supply scheme in Gwamillion gallon per day de-salination plant work will be completed by October to solve water issue in Gwadar.

He elaborated that 65 percent funding of the project will be made by the federal government while 35 percent will be borne by the provincial government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. He underlined that the new Gwadar International airport will also be completed by March next year.

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Climate Change Senator Sherry Rehman on Wednesday said the Ministry of Climate Change's task force has identified forest risk areas to ensure strict vigilance and monitoring of high risk regions and directed the provinces to replicate the system rolled out during the meeting.

Addressing a media briefing here flanked by Additional Secretary MoCC Jodat Avaz and IG Forest MoCC Raja Mohammad Omar, she said the task force report on forest risk areas identified was shared with the prime minister. She said, "Every province will have to mark low to high risk areas for strategic deployment of resources to contain

ravaging forest fires.' The Minister added that every province would have to mark low to high risk areas for strategic

deployment of resources during forest fires where the high risk areas to be monitored daily and Balochistan was especially apprised on the process.

The relevant forest departments of the provinces would form vigilance teams to be formed as per the directions of the ministry, she said, adding, latest drones would be used for vigilance of high risk areas. Earlier, a video of federal Minister highlighting environmental degradation impacts and challenges faced by the country including pollution, global warming and degradation of natural resources was showed to media men prior to media briefing.

three fires were again reported in Margalla hills, where two of them were contained and one was to be put out as fire fighting operation was underway.

"I request the masses to remove garbage and dry twigs that become source of forest fire during searing heat. Fire in Sherani forests kept blazing for ten days and we had to called a tanker aircraft from Iran to extinguish it", she said. She also appreciated the fire fighters who were facing serious fires with limited equipment and resources in very hard terrain areas. "We will have to tribute and salute the fire fighters for their efforts," she added. She also thanked the IWMB fire fighters, and Capital Development Authority (CDA) control room that helped reduce damage of life and property during repeated forest fires. - APP

Boris Johnson: a dead man walking

minster. Unfortunately for the Conservative party, those with the most to gain sit on the benches opposite. Few voters know exactly what Labour and the Liberal Democrats stand for, but both parties think that many more Tory seats will be vulnerable at the next general election if Mr Johnson remains in post. This is a reasonable belief. The government is out of ideas and exhausted. Tory despair is compounded by Mr Johnson presiding over an openly divided party.

On Monday night, more than four out of 10 of his colleagues said that Mr Johnson should go. That rebels could be found from all wings of the party, rather than in one organised faction, is an indication of how far the rot has spread. Conservative MPs would no doubt keep Mr Johnson if he helped them keep their jobs. The trouble is that opinion polls show that Mr Johnson is neither popular nor trusted even among Tory voters. The governing party is right to fear electoral retribution, one likely to materialise this month in two byelections where scandal-hit Tory MPs stepped down.

With such backbench resentment, it is hard to see how Mr Johnson will get the 38 bills in his Queen's speech through parliament. The prime minister has been unable to convince the public that he has the answers to household incomes being squeezed by inflation and public services being stretched to breaking point post-pandemic. His rhetoric of ready fixes and easy wheezes might have been funny once, but no one is laughing in a crisis. Voters won't believe a prime minister who has repeatedly failed to tell the truth about Downing Street's pandemic partying.

Conservative MPs might fret about the absence of anyone suitable to succeed Mr Johnson. The cabinet lacks the courage to tell him to go. But the prime minister is a dead man walking. He survives because no one wants to be responsible for finishing him off. This is only delaying the inevitable. The betting is that the Tory leadership rules will be changed to allow the prime minister to face another challenge sooner than next June.

The country needs new leadership, one that can produce policies, not just play to the gallery. Mr Johnson is comfortable with lying in politics. Despite agreeing on a customs border in the Irish Sea to get Brexit done, he now improbably claims he did not. Mr Johnson was never fit to be prime minister. He has not been able to face up to the difficult choices ahead. Britain should be led by someone who can.

As for the similar close encounters between Chinese and Australian planes, the responsibility for any mishap would lie on the Australian side: On May 26, contrary to the disingenuous claims of Canberra that the plane was engaged in "routine maritime surveillance activity" in international airspace, an Australian P-8 anti-submarine patrol aircraft repeatedly approached the Chinese airspace around the Xisha Islands in the South China Sea for close-in reconnaissance despite repeated warnings from the Chinese military. The People's Liberation Army's Southern Theater Command mobilized naval and air forces to identify it and warn it off. Such activities have indeed become routine, and China has good reason to ask what Canadian and Australian military craft are doing on its periphery so often. Such dangerous encounters would not happen if the Canadian and Australian militaries did not provocatively and irresponsibly come to ferret around China's periphery. It is extremely troubling that the two US allies in their enthusiasm to curry favor with Washington have heightened the frequency with

The United Arab Emirates' foreign ministry said the BJP officials' comments were "contrary to moral and humanitarian values and principles ."It insisted on the "need for respecting religious symbols... and countering hate speech.'

Calling for a boycott of Indian goods, Oman's grand mufti, Ahmad bin Hamad obscene rudeness of the official spokesman for the ruling extremist party in India." Many on social media echoed the boycott call under the hashtag #AnvoneButTheProphetOModi.

The Ukraine war hinges US and European credibility and claims to a moral high ground to countering accusations of double standards and hypocrisy by applying values and principles universally rather than selectively. However, the shoe is on the other foot when it comes to the brutal repression by China of Turkic Muslims in the north-eastern region of Xinjiang.

For opportunistic geopolitical reasons, United States, Europe, and of their partners and allies have been outspoken about Chinese policy in Xinilang and imposed relevant sanctions Virtually no Muslim partner of the US and Europe has joined the choir. On the contrary, some like Saudi Arabia have gone as far as justifying the repression. They did so to earn brownie points in Beijing and find common ground with China in suppressing domestic dissent and non-violent political Islam under the mum of fighting terrorism.

As a result, if the United States and Europe are throwing stones from a glass house, so are Muslim nations when they rightfully take India to task. It's a vulnerability that those eager to distract attention from BJP policies are happy to highlight. And a post-colonial mind can never think out of the box and hence it's one of the reason that our system in government sector may it be recruitment, selection, training and working is all flawed, a relic of our colonial legacy and hence needs to change. In order to make public sector efficient, the ACR or PER system need to revisit What is expected of him and what are the goals of the public sector organization, are not things which have anyweightage. What we have is "we only need a job aikachee pakki naukri" which is a euphemism for "I want a well-paid government job, with lifelong security and then pension, I want to be a sarkari afar". So candidates don't apply on the basis of relevance rather on the basis of job security. Most of our government Job seekers have the "Pakki naukri syndrome" (CSP's included). Some federal or provincial commission or autonomous department gives an add. The a candidates apply in huge number. The commission has an exam, an interview of 15 minutes and select an officer who will earn life long benefits. This raises the big question that how can you judge someone in 15 to 20 minutes. if someone performs well in those 15 minutes, he or she is then awarded lifelong security of tenure whereinhe/she knows that even if he or she performs badly they cannot be touched.

After the selection comes the training process. The Pakistan Civil Service and FPSC prides itself over its training modules for civil servants and ex- cadre officers but it doesn't produce innovators or out of the box thinkers. It doesn't produce problem solvers. They go into the academy as normal citizens but as soon as they come out they believe that they are somewhat above the normal middle class in the society. So now you have an even worse product, a product created by an age old recruitment and training process and made to fear the seniors because of ACR.

After this questionable out dated selection and training new breed emerges, a specie that was not a part of the elite but are now instrumental to elite interests. This new specie is trained to be careful about following orders, and doing all things possible to keep the boss happy coz in the end the boss gives an ACR. This yearly document is also often used by seniors to controls juniors like puppet. This is testimony that civil service can never bring an innovation.

The solution to this lies in replacing this out dated recruitment system and reframing replacing it with an innovative system of recruitment and progression.. the system should be applicable to public secor across the country Public sectors employee may it be PSP, PAS or lectureship should not have guarantee permanent job rather there should be a KPI system upon which the officer must be evaluated twice with a gap of 2.5 years. In my institution for instance, we have a system differentother public sectorsinstitutions. We grade employees based on the input that they have given in the past six months. A quantitative and qualitative criterion is there for instance an officer has to present two working papers, a knowledge brief anda policy view point. Based on these factors a grade is given low grade doesn't mean termination but the management gives you reason of what was lacking in your performance and how to make up for that, In what directions do you need to work and how to become good team member.

Although the system is now in its infancy but its results are positive. We have been able to maintain a competitive culture where in everyone tries to put up his/her best efforts and perform better. I firmly believe that such a system is the potential cure for many ills of the Government sector in Pakistan. Entire modern Economic Theory is on my back when I say this" people only work right if you give the right incentives, the ACR, PER give perverse incentives and henceis are roots of many evils, while a performance based system has the strength to make things more efficient in the Public sector.

Tehran eyes on Beijing's arms

In March 2010, it was reported that Iran had begun manufacturing Chinese-designed Nasr-1 anti-ship missiles. Just four years ago, during the 2006 Lebanon war, four Israeli navy soldiers were killed by an Iranian derivative of a Chinese C-802 subsonic anti-ship cruise missile launched by the Iranian proxy Hezbollah

in hinese minister of national defense Wei Fenghe visited Tehran in April 27, 2022 and met with high profile personalities of Iran. Wei Fenghe expressed that Iran sees China as a Strategic partner. The close cooperation of both the countries would provide security particularly in the current critical and tense situation. The intentions of both the countries demonstrate that their cooperation may lead

towards deep strategic coopera-After meeting with PresidentEbrahimReiss, the two sides agreed to expand all areas of cooperation, including the military, while reiterating their shared commitment to protecting fundamental interests, which they called the West's "unilateral, domination and external intervention." Admittedly, it emphasizes mutual inattention. United States. After meeting with AFGS, the two countries "agreed

to enhance bilateral cooperation in joint military exercises, exchange of strategies, training matters and other common areas." Due to Baqeri's strong defense diplomacy, Iran's relations with the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) have become closer in recent years. In 2019, Baqeri became the first Iranian armed forces chief of staff to visit China since the 1979 Islamic Revolution. In addition, Wei Feng's visit was the third high-level PLA delegation to visit Iran since 2016, which coincided with Baqeri's appointment as head of state. It shows that there is more going on below the surface.

China has reaffirmed its commitment to peace and security in the Middle East and the Gulf. At the same time, he criticized the United States for imposing unilateral sanctions on Iran and proposed a series of forgotten alternative security frameworks for the Gulf, which undermined the US-led security umbrella in the region. It may ensure the prosperity of Beijing and the free flow of oil.

China has been considered suspicious of arms supply to Iran during the sanctions and it also has been cautious with Iran over the UN arms embargo, which was in effect until October 2020. Once sanctions lift, private and stateowned companies may seek to diversify their portfolios by selling military assets. China was the largest supplier of weapons to both sides during Iran-Iraq war, they bought more than 7. 7.5 billion Arms in the late 1980s. According to the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute, China took advantage of a flaw in pre-2006 orders to continue supplying weapons to Iran after the years of sanctions. These weapons

were anti-ship missiles, surface-toair missiles; armored personnel carriers, surface-to-air missile systems, air search radar and missile launch catamarans systems reached Iran. Strengthen the denial of disproportionate territory. In recent years, Iran has used its control over this strategic barrier of Strait of Hurmoz, through which is one-fifth of the world's oil passes, to attack passing tankers and shoot down US drones. For their own reasons, China and Iran are trying to develop A2 / AD capabilities on their shores to counter US and allied navies. Both countries practice drowning American aircraft carriers in make-ups. He has also helped develop long-range anti-ship missiles, demonstrating how Chinese companies can boost Iran's development of indigenous weapons. In March 2010, it was reported that Iran had begun manufacturing Chinese-designed Nasr-1 anti-ship missiles. Since the lifting of sanctions in 2020, bilateral arms purchases

have not been reported, possibly due to Tehran's economic woes and possible backlash from Iran's rivals (especially through US Executive Order 13949). But Iran's defense industry is showing interest in Chinese weapons, especially fighter jets. The possibility of future deployment of Chinese J-10 fighter jets in the Persian Gulf was raised by former US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo, and there is no question of a jet trade for energy. With the possibility of a resumption of the nuclear deal, may allow Tehran to gain greater access to funds could lead to a growing concern for the arms trade with Washington and its allies. Some analysts have ruled out the possibility of China becoming a major arms exporter to Iran in the post-sanctions period, but as the Lebanon war and recent bombings have made clear, Chinese technology is in the wrong hands. Drones, dual-use and missile technology are also of concern. Unlike other major arms suppliers in the region, China is not a party to the Wassenaar Agreement, which could make it the largest supplier of armed drones in the Middle East Region. Because Iran can manufacture its drones locally, Tehran's opponents currently use Chinese drones exclusively. Reports have revealed Chinese support for the local production of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) in the Gulf States, including a recent joint venture between China and Saudi Arabia to develop military drones in the kingdom. Given China's high-quality, low-cost drones, as well as its ability to transfer knowledge and upgrade Iranian UAVs, the possibility of bilateral cooperation in this emerging field cannot be ruled out.

Duringthe recent years, both the country have increased their military cooperation with their navies visiting each other's seaportsand organized joint naval drilling in the Indian Ocean. In March 2021, China Iran has signed a 25-years strategic cooperation agreement. It also covers all variety of cooperation and economic activities from oil and mining to establishment of industries in Iran. The improvement of strategic and defense cooperation between Chin and Iranwould have a remarkable impact in diffusing unilateralism and fighting terrorism in the region.

US sanctions have 'returned like boomerang,': Maduro

ANKARA: US sanctions have "returned like a boomerang," affecting the American and European economies, Venezuela's President Nicolas Maduro told Anadolu Agency. In an exclusive interview with Anadolu Agency on Wednesday, Maduro said "it is very difficult" when he was asked about the possibility of the lifting of US sanctions against Venezuela.

"Because the US empire has always been caught up in its own aggression. Look at what is happening right now with Russia. All the sanctions imposed - more than a thousand economic sanctions against the Russian economy, agriculture, oil, and gas have returned like a boomerang, and today they have returned against the European and American economies, which are creaking with galloping inflation, and they also affected the economies and economic rights of all the countries of the world."

Caracas made an "important contact" on March 5 with a delegation from the US government, and they maintained a fluid, permanent communication, Maduro said, adding Washington authorized American oil company Chevron, Italian Eni, and Spanish Repsol to move their investments in Venezuela to produce oil and gas for its natural

Summit of the Americas organized by the Organization of American States, Maduro said that the exclusion of his country along with Nicaragua and Cuba, which he called "anti-imperialist countries in Latin America and the Caribbean," has been rejected by more than 25 governments across the region. "This meeting of the Americas has been transformed into a meeting of the protest of the governments against exclusion and a lesson has been taught to the American empire that ... the time of the imperial orders is over," he

"And I would say that it was a huge mistake made by the country's administration to try to exclude our country," Maduro said, referring to Caracas' absence in Los Angeles. He further said: "Unfortunately, that so-

Asked whether he plans to meet with Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavroy, who is also in the Turkish capital Ankara for contacts, Maduro said he did not know that Lavrov is also in Ankara, but added: "If I can see him, I would be very happy. He is a great friend."

Maduro said he has already been in "this beautiful Turkish homeland" on several occasions, hailing "the great friendship" Türkiye and Venezuela enjoy. He said Ankara and Caracas have already agreements in various areas, such as commerce, finance, science, technology, agriculture, mining, and energy. In 2021, Türkiye and Venezuela reached a commercial exchange of \$858 million, he said, adding the

goal is to reach \$1.5 billion between 2022 and 2023. "And this visit precisely has the objective of adjusting new issues that allow us to grow in everything: comprehensive cooperation in the economic, scientific, technological, and energy areas," the president said. "We have never had such a close relationship with Türkiye or with this region of the world as we have today. That is why I tell you the world is much more than the United States and the West," he said, adding that Türkiye is "one of the most important regions."

On the third meeting of the High-Level Joint Commission of Türkiye and Venezuela, which has been held recently, Maduro said: "There we are seeing a growth plan for the next 10 or 15 years of all commercial, agricultural, energy, and financial relations. "I can tell you that Venezuela is the best guarantee that Turkish businessmen can have to make their investments in Latin America and the Caribbean," he said. "Venezuela can be the port of arrival for all the products of great industry and great production of Türkiye to Latin America and the Caribbean. We give all the legal guarantees to the Turkish investors so that they will present their work." Recalling Venezuela's economic suffering for years, Maduro said 2021 was the first year of a definitive slowdown in inflation, construction of new macroeconomic instruments, exchange rate stability, and economic growth in Venezuela.

Food exports must keep flowing: FAO chief

UNITED NATIONS: As part of the international efforts to address growing concerns over the Ukrainian-war-linked global food security, a top UN official on Wednesday urged countries not to slap restrictions on the export of foodstuffs that are in such short supply elsewhere. "Food insecurity and high prices can become a trigger for instability," Qu Dongyu, Director-General of the UN Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), said in a statement. Addressing the "Mediterranean Dialogue on Food Crisis" in Rome, Qu insisted that "we must keep the global

food trade system open and ensure that agrifood exports are not restricted or taxed". The Mediterranean Sea region includes 22 countries on three continents, many of which rely on cereal imports from Ukraine to feed their population, the FAO top oficial said. Most countries in the region had shown an increasing food import trend to meet domestic consumption needs even prior to the war in Ukraine, he added. Today, the current global situation is "very complicated", Qu said, his comments coming after more than 100 days of war in Ukraine that have cut off exports of millions of tonnes of wheat, cereals and vegetable oil from the country's Black Sea ports since the Russian

invasion on 24 February. The war has also prompted targeted international sanctions on Russia that have in turn hampered the distribution of its own substantial agricultural output and fertilizers - which farmers rely on around the world. To counter these challenges, countries in the Mediterranean should work together to mitigate food security risks, Qu told delegates. – APP

Sudan starts post-coup talks without key civilian bloc

KHARTOUM: Sudan on Wednesday began UN-facilitated direct talks between rival factions, hoped to resolve a political crisis sparked by last year's coup, but with a critical civilian bloc refusing to participate. Meanwhile, hundreds of people rallied in east Khartoum to call for civilian rule, in the latest protest against the October 25 power grab led by army chief Abdel Fattah al-Burhan. Security forces fired tear gas to disperse them, said an AFP correspondent at the scene. "It is important to not let this moment slip," United Nations special representative Volker Perthes told reporters in Khartoum. "We are asking everybody to work with one another in good faith." Since the coup, Sudan has been rocked by deepening unrest - near-weekly protests, a violent crackdown that has killed over 100 people, and a tumbling economy.

The military takeover derailed a fragile transition to civilian rule that had been established following the 2019 ouster of long-serving autocratic president Omar al-Bashir. The UN, African Union and regional bloc IGAD have since March been pushing for Sudanese-led talks to break the political stalemate. - Agencies

Zverev undergoes ankle surgery

BERLIN: Alexander Zverev has had surgery on torn ligaments in his right ankle following his painful exit from the French Open semi-finals. The German world number three turned his ankle while trailing eventual champion Rafael Nadal in the last four in Paris last week, screaming in pain before retiring from the match. The 25-year-old did not say when he will be back on court, but looks certain to miss Wimbledon which begins on June 27. The US Open starts on August 29. We all have our own journey in life. This is part of mine," Zverev wrote to his 1.8 million followers on Instagram late Tuesday alongside a picture of him giving a thumbs-up from a hospital bed. "Next week I'll reach a career-high ranking of number two in the world, but this morning I had to undergo surgery. "After further examination in Germany, we received confirmation that all three of the lateral ligaments in my right ankle were torn. "To return to competition as quickly as possible, to ensure all the ligaments heal properly, and to reclaim full stability in my ankle, surgery was the best choice."

BRUSSELS: The European Union cannot tolerate Russia's use of food as a weapon, the EU Commission chief said on Wednesday, Speaking at the European Parliament's plenary session in Strasbourg, Ursula von der Leyen warned: "We are facing up to a collision of crises, which will amplify food insecurity and debt distress around the world."

She explained that the origins of these crises are partially structural and also related to the COVID-19 pandemic, but stressed that the impacts are "massively and deliberately compounded by Putin's actions." "Food has become part of the Kremlin's arsenal of terror, and we cannot tolerate this," von der Lev-

Baku, Prague mull energy cooperation

BAKU: Azerbaijan and the Czech Republic have discussed the energy cooperation issues between the two countries. Azernews reports, citing the Energy Ministry. The discussion took place during the meeting between Azerbaijan's Energy Minister Parviz Shahbazov and outgoing Czech Ambassador Milan Ekert.

At the meeting, the parties discussed the energy cooperation agreement signed between Azerbaijan's Energy Ministry and Czech Republic's Industry and Trade Ministry. They also exchanged views on the establishment of a joint working group and holding its first meeting.

On September 30, 2021, Azerbaijan and the Czech Republic signed an agreement on energy cooperation. The agreement envisages the expansion of bilateral cooperation in the spheres of oil and gas, petrochemicals, renewable energy, including bioener gy in the field of energy, and the establishment of relations between the relevant sectors in line with both countries national legislation.

The document also covers the development of energy efficiency and energy-saving cooperation in the residential sector and large energy enterprises, and the matters such as the mutual exchange of information and practices, training sessions, joint seminars, conferences, and forums.

Workers stage protest in Australia for better pay

SYDNEY: Thousands of Australian public service workers on Wednesday staged a protest across New South Wales (NSW), Australia's most populous state, demanding better salaries, according to local media.

They also boycotted a day of work, demanding a 5.49 rise in their salaries because of the skyrocketing cost of living in the country, Sky News reported.

State premier Dominic Perrottet already announced a 0.5% increase to the public service annual pay cap but workers have rejected the raise, calling it "not enough." Over 30,000 workers including prison guards, court sheriffs, child protection officers, school support staff and park rangers took part in the protest.

"This offer is pure politics - moving half a per cent and playing silly games with one-off bonuses for certain workers," the broadcaster quoted Stewart Little, Public Service Association's general secretary, as saying. According to the Sydney Morning Herald, Australia is witnessing the biggest energy crisis in 50 years, with prices hitting multi-year highs on global markets due to sanctions on Russian exports.

US arrest man who threatened SC justice

WASHINGTON: US police arrested an armed man who made threats against Brett Kavanaugh near the conservative Supreme Court justice's home, the court said Wednesday.

"At approximately 1:50 AM today, a man was arrested near Justice Kavanaugh's residence. The man was armed and made threats against Justice Kavanaugh," court spokeswoman Patricia McCabe said in a statement. The arrest came as the court prepares to release potentially landmark judgements on politically charged cases on gun rights and abortion. The Washington Post, citing anonymous officials, said the man was arrested not far from Kavanaugh's house in Chevy Chase, Maryland, just outside of Washington, carrying a weapon and burglary tools. He told officers that he wanted to kill the justice, the Post said. The report said investigators understood from initial evidence that the man, in his 20s, was angry about a leaked draft opinion that indicated the court could be poised to overturn federal protections for abortion rights, which will likely allow many states to ban the procedure outright. - APP

Biden to attend G7, NATO summits this month

WASHINGTON: US President Joe Biden will travel to Europe later this month to attend two major summits, according to a White House spokeswoman Wednesday. Biden will travel to Schloss Elmau in southern Germany on June 25 to attend the G7 Leaders' Summit, Karine Iean-Pierre said in a statement.

"The President and G7 leaders will discuss a range of the most pressing global issues, including the G7's unwavering support for a democratic, sovereign, and prosperous Ukraine, economic and democratic resilience, tackling the climate crisis, development infrastructure, global health security, and the food and energy crisis caused by Russia's war of aggression," she said.

Biden will then head to Madrid to join the 2022 NATO Summit. "Allied leaders will endorse a new Strategic Concept to guide NATO's transformation over the next decade, from strengthening deterrence and defense, to building resilience against transnational threats including cyber and climate, to deepening partnerships with democratic partners in Europe and Asia in order to strengthen the rules-based international order," said the statement.

TOKYO: Japan's main opposition submitted Wednesday a no-confidence motion against the Cabinet of Prime Minister Fumio Kishida over its response to rising prices and another against the House of Representatives speaker mired in a sexual harassment scandal as the end of the current Diet session nears ahead of a House of Councillors election, Kyodo reports.

Kenta Izumi, who heads the Constitutional Democratic Party of Japan, told

reporters ahead of the submission that his party cannot overlook the Kishida government's failure to protect people's lives from the impact of rising prices. Tsuyoshi Takagi, Diet affairs chief of the ruling Liberal Democratic Party,

said the ruling coalition of the LDP and Komeito party will vote down the motion against the Cabinet «without making a fuss» as there is «no clear reason of no confidence.» Takagi said Kishida has the option of dissolving the lower house in response to the motion. He also said they will vote

down the other motion for Hiroyuki Hosoda. The lower house speaker was recently reported by a weekly magazine to have sexually harassed women including a reporter and an LDP employee. Izumi criticized Kishida's Cabinet for only taking measures against rising gasoline prices, which centered on subsidizing wholesalers, in the fiscal 2022 supplementary budget, saying, «It will neither protect people's lives nor revive the Japanese economy.»

"This recent move by three European countries and the US by presenting a draft resolution against Iran is a political one," Eslami said, adding Iran had maintained maximum cooperation" with the IAEA.

The trigger for the latest Western condemnation was a report issued by the IAEA late last month, in which it said it still has questions about traces of enriched uranium previously found at three sites, which Iran had not declared as having hosted nuclear activities.

The UN watchdog said those questions were "not clarified" in its meetings The IAEA board of governors is expected to vote on the motion later on Wednesday or on Thursday, diplomats said. The talks to revive the nuclear accord started in April 2021 with the aim of bringing the United States back in, lifting sanctions and getting Iran to return to the limits it agreed to on its nuclear activities.

negotiations have stalled in recent months and the European Union's top diplomat JosepBorrell warned last weekend that the possibility of returning to the accord was "shrinking". IAEA head Rafael Grossi said Monday that it would be "a matter of just a few weeks" before Iran could get sufficient material needed for a nuclear weapon if it continued to develop its programme. - APP

UNAOC slams anti-Islam remarks by **BJP's leaders**

UNITED NATIONS: The top official for the U.N. Alliance of Civilizations (UNAOC), Miguel Moratinos, has rejected the "derogatory" comments about holy Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) and Islam made by two leaders of India's ruling party BJP, warning that such remarks will lead to violence.

Moratinos, the High Representative of UNAOC, an initiative aimed at galvanizing international action against extremism, also said that "offensive comments or actions that aim at insulting Muslims and/or adherents of any other faith will lead to incitement of violence and will fuel hatred".

In a statement, he reiterated the importance of strengthening efforts to advance respect for all religions and beliefs and fostering dialogue on the promotion of a culture of tolerance and peace at all levels, based on respect for human rights and for the diversity of religions and beliefs.

The condemnation from the United Nations comes against the backdrop of massive diplomatic protests across the Muslim world over BJP's leaders remarks insulting the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH).

In an attempt at "damage control" and to quell the anger sweeping across the Muslim world, the BJP, which is led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, suspended its national spokesperson, Nupur Sharma, and expelled its Delhi media head, Naveen Kumar Jindal, calling them as "fringe elements". But the move has had little success. - APP

MEPs vote down key part of EU climate plan

STRASBOURG: The European Parliament on Wednesday voted to reject a reform of the EU carbon trading system, in a surprise setback to Brussels' plan to tackle the climate crisis.

The EU has vowed to cut greenhouse gas emissions by 55 percent by 2030, but Green and socialist MEPs judged the plan to expand carbon trading insufficiently ambitious. The legislation to expand the EU Emissions Trading System (ETS) to include carbon from transport and construction is a keystone of Brussels' entire climate package.

It also foresees the abolition of exceptions to the carbon trading scheme for European industry in exchange for a carbon tax on imports at the EU's borders.

The text will now go back to the parliament's environmental committee to be re-negotiated, in a severe blow to the European Commission's key legislative project. There were fierce recriminations following the vote, with conservative and liberal members accusing the socialists of allying with extremists to defeat the measure by 340 votes to 265. The left in turn accused the right of watering down the plan in committee, forcing those seeking a more ambitious goal to make a stand by rejecting its quick passage. - APP

India has become 'vindictive nation'

WASHINGTON: A prominent Indian journalist, referring to the backlash in Muslim countries over the blasphemous remarks against Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) by two leaders of India's ruling party, BJP, denounced Prime Minister Narendra Modi for remaining silent amid growing protests across the country and beyond. "Throughout all of this, the

social-media-savvy Modi - known to invoke values of pluralism abroad - has remained silent as Indian democracy has descended into hate and is humiliated with international backlash," wrote Rana Ayyub in an article published in The Washington Post's Wednesday edition.

"To me – a journalist who has been reporting on the Indian government's relentless attacks on the country's more than 200 million Muslims since Modi assumed power in 2014 - this global reaction was long in the offing," she wrote. – APP

SHC allows Dua Zahra to decide her fate

KARACHI: The Sindh High Court (SHC) Wednesday allowed teenager Dua Zahra who had mysteriously gone missing from Karachi in April but later declared that she had run away from her home to marry 21-year-old Zaheer Ahmed - to decide where she wants to go, with her parents or husband.

In a three-page written order, Justice Junaid Ghaffar said the court reached the verdict in line with the testimonies. "In light of all the evidence, this is not a case of kidnapping.'

"...the alleged/minor Dua E Zahra Kazmi, pursuant to her statement on Oath and Age Certificate is set at liberty to decide as to whom she intends to reside and go along," the order read.

In the order, the court also said that it has decided to dispose of Zahra's father's -Mehdi Ali Kazmi - petition for her recovery as the case of his daughter was not of kidnapping. For the production of Dua before the Lahore High Court later this week, the SHC said the Sindh Police is at liberty to produce her if required. But the judge said that "we, after production and statement of the alleged abductee Dua, are not inclined to issue any further directions to that effect."

The SHC earlier in the day reserved the verdict after police presented Dua and her 21-year-old husband Zaheer Ahmed before the court after the ossification test as per the court's orders passed in the last hearing. During hearing, Justice Ghaffar allowed Dua's parents to meet her for 10 minutes in his chambers as they were not permitted to speak to her earlier.

Indian police arrest dozens of youth in IIOJK

DNA SRINAGAR: In Indian ille-

gally occupied Jammu and Kashmir, Indian police have arrested dozens of youth during house raids in different areas of the territory. According to Kashmir Media Service, Indian police during raids across occupied Jammu and Kashmir detained several youth for their affiliation with the ongoing struggle for right to self-determination in the occupied territory.

Police have rounded up a number of individuals and initiated legal action against them as they have been found to be involved in the ongoing struggle, the officials claimed. Police have raided the residences and work places of such people and investigations with regard to the level of their involvement are underway, they said.

Raids have been carried out at several places in Srinagar, Baramulla, Islamabad, Kulgam, Jammu, Ramban, Udhampur and Kathua districts, the officials said. As on today (Wednesday), dozens of suspected have been picked up across the territory, they added.
