Committee formed to review the fixed taxes imposed on the retailers

DOHA: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Tuesday announced a major relief package for the inflation-burdened nation under which fixed taxes have been abolished for retailers and more than 1.7 million people will now be exempt from fuel charges adjustment on electricity bills. Addressing the nation from Qatar - where he arrived on a two-day trip - the premier said that fixed taxes were imposed on the people in the federal budget for the fiscal year 2022-23, announced on June 10, against the intention of the coalition government. "I have formed a committee to review the fixed taxes imposed on the retailers," he said. The move will translate into a tax gap of Rs42 billion, but PM Shehbaz said that the coalition government "cannot add further pressure on small traders". In a press conference last week, Minister for Finance Miftah Ismail said that the coalition government aimed to collect Rs42 billion through retail taxes, however, after the tax exemption, it would no longer be able to meet the target. Ismail revealed hat the revised target is now Rs27 billion.

KARACHI: Pakistan is likely to receive a \$1.17 billion loan tranche from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) within six days after the Executive Board's approval, State Bank of Pakistan Acting Governor Murtaza Syed told Bloomberg TV. The executive board of the Washington-based lender is scheduled to meet on August 29 (Monday); accordingly, analysts expect the Fund to give its final approval as Pakistan has met all prior conditions necessary to revive the stalled loan programme.

The acting governor said that the country's forex reserves will shore up to \$16 billion by the end of the current fiscal year 2022-23 which dropped to \$8 billion due to delay in the revival of the IMF agreement and external flows. "Pakistan has

commitments of \$38 billion so we are over financed," he said, adding that approvals of bilateral help will materialise soon, amounting to \$4 billion, while the current account deficit is expected to clock in at around 3% of the gross domestic product. Pakistan has approached China, Saudi Arabia, Qatar and UAE to meet the financing gap on the IMF's demand. The breakdown of commitment of \$4 billion from friendly countries includes \$2 billion from Qatar, \$1 billion from Saudi Arabia (deferred oil facility), and \$1 billion from UAE (investment).

Officials in Social Welfare Department told APP that these centres were setup in 12 districts including Swabi, Peshawar, D.I. Khan, Karak, Kohat, Malakand, Mardan, Charsadda, Swat, Nowsehra and Dir Lower.He said Drugs Free Peshawar Program was underway to clear the city of drugs and make addicts useful

DC reviews anti-polio campaign

LODHRAN: Deputy Commissioner Rai Muhammad Yasir Bhatti has said that the 5-day anti-polio campaign is going on in full force throughout the district. He further said that during the first phase of the anti-polio campaign, 1 lakh 24 thousand 143 children of the district were administered vaccine drops. gone.

He said that during the first phase, Lodhran district has achieved the first position in the division by achieving a total of 34.42% of the target during the anti-polio campaign. He expressed these views while presiding over the anti-polio campaign review committee meeting at the end of the first day of the anti-polio campaign. Deputy Commissioner Rai Muhammad Yasir Bhatti said that the district administrative officers are closely monitoring the teams during the anti-polio campaign. He said that the anti-polio campaign will continue till August 26. Deputy Commissioner Rai Muhammad Yasir Bhatti said that 175 area in-charges, 1 thousand 444 mobile

Rai Muhammad Yasir Bhatti urged the anti-polio teams. He said that special attention should be given to finger marking and door marking during the campaign.

He instructed the parents to get their children vaccinated against polio to protect them from lifelong disability. In the meeting, Assistant Commissioner Lodhran Farhan Mujbata, Chief Executive Officer District Health Authority Dr. Shaukat Ali Ijaz, District Health Officer Dr. Muhammad Usman, Deputy District Health Officer Dr. Amir Bashir and other officers were present. Under the direction of Deputy Commissioner Rai Muhammad Yasir Bhatti, the District Price Control Magistrates are continuously active against wholesalers and hoarders.

According to the report issued by the district administration, the price control magistrates have imposed fines of 920 thousand rupees on 460 people involved in high selling, hoarding and illegal profiteering during this month. Cases have also been registered against 9 wholesalers for violating the Price Control Act, while 24 people have been arrested. According to the report, the price control magistrates conducted 5 thousand 379 inspections of different markets.


es to its credit as far as development of D. I. Khan is concerned, whereas the district was left bereft of several public serving entities during the PTI government," the

Lumpy skin disease, vaccination ordered by CM

PESHAWAR: The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Government has decided to launch a large-scale special vaccination campaign on emergency footings to effectively control the lumpy skin Disease (LSD) of cattle. During the campaign seven million cattle will be vaccinated against the lumpy Skin disease. The decision was made in a meeting held regarding Lumpy Skin disease here on Thursday with Chief Minister Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Mahmood Khan in the chair. Besides, Provincial Ministers Taimur Saleem Jhagra and Mohib Ullah Khan, Additional Chief Secretary Shahab Ali Shah, Principal Secretary to CM Amjad Ali Khan, Secretary Agriculture and Livestock Israr Khan and other concerned senior officials attended the meeting.

The meeting reviewed latest situation of the disease across the prov-

made regarding the future course of action to prevent the spread of LSD. It was decided in the meeting to ensure availability of trained manpower to vaccinate maximum cattle in the shortest possible time. During the campaign, 7 million cattle will be vaccinated against Lumpy Skin Disease for which it has been decided to purchase vaccine on an emergency basis. The chief minister, on the occasion, directed the finance department to provide the required funds for the purchase of vaccines on priority basis and said that timely prevention of Lumpy Skin Disease is the first priority of the government at this time. He further directed that orders for the purchase of vaccines should be placed immediately. The Chief Minister said that livestock is the only source of income for most of the people in the province and incase of further spread of LSD,

huge damage would be inflicted so timely and effective measures need to be taken to protect the people from this possible damage. He also directed the Livestock department, District Administration and other relevant authorities to immediately prepare a workable plan to effectively control LSD and said that the provincial government will provide all the financial resources needed to prevent the disease. While briefing the meeting regarding the measures taken by the livestock department to prevent lumpy skin disease, it was told that more than 46 thousand cases of the disease have been reported so far. More than eight and a half lac cattle have been vaccinated while more than 2000 cattle have fully recovered from the disease and more than 13 thousand cattle are under treatment. Similarly, more than 31 lakh cattle have been sprayed against Lumpy Skin Disease.

Ten feeders completed in FDA City

FAISALABAD: Faisalabad Development Authority (FDA) Director General Dr Zahid Ikram said on Tuesday that 10 feeders had been completed to provide electricity in FDA City. Reviewing development projects in FDA City during a meeting, he said the development pace was in full swing to facilitate the residents of FDA City as early as possible. He said that installation of 10 feeders including 8 residential feeders and 2 commercial was completed, whereas, 8 other feeders would also be installed in the city very soon.

He said that installation of 4 feeders would be completed up to January, whereas remaining feeders would be made functional till June 2023. He said the FDA City had invited tenders for the installation of electrification material including electricity poles, wires, etc. and the project would be completed on war-footing. He directed the management of FDA City to update him about progress report of development projects in the city so that unnecessary delay could be averted in the larger interest of the general public. Director Planning & Development Asim Mehmood, Directors Estate Management Sohail Maqsood Pannu, Junaid Hasan Manj, Deputy Director Asad Majeed, Deputy Director Engineering Sanwal Malik and others were also present in the meeting. - APP

herry stresses need for urgent rescue efforts

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Climate Change Senator Sherry Rehman, during her remarks in the briefing on current flood emergency in Pakistan by NDMA, stressed the need for immediate humanitarian and rescue efforts to rehabilitate the aggrieved and flood-hit populations throughout the country. This was an urgent meeting called to reassess damage done by recurring and unprecedented floods and to apprise development partners and donors of the criticality of the crisis.

Calling attention to the current climate crisis in the country, Minister Rehman said, "Right now we are in 7th spell of a torrential monsoon that has left thousands homeless, 830 dead and 1348 injured. From Balochistan, the monsoon system has moved to Sindh where 30 districts are under water. The magnitude of it can be assessed from the fact that it has rained more than 395% in Sindh and 379% in Balochistan above the average rainfall. It is a climate catastrophe of epic scale, bringing in its wake the humanitarian crisis that could well match the magnitude of the big flood that was witnessed in 2010. At this point both sides of the Indus are flooded in Sindh which is the current epicentre of the calamity. Shelter is dangerously impacted in the 30 districts of Sindh, and even in Balochistan, and now the same kind of speed and velocity of water is being experienced in South Punjab. People are adrift, livestock and crops are damaged. It is a humanitarian disaster of unprecedented monsoon proportions.."

Further apprising on the situation in Sindh, she highlighted. "The torrential rains have been unprecedented

in Sindh right now, Balochistan, DG Khan too are at risk. Given the scale of the disaster there is no question of the provinces or even Islamabad being able to cope with this magnitude of climate catastrophe on their own. Lives are at risk, thousands homeless. It is important that international partners mobilise assistance. The Indus is in high floods where flow of over 600,000 cusecs is expected to cross Guddu and then Sukkur Barrages on 23rd and 24th of August, 2022 which will bring all the Katcha area along Indus under water, displacing thousands of families. This is in addition to the current displacement. In terms of precious human lives, 216 lives have been lost to the floods in Sindh. An estimated 1,500,000 katcha houses have been damaged and crops cultivated on 1,989,868 acres have been completely destroyed in Sindh. And with the new monsoon spell setting in, other areas in the country, especially DG Khan will remain vulnerable to hill torrents."

Stressing the need for urgent and immediate relief measures, Minister Rehman said, "The current climate catastrophe needs immediate International and national mobilization of humanitarian efforts, not just in the form of food, shelter and basic survival amenities but we need to amplify our rescue efforts. ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Tuesday appealed to the nation to donate for supporting the relief and rehabilitation of the people and infrastructure in flood-hit areas where hundreds have been killed and thousands rendered homeless.

He said the government was distributing Rs 37.2 billion as cash relief among the flood-stricken people. IRSA releases 436,921 cusecs water

ISLAMABAD: Indus River System Authority (IRSA) on Tuesday released 436,921 cusecs water from various rim stations with inflow of 454,931 cusecs.

According to the data released by IRSA, water level in River Indus at Tarbela Dam was 1550 feet, which was 152 feet higher than its dead level of 1,398 feet. Water inflow in the dam was recorded 256,300 cusecs and outflow 256.300 cusecs. The water level in River Jhelum at Mangla Dam was 1177.85 feet, which was 127.85 feet higher than its dead level of 1,050 feet. The inflow and outflow of water was recorded 28,010 cusecs and 10,000 cusecs respectively.

The release of water at Kalabagh, Taunsa and Sukkur was recorded 256,097,435, 669 and 474,377 cusecs respectively. Similarly, from River Kabul, a total of 100,800 cusecs of water released at Nowshera and 43,646 cusecs released from River Chenab at Marala. – **APP**

15 more dengue cases reported

RAWALPINDI: As many as 15 more dengue cases were reported in Rawalpindi during the last 24 hours, raising the tally of confirmed cases to 194. District Coordinator Epidemics Prevention and (DCEPC), Dr Control Sajjad Mehmood Tuesday said that, among the new cases, seven patients had arrived from Dhama Syeda and four from Chak Jalaldin in the Potohar town area while two cases were reported each from Kahutta and Islamabad.

During the last 24 hours, he added, around 128 dengue fever suspects were brought to the city's hospitals, out of which 15 tested positive, 22 probable and four non-dengue. Chinese power plants brought down electricity prices

ISLAMABAD: As per the monthly electricity generation data released by NEPRA, Pakistan, three power plants built by Chinese corporations have brought down the average cost of energy in the country to Rs10.98 per unit in July from Rs15.84 per unit in June 2022. According to Gwadar Pro, this will result in a big relief for consumers, as Central Power Purchasing Authority (CPPA) has sought Rs4.70 per unit in monthly Fuel Price Adjustment (FCA) for the month of July as compared with Rs9.91 per unit FCA for June 2022. It translates into an Rs5.21 per unit reduction in electricity prices for the month of July. Ismail Igbal Securities, a stock brokerage firm, in their research report has attributed the reduction in electricity prices to a 48% increase in generation of hydropower and 59% increase in nuclear power generation during July as compared with June. According to the data, the 720 megawatts Karot hydropower plant contributed 393.5 million units of electricity in July as compared with 298 million units in June. The power plant not only provided additional electricity but also mitigated the negative impacts of the 969 MWs Neeum Jhelum hydropower plant's closure after encountering a fault on July 6. Neelum Jhelum generated 107 million units in July as compared with 619 million units in June. Karot, which started fullscale commercial operations on June 29, is built by China Three Gorges Corporation (CTG) at a cost of nearly \$2 billion as the first hydropower project under China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC). - DNA

Fans' export increases 16.19%

ISLAMABAD: The export of fans witnessed an increase of 16.19 percent during the first month of current fiscal year, against the exports of the corresponding period of last year. The country exported fans worth US\$2.684 million during July 2022 against the exports of US\$2.310 million during July 2021, showing a growth of 16.19 percent, according to a report issued by Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS).

Meanwhile, on month-onmonth basis, the export of fans, however, decreased by 29.41 percent during July 2022 as compared to the exports of US\$3.802 million in June 2022, the PBS data revealed. It is pertinent to mention here that the country's overall merchandise export declined by 5.17 percent in July 2022 as compared to the export of July 2021. The export during the month were recorded at US\$2,219 million against the exports of US\$2,340 million in last July.

The imports also declined by 12.81 percent to US\$4,861 million in July 2022 compared to the exports of US\$5,575 million in July 2021. Based on the figures, the merchandize trade deficit declined by 18.33 percent by going down form the deficit of US\$3,235 million last July to US\$2,642 million in July 2022, according to PBS data. – **APP**

ISLAMABAD: Kachhi Canal Project (KCP) in Balochistan is going to unleash a "Green Revolution" by irrigating 713,000 acres of barren land in most areas of the province. The project is carried out in the same vein as CPEC, which pays special attention to agricultural development and people's livelihood, according to Gwadar Pro on Tuesday. Though it does not fall in the ambit of CPEC, it is among those initiatives that receive positive vibes from many agro-based

development projects under CPEC. Balochistan has no canal system for irrigation. After the completion of Kachhi Canal, the cropping intensity of sorghum, oilseeds, pulses and wheat will be increased up to 88.5 percent approximately with Rs19.66 billion (Rs3.82 billion for phase-I) added to the national economy annually.

The project would create hundreds of thousands of jobs as well. Areas including

Dera Bugti, Naseerabad, Kachhi (Bolan) and Jhal Magsi will benefit.

Kachhi Canal is also known as the 'Green Revolution' project of Balochistan. Apart from irrigating barren lands, it would also mitigate drinking water stress for about two million people. KCP is located in a typical arid zone climate, characterised by high temperature and low rainfall, where economically sound agriculture is only possible under irrigated conditions. Now, things are being changed for the poor people of Balochistan, the most underdeveloped part of the country.

The project is being financed by the federal government through its Public Sector Development Programme (PSDP). The work of the project is being executed by WAPDA in collaboration with the Kachhi Canal Consultants. So far, an expenditure of around Rs100 billion has been incurred on the project since its start in 2002.

According to a senior WAPDA official, the authority has already constructed a 363km main canal and 81-km long allied water distribution system to irrigate 72,000 acres of land in Phase-I. "Kachhi Canal is a vital project to alleviate poverty and eradicate extremism in remote and backward areas of Balochistan by developing irrigated agriculture and an agro-based economy in the province", the official said.

Terming the land being cultivated in Sui and adjacent areas of Dera Bugti district through Kachhi Canal as a good omen for Balochistan, the official said the project has brought phenomenal changes to the locals as corp cultivation is gaining momentum due to availability of water. He also said now green fields can be seen in the areas of Dera Bugti. According to the official, phase-I of the project has been almost completed as work only on 40-km is remaining which is under progress. To a question, he said PC-I for the phase-II (58-km) and phase-III (39-km) is being prepared by the consultants, under which command areas of 267,000 acres in District Nasirabad & Bolan and 344,000 acres in Nasirabad, Bolan & Jhal Magsi districts would become cultivated. "The main incremental benefits of the project for irrigation of 611,000 acres of land lies in Phase-II & III." Moreover, the WAP-DA official said, as per approved timeline of Consultancy Contract Agreement, the Consultants will submit the detailed engineering design, tender documents and the PC-I of Phase-II & III by September 2022. The actual construction of the Phase-II & III works will commence after the approval of the PC I by the commence the the approval

of the PC-I by the competent forum. Furthermore, the WAPDA official said the provincial irrigation department had taken over the completed portion of the main canal and allied distribution system (Balochistan portion) in March 2021. However, the remaining portion of the main canal (Punjab Portion) shall be taken over from the authority concerned after sanction/arrangement of staff & other administrative issues. So far the command area of 52,000 acres has been developed under Phase-I by the provincial agriculture department whereas the remaining is under progress.

Regional countries refuse to take sides

n a bid to slow, if not stall, China's rise, the US has tried to depict China as an aggressor that is disrupting the rules-based international order and as a bully that is coercing and intimidating its regional neighbors. Yet to Washington's dismay, many regional countries have refused to toe its anti-China line and resisted Washington's attempts to pressure them to distance themselves from Beijing. The first summit between the US and the members of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations, held in May, which the Joe Biden administration had hoped to use to win over some countries to side with it in its confrontation with China, obviously failed to achieve that purpose, ending only with a vague agreement to "appropriately cooperate in international and regional fora". The US-orchestrated efforts aimed at containing China are already posing unprecedented challenges to peace and stability in the region. The creation of AUKUS, which groups the US, the United Kingdom and Australia against China, for instance, is enabling Australia to acquire nuclear-powered submarine technology in violation of the global non-proliferation treaty.

Not to mention the countless military drills targeted at China the US has conducted with its allies in the South China Sea, which have drastically stoked tensions in the region. China and ASEAN have long been economically interdependent and are each other's largest trading partner. China has also promised to get along with its neighbors peacefully and never seek hegemony in the region. Their mutually beneficial relationship has withstood the test of times and will not be led astray by any external force prodding them to take sides. Singaporean Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong is sober-minded about how rising geopolitical tensions are affecting countries, especially in the Asia-Pacific.

The rivalry between China and the United States, for example, is making it "almost impossible" to deal with pressing global issues such as climate change, pandemics, and nuclear proliferation. "We can expect more geopolitical contestation in the Asia-Pacific," he said in a National Day speech on Sunday. "Some countries will choose a side. Others, like Singapore, will try our best to avoid being caught up in the major power rivalry". Former US secretary of state Henry Kissinger, in a recent interview with CNN, criticized the US administration's current China policy. The choice that Washington faces is whether to deal with China "by confrontation or whether we could attempt to deal with this absolutely unique situation initially, well, primarily by dialogue". It is obviously up to Washington to answer that question.

Flood disaster

ore than 700 people have been killed in the recent floods and federal and provincial governments remain hopelessly overwhelmed. The loss of life and property, despite billions having been poured into national and provincial disaster management authorities over decades, also speaks volumes of how inefficiently taxpayer money is being spent. There is no doubt that the scale and extent of the floods is massive - over one million people affected in over 100 districts, with at least 30,000 households still at risk – but we would not have expected the situation to get out of hand this much given the experience of the government and disaster management authorities in dealing with the massive floods in 2010 and similar events since then. Unfortunately, few lessons appear to have been learnt. The 'response' in Balochistan is perhaps the most telling. While Chief Minister Abdul Quddus Bizenjo is going around asking Islamabad and international donors for money to fund relief efforts, former chief minister Jam Kamal, whose Lasbela constituency is among the worst-affected areas, noted that there had been no preemptive efforts to deal with flooding despite Met Office warnings that had been issued several days in advance. He also admitted that while these are record floods, the government's post-disaster response has also been weak as he noted that it is citizen volunteers, not the state, who have been supporting most of the victims.

Meanwhile, protests by flood victims in Punjab have largely been ignored by the provincial government there as well, with reports suggesting that local police officials have been redeployed to assist in relief efforts but no outside reinforcements have been sent in. And while Karachi is a notorious basket case when it comes to drainage, local authorities there have also outdone themselves with their incompetence with the death toll crossing 40 and many neighbourhoods remaining inundated with sewer-mixed rainwater. Government officials may repeat the facts about how Pakistan is the eighth-most climate change-vulnerable country despite its low carbon footprint, but that does not change the fact that we still need to do our best to cope with the hand we have been dealt. Unfortunately, it appears that while policymakers will happily absorb the billions in foreign aid and local tax money being dedicated to climate change adaption and disaster mitigation, they are unwilling to let it be put to use, lest effectively preempting massive disasters leads to those funds drying up.

Yet, these two Gulf Arab states are unlikely to act in lockstep with Israel vis- vis Iran in a post-JCPOA pe-riod. In contrast to Israel, Riyadh and Abu Dhabi have been cautiously making diplomatic overtures to Tehran while signalling their desires for removing some tension between Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) members and Iran. The leadership in Saudi Arabia and the UAE have essentially come to terms with the extent to which their countries are exposed to grave economic and security threats posed by an angry Iran. The September 2019 Aramco attacks which followed acts of sabotage off the UAE's east coast did much to inform their assessments. Realising that Washington's "maximum pressure" on Tehran could spiral beyond the control of any one actor, Saudi Arabia and the UAE have pragmatically taken steps to try to keep GCC members out of harm's way if such a catastrophic scenario would unfold. Such efforts to cool tensions between these Gulf Arab states and Tehran might soon result in diplomatic relations being restored to what they were prior to the GCC-Iran crisis of January 2016. From Iran's perspective, such rapprochements would be extremely beneficial to its interests irrespective of the outcome of the nuclear talks. "The Iranian government in general, particularly the Raisi administration, has been insisting that the diplomatic engagement with regional countries is a separate path from the JCPOA," says Azizi. "Regardless of the fate of the JCPOA, Iran is eager to go ahead with its outreach to the neighbours within

the framework of the so-called 'Neighbours First' policy." But the picture gets complicated due to a host of factors, including the Abraham Accords and Washington's desire to see stronger Arab-Israeli coordination against Iran if the JCPOA negotiations collapse

This brings us to questions surrounding Israel's role in the Gulf security architecture and implications for Tehran. If some GCC states and Tel Aviv continue strengthening military cooperation and intelligence sharing, Iran will find itself in a weaker position. Under such circumstances, Iranian retaliation can be expected. "With the unveiling of the drone-carrying ships, Iran has given a nod to combined operations in order to deal with new threats [stemming from the Israeli entry into the Gulf]," Javad Heiran-Nia, the director of the Persian Gulf Studies Group at the Center for Scientific Research and Middle East Strategic Studies in Iran, tells TRT World.

Creating new economic interdependence As Azizi argues, the only way for Tehran to achieve a lasting rapprochement with Riyadh and an expansion of normalised relations with Abu Dhabi is through an "element of economic interdependence" between these countries. If the JCPOA is restored with sanctions on Iran being lifted, this is possible. Yet, if sanctions remain in place, that would be the "greatest barrier in the way of any kind of economic cooperation between not only Iran and its neighbours but also Iran and most of the countries in the world," according to Azizi. Ultimately, if Iran remains heavily sanctioned with the JCPOA finding its way to the graveyard, the country will intensify its "maximum resistance" to Washington's "maximum pressure". To grow a stronger "resistance economy", Tehran will work to develop its economic relations with alternative powers - chiefly China, Russia, India, Central Asian countries, and GCC members.

The extent to which the Iranians could succeed on this front is the basis of much debate. In any event, the Middle East will be subjected to greater instability if diplomats in the P5+1 and Iran fail to find a middle ground that can restore the nuclear deal. Such consequences would likely plague the region for decades.

he development and future of any country and society is the youth of this country. But unfortunately, Pakistan is one of the countries where many youths face many problems, including unemployment, equal opportunities for education, and a lack of adequate medical resources. Pakistan is the sixth most populous country in the world, with a population of more than 22 million, and youth constitute a large part of the population. According to UNDP, 64 percent of the total population in the country consists of youth under the age of 30, while 29 percent of the population consists of youth between 15 and 29 years of age. In a country with such a large youth population, 29 percent of the youth are uneducated, while only six percent of the youth receive education beyond the 12th grade.

With the lowest female labor force participation rates (LFPR) in South Asia across all age groups, Pakistan is presented with the daunting task of generating additional 1.3 million jobs each year for the next five years to fill this gap. The biggest problems of the youth in Pakistan are education and unemployment. According to experts, the Corona epidemic has further increased youth problems. This is also confirmed by the report issued by the country's statistical agency, which states that the unemployment rate in the country has increased by 22 percent. Before the Corona epidemic, the number of employed people in the country was around 55.7 million, but due to the epidemic, the number of unemployed people has reduced to around 35.5 million. Not only this, but during the lockdown, 37 percent became unemployed, i.e., about 26 million people.

The study, "Pakistan's opportunity to excel: now and the future," by Dr. Nadeem ul Haq, vice chancellor of the Pakistan Institute of Development Economics, and Dr. Durre Nayab, Director, PIDE, conducted an in-depth examination of the labor force survey, which revealed that the unemployment rate among university graduates is 31.2 percent.

The sudden increase in the demand for education in the past decade, combined with a lack of job opportunities, has significantly contributed to this high unemployment rate. However, the high unemployment rate also indicates the inadequacy of educational institutions to connect their students to the labor market-the misalignment of university-industry linkages. In addition to severe social unrest, rapid economic and social changes occur. Due to the lack of financial resources, the youth are deeply disappointed and feel deprived. Most youths do not have opportunities to pursue higher education, and those who have are worried about the lack of suitable jobs and business opportunities.

According to Pakistani experts, in an era when the world is benefiting from scientific development, education, and health advancement, the Pakistani people still do not understand the basic concept of using contraceptive methods. However, one positive thing is that people now want to have Birth Spacing and fewer children. According to a study by the Pakistan Institute of Development Economics (PIDE), 31 percent of the educated youth in the country are unemployed. This alarming situation can be reversed by imparting the required skills to the youth. Pakistan produces many engineers and university graduates in various fields. However, according to the Pakistan Engineering Council report 2021, more than 10 million engineers are unemployed in Pakistan. Pakistan needs to focus on improving the level of human capital in the economy to ensure that the existing and future workforce is skilled enough to meet the increasing technological demands of the evolving nature of work. In this phase, it is necessary for the authorities concerned to equip the young unemployed graduates with skills.

"To meet the gap, which will be created by the exemption of fixed taxes on small traders, the government is imposing a further tax of Rs36 billion on the tobacco industry." he said. Addressing the backlash received in the last two days regarding inflated electricity bills, the prime minister announced that the coalition government, after intense discussions with the International Monetary Fund (IMF), has decided to exempt 17.1 million people from paying excessive amounts charged under fuel charges adjustment for the month of July and August. "We have been working on the fuel charges adjustment case for last five days and we have decided to exempt a major chunk of the population from these charges; however, we are yet to take a decision regarding the 13 million people falling under the category of people who consume more electricity," he said.

He added that agricultural consumers with tube wells will also be exempt from the fuel charges adjustment amounts. The announcement by the prime minister follows necessary amendments to the relevant tax laws and the president's nod. On Monday, President Dr Arif Alvi signed he Tax Laws (Second Amendment) Ordinance, 2022. According to a statement issued by the President's Office, Dr Alvi gave the approval to the Ordinance on the advice of the prime minister under Article 89(1) of the constitution. Under the Ordinance, the amendments have been made to the Sales Tax Act 1990, Income Tax Ordinance 2001, Federal Excise Act 2005 and Finance Act 2022.

Syria calls for withdrawal of US, Turkish forces perceive that they should stand by

MOSCOW: Foreign and Expatriates Minister Fayssal Mikdad called for the withdrawal of the US and Turkish occupation forces from Syria, stop their support to terrorist originations and separatist militias, stop their intervention in Svria's domestic affairs as well. Mikdad, in a joint press conference with his Russian counterpart, Sergey Lavrov, described the Syrian-Russian relations as strategic that come in implementation of the two peoples' will in establishing best relations. He added "we appreciate Russia's support for Syria in its war against Western countries-backed terrorism." "The US state is the side which support terrorism in Syria, destroyed its infrastructure and economy, and continue to plunder its resources and impose coercive economic measures in flagrant violation of UN charter," Mikdad went on to say. He stressed that the Washington-backed separatist militias should

their country and the Syrian Arab Army in defending the unity of Syria. Mikdad said that the two sides have held an in-depth session of talks on the stances of the two friendly countries on the level of economic relations and the situation in the Middle East region. In response to SANA reporter's question, Mikdad said that "our trust in the Russian and Iranian friends is full" asserting that the two countries have played a wise and keen role to end the interventions of powers which had to respect Syria's sovereignty and territorial integrity. He stressed that the statement of Tehran Summit meets Syria's aspirations to a large extent. Mikdad warned that the Turkish regime should withdraw its forces from the lands which it occupied in Syria and stop its support to the terrorist organizations and its interference in Syria's internal affairs.

The Foreign Minister described the assassination of Russian journalist Darya Dugina as " a criminal act," asserting that the perpetrators should be held accountable. As for Syria's recognition of Donetsk and Lugansk republics, Mikdad said that Svria was one of the first states that recognized their independence, adding "work is underway to establish diplomatic relations with the two states. For his part, Lavrov said that Russia rejects any foreign interference in Syria's internal affairs and stresses the necessity of finding a political solution to the crisis in the country. The Russian Foreign Minister called on the international community to support the return of Syrian refugees far from any politicization.

Lavrov added that Russia condemns Israel's aggression on Syrian territory, expressing his country's concern over the Israeli continued targeting of establishments in Syria, citing the attack that targeted Damascus International Airport. "We are satisfied with the return of relations between Syria and a number of Arab states," lavrov said, thanking Syria for its support to the Russian special operation in Ukraine

UK spies accused over arrest of Sikh blogger in India

LONDON: Human rights groups on Tuesday said UK intelligence agencies may have shared information with India that led to the arrest and torture of a Sikh blogger from Scotland. Jagtar Singh Johal, 35, has been held in detention in India for more than four years. He is accused of being part of a terror plot against right-wing Hindu leaders and has been charged with conspiracy to murder. "Our investigators have uncovered critical information that in 2017, the UK government may have authorised MI5 and MI6 to share information about UK citizen Jagtar Singh Johal," two organisations, Reprieve and Redress, said in a joint state ment. They claimed this tip-off "led to his unlawful arrest and torture in India". Current prime minister Boris Johnson was foreign minister at the time. Britain is bound by international treaties such as the European Convention on Human Rights not to hand over citizens where they are at risk of torture. But family members of Johal and other British citizens detained abroad or recently released have called for a law obliging the UK government to actively protect people caught up in such cases.

Johal, from Dumbarton in west Scotland, has filed a legal claim against the UK government and is being represented by British law firm Leigh Day. He has filed a petition with the High Court in London and is asking for a public apology and redress from the government. "It would be totally unacceptable for the UK government's actions to have placed an individual, let alone a British citizen, at risk of torture or the death penalty," said Leigh Day partner Waleed Sheikh. Reprieve and Redress said Johal was abducted in 2017 with a sack over his head while in India for his wedding. He was held incommunicado for 10 days and tortured with electric

Rupert Skilbeck, director of Redress, called for a "full review of the way that the UK government responds when UK citizens are tortured abroad" and "the role of the intelligence community in this case". Leigh Day is arguing that an anonymised case study in a 2018 report by a British interior ministry body, the Investigatory Powers Commission, appears to discuss Johal's case. The commission oversees the use of covert investigatory powers by UK authorities, including the police and intelligence services. It said domestic spy agency MI5 and MI6 passed information on a British national to foreign authorities resulting in their detention and torture. "Britain is fortunate that its civil service doggedly documents wrongdoing," wrote The Times newspaper. "It was only because of the investigatory powers commissioner's annual report that Johal's treatment and the hand of the British state in it was revealed." The UN working group on arbitrary detention reported this year that Johal's arrest was "excessive" and "arbitrary" and on "discriminatory grounds". Prime Minister Johnson subsequently accepted this.

Ukraine begins football season in spite of war

KYIV: Ukraine on Tuesday launched its new football season despite Russia's ongoing invasion, in an apparent attempt to give a morale boost to the war-ravaged nation. In the first match of the Ukrainian Premier League, Shakhtar Donetsk drew 0-0 with Metalist 1925 from Kharkiv at the Olympiysky stadium in Kyiv. In an emotional pre-match ceremony, the players of both teams and the referees entered the pitch wrapped in Ukrainian flags and unfurled a banner that read "We are of the same courage." The Shakhtar players wore T-shirts with the inscription "Donetsk. Ukraine will win" over their playing jerseys, while the players of the Kharkiv club wore similar T-shirts with the inscription "Kharkiv. Ukraine will win."

In addition, Metalist 1925 played the match wearing T-shirts with the emblem of the Ukraine's Armed Forces instead of the traditional sponsor logo. - Agencies

ore than 0.3 million people were affected by the enormous and unprecedented monsoon flood catastrophe in Lasbela, which also claimed the lives of more than 22 people and damaged infrastructure, houses, crops, livestock, and other family assets, costing billions of rupees. Roads, bridges, and markets-all necessary infrastructure have all suffered significant damage, and many are still impassable. Recent monsoon rains in the Lasbela area caused a lot of damage, which shows that the local administration and provincial government have no strategy that how to deal with heavy rains and other disasters.

Social media videos that went viral showed rivers of water pouring into cities and houses. The catastrophic floods

brought by monsoon rains also severely affected the educational institutions in the district., notably Lasbela University of Agriculture of Water and Marine Sciences (LUAWMS), and approximately caused losses of 90 million rupees through damaged labs, infrastructure, and equipment in the University. Besides, it also affected severely the academic activities on campus. Nevertheless, monsoon rains still knocking at the door of the district, and still the people expect more widespread flooding in the area.

Floods are a sign of climate change, and it is evident that the country's climate is changing from altered rainfall patterns to increased precipitation during monsoon seasons. One of the most frequent natural disasters in Balochistan is flooding, and the effects are frequently devastating. More than sixty-five percent of the population touched by natural disasters is prone

to floods. Floods have significant adverse social effects on both communities and individuals. People and communities are affected by floods, which have detrimental social, economic, and environmental repercussions. Due to the loss of livelihoods. productivity, and other long-term economic effects from frequent flooding, populations may be displaced or forced to migrate in large numbers, and migration is a contributing factor in urban centers' overcrowding. Floods most frequently cause infectious illness outbreaks linked to the weather. Flooding incidents raise the potential for the development of cholera and hepatitis A. Floodwaters that have receded may leave behind pools of stagnant water that are ideal mosquito breeding grounds and can spread illnesses like malaria. Flooding also contributes to a rise in zoonosis or diseases that people may get from animals, such as leptospirosis. Ineffective response to relief efforts during significant flood catastrophes may cause public unrest or a decline in faith in the government, including the provincial and federal governments. Social injustice and even social unrest might result from a lack of development in flood-prone regions, endangering the peace and stability of the area. Therefore, the government should prioritize making plans for livelihoods in the most affected areas by helping the affected populations. Moreover, research is required to fully understand the climate change vulnerabilities in the region, especially during extreme weather occurrences. Furthermore, to mitigate the vulnerabilities with successful climate adaptation programs, local populations should be provided with knowledge of climate change and floods.

Covid cases declining across Indonesia

ANTARA

JAKARTA: The number of COVID-19 cases has declined in all islands in Indonesia, Coordinating Minister for Economic Affairs, Airlangga Hartarto, has informed. On a national scale, cases have dropped 1.12 percent. "COVID-19 cases in Sumatra, Java, Bali, Nusa Tenggara, Sulawesi, Maluku, and Papua have shown a declining number," Hartarto noted while delivering a press statement on the community activity restrictions (PPKM) evaluation meeting here on Tuesday.

Hartarto, who is also chair of the COVID-19 Handling and National Economic Recovery Committee (KPCPEN), said that the number of COV-ID-19 cases in the country has continued to decline. with the weekly average pegged at 1.94 percent and the weekly positivity rate recorded at 9 percent, with the number of active cases touching around 48 thousand. "Cases in Java-Bali were recorded around 3 thousand or 89 percent, and outside Java-Bali with around 300 or 10 percent," he informed. Although COV-ID-19 cases have continued to decline, the government has determined that all 386 districts and cities must implement Level 1 PPKM.

JWST captures stunning images of Jupiter

WASHINGTON: NASA's James Webb Space Telescope has captured stunning images of the planet Jupiter showing two tiny moons, faint rings and auroras at the northern and southern poles. "We hadn't really expected it to be this good, to be honest," said planetary astronomer Imke de Pater of the University of California, Berkeley. "It's really remarkable that we can see details on Jupiter together with its rings, tiny satellites, and even galaxies in one image," she said. De Pater headed the observations of Jupiter, the largest planet in our solar system, with Thierry Fouchet of the Paris Observatory. The composite images were taken with the observatory's Near-Infrared Camera (NIRCam) and were artificially colored because infrared light is not visible to the human eye. The auroras above the northern and southern poles of Jupiter have been mapped in redder colors while the Great Red Spot, a storm bigger than Earth, appears white. One image shows Jupiter's faint rings and its moons Amalthea and Adrastea. - APP

The airline will axe up to 10,000 flights to and from the UK's largest and busiest airport until the end of March next year as it grapples with staff shortages that hit the aviation industry following the coronavirus pandemic.

"While the vast majority of our customers will travel as planned and we're protecting key holiday destinations over half-term, we will need to make some further cancellations up to the end of October," said a statement from British Airways.

"In addition, we're giving customers travelling with us this winter notice of some adjustments to our schedule, which will include consolidating some of our short-haul flights to destinations with multiple services," the statement added. More than 600 return flights from the summer schedule will be cancelled up until Oct. 29, while the winter schedule, which will run until the end of March next year, will be cut by 8%.

The announcement of the cancellations was made after Heathrow Airport extended the daily cap of 100,000 passenger numbers by a further six weeks and requested the airline to sell less tickets to customers in order to clear passenger backlog at the terminal.

Sadr's supporters launch sit-in outside top judicial body

BAGHDAD: Several hundred supporters of Shiite cleric Mogtada Sadr launched a sit-in outside Iraq's top judicial body on Tuesday, ratcheting up tensions in a showdown with a rival Shiite alliance. Caretaker Prime Minister Mustafa al-Kadhemi cut short a visit to Egypt, where he had been due to take part in a five-nation summit, to return home to monitor developments. Kadhemi "called on all political parties to calm down and to take advantage of the opportunity for national dialogue to get the country out of its current crisis", a statement from his office said. The standoff between rival Shiite factions has triggered an intensifying war of words, but so far no violence. The Sadrists, who have already been camped outside parliament for the past three weeks, pitched tents outside the gates of the judicial body's Baghdad headquarters, AFP correspondents reported. They carried placards demanding the dissolution of parliament and new elections, 10 months after an inconclusive poll failed to deliver a majority government.

Nearly 9,000 Ukrainians killed in war DNA

KIEV: Ukraine's Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces said on Monday that nearly 9,000 Ukrainian troops had been killed since the start of the war. "Not only servicemen and not only those who took up arms take part in this war, but our little children, who are not to blame for anything at all, except for the fact that they were born here and at this particular time," said Valerii Zaluzhny during "Defenders. Roll Call Forum" event. He said about children: "They do not understand what is happening, but they definitely need protection both near Soledar, Bakhmut, Velyka Novosilka, and here, because their father went to the frontline and, perhaps, is one of those almost 9,000 heroes who died."

Zaluzhnyi, however, did not specify whether the figure refers only to the service members of the armed forces or also to other formations and what period it covers. Ukraine's President also addressed the participants during the event. "My address today is, of course, primarily about veterans. But it is not only for veterans. Not only for our warriors and all those who dedicate their lives to serving Ukraine with weapons in their hands. This appeal of mine is for all our people. And it is about the fact that the veterans' cause has truly become national. - DNA

Promoting RMB/PKR direct settlement to reinforce CEPE

ISLAMABAD: "It is the best time to promote direct conversion between RMB and PKR to enhance bilateral Pak-China economic and trade cooperation. has put in place a regulatory

framework and loan mechanism to ensure RMB to be freely used in the imports and exports and financing transactions, including the opening of L/Cs. As financial market risk is in-

creasing, RMB is becoming a more competitive hedging instrument. Wind Data shows that China's cross-border RMB settlement is growing rapidly, with cross-border trade settlement business rising 33.84% year-on-year to RMB 806 billion in May. There are approximately 240 countries and regions engaging with RMB cross-border settlements and about 2.300 financial institutions using RMB for international settlements. More than 60 central banks

and monetary authorities across the world have maintained RMB as part of their foreign exchange reserves. The use of RMB for cross-border settlement effectively avoids the risk of exchange rate fluctuations and increases the predicta-

Hungary sacks weather chiefs

BUDAPEST: The Hungari an government sacked the head of the country's weather forecasting service and her deputy on Monday, two days after a major holiday fireworks display planned for Budapest was postponed due to fears of bad weather that never materialised.

Kornelia Radics and Gyula Horvath of the National Meteorological Agency (NMS) were dismissed from their posts by the technology and industry minister Laszlo Palkovics. The ministry gave no explanation. Contacted by AFP, the government did not react immediately. The announcement came a day after pro-government media criticised the weather agency, whose forecast of thunderstorms and gusts of wind led to the cancellation of the fireworks on Saturday.

"They gave misleading information about the extent of the bad weather, which misled the operational team responsible for safety," wrote the online newspaper Origo. In 2006, the festivities were plunged into mourning by a violent storm that killed five people and injured several hundred, spreading panic among more than a million people massed to watch the show on the Danube. "They couldn't produce the desired weather, they were fired. No, this is not a dictatorship in Central Asia; this is the Hungary of Fidesz," Andras Fekete-Györ of the opposition Momentum Movement said ironically on Facebook, referring to the ruling party.

French people uneasy about rising costs

PARIS: French people are concerned about the declining living standards due to the soaring cost of living, especially energy. While food, energy and fuel prices in France - which are already affected by the COVID-19 crisis - increased rapidly after the Ukraine-Russia war, it is expected that the heat wave and drought in the summer months will push the prices even higher. Speaking to Anadolu Agency, Saisabil Dafraine, an engineering student living in Versailles, said:

"As a student, I think my living standard has fallen because our income is the same. Especially as students. I can't even imagine minimum wage earners." Dafraine pointed out that the price of each product increased by at least 1 or 2 in grocery shopping. The number of products in a shopping cart varied between 20 and 50, which shows on the bill as an extra 50. Dafraine further stated that while she was charged 50-60 for a tank of petrol a few years ago, now this has reached 90-100. Another French Alhassan Binate, a resident of Goussainville, a suburb of the capital Paris, also stated that he does not pay electricity bills below 40 per month and that the prices are increasing daily. "Life in France is really expensive today." Linda, a Saint-Denis resident, stated there had been a serious increase in energy and food prices in recent months, adding, "There is an increase in everything. I am a little lucky because my children are adults. They are financially independent; they work. I feel sorry for those who have children. - DNA

Europe's energy crisis haunts the euro

LONDON: Asian shares were down for a sixth straight session on Tuesday after a renewed spike in European energy prices stoked fears of recession and pushed bond yields higher, while tipping the euro to 20-year lows.

Benchmark gas prices in the European Union surged 13% overnight to a record peak, having doubled in just a month to be 14 times higher than the average of the past decade. Analysts at US bank Citi warned on Monday that inflation in the UK could top 18% if energy prices were not restrained, more than nine times the Bank of England's target. Consumer price inflation last reached such a level in 1976.

European and British manufacturing surveys due later on Tuesday were expected to highlight the damage being done to activity, with Germany seen deeper in contractionary territory. One analyst said the "dire energy situation" suggested the inflation peak had no vet been reached, with a high risk that it would remain high for some time without central bank intervention.

"No surprise then to see the US dollar at near multi-decade highs against a falling euro and (British) pound," said Tapas Strickland, a director of economics at NAB. The single currency was struggling at \$0.9937, having again plunged below parity with the dollar on Monday - the lowest in nearly 20 years - caught between a major energy crisis in Europe and a US Federal Reserve still on the offensive to curb inflation. The announced closure for maintenance of the Nord Stream 1 pipeline - which supplies most of Russia's gas to Europe - between 31 August and 2 September, has further heightened fears of shortages and sent natural gas prices in Europe soaring. "This increases the risk of a significant economic slowdown by the end of the year" in the eurozone, said Shaun Osborne of Scotiabank. German Chancellor Olaf Scholz, working to reduce his country's dependence on Russia for energy, is in Canada this week to sign a deal to supply clean hydrogen to Germany in the future. But in the meantime he said natural gas will be needed. - Agencies

Migrants crossing in English Channel hit new record

LONDON: The number of people crossing the Channel to the UK from northern France in small boats has hit a new high, the government in London said on Tuesday. Some 1,295 people were detected on Monday, beating the previous single-day record of 1,185 on November 11, 2021, the Ministry of Defence said. So far this year there have been some 22,670 crossings. At the same point in 2021, nearly 12,500 were intercepted making the journey. Last year, the UK authorities brought ashore a total of 28,526 people as they tried to cross the busy shipping lane. The issue has caused a major political headache for the UK government, which promised tighter border controls after leaving the European Union. Tensions have risen between London and Paris, with the UK govt accusing France of not doing enough to stop the crossings. To try to address the issue, immigration laws have been tightened to target people-smuggling gangs behind the crossings. Rights groups have said legislation also runs the risk of criminalising migrants seeking asvlum from violence and persecution in their homelands.

UK to 'never recognize' illegal annexation of Crimea

LONDON: Britain on Tuesday said it will "never recognize" Russia's annexation of Crimea or any other Ukrainian territory "in the face of (Russian President) Putin's assault." Speaking at the Crimea Platform summit via video link, Prime Minister Boris Johnson said the military, humanitarian, economic and diplomatic support to Ukraine must continue to Ukraine "until Russia ends this hideous war and withdraws its forces from the entirety of Ukraine."

The outgoing prime minister said the "land grab in 2014 was the direct precursor of today's war," referring to the annexation to Crimea. "And we should have the humility to acknowledge that not everybody realized the sheer enormity of what was happening at the time," he added. "All of our countries forever reacted with strength and unity, after Putin escalated his onslaught against Ukraine on the 24th of February this year." Johnson added that with the illegal annexation of Crimea, Putin had breached Article 2 of the United Nations Charter, the Helsinki Final Act, and the Russia-Ukraine Treaty of Friendship. "And ever since the annexation, the peo-

ple of Crimea have endured a brutal and systematic campaign of human rights abuses," he said. The abuses included "the persecution of the Tartars, arbitrary arrests with a tenfold increase in detentions last year and the

restriction of land ownership to Russian citizens." Johnson said: "Putin deployed more and more Russian forces in the peninsula, turning the territory into an armed camp from which to threaten the rest of Ukraine, and so Crimea, duly became the launch pad for the invasion of the 24th of February.

He underlined that the Russian president is planning to do the same thing to the rest of Ukraine and "more sham referendums". "So, it has never been more important for us all to stand togeth er in defense of the foundational principle of international law, which is that no territory, no country can acquire territory, or change borders, by force of arms." In 2014, Russia annexed Ukraine's Crimean Peninsula, a move widely viewed as illegal by the international community, including Turkiye and UN General Assembly.

BERLIN: Germany has registered almost a million refugees from Ukraine since Russia invaded its neighbour in February, the interior ministry said on Tuesday. A total of 967,546 people fleeing the war have entered Germany at least temporarily, 36 percent of them children, the ministry said in a statement. Around 97 percent are Ukrainian nationals. Among the adults, three in four are women and around eight percent are over the age of 64.

"Many in our society have gone above and beyond to help refugees," said Interior Minister Nancy Faeser, calling the influx "the largest movement of refugees (in Europe) since World War II". There were almost 155,000 Ukrainian pupils enrolled at German schools by the end of last week, according to the conference of state education ministers in Berlin. The UN refugee agency UNHCR says more than 6.6 million Ukrainians have been registered as refugees across Europe since the Russian invasion. Countries including the Czech Republic, Poland, Romania and Slovakia have opened their borders, homes and wallets to help those fleeing the war.

PUTRAJAYA: Malaysia's highest court Tuesday upheld former prime minister Najib Razak's 12-year jail sentence for corruption in the 1MDB financial scandal, a decision analysts said could slam the door to a political comeback. Najib's daughter-in-law Nur Sharmila Shaheen said the family was told he was sent to Kajang Prison, located south of the capital Kuala Lumpur.

"My father-in-law asked us to take care of the family. He remained strong and calm,' she said. Federal Court chief justice Maimun Tuan Mat, speaking on behalf of a five-judge panel, said the tribunal found Najib's "complaints as contained in the

petition of appeal devoid of any merit". "On the totality of the evidence, we find the conviction of the appellant on all seven charges safe. We also find that the sentence imposed is not manifestly excessive," she added. The appeals are "unanimously dismissed and the conviction and sentence are affirmed", Maimun said. The 69-year-old former prime minister looked somber and dejected, seated by his wife Rosmah and two children as the verdict was read. Journalists who were in an adjacent room watching the proceedings through video link saw Najib surrounded by family members, friends and party mates before the connection was cut off. Outside the court, teary-eyed family members and supporters hugged each other.



Earlier in the day when Najib arrived in court, around 300 supporters mobbed his car chanting "bossku" - "my boss" in Malay - a rallying cry among his defenders.

Just before the verdict was read, Najib, who had said he received an unfair trial, made an impassioned plea asking for a two-month adjournment so he can adequately prepare for a defence. During a break in the proceedings, he spoke to supporters, telling them "if I am guilty, please forgive me".

Najib is the UK-educated son of one of Malaysia's founding fathers who had been

groomed for the prime minister's post from a young age. The final ruling on the jail sentence also came four years after his long-ruling party's shock election defeat in 2018, during which allegations he and his friends embezzled billions of dollars from state fund 1MDB were key campaign issues.

NEW DELHI: The Indian Air Force said on Tuesday the government had sacked three officers for "accidentally" firing a missile into Pakistan in March, an incident that the two nuclear-armed rivals handled calmly as there were no casualties.

The BrahMos missile - a nuclear-capable, land-attack cruise missile jointly developed by Russia and India - was fired on March 9, prompting Pakistan to seek answers from New Delhi on the safety mechanisms in place to prevent accidental launches. "A Court of Inquiry, set up to establish the facts of the case, including fixing responsibility for the incident, found that deviation from the Standard Operating Procedures by three officers led to the accidental firing of the missile," the air force said in a statement.

It said the government had dismissed the three officers with immediate effect on Tuesday. According to the US-based Arms Control Association, the BrahMos missile's range is between 300 km (186 miles) and 500 km (310 miles), making it capable of hitting Pakistan's capital Islamabad from a northern Indian launch pad. Pakistan had summoned Indian Charge d'Afaires (Cd'A) to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs days after the incident to record the nation's protest over the incident.

UN concerned Russia preparing 'unlawful' PoW trials

GENEVA: The United Nations voiced alarm Tuesday at reports that Russia is preparing to prosecute Ukrainian prisoners of war under conditions that could amount to war crimes. The UN human rights office said it was concerned by images and footage appearing to show metal cages being built in the philharmonic hall in the shattered Ukrainian city of Mariupol, apparently to hold PoWs during proceedings. "Under international law, individuals entitled to prisoner of war status have combatant immunity and cannot be prosecuted for having participated in hostilities, or for lawful acts of war committed in the course of the armed conflict, even if such acts would otherwise constitute an offence under domestic law," spokeswoman Ravina Shamdasani told reporters in Geneva. "If prisoners of war are charged with crimes, they are entitled to due process and

US warns of Russian strikes on Ukraine govt targets

KYIV: Washington warned on Tuesday that Russia could attack Ukrainian government facilities in the coming days as Moscow said it would show "no mercy" over an assassination it has blamed on Ukraine. World leaders also reasserted their support for the country on the eve of its independence day celebrations and the six-month anniversary of the beginning of Russia's invasion on February 24.

Leaders including British Prime Minister Boris Johnson and German Chancellor Olaf Scholz warned Russia against further attempts to annex Ukrainian territory in the same way it did with Crimea. "It has never been more important for us all to stand together," Johnson said in a video address to the Crimea Platform conference in Kyiv. Polish President Andrzej Duda attended in person, warning against any "appeasement" of Russia.

"There is no return to business as usual in relations with Russia," he said. In his address, French President Emmanuel Macron vowed that the EU's support for Ukraine would continue "for the long term". "There can be no weakness, no spirit of compromise, because it's a matter of our freedom, for everyone, and of peace everywhere around the world." he said.

Ukraine's Western allies have supplied Kyiv with billions of dollars of military equipment and imposed ever more stringent sanctions on Russia. Moscow has accused Western powers of escalating the war with its support for Ukraine. As tensions grew in the capital, the US embassy in Kyiv issued a security alert and reiterated its appeal for US nationals to leave Ukraine.

"The Department of State has information that Russia is stepping up efforts to launch strikes against Ukraine's ci-

vilian infrastructure and government facilities in the coming days," it said. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky and other officials also warned that Russia could step up attacks around the Independence Day holiday. The celebrations will be muted this year and large gatherings have been

banned in the capital Kyiv. There is also mounting concern after Russia accused Ukrainian intelligence of being behind the assassination of the daughter of a prominent ultranationalist intellectual in Moscow on Saturday. "The investigation will hopefully be completed soon," Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov said at a press conference in Moscow. "According to the results of this investigation, there can be no mercy for those who organised, ordered and carried out (the car bombing)," he said. Ukraine has denied any involvement. - APP

fair trial guarantees. No sentence or punishment may be passed on them unless it is delivered by an impartial and regularly constituted court," she said.

International humanitarian law prohibits the establishment of courts solely to judge PoWs, and wilfully depriving a PoW of the right to a fair and regular trial "amounts to a war crime", she added. "It would be the Russian Federation that would be responsible if this goes ahead," she said. The UN rights office is concerned that PoWs have generally been held without access to independent monitors, exposing them to the risk of being tortured to extract a confession, Shamdasani added. "We have had reports that have led to our concern that torture may be used in these circumstances," she said. "There have also been worrying public statements by Russian officials and members of affiliated armed groups labelling Ukrainian prisoners of war as 'war criminals', 'Nazis', and 'terrorists', thereby undermining the presumption of innocence," she added. - APP
