PM addresses nation

Independence sans economic self-reliance not possible

"Why this nation is still lost even when God has blessed it?" he questioned

ISLAMABAD: On the eve of August 14, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif told the nation that there is no concept of a nation's independence without economic self-reliance. In a televised address to the nation on Saturday, the prime minister reiterated his call for the formation of a "charter of economy", saying that time has come for Pakistan to head in the right direction. "We should keep national interest above personal interest [...] as real political leadership does not look towards the next elections, but at the future of the next generation," he said. "Most importantly, we will need to revive the passion that led to the creation of Pakistan," he said, noting that this passion will lead to the establishment of a great nation. The prime minister's call for economic stability comes as the cash-strapped nation desperately seeks financial assistance from friendly countries and the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

The country's foreign reserves held by the State Bank of Pakistan were recorded at \$7,830.3 million, down \$555 million compared with \$8,385.4 on July 29, data released by the SBP on Thursday showed, which can cover fewer than 1.12 months. Jeddah Terror Attack

Pak reiterates 'full support' to KSA

The Foreign Office (FO) expresses solidarity with the kingdom

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Saturday condemned the recent terror attack in Saudi Arabia's Jeddah in which four people were injured, including a Pakistani national. Earlier this week, a Saudi Arabian man wanted in connection with a deadly 2015 bombing in the kingdom detonated an explosive device in Jeddah as security forces attempted to arrest him, killing himself and injuring four others, state media reported. The Saudi news agency SPA identified the man as Abdullah bin Zayed Al-Shehri.

The report said that Al-Shehri detonated the explosive belt on Wednesday night in Jeddah's Al Samer neighborhood, injuring three members of the security forces, who were seeking to arrest him, and a Pakistani national. The injured, who were not

named, were taken to hospital, SPA said, without giving details of their injuries. According to Saudi state media reports Al-Shehri was suspected of being a member of a domestic terrorism cell that coordinated the 2015 suicide bombing of a mosque in Abha frequented by security force members. The Saudi Arabian government named Al-Shehri in early 2016 as one of six Saudi nationals wanted in connection with the bombing. The Foreign Office (FO) expressed solidarity with the kingdom and prayed for the speediest recovery of those injured.

"The government and people of Pakistan reiterate their full support for and deep solidarity with the leadership, government and brotherly people of Saudi Arabia against any threats to the Kingdom's sovereignty and territorial integrity," it said in a brief statement.

Taliban violently disperse women's protest in Kabul

About 40 women - chanting "bread, work and freedom" - marched in front of the education ministry building in Kabul, before the fighters dispersed them

KABUL: Taliban fighters beat women protesters and fired into the air on Saturday as they violently dispersed a rare rally in the Afghan capital, days ahead of the first anniversary of the group's return to power. Since seizing control on August 15 last year, the Taliban have rolled back the marginal gains made by women during two decades of US intervention in Afghanistan.

About 40 women - chanting "bread, work and freedom" - marched in front of the education ministry building in Kabul, before the fighters dispersed them by firing their guns into the air, an AFP correspondent reported. Some women protesters who took refuge in nearby shops were chased and beaten by Taliban fighters with their rifle butts. The demonstrators carried a banner

which read "August 15 is a black day" as they demanded rights to work and political participation. "Justice, justice. We're fed up with ignorance," they chanted, many not wearing face veils. "Unfortunately, the Taliban from the intelligence service came and fired in the air," said Zholia Parsi, one of the organisers of the march. "They dispersed the girls, tore our banners and confiscated the mobile phones of many girls." But protester Munisa Mubariz vowed to continue fighting for women's rights. "If the Taliban want to silence this voice, it's not possible. We will protest from our homes," she said. Some journalists covering the demonstration the first women's rally in months – were also beaten by the Taliban fighters, an AFP correspondent saw. While the Taliban authorities have allowed and even promoted some rallies

against the United States, they have

declined permission for any women's rally since they returned to power. After seizing control last year, the Taliban promised a softer version compared to their time in power from 1996 to 2001. But many restrictions have already been imposed, especially on women, to comply with the movement's vision.

Tens of thousands of girls have been shut out of secondary schools, while women have been barred from returning to many government jobs. Women have also been banned from travelling alone on long trips and can only visit public gardens and parks in the capital on days separate from men.

In May, the country's supreme leader and chief of the Taliban, Hibatullah Akhundzada, ordered women to fully cover themselves in public, including their faces – ideally with an all-encompassing burqa.

District Health Officer Dr Ataul Mun'im said on Saturday 4,756,802 citizens were injected first dose while 4,024,397 were administered the second dose of vaccine.

He further said that 39,878 health workers were given first dose whereas 45,379 received the second dose of vaccine. He said that sufficient stock of coronavirus vaccine was available in the district. As of now 60.541 first doses and 40,360 second doses were in the stock in Faisalabad. He said that 37 vaccination centers and 20 mobile vaccination camps were operational in Faisalabad where registered people were being vaccinated.

City Mayor presents annual budget

PESHAWAR: Mayor Peshawar, Haji Zubair Ali has presented annual budget for fiscal year 2022-23 worth Rs4.40 billion for Capital Metropolitan with an allocation of Rs 60million each for beautification of Peshawar, annual repairs of Easter Zone and Western Zone of the city. In a statement issued by Mayor Office on Saturday, the budget has been approved in a meeting held here on the other day. The members of City Council Peshawar attended the meeting. Mayor Peshawar in his budget speech elaborated the allocated amount and said that Rs20 million allocated for repair works of street light in Western Zone and Rs30 million allocated for repair works of street light in Eastern Zone. Rupees five million has been allocated for supply of water coolers in public places, three million for sports activities and Rs7.5million for natural calamities including anti-dengue and anti-corona vaccination. An amount of Rs20 million has been allocated for repair of seven electricity transformers, Rs115 million for purchase of machinery for municipal services including funeral vehicles and water tankers, Rs 115 million has been allocated for construction of toilets in public places and for water supply besides sanitation services. - APP

350 new cases of virus reported in Punjab

LAHORE: As many as 350 new cases of coronavirus and two deaths were reported in Punjab during the last 24 hours. According to the data shared by the spokesperson of Punjab Primary and Secondary Healthcare Department (P&SHD), the number of coronavirus cases in the province reached 517,678, death toll 13,593 and 500,108 recoveries were recorded. The P&SHD confirmed that 275 new cases of COVID-19 were reported in Lahore, 4 in Rawalpindi, 28 in Faisalabad, 9 in Multan, 4 in Okara, 3 in Bahawalpur, 3 in Dera Ghazi Khan, 3 in Sialkot, 2 in Rahimvar Khan,

wala, 01 in Toba Tek Singh, 4 in Sargodha, 5 in Sahiwal, 4 in Sheikhupura, 01 in Muzaffargarh, 01 in Jhang and a case was reported in Nankana Sahib district during the last 24 hours. The Punjab health department so far conducted 11,754,533 tests for COVID-19 in the province. The Punjab health department has urged the masses to follow SOPs for their protection and cover their faces with masks. People should wash their

hands with soap several times in a day to protect themselves from COV-ID-19. Citizens above the age of 12 years must ensure vaccination against the coronavirus. - APP

Debunked Monetary Policy to shut industries

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's industry in general and the steel sector in particular are fighting for sheer survival and are greatly concerned with the current economic situation that is getting worse day by day. The industry fears of more burden which is expected in the upcoming monetary policy of State Bank of Pakistan, due to be announced in its Monetary Policy Statement

The key rate currently stands at 15%, which is highest since the last two decades last seen in April 1999. The industry experts believe that the unbearable benchmark interest rate of 15% is unsustainable for the

on August 22, 2022.

industry. Comparing it with other regional countries, the benchmark interest rate in Malaysia was 2.25pc, Indonesia 3.5pc, China 3.7pc, Bangladesh 4.75pc and India 5.4pc The upcoming Monetary Policy Statement will be disastrous and is set to shutdown industries of Pakistan and create unemployment if the interest rate is not reduced effective immediately.

The SBP has raised rates in previous 7 meetings since September 2021, cumulatively increasing the interest rates by 800 basic points and is expected to hike further. Pakistan Association of Large Steel Producers (PALSP) notes that it is impossible for any businesses to plan expansions or working capital

with such abrupt changes. Secretary General PALSP. Wajid Bukhari, states, "Such fast hikes are a perfect recipe to shut down businesses. How can a business sustain if an interest rates doubles in only 8 months, whereas your regional peers are at around 2-5%?"

Industries are facing problems as Banks are not opening LCs for raw materials. Further exacerbating the situation, spare parts and even consumables falling under Chapter 84 and 85 have become impossible to seek approval from SBP, leading to shutdowns imminently. "Our members are complaining that SBP has become defunct and approvals are just not coming, whereas banks are hesitant to open LC's for raw materials.

Similarly, complete remission was also extended to those female prisoners having an age of 60 years or more and who had spent 10 years or more in jail, besides the same would be applicable to those prisoners who had completed I'th of their substantive imprisonment terms, President Secretariat Media Wing said in

a press release. Those jail inmates would also get benefits of complete remission who had completed 20-year of their substantive sentences. The jail sentences of general prisoners would be reduced by a fifth. - APP

425 cops to perform duties on today

ISLAMABAD: Islamabad Traffic Police (ITP) have decided to depute 425 officers and officials to control traffic in the capital on the occasion of Independence Day (today). 16 more test positive for fatal virus

RAWALPINDI: As many as 16 more people were diagnosed with fatal coronavirus during the last 24 hours, raising the district's tally of confirmed cases to 47,396.

As per the latest data released by the District Health Authority here Saturday, the infected cases included 43,807 from Rawalpindi and 3,589 from other districts.

Among the new cases, eight arrived from Potohar town, three from Rawalpindi Cantonment, two from Islamabad and one from Rawal town, Chakwal and Kahutta.

"Presently, 145 confirmed patients are quarantined at homes while no one is admitted at any district's health facility", the report added. The report further said that 6,995,552 people, including 44,797 health workers, had jabbed themselves against the lethal coronavirus (COV-ID-19) across the district since the vaccination administering drive launched on March 10, 2021.

District Health Authority updated that during the last 24 hours,1,520 samples were collected, out of which 1,504 were declared negative, while the positivity rate was recorded at 1.05 per cent. – APP

PMD alerts authorities of more torrential rains in coming week

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) has forecast more torrential rains in Sindh, Balochistan and South Punjab from August 14-18 under a vigorous monsoon activity. The met office informed that a depression has developed in Arabian Sea which is likely to move towards west along Makran coast.

Due to this weather system monsoon currents are continuously penetrating in southern parts of the country. Another low pressure (LPA) is likely to approach Sindh on August 16. Under the influence of this weather system:

Rain-wind/thundershower with few heavy falls are expected in Sindh, Balochistan, Punjab, Islamabad, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Gilgit Baltistan and Kashmir from August 14-16 with occasional gaps. Widespread rainwind/thundershowers with scattered heavy to very heavy falls are expected in Sindh and Balochistan from

August 16-18 with occasional gaps. About the possible impacts, the met office said that the heavy rains may generate urban flooding in Karachi, Thatta, Badin, Hyderabad, Dadu, Jamshoro, Sukkur, Larkana, Shaheed Benazirabad and Mirpurkhas from August 14-18. Flash flooding is expected in Qilla Saifullah, Loralai, Barkhan, Kohlu, Mosa Khel, Sherani, Sibbi, Bolan, Kal-

Jiwani, Ormara, Gwadar and hill torrents of Dera Ghazi Khan during the forecast period from August 14-18. Heavy rains may generate urban flooding in Rawalpindi/Islamabad, Peshawar, Nowshera, Mardan, Faisalabad, Lahore and Gujranwala from August 14 (night) to August 16.

Imran Khan's fake narrative exposed: Musadik Malik ISLAMABAD: Minister of nation over the regime ask them about the amount aged the entire process

State for Petroleum Musadik Malik on Saturday said that Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) chief Imran Khan's fake narrative of regime change operation got exposed after its US chapter hired the services of a firm to maintain relations with the American administration.

"On the one hand, Imran Khan claimed that his government was changed as a result of foreign conspiracy, while on the other side, he was hiring the services of a firm to improve relations with the same country," he said while addressing a news conference here.

The minister said Imran

Khan was misleading the

change conspiracy. He should tell truth to the nation about the firm named Feton Group hired by his party in the United States for lobbying there.

Musadik Malik said the PTI chief made a mockery of the nation by spreading lies that coalition government was foreign sponsored to weaken Pakistan, while he hired the services of a firm headed by David Fenton, who had been striving to denuclearize Pakistan and also written several books on it.

"Moreover, the PTI chief and other party leaders want that no institution should question their conduct, nor

ask them about the amount of prohibited funding received from the different countries," he added. The minister said PTI used

the minister said PTI used the donations to run the affairs of the party and received funds from over 350 foreign companies. The details in this regard were provided by the State Bank of Pakistan to the Election Commission when Imran Khan was in power.

He said PTI government

had not deposited billion of rupees recovered from business tycoon Malik Riaz in the United Kingdom in the national exchequer, adding that the former SAPM on Accountability Dr Shahzad Akbar managed the entire process and "settled the whole matter." In exchange of the deal, the PTI chief got 458 canals under the garb of the Al-Qadir Trust, the minister added.

Musadik Malik said Imran Khan took prohibited funding of billion of rupees from Arif Naqvi which was illegal as per the law as no political party could get funds from anyone other than Pakistani citizens. He wondered if Nawaz Sharif could be removed from office and jailed for not withdrawing salary from his son, then why Imran Khan, who was declared guilty of crime in the foreign funding case, should not be held accountable. - APP

ISLAMABAD: PTI leader and Imran Khan's chief of staff Shahbaz Gill on Saturday submitted a petition to a sessions court in Islamabad seeking his post-arrest bail. Gill filed his petition through PTI lawyers Faisal Chaudhry and Ali Bukhari. In his petition, he said that the government registered a case against him to settle political scores with the PTI. He stated that the police could not prove any allegation against him during investigation. A false First Information Report (FIR) has been lodged for political gain, the petitioner said pleading with the court to accept his post-arrest bail. The district and sessions court on Friday rejected a plea by the police to extend the physical remand of Shahbaz Gill and sent him to jail on judicial remand. In his written judgement, the sessions court judge said that the court could not allow the physical remand of Shahbaz Gill owing to lack of substantial proofs. Islamabad police on Tuesday arrested Gill from Banigala Chowk on charges of sedition and inciting public against state institutions and their heads. – **DNA**

An year of Taliban's victory

N Monday it will be a year since the Taliban seized Kabul, marking "not the collapse of a regime, but the collapse of the dreams of a nation", in the words of one Afghan interviewed by the BBC. Some welcomed the departure of foreign troops and the prospect of peace after two decades of appalling civilian casualties and corruption. But despite the violence and suicide bombings, for many others these years were shaped by increases in life expectancy and literacy, and new opportunities and aspirations: women in rural areas as well as big cities wanted education and freedom of movement.

The nightmare is deepening. Afghans are now living with both Taliban repression and mass hunger. The claim was that, 20 years after their overthrow by the US-led coalition, the world was likely to see a more moderate "Taliban 2.0" when they took power. It is true that the mass executions many feared did not materialise. But critics and opponents have been killed or arbitrarily detained and tortured, and media silenced. A struggle between pragmatists and hardliners is ongoing: in March, excited girls arrived at secondary schools to resume their studies - only to be told that classrooms remained closed to them after the central leadership overruled education officials. Women have been barred from many jobs, and prevented from travelling or going to work unless accompanied by a male guardian. Some have been threatened or beaten for ignoring the order to cover their bodies or faces in line with the Taliban's interpretation of Islamic dress codes.

Observers say that for now at least the Taliban appear less corrupt than their predecessors. But they are seeking to translate a rural insurgency into national government, and cannot meet the basic needs of 38 million Afghans in the midst of economic collapse. Cracking down on your citizens is easier than ensuring they have food. The UN calls this the world's largest humanitarian crisis; parents have been forced to sell kidneys and children. The World Food Programme is feeding almost half the population. Though the US has issued sanctions exemptions for humanitarian support, Afghans need development aid and a functioning economy. The brain drain comes not just from fleeing young professionals, but the squandering of female talent.

Washington has no desire to dwell on its own role and responsibility. Public concern has been largely redirected towards Ukraine. Yet the women and men who have dared to protest against Taliban oppression; the teenage girls covertly attending school; and indeed the Afghans who fled to the UK and elsewhere, but remain unable to rebuild their lives – all these hope for, and deserve, much better.

One step closer

HE receipt of a letter of intent (LoI) from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) augurs well for the bailout facility, which continues to hang in the balance as the Fund's executive board meets on Aug29 to decide on it. The word on the market floor is that this all put puts the final stamp on the \$1.7 billion tranche that will stabilise national reserves and make it much easier and cheaper to go fishing for more debt.

Yet even though this is good news for the government because it one step closer to its most urgent aim, there's still no light at the end of the tunnel for the people that have sacrificed so much to bring he government this far in restoring the extended fund facility (EFF).

That's because on top of the subsides they've had to be deprived of and additional taxes they must pay so the government can stay solvent, there will now, for sure, be a mini budget very soon that will slap even more taxes on them. And the reason is that the government was just blackmailed by traders and retailers into taking back the fixed tax imposed on them through their electricity bills and this shortfall, like all others, will also have to be met by squeezing more out of ordinary, hard-working Pakistanis. So, while they will cheer that a Sri Lanka or Lebanon like situation has been averted, for now, a lot of Pakistanis will still end up looking and feeling just like a lot of Sri Lankans and Lebanese.

The big question, then, is how long will the economy take to stabilise once we're back in the good books of the Fund and therefore able to get all the loans that we need for the present fiscal? And the answer is sure to disappoint everybody, because it will take a very long time. We must first stand on our own two feet, then completely revamp production and manufacturing, while at the same time carve out more export markets, and then offer a new, value-added export basket to the world. We'll be a lot better off as soon as we can get at least half of that going.

Will America ever keep its climate promises?

is Back." The statement, which meant different things to various people, was welcomed by the global community, notably the environment and climate change activists as well as US allies for its reference to NATO and climate change. The abrupt exit of the US from the Paris Climate Change Treaty, ordered by Donald Trump, was a near fatal blow to the agreement that has floundered since it was signed seven years ago. Though Biden did reverse his predecessor's decision to exit Paris immediately and brought the US back tothe negotiating table, the world has had to wait for over 18 months to see Biden take any meaningful step toward cutting carbon emissions in the US, which is by far the largest major polluter per capita emissions; its total emissions in 2019 stood at 5.2 gigatons, or 15.6 tons per capita per year. This compares poorly with even large economies such as India (1.87 tons) or China (7.38 tons). Historically, too, the US is responsible for the bulk of carbon emissions, accounting for 21 percent of all carbon ever emitted by human activity.

Thus, it was key that the US begin some meaningful action to cut its emissions. Biden's signature legislation, the Inflation Reduction Act, fits the bill nicely, even if just a start. With over \$369 billion allocated to climate and energy provisions, the act seeks to change how the country's energy is produced and is expected to put the US on the path to its stated goal of cutting its carbon emissions 40 percent below 2005 levels by 2030. Though that is clearly far from enough to save the world, most environmentalists would welcome the idea of the US taking climate change seriously, at least. The act also should spell an end to the decision of Biden administration to boost oil and gas output to combat sky-high energy prices. But while the act is certain-

ly expected to nudge the US toward tackling climate change in a serious manner. the country needs to do far more to come anywhere close to its commitments, both binding and moral, in cutting carbon emissions and leading the battle against climate change and

global warming. First, the US would need

even the 50 percent as agreed in Paris, but as climate scientists have been pointing out the battle to restrict the rise in global temperatures to below 1.5°C from pre-industrial era is almost certainly lost and the world needs to do much more than meeting current commitments to even keep

the rise below 2.5°C. As of now, no major economy is anywhere on the path to even meet their commitments, let alone do anything more. Here, the US is definitely among the laggards rather than the leaders. But Biden's legislationfails on another key measure that is of immense significance to the billions of people living in poor countries around the world facing the worst impact of climate change through desertification, rising sea levels, flash floods and prolonged droughts.

And even in these minuscule payments, the West has resorted to "smart" financial fudging - or cheating, in simpler terms. Instead of giving this money as outright grants or at best soft government-to-government loans and only for climate-related projects, the West has started counting any kind of loan or investment by a Western company made out to the poor world as part of climate finance. Even if Biden and all the oth-

er Democrats wanted to set an example for the rest of the rich countries and honestly on climate, domestic political compulsions would stop them from even trying. The US is headed for mid-term elections in a few months and Donald Trump is sniping at the Democrats' heels. Though it is still early to call, most polls say that the Democrats will lose control of both houses of the US Congress, rendering the next two years of Biden's term almost useless in terms of even moderate policy changes, let alone something as "revolutionary" as the US actually doing what it signed upto do.

Indeed, it should not come as a big surprise, if the Republicans, wholeheartedly opposed to the Inflation Reduction Act, actually try to force a roll back of at least some of its measures, notably for cutting oil and gas investments and hiking corporate taxes, rendering the entire act at best a paper tiger, and at worst a dead one.

Yamauchi earns uppercut knockout over Neiman Gracie

NEW YORK: Goiti Yamauchi produced a clean uppercut to knock out Neiman Gracie in the second round of their welterweight contest at Bellator 284 in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. The 29-year-old dropped his hands, encouraging his fellow Brazilian opponent to come forward, before landing the shot to end the fight. It is the first time Gracie, 33, has been stopped in his nine-year career. Yamauchi said he channelled Kazakhstani boxing great Gennady Golovkin - also known as GGG - to win the fight. "I used to be a defensive fighter but this time I'm Triple G style, a big drama show," he said. The main event was predicted by some pundits to be a submission chess match, with both fighters possessing world class jiu-jitsu. Jap-

anese-born Yamauchi holds 21 career submission wins with nine of them in Bellator, while Gracie has nine in total, submitting six of his previous seven opponents. Yamauchi had spoken of his admiration for the Gracie family's legacy before the fight, with its members being pivotal to the growth of jiu-jitsu. However, it was in the stand-up

that the fight was decided, with Yamauchi getting the better of the striking exchanges throughout. Yamauchi wobbled Gracie with a left hand in the first round, and preferred to keep the fight on its feet throughout, rather than following him to the ground. Gracie landed a combination in the second round, which prompted Yamauchi to taunt Gracie and drop his guard, before countering with the finishing uppercut. Yamauchi paid tribute to fifthranked Gracie and called for another ranked opponent following his second win since moving up to welterweight from lightweight. "This is very meaningful, not just because it's my first main event but because it's Gracie, one of the best grapplers in history," he said. "Everybody above me in the rankings, I'm sure these guys are watching today, so I want to fight all those guys to be a welterweight title contender -

to win is my destiny." Ukraine's Yaroslav Amosov is the current champion but is unable to defend his title because he is helping defend his country from Russia's invasion. American Logan Storley holds the interim title after beating Britain's Michael 'Venom' Page in London in May. A win over the second-ranked middleweight represents a pivotal moment in 29-yearold Jeffery's career, with Vanderford now suffering back-to-back defeats after being victorious in his first 10 fights as a professional.

Raducanu to face Williams for first time LONDON: Britain's Emma Raducanu will face 23-time

Grand Slam singles champion Serena Williams for the first time in her career on Sunday. The pair have been drawn together in the first round of the Western and Southern Open in Cincinnati. Earlier this week, Williams suggested she would soon retire from tennis, saying she will be "evolving away" from the sport after the US Open.

Raducanu is preparing to defend her US Open title later this month. The British number one won the Flushing Meadows tournament last year as an unseeded 18-year-old, 22 years after Williams won her first Grand Slam singles title in New York, aged just 17. The winner will face either Victoria Azarenka or Kaia Kanepi in the second round of the Cincinnati tournament. In the men's event, Rafael Nadal, who has a bye to the second round, will play for the first time since suffering an abdominal tear at Wimbledon that forced him to withdraw before his scheduled semi-final against Nick Kyrgios. British number one Cameron Norrie faces Denmark's Holger Rune and Dan Evans will take on Serbia's Filip Krajinovic in the first round, while Andy Murray meets Taro Daniel of Japan in qualifying. - DNA

Shakib returns as Bangladesh T20 captain

DHAKA: Shakib Al Hasan on Saturday was named to return as Bangladesh's Twenty20 international captain after he bowed to a Bangladesh Cricket Board ultimatum to scrap a deal with a betting site. The all-rounder was given the nod to lead the side for the upcoming Asia Cup in the United Arab Emirates and the World Cup in Australia. "Shakib realised his mistake," BCB cricket operations chief Jalal Yunus told reporters as he announced the decision. "He is a very important player for us." Earlier this month Shakib announced a partnership with Betwinner News, a portal operated by a gambling firm based in the Dutch Caribbean island of Curacao.

He wrote on his social media pages that it was the "one and only source of sports news!"

Gambling is illegal in Bangladesh and he was forced to cancel the deal after the BCB president, Nazmul Hassan, issued an ultimatum ordering him to choose between the national team and Betwinner. Shakib captained Bangladesh to seven wins and 14 defeats in 21 T20Is until he was banned for two years - one of them suspended - in 2019 after he failed to record corrupt approaches.

Shakib, who also returned as Test captain in July, replaces wicketkeeper-batsman Nurul Hasan as Bangladesh's T20 skipper. Nurul was retained in the Asia Cup squad despite undergoing surgery on a finger in Singapore last week in the hope that he would regain his fitness by the time the tournament starts on August 27 in Dubai. - APP

UAE, Ukraine FMs discuss bilateral ties

KIEV: UAE Foreign Minister Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed reviewed the latest developments of the Russia-Ukraine conflict with his Ukrainian counterpart Dmytro Kuleba in a call. The foreign ministers discussed bilateral relations and ways to enhance them, and other issues of common interest, Emirates News Agency WAM reported on Friday.

During the call, the UAE minister praised the UNbacked agreement between Ukraine, Russia and Turkey to allow a resumption of grain exports from Ukraine's Black Sea ports. On July 22, Ukraine and Russia signed a landmark deal with Turkey and the United Nations aimed at relieving a global food crisis caused by blocked Black Sea grain deliveries. Ukraine's infrastructure ministry said on Saturday that 16 ships carrying 450,000 tons of agriculture products had departed from Ukrainian sea ports since early August under the deal which ensured safe passage for vessels.

As part of the UN deal, all ships are inspected in Istanbul by the Joint Coordination Center, where Russia, Ukrainian, Turkish and UN personnel work. Their primary assignment involves monitoring the safe passage of Ukrainian grain ships along established routes and overseeing their inspection for banned weapons on the way into and out of the Black Sea.

Migrant arrivals in EU rises 86%

BRUSSELS: There has been an 86% surge in the number of migrants in the European Union in the first seven months of 2022 compared to the same period last year, the bloc's border agency Frontex said Friday. In July alone, the number increased by 63% year-overyear to 34,570, according to a news release publishing the preliminary data. Overall, 155,090 migrants arrived in the EU from January to July, it said. Ukrainian refugees entering the EU through border crossings were not included in the figures, the agency said.

According to Frontex, 7.7 million Ukrainian citizens have entered the EU since the start of the Russian invasion in February. More than 14,866 irregular entries, "nearly three times more' than in July last year, were recorded via the Western Balkan route, which continues to be "the most active." The main nationalities on this route were migrants from Syria, Afghanistan and Türkiye. The central Mediterranean route was used by more than 42,500 migrants between January and July, an increase of 44% compared to the first seven months of last year. The number of detections on the Eastern Mediterranean route remained high with 22,601 arrivals, "more than double" compared to last year.

The number of arrivals in the Greek Cypriot administration accounted for more than half of the total number of detections, with most migrants coming from Svria, Nigeria and Congo. On the EU's eastern border, the number of illegal crossings has fallen by 32% since the start of the year, to 2,923. The main nationalities present on this route were Ukrainian, Iraqi and Belarusian nationals.

EU praises Türkiyebrokered grain deal

BRUSSELS: EU foreign policy chief Josep Borrell hailed the recently signed deal mediated by Türkiye and the United Nations, enabling Ukraine to ship grain for the U.N.'s World Food Programme (WFP).

"Thanks to the Istanbul agreement, Ukraine is again able to deliver grain to the WFP," Borrell said on Twitter. He hailed the U.N. shipment of 23,000 tons of Ukrainian prod-

ucts to the Horn of Africa, which was the first humanitarian cargo that set sail since the Türkiye-brokered accord was signed on July 22 between Türkiye, the U.N., Ukraine and Russia. Borrell noted that Russia has used "food as a weapon" to worsen hunger around the world, calling on Moscow to "respect its commitment so that Ukraine's exports can continue to reach those in need, mostly in Africa." The U.N.-chartered carrier Brave Commander left Istanbul on Wednesday and arrived on Friday at the port of Yuzhny in southern Ukraine. The ship will carry 23,000 tons of grain

through the port of Djibouti to be distributed in Ethiopia. Ethiopia, Kenya and Somalia have been experiencing one of their worst droughts in decades. The four-year natural disaster has left over 18 million people facing hunger. According to the U.N., Ukraine exported 45 million tons of grain before the war with Russia erupted in February.

On July 22, Türkiye, the U.N., Russia and Ukraine signed a deal in Istanbul to reopen three Ukrainian ports - Odessa, Chernomorsk and Yuzhny - for grain exports. The historic deal, brokered by Türkiye and the U.N., has unblocked exports of grain stuck in Ukrainian ports since the beginning of the war. Internationally praised for its mediator role, Türkiye has also coordinated with Moscow and Kyiv to open a corridor from the Ukrainian port city of Odessa to resume global grain shipments.

Tingia nig Russian origin of fuel shipped to US

NEW DELHI: The United States has expressed concern to India that it was being used to export fuel made from Russian crude, through high-seas transfers to hide its origin, to New York in violation of U.S. sanctions, a top Indian central banker said on Saturday. The U.S. Treasury Department told India that an Indian ship picked up oil from a Russian tanker on the high seas and brought it to a port in Gujarat on the west coast, where it was refined and shipped on, said Reserve Bank of India Deputy Governor Michael Patra.

U.S. sanctions on Moscow for its February invasion of Ukraine prohibit the import to the United States of Russian-origin energy products including crude oil, refined fuels, distillates, coal and gas.

Rushdie on ventilator after New York stabbing

NEW YORK: Salman Rushdie, the Indian-born novelist who spent years in hiding after Iran urged Muslims to kill him because of his writing, was stabbed in the neck and torso onstage at a lecture in New York state on Friday and airlifted to a hospital, police said. After hours of surgery, Rushdie was on a ventilator and unable to speak on Friday evening after an attack condemned by writers and politicians around the world as an assault on the freedom of expression. "The news is not good," Andrew Wylie, his book agent, wrote in an email. "Salman will likely lose one eve: the nerves in his arm were severed; and his liver as stabbed and damage

US in July sets new record for overnight warmth

CALIFORNIA: Talk about hot nights, America got some for the history books last month. The continental United States in July set a record for overnight warmth, providing little relief from the day's sizzling heat for people, animals, plants and the electric grid, meteorologists said.

The average low temperature for the Lower 48 states in July was 63.6 degrees (17.6 Celsius), which beat the previous record set in 2011 by a few hundredths of a degree. The mark is not only the hottest nightly average for July, but for any month in 128 years of record keeping, said National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration climatologist Karin Gleason. Moscow warns of possible end to relations with US

MOSCOW: The Russian Foreign Office has said if the US seizes its assets, it could lead to a total breakdown in bilateral relations. Meanwhile, the UK said Russia could face big logistical problems in Kherson. Read DW for more. The seizure of Russian assets by the United States would destroy Moscow's bilateral relations with Washington, the Russian state news agency TASS quoted a Russian foreign ministry department head as saying. It comes as top Western officials have suggested seizing frozen Russian reserves to help fund the future reconstruction of Ukraine. "We warn the Americans of the detrimental consequences of such actions that will permanently damage bilateral relations, which is neither in their - nor in our interests," said Alexander Darchiev, head of the ministry's North America department. It was unclear to which assets he was referring. Meanwhile, Darchiev said Washington's involvement in Ukraine had increased to the degree that "Americans are increasingly becoming more and more a direct party in the conflict." He also said that, if the US singled out Russia as a "state sponsor of terrorism," relations with Washington would have passed the point of no return. Two US senators seeking to pass a law designating Russia as such visited Kyiv last month to discuss the bill with President Volodymyr Zelenskyy. - DNA

Mar-a-Lago that housed classified records

WASHINGTON: The seizure of classified US government documents from Donald Trump's sprawling Mar-a-Lago retreat spotlights the continuing national security concerns presented by the former president and the property he dubbed the Winter White House. A search warrant has shown that Trump is under federal investigation for possible violations of the Espionage Act, which makes it unlawful to spy for another country or mishandle US defence information. Mar-a-Lago is a mansion and private-members club located in Palm Beach

County in Florida. It has guest rooms, a spa and hotel-style amenities for members. Trump maintains private quarters on the grounds of the century-old property that are closed off to club members. Mar-a-Lago was used by Trump to host meetings with international leaders such as then Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and Chinese President Xi Jinping.

The well-heeled members of the club and, members of the public, also attended weddings and fundraising dinners for Trump at Mara-Lago. The Secret Service provided physical security at Mara-Lago while Trump was president and afterwards, but they are not responsible for vetting guests or members of the club.

Ukraine says it has taken out vital bridge in Kherson

KYIV: Ukraine says it has taken out another bridge that is vital for Russian forces occupying the southern Kherson region. It says the bridge on the dam at Nova Kakhovka which it has attacked before - is now impassable. The claim has not been independently verified. It comes just weeks after the key Antonivsky Bridge was put out of action by Ukrainian forces. Ukraine is waging a counter-offensive towards Kherson city, which Russia captured in the early days of the war. "The destruction of the road bridge of the Nova Kakhovka dam was ensured, with the result that it was taken out of operation," the Ukrainian army's Operational Command South posted to Facebook. In a daily intelligence update, UK defence officials said Ukrainian precision strikes were likely to have made the road crossing over the Dnieper River "unusable for heavy military vehicles". Nova Kakhovka lies about 55km (34 miles) north-east of Kherson. Russian forces had only succeeded in making superficial repairs to the main Antonivsky Bridge, the officials said, which Western military sources said was "completely unusable" after a Himars artillery rocket attack last month

artillery rocket attack last month. The main rail bridge near Kherson was also further damaged last week, the UK update said. "Even if Russia manages to make significant repairs to the bridges, they will remain a key vulnerability," the UK defence ministry said. It added that thousands of Russian troops west of the river were now "almost certainly reliant on just two pontoon ferry crossing points" for ground resupplies. Military analysts say there is a growing risk of the troops being cut off from the rest of main Russian occupying forces. – DNA

Ex-hostage returns to Kabul to 'celebrate' Taliban rule

"I ask world to understand the Taliban and give them time," Weeks said in a recent interview with Turkish media

KABUL: An Australian teacher who was kidnapped in Kabul by Taliban forces in 2016, then held hostage for three years before being released in an exchange deal with U.S. officials, returned here Friday and announced that he planned to "celebrate" the upcoming first anniversary of Taliban rule. Timothy Weeks, 53, arrived at Kabul's international airport clad in a black tribal turban and white Afghan tunic. He told waiting journalists that he had first come to Afghanistan "with a dream to learn about Afghanistan, and now I'm coming again to complete my journey." Weeks converted to Islam during more than three years in Taliban captivity and changed his name to Baar Muad Jibra'il after returning home. During his many months as a prisoner he else has been able to do," he said, adding that he has long "stood behind" the Taliban and continues to do so.

He recently announced to Australian press his plan to return for the anniversary of Taliban rule, saying he now considers himself "an Afghan and a Pashtun," the ethnic group of the Taliban, and that he wants to help the Afghan people through a new charity in Australia. The country is facing a severe humanitarian crisis, with many Afghans unable to find enough food, according to international aid groups.

"I ask the world to understand the Taliban and give them time," Weeks said in a recent interview with Turkish media. But Weeks's visit and supportive comments toward the Taliban drew immediate criticism from international human rights groups, many of which have recently denounced the regime for suppressing women's rights and refusing to let teenage girls attend school.
