Imran says ministers should refrain from giving irresponsible statements against Taliban-led Afghan govt

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Imran Khan came down hard on the imported government's ministers for issuing irresponsible statements against the Taliban-led Afghan administration in the backdrop of rising terrorism, warning that if the new Afghan government decided to stop cooperating with Pakistan, it could lead to a "never-ending" war against terrorism. Addressing a seminar on the resurgence of terrorism in Pakistan via video link on Tuesday, PTI Chairman said that the government of crooks was not serious in dealing with the issue of terrorism, as they were more interested in ending their corruption cases due to which terrorism was rearing its ugly head again. Imran Khan said that the imported government's non-serious attitude clearly reflected from the ministers' irresponsible statements that they were planning to attack Afghanistan. The seminar was also addressed by Chief Minister Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Mehmood Khan, PTI Senior leader Murad Saeed, Security analysts Dr. Amir Raza and Imtiaz Gull. ECP issues arrest warrants for Imran, others

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) has issued bailable arrest warrants for PTI leaders including its chairman and former Prime Minister Imran Khan while rejecting pleas for exemption from appearance in contempt of Election Commission cases. The ECP on Tuesday also issued arrest warrants of Asad Umar and Fawad Chaudhry. A four-member ECP commission announced the verdict in contempt cases. The ECP had earlier reserved the verdict. On Tuesday last week, the Supreme Court had allowed the ECP to go ahead with its proceedings against Imran Khan, and his party leaders Asad Umar and Fawad Chaudhry in contempt case filed against them over controversial remarks against the electoral body.

Shebaz Sharif son meets Jehangir Tareen to seek his support

LAHORE: Atta Tarar, Special Assistant to the Prime Minister, on Tuesday claimed that their numbers in the Punjab Assembly had been completed. Speaking to the media, Atta Tarar said their 177 members were present in the assembly on Monday while the number of the Punjab government members was 140. "I am telling the numbers after a complete work and I am confident that our numbers will be complete while Parvez Elahi's numbers will not be complete as women candidates have also been saying they do not want to vote for Parvez Elahi," he said. Mr Tarar further said Parvez Elahi was reluctant to take the vote of confidence and the government had run away along with Moonis Elahi. Sooner or later, the vote of confidence would have to be taken since a hollow person was sitting on the chair of the chief minister. He further claimed that the federal ministers could not enter the Punjab Assembly. "The Punjab Assembly is not the district council of Gujrat and will not allowed to be so.

COAS, UAE president discuss military ties

Both sides vow to further cement bilateral relations

ABU DHABI: Chief of Army Staff (COAS) General Asim Munir discussed defence and military ties with United Arab Emirates President Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan on his first official visit to the Gulf country, a statement issued by the Emirates News Agency (WAM) said Tuesday. The two sides also discussed ways to strengthen military affairs to serve the common interests of the two friendly countries during the meeting, as per the state news agency. "The two sides reviewed cooperation relations and joint work between the UAE and Pakistan in defence and military affairs, as well as ways to strengthen them to serve the common interests of the two friendly countries," said the statement. Gen Munir was received by the UAE president at Qasr Al Shati Palace. President Nahyan congratulated the army chief on his appointment, wishing him luck in his new duties to serve his country and people. Gen Munir expressed his thanks and appreciation to the president for congratulating him. The meeting was attended by UAE's National Security Adviser Sheikh Tahnoon bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of the Presidential Court Sheikh Mansour bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Adviser for Special Affairs at the Ministry of Presidential Court Sheikh Mohammed bin Hamad bin Tahnoon Al Nahyan, Secretary-General of the Supreme Council for National Security Ali Mohammed Hammad Al Shamsi and Staff Lieutenant General Engineer Issa Saif Mohammed Al Mazrouei as chief of staff of the UAE armed forces.

MBS directs to enhance investment to US\$10 billion

KSA agrees to deposit \$ 2 billion more in the State Bank

RIYADH: In a crucial financial relief for Pakistan, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia has hinted at increasing its investment in the country to \$10 billion. It has also suggested to deposit \$2 billion more in country's central bank in order to shore up its forex reserves. Saudi Arabia's Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman has directed to study increasing the Kingdom's investments in Pakistan to reach \$10 billion. According to an announcement made by Saudi Press Agency (SPA) on Tuesday, the Saudi crown prince also directed to assess steps to increase deposits in the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) to US\$5 billion. The announcement came a day after the Saudi crown prince's meeting with Chief of Army Staff General Asim Munir. The investments in Pakistan were previously announced in August. The Saudi deposit to the central bank was extended in December.



PM to visit UAE on Thursday

ISLAMABAD, Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif will undertake a two-day official visit to the United Arab Emirates on January 12-13. The prime minister will visit UAE on the invitation of President of the United Arab Emirates Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Foreign Office spokesperson said in a press release on Tuesday. The prime minister will be accompanied by a high-level delegation, including key members of the cabinet. This would be the prime minister's third visit to the UAE after assuming office. During the visit, prime minister will meet the UAE president with particular focus on advancing economic,

Pak achieves historic success by receiving pledges

ISLAMABAD: Special Assistant to Prime Minister (SAPM) on Poverty Alleviation and Social Safety, Faisal Karim Kundi Tuesday said that Pakistan had achieved historic success in the Geneva Conference by receiving pledges worth Rs 9.7 billion dollars. "This was the result of effective diplomatic efforts of the Foreign Minister, Bilawal Bhutto who in a very short span of time visited various countries and sensitized the international community about the post flood situation being faced by Pakistan", he said during a presser. Flanked by Pakistan People's Party (PPP) Media Coordinator, Nazir Dhoki during the news conference, the SAPM said the total pledges of 9.7 billion dollars included 9.04 billion dollars, 570.50 million Euros and 36 million pounds which is approximately PKR 2204 billion. Faisal Kundi said that the funds acquired through pledges would be spent on the reconstruction and rehabilitation of the flood affected areas and people across the country. The way Bilawal Bhutto fought the case of Pakistan at international forums by visiting different countries and inviting United Nations Secretary General to Pakistan for creating awareness and sense of sympathy about the flood damages which reflected his diplomatic wisdom, he said. He said that still water had not receded from many of the flood affected parts of the country including Sindh,

Balochistan, South Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and South Punjab. "The country needs serious efforts and financial help for the complete rehabilitation of infrastructure and agriculture sector of the country", he added. Criticizing the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf propaganda against Bilawal Bhutto visits, Faisal Kundi said that all the political parties should support the efforts of foreign minister for this national cause keeping aside the political differences. He also criticized PTI for ruining diplomatic relations with the foreign countries and said that the incumbent government was eager to rebuild ties with the friendly countries including Saudi Arabia, Turkey, China, UAE and others who have extended their support in difficult times. Talking about the climate change repercussions being faced by Pakistan and other countries, Faisal Kundi emphasized on engaging national and international community to fight the challenge of climate change which was caused by various reasons including illegal deforestation. About the Benazir Kafalat disbursements under the Benazir Income Support Program (BISP), he said the first tranche of Rs 55 billion had been released to the designated banks and retailers for around 7.7 million families. While a separate amount of Rs 12 billion is being released for the children of Benazir Kafalat beneficiaries under Benazir Education Stipend. These stipends were being disbursed without any deduction and if a person

demands any kind of deduction or fee for payment, the beneficiaries should immediately report to BISP, he said and assured that zero tolerance policy would be adopted in case of any illegal deduction by any means. Faisal Kundi said that the BISP was closely working with National Database Registration Authority (NADRA) to re-include the Benazir Kafalat beneficiaries who were exited without any verification during the PTI tenure. He said that the preparation for the launch of BISP dynamic survey had been finalized and would be inaugurated by the Prime Minister, Shehbaz Sharif and Foreign minister, Bilawal Bhutto soon. The flood hit people having less poverty score will also be included in the BISP through resurvey, he said. Talking about the recent wheat crisis in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Faisal Kundi criticized PTI Chairman for not playing any role in resolving the crisis. He said that Imran Khan was hiding in the Zaman Park and not asking chief ministers of his own governed provinces of Punjab and KP to redress the wheat crisis which he termed as criminal negligence. To a question, Faisal Kundi said that Imran Khan should be made accountable for the public amount of Rs 15 billion which were collected for flood relief activities through telethon. Responding to another question, he said 70 billion rupees had been disbursed among the flood hit families through adopting a transparent procedure.

Afghan Transit Trade PAJCCI expresses concern over excessive documentation in clearance

PESHAWAR: Director Pak-Afghan Joint Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PAJCCI), Zia-ul-Haq Sarhadi has expressed concern over excessive documentation and demand of irrelevant documents at Karachi sea port causing delay in clearance of containers imported under Afghan Transit Trade Agreement. In a press statement issued here on Tuesday, Zia-ul-Haq Sarhadi who is also President Frontier Custom Agents Association said the practice of excessive documentations is not only causing delay in clearance of goods, but also diversion of trade to sea ports of other countries including Cha Bahar and Bandar Abbas in Iran.

The Afghan traders, Zia added, have conveyed their concern and resentment to PAJCCI regarding demand of unnecessary documents during clearance of goods at Karachi port imported under the Afghan Transit Trade facility. Leading Afghan traders including Khan Jan Alkozezy who is also Co-Chairman of PAJCCI, Youna Mohmand, President Afghanistan Chamber of Commerce and Industry and government representatives recently held a press conference in Kabul to raise this issue that is affecting the business, he added. The Afghan businessmen, Zia continued, said they are not facing such kind of hindrances while importing goods from other countries. He demanded of the quarters concerned to take notice of this practice which is not only causing delay in clearance of goods, but is negatively affecting revenue generation due to shifting of business to ports of other countries. Zia said thousands of people are associated with Pak-Afghan Transit trade from landing of imported goods in Karachi to its transportation from sea port to Afghanistan and if the business is shifted to other countries it would render hundred of thousands of people job less. In the prevailing circumstances of global economic recession, it is need of the hour that our concerned departments should chalk out policies with focus on providing ease of doing business to promote commerce and trade and create livelihood for people, he stressed.

PAC demands strict compliance of audit paras from Railway division

ISLAMABAD: The Public Accounts Committee (PAC) on Tuesday demanded from the Ministry of Railways to ensure strict compliance with audit paras for a transparent probe into irregularities highlighted in the detailed report and help secure precious national exchequer funds in various projects of the Ministry. The meeting was chaired by PAC chairman Noor Alam Khan who directed the representatives of the Ministry of Railways to make the institution a profitable entity. Pointing out an issue of misappropriation and misuse of power by a Railways official, MNA Noor Alam Khan told the Secretary Railways that the Deputy Director of Property and Land of Rail-

ways in Peshawar harassed a businessman for giving him bribes. He directed the authorities concerned to conduct an inquiry against the said officer by taking stern disciplinary action to set a precedent for others. He also requested all PAC members and conveners to recommend blacklisting the Akeel Karim Dhedhi Securities Private Limited (AKD) company for its poor performance, and outstanding lease dues for the Pakistan Railways' land of 10,207 square kilometers in Karachi. He also directed to send the issue directly to National Accountability Bureau (NAB) and Federal Investigation Agency (FIA). The Committee recommended that the briefing on

para no. 2.5.65 brief should be given by the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR), Auditor General of Pakistan, Pakistan Railways and Finance Division to resolve this issue within 15 days. "The responsibility should be fixed after inquiry on officials concerned and the lease shall stand canceled from today and it should be vacated by force in Akeel Dhedhi case and Auditor General office should be part of this process," the chair noted. MNA Sheikh Rohale Asghar pointed out that the General Manager of the Railways department was hanging up telephone calls of the Committee members and lacked the courtesy to respond. The PAC chairman urged all the secretaries that they were

civil servants and bound to respond to the parliamentarians' telephone calls, saying that the parliamentarians were representatives of the public. Noor Alam Khan apprised the committee that he had sent a letter on the above matter of misappropriation by the Railways official in Peshawar on Dec 26, 2022, but the Secretary did not reply to it. "People will prefer to commute on trains if the Railways department provided them proper basic facilities," he said. Deputy Auditor General said the Railways have not collected the tax liable deposited in FBR from various contractors while the FBR tax authorities can elaborate on the matter. The chairman PAC directed the Railways

officials to apprise the Supreme Court that the PAC took notice and blacklisted the AKD firm whereas the compliance report should be given within a month but the lease cancellation letter to be issued within a week. The direction should be circulated widely through print and electronic media, he added. The last three paras of the report should be resolved under the DAC to be held and a report of occupied land should be presented before the PAC in the next meeting regarding the Railways. Member of Finance Railways Kashif Noor apprised the committee that the land inquiry is underway and apparently it was given for welfare purposes.—APP

ISLAMABAD: United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF) will continue to respond to urgent humanitarian needs in flood-affected areas, restoring and rehabilitating existing health, water, sanitation, and education facilities for families returning home in the months ahead. "As families begin to return to their villages, our response has moved with them and our mobile health, nutrition, and water teams continue to respond to an immediate lifesaving need," said Abdullah Fadil, UNICEF Representative in Pakistan. He said, "We will continue to help restore and rehabilitate existing health, water, sanitation, and education facilities, supporting

the government's efforts in climate-resilient recovery and reconstruction. We know the climate crisis played a central role in supercharging the cascading calamities evident in Pakistan." He said, "We must do everything within our power to ensure girls and boys in Pakistan are able to fully recover from the current disaster and to protect and safeguard them from the next one." Acute respiratory infections among children, a leading cause of child mortality worldwide, have skyrocketed in flood-stricken areas. In addition, the number of cases of children identified as suffering from severe acute malnutrition in flood-affected areas monitored by UNICEF, nearly doubled between July and December as compared to 2021 as an estimated 1.5 million children are still in need of lifesaving nutrition interventions. Nearly

10 million girls and boys are still in need of immediate, lifesaving support and are heading into a bitter winter without adequate shelter. Severe acute malnutrition, respiratory and waterborne diseases coupled with the cold are putting millions of young lives at risk," Abdullah Fadil added. UNICEF and partners have started providing items such as warm clothing kits, jackets, blankets, and quilts, aiming to reach nearly 200,000 children, women, and men. In response to the worsening child survival crisis, more than 800,000 children have been screened for malnutrition, 60,000 were identified as suffering from Severely Acute Malnutrition - a life-threatening condition where children are too thin for their height - and referred for treatment with Ready-to-Use Therapeutic Food (RUTF).

UNICEF health interventions have reached nearly 1.5 million people with primary health care services so far, and 4.5 million children have been immunized against Polio in 16 flood-hit districts. UNICEF and partners have also provided more than one million people with access to safe drinking water, and one million with hygiene kits. UNICEF Pakistan has permanent field offices in all four provinces and has established four hubs to bring UNICEF operations and programmes closer to the hardest hit areas. "We have been working with the government of Pakistan, UN agencies, and NGO partners to respond to the needs of the most vulnerable populations in 55 calamity-affected districts, both for displaced populations and those returning to the location of their destroyed villages.

the potential visit of Argentinian female football players to Pakistan early this year, to train and coach female football players in Pakistan. He further said that Pakistan female football players from Quetta have a great talent for the sport. It was mutually proposed that both the countries can work together on exchange of sports specialists for the development of bilateral relations and also fight together against the menace of doping among the players.

HEC invites research proposals from faculty members

ISLAMABAD: The Higher Education Commission (HEC) has invited research proposals from faculty members, under the RAPID Technology Transfer Grant (RTTG) programme. The official sources told APP that HEC, in that regard, had invited faculty members of public and private sector universities/degree awarding institutions (DAIs) to submit research proposals focused on the transfer of university developed technologies and products to the industry and commercial sector. The RTTG is a key element of the Higher Education Development in Pakistan (HEDP) project supported by the World Bank and implemented by the HEC. It is a fast-track funding mechanism dealing with themes, topics, and issues of severe urgency for quick-response research on Flood Response, Climate Change and Environment. The grant is anticipated to support proposals in applied research, product innovation, and commercialization of developed technological research and solutions. The RTTG will provide funds to selected institutions based on a competitive, peer-reviewed evaluation of proposals. The amount of funding for RTTG awards may range between PKR 10 - 20 million with a maximum project duration of six months. Sharing the details of applicant eligibility, the sources stated that Lead Principal Investigators (PIs) must be a regular faculty member of higher education institutions (public and private), or hold a contract equivalent to the length of the project duration. The priority sectors for RTTG support are Flood Response, Climate Change and Environment, including but not limited to climate mitigation, adaptation, policy dialogue interventions and disaster management (focusing on climate modelling and disaster surveillance, environment monitoring, and geological monitoring). Metro-scale pollution reduction technologies, protection of available trees through artificial intelligence system controls, and use of membrane systems for gaseous and water industrial waste treatment. The other sectors, including design and development of hybrid membranes and classical system per the requirement of site and location, identification and development of hospital waste treatment processes, removal of arsenic/other toxic metal elements from industrial effluents and water underground aquifers, Climate Change and Environment. – APP

Chairman CDA inaugurates rechargeable well at H-8/2

ISLAMABAD: Capital Development Authority Chairman Captain (Retd) Muhammad Usman Younis on Tuesday inaugurated the rainwater rechargeable well constructed in PMD Sector H-8/2. On this occasion, DG Water Management and other officers were also with him. Chairman Capital Development Authority Captain (retired) Muhammad Usman Yunus was told that 100 recharge wells have been constructed at different places in the city. In which 60 rechargeable wells have been completed while work on 40 rechargeable wells is going on rapidly and soon all these rechargeable wells will be completed. Chairman CDA was further informed that more than one million gallons of rain water has been saved from these recharge wells. These wells are built in a place where water used to stand for 12 to 14 hours due to rains, which was lost by flowing into the rivers. These water rechargeable wells also have a special filtration system that keeps the water clean from polluted elements. The depth of these wells is about 150 to 160 feet. This water gets absorbed into the underground layer which helps in raising the underground water level. The Chairman Capital Development Authority was further informed that flow meters and other devices have been installed at the rechargeable wells which help in monitoring the amount of groundwater and the amount of water absorbed into the ground. The Chairman Capital Development Authority was further informed that it has been observed that even a little rain increases the level of underground water.

No early elections: Javed Latif

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister Mian Javed Latif of Pakistan Muslim League Nawaz (PML-N) Tuesday said that the government would complete its constitutional term and amendments for electoral reforms would be made before the election to maintain transparency. While talking to a private news channel, he said the coalition government was ready to talk about early elections, but the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) should come to parliament and work out a framework for the transparency of elections. PML-N leader alleged PTI leaders of having "double standards," as they were receiving remuneration and using the facilities of parliament houses while also playing politics in the name of resignations. – APP

SMEDA to organize training on tax management

ISLAMABAD: The Small and Medium Enterprises Development Authority (SMEDA) is going to organize a one-day training programme on "Tax Management and E-Filing for SMEs" for profitable business growth on January 17. Senator Nuzhat Sadiq appointed Rapporteur

ISLAMABAD: The 13th plenary session of the Asian Parliamentary Assembly (APA) has gotten underway in the Türkiye city of Antalya. A Parliamentary delegation of Pakistan is participating in the prestigious event, comprising members from both National Assembly and Senate, said a message received here on Tuesday. On the first day of the plenary session, the APA, in a historic move, granted Observer Status to the International Parliamentarians Congress (IPC), an international parliamentary organisation constituted through a resolution adopted by the Senate of Pakistan. The APA also extended an invitation to the IPC for participation in the ongoing plenary.

The plenary session, held under the theme "Promoting multilateralism in the changing global dynamics", brings together representatives of parliamentary delegations from 27 APA member countries. APA Secretary-General Mohammad Reza Majidi, Speaker of the Turkish Grand National Assembly of Türkiye, APA Acting Chairman Mustafa Sentop, as well as the speakers of the parliaments representing the member countries, delivered opening remarks. In his opening remarks, Mustafa Sentop also commended Chairman Senate, Muhammad Sadiq

Sanjrani for having officially registered the nomination in favour of Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan for his efforts to resolve the Ukrainian crisis in a letter addressed to Norwegian Nobel Committee. Asad briefed on NHA apartments

The minister was informed that 456 apartments would be constructed in the A, B, C and D categories. He was informed that the project would be completed in the time of three years and two months. The minister instructed the authorities to consult the relevant departments and start the project at the earliest. He said that apartments should be built on international standards. He said that after the completion of the project in Islamabad, similar residential projects would be started for the NHA's regional offices. The minister affirmed to do his best for the employees of NHA in his tenure and said that no negligence would be tolerated in the project. He also passed instructions for the construction of two additional loops at the junctions of Motorway M1 and M2 which will provide ease to the passengers traveling towards the airport.

The Ambassador also pointed out that Pakistan and Hungary have similar priority areas for research and development, specifically in fields such as Agriculture, Veterinary Sciences, Sports Sciences, Engineering and Technology. He also suggested to create a forum for promoting the exchange of best practices between universities in both the countries. Mr. Fazekas stressed that Hungary places great value on its relationship with Pakistan which is built on shared interests and that Pakistan-Hungary Alumni Network has been set up in the same context. The network fosters cultural exchange and understanding, helping to break down barriers and promote mutual respect and understanding between the two countries.

China can provide insights to Pakistan on food security

ISLAMABAD: China's food security strategy has become a hallmark for many countries to emulate and Chinese food security strategy can provide forward guidance to Pakistan policymakers, said Shan Saeed, Chief Economist at Juwai IQI. Shan told Gwadar Pro that China is leading from the front in terms of storage capacity, supply chain, quality of staple food, and above all timely connecting the farmers and sellers through the use of technology. "Grain storage capac-

ity runs over 650 million tonnes for the country. All credit goes to the leadership of the Chinese government and policymakers. China has got 150 million people out of poverty since 2013 and 900 million people out of poverty since 1986," he added. He further said that the technology-driven food security has provided peace of mind to the masses and rising income for hard-working farmers. Masood Chaudhary, economic expert and businessman, shared with Gwadar Pro his thought that lack of awareness is the biggest issue in Pakistan, as farm-

ers don't have proper education, and policymakers need to improve policies according to international standards. "Adoption of successful business models of multinational companies like Chinese companies could help Pakistani enterprises learn their methods and techniques which could help boosting their business through joint ventures". He further said that China is very good in AI, Big Data, IOT. These kinds of technologies are necessary to enhance business, whereas strict checks and follow-up mechanisms should be launched where

they can analyze their progress and weakness on a monthly basis. "I hope more Chinese companies would invest in the agriculture sector here and teach us all kinds of methods to improve this sector, particularly in technologies," he said. Masood mentioned that Pakistan needs to improve the technical skills of their labor and China may help establish vocational training through MOUs with prestigious educational institutes in different fields, where China can provide solutions.

SC confirms bail of Aijaz Jakhri

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court on Tuesday confirmed the bail of Special Assistant to Chief Minister Sindh Aijaz Hussain Jakhri in NAB reference. A three-member bench headed by Chief Justice Umar Ata Bandial heard the bail petition of Jakhri. Additional Prosecutor NAB said that the bureau had not opposed the interim bail petition of the petitioner as the reference was worth less than Rs 500 million. After listening arguments, the court accepted the bail of accused. The court noted that the petitioner had assured that he would become the part of trial process. The court said that it hoped that the concerned court would increase the pace of trial and it would be concluded within two months. Meanwhile, a woman witness Madeha Malik said that this reference was prepared on the directives of the top court. She said that her statement had been recorded by the trial court but she was being threatened. The chief justice asked the woman to approach the police if she had some threats. She could also file a separate case if she had other issue, he added. The chief justice remarked that an accused remained innocent until charges proved against him as per the law. It may be mentioned here that Aijaz Jakhri had moved a bail case in reference worth Rs 311 million.—APP

President directs FUUAST to provide justice to student

ISLAMABAD: President Dr Arif Alvi, endorsing an order of Wafaqi Mohtasib (WM), has directed Federal Urdu University of Arts, Science and Technology (FUUAST) to update the result of a student who had been earlier declared as fail on account of non-submission of a paper. The student had submitted his paper of Pakistan Studies and its receipt was also acknowledged but he was declared fail on account of the non-receipt of the paper for marking in the examination department, President Secretariat Press Wing said in a press release on Tuesday. While upholding the findings of the Wafaqi Mohtasib, the president observed that due to the Corona lockdown as per the policy of the university.—APP

IT Ministry finalises draft of TASRF

ISLAMABAD: The Ministry of Information Technology and Telecommunication (MoITT) has finalized the draft of the first-ever Telecom Airwaves Spectrum Refarming Framework (TASRF). "Telecommunication is glad to finalize the framework on spectrum refarming which is first of its kind prepared with recommendations from Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA), Pakistan Electronic Media Regulatory Authority (PEMRA), Frequency Allocation Board (FAB) and industry stakeholders after multiple consultations," said a news release. Federal Minister for IT & Telecommunication Syed Amin UI Haque said the draft has been uploaded to the MoITT website for open consultation before approval of the Federal Cabinet. He said frequency or airwaves spectrum refarming is a process governing the repurposing of frequency bands that have historically been allocated for legacy cellular services for new generation of mobile technologies, including emerging technologies, Internet of Things & 5th Generation Technology for on ground inclusion of 4th Industrial Revolution. Amin said that in view of the increasing demand for cellular and radio communication services worldwide, emerging technologies, Spectrum refarming is considered a powerful and innovative approach to manage the spectrum dynamically so as to make it available for newer commercial applications 5G, Internet of Things, broadband wireless access and digital broadcasting. The framework shall enable the effective utilisation of the available frequency spectrum for front-end and backhaul frequencies, increase potential business viability for licensees, better quality and coverage of mobile broadband services and emerging technologies including additional revenues for the national exchequer. The framework shall enable Operators to have a sufficient contiguous spectrum to support the simultaneous operation of multiple technologies in a frequency band.—APP

SC adjourns case regarding NAB amendments

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court (SC) on Tuesday adjourned hearing till January 11, on petition filed by PTI's chairman Imran Khan against amendments in National Accountability Bureau (NAB)'s law. A three-member bench headed by Chief Justice Umar Ata Bandial heard the petition. During the course of proceeding, federal government's lawyer Makhdom Ali Khan argued that there was no important points in the petitions to be answered. A law could only be terminated when there was no other option, he said. He said that the institutions including Parliament, executive and judiciary should work in their defined limits. The judiciary was not given powers in the constitution to terminate the law,

he added. The Supreme Court had granted this authority to the judiciary through a judgment, he said, adding that this authority was also conditional. Makhdom Ali Khan said that the legislation was also challenged under 'shariah' but the top court could not evaluate it under 'shariah' rules as the only forum for this was Federal Shariat Court. The lawyer said that the legislation was the domain of the Parliament and judiciary could not interfere into it. The top court, in its judgments, had also declared that court could not raise question on the intention of the house. Since 1947 the burden of proof was always on the shoulders of complainants, he said. The chief justice questioned that what should be the strength of mem-

bers in the house at the time of voting. How many members of the parliament were in attendance at the time of NAB amendments, he asked. The lawyer said that no law was terminated till this day for not being approved by the majority of members. The chief justice said that it was mere a question. The lawyer said that members Parliament took oaths for taking all decision under the constitution. Justice Ijaz ul Ahsan remarked that it was also in their oaths that they would take decision for development and prosperity of the country. Whether the legislation against country's development would not be violation of oath, he asked. Makhdom Ali Khan said that no any court could determine the intention of members'

Parliament. The judges were bound to take decisions under the law. Justice Mansoor Ali Shah said that it was the difference between the oath of judges and members as the judges took oaths for taking decision as per the law. The lawyer said that the legislation introduced by the members was considered for the development of the country. The US Supreme Court's judge had remarked that the house had right of every legislation, he said. The American court had declared that it would assist the public if it wanted to go towards the hell with its representatives. The advocate said that the court had no authority even on any foolish legislation by the house. After this, the court adjourned further hearing of the case till tomorrow.

Brazil's far right: a clear and present danger

The storming of the three branches of Brazilian government is the most significant threat to the country's democracy since the end of its dictatorship in 1985. Rioters ransacked Brazil's Congress, its presidential palace and its top court in the capital, Brasilia. They had been led to believe false claims by Jair Bolsonaro, the far-right populist, that last October's presidential election had been stolen by the victor, Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva. They hoped to trigger a military intervention by tapping into pro-Bolsonaro sentiment in the armed forces. Mercifully, this did not materialise. Far-right protesters ended up being arrested by the very soldiers whose arrival they had cheered. President Lula, the 77-year-old leader of the Workers' party, will now need all his considerable political skills to navigate a dangerously divided nation. His immediate – and understandable – reaction was to call protesters "vandals, neo-fascists and fanatics". He singled out Mr Bolsonaro, with good reason, for "inciting" the invasion. The blueprint looks to have been the January 6 US Capitol attack by a mob of supporters of Donald Trump. But while Mr Trump whipped up the crowd personally to rush the US Congress weeks before his opponent Joe Biden took office, Mr Bolsonaro fled Brazil and spent inauguration day in Florida. He has yet to concede defeat in October's election. He did condemn Sunday's violence but not the goal that inspired it. Mr Bolsonaro is a clown missing his circus. He is now looking over his shoulder, fearing extradition back to Brazil on corruption charges. The Bolsonarista bloc was consolidated not by good governance but by keeping supporters mobilised with bigotry and conspiracy theories. Lawmakers were bought off with a "secret budget" that was set to hit R\$19.4bn (£3bn), six times what Brazil spends on the environment, until it was deemed illegal last month. Without their leader, and locked out of institutionalised power, Bolsonaristas represent a powerful constituency waiting to be courted. There is likely to be no lack of opportunists who will attempt to win them over. That is why President Lula has not only to root out the political cancer of the far right, but also to deal with the social and economic conditions that caused it. Lulism lasted longer than its originator's time in office. President Lula won two terms from 2003 to 2011, but his ideology remained ascendant until 2016. The transition to Bolsonarism was marked by the rise and fall of the economy, corruption scandals and the collapse of the political system. The key figure in this shift was a rightwing president, Michel Temer, installed in power after the impeachment of his Workers' party predecessor, Dilma Rousseff, in what Mr Temer later referred to as a "coup". During this time deregulation and exploitation were recast as personal freedom and entrepreneurship. Simultaneously, racism and sexism were presented as a defence of Christian family values, to which many Brazilians retreated in the face of economic uncertainty. Mr Bolsonaro's base was then built on deforestation – he won in agribusiness's heartlands, where he had been cheerleading illegal mining and logging. President Lula is right to want to reverse the reforms passed by the last two presidents. He says erasing poverty and hunger would be the "hallmarks" of his government.



Political paralysis looms after house speaker fiasco

Republican Congressman Kevin McCarthy was elected speaker of the United States House of Representatives early on Saturday, after making extensive concessions to right-wing hardliners in his party. McCarthy's victory in the 15th ballot ended the deepest congressional dysfunction in over 160 years. But it sharply illustrated the difficulties he will face in leading a narrow and deeply polarized majority. What this drama on Capitol Hill exposes is the political instability that will have an impact on the future of the United States and interests of its people. The fact that McCarthy was elected only after agreeing to a demand by hardliners that any lawmaker can call for his removal at any time makes it very difficult for him to exercise his power as speaker. Which means legislation will be very hard to be passed on critical issues such as funding the government, addressing the nation's looming debt ceiling and other crises that may arise. In addition, the main tool for the speaker, on behalf of the majority, in controlling the House floor is the Rules Committee, which sets the terms of legislative debate, including which bills can be considered, for how long and – crucially – what amendments may be offered and by whom. As part of McCarthy's compromise with the dissidents, he agreed to give the ultraconservative wing of the Republican Party approval power over one-third of the Republican members of the panel. In effect, that gives the extreme faction the ability to block any legislation it does not like from the floor, by banding together with Democrats on the panel who are all but certain to oppose most Republican bills. Some Republicans might be inclined to vote for spending bills and a debt ceiling increase, not wanting to see a government shutdown or a debt default. They would have an incentive to work with Democrats on bipartisan deals that could make it through the Senate to President Joe Biden's desk. But in the past couple of decades Republican speakers have followed an unofficial, but hard-and-fast rule – known as the Hastert Rule – for the GOP speaker to not put forward any legislation that does not have the support of a majority of the majority. That means if conservatives are not on board, a bipartisan deal can never see the light of day on the floor. As a result, under the new speaker, Congress will in all likelihood be a paralyzed one, and even the speaker himself runs the risk of being removed if he ever angers the right-wing faction. The problem is that very few politicians in Washington are willing to put the interest of their country and people before that of the political factions that have an inordinate influence on US politics. This is exactly the root cause of this crisis around the election of the house speaker, and also the root cause of the political instability the country faces.

statehood and claims exclusive right to all of historic Palestine. It tramples over past agreements as it prepares to annex much of the occupied West Bank, which makes up the backbone of a prospective Palestinian state. This week's provocation by Israel's minister of national security, Itamar Ben-Gvir, in entering the Al-Aqsa Mosque compound, is only the beginning of what threatens to be a protracted campaign of incitement and violent escalation until this pyromaniac government sets Palestine on fire. The Palestinian reaction has thus far been meagre at best. Politically divided, diplomatically isolated and terribly unpopular, Palestinian leaders have resorted to the same old empty slogans and tired manoeuvres. They have proven incapable of rising to the challenge or unwilling to do what it takes to face the imminent threat. Their appeal to the United Nations for salvation smacks of desperation and escapism. It is no victory to extract yet another resolution when previous resolutions collect dust at UN headquarters. If history is any guide, Israeli obstinacy and aggression have only increased with every resolution. It pains me to watch smug Palestinian spokespeople speak of an inevitable "end of apartheid" or the "demise of the Zionist regime" when, in reality, Israel has become the Middle East's most powerful state and one of the richest in the world while Palestine devolves into an impoverished, failed and broken entity. After more than seven decades of dispossession, five decades of occupation and three decades of protracted negotiations, Palestinians deserve better than having their rights and freedoms reduced into wishful dreams and political fantasies. They deserve a worthy, responsible and unified leadership ready and able to take on Israeli intransigence, Western indifference and official Arab insolence. A tall order? Perhaps. But the sooner the Palestinian leaders realise that the UN is no substitute for a united nation, that international law is not synonymous with international action and international alli-

ances are no replacement for national bonds, the sooner they can prepare to weather the Israeli hurricane coming their way. Indeed, the international community will remain largely indifferent to their pleas unless or until the Palestinians make a real difference on the ground, which requires them, first and foremost, to make amends and reunite their efforts.

The West Bank-based Fatah leadership and the Gaza-based Hamas leadership must stop sacrificing the national struggle at the altar of their power struggle. They must recognise that their factional friction is paralysing the popular struggle for freedom, that national unity is indispensable for national liberation. If they must compete, it should not be over the manning of the open-air prisons of the West Bank and Gaza Strip, rather over ending the occupation of Palestine altogether. It has been more than a decade now since Fatah, Hamas and other factions met in various world capitals to end their 2006 friction. They have reached a variety of agreements, most recently in Algiers, that should pave the way to a true national unity. To no avail. Their personal, factional and ideological differences continue to trump their common struggle against the Israeli occupation.

Their pursuit of conflicting regional and international agendas has confounded their friends and comforted their foes. President Mahmoud Abbas may be lamented for having put all his eggs in Washington's basket or later desperately seeking salvation in Moscow, but Hamas's pursuit of relief and redemption in Damascus and Tehran is no less short-sighted – read disastrous. Pursuing such relationships undermines, even betrays, the most basic value at the heart of the Palestinian struggle, namely, seeking justice. Bloody thugs and cynics do not make for good saviours. Never. Both sides will need to transcend their opposite approaches to the conflict – nothing but diplomacy vs anything but diplomacy – in light of mounting Israeli intransigence that demands Palestinians surrender as a prerequisite to diplomacy. None of that is to say that the Palestinian

leadership should not pursue UN involvement and international support for their cause. On the contrary. But such support should be channelled and instrumentalised by a well-defined national agenda and strategy for liberation, one that is put to a national vote. Since 2006, both Abbas and the Hamas leaders have ruled like incompetent autocrats, overly dependent on foreign powers. It is time that changes, but not by subjugating the Palestinians to another divisive election under occupation, rather by solidifying and strengthening their unity through a popular vote. Once an overwhelming majority of Palestinians supports such a united agenda, no regional or international power, including Israel, would be able to ignore, divide or blackmail the Palestinians for their cynical ends.

United, national leaders could tap the infinite capacity and willingness of Palestinians to fight for their cause and the passionate and overwhelming popular Arab support for Palestine and opposition to Israel. Together, they will make the Israeli fanatics regret waging holy war against Palestine.

United, the Palestinians will be reinvigorated and better suited to stand up to the fanatics ruling Israel, using all means necessary to effect change. Lest we forget that it was Palestinian unity in the first Palestinian Intifada that forced both Israel and the United States to recognise and negotiate with the PLO and their unity in the second Intifada that forced them, albeit theoretically, to embrace the two-state solution. United, they could build bridges to the Palestinians within Israel and reach out to other disenchanted Israelis and Jews who oppose fascism and support liberty and justice in Israel and Palestine. United, they are better positioned to garner international support now that the new Israeli government faces greater scrutiny by its American and other Western backers. Where there is unity, there is victory.

India and Pakistan can agree on one thing: neither wants the other one around", writes Tim Marshall in his book "Revenge of Geography". The states that consider each other their rivals are always embroiled in security dilemma. If one state adds any new weapon in its defenses, then other states comprehend this as power imbalance. Hence, in return, the second state will also boost its defense to maintain the balance of power. This spiral goes on and both states continue developing their defense. Such is the case of Pakistan and India, archrivals since independence have fought four wars. India wants hegemony in the region while Pakistan is a major obstacle for India. India is following an offensive realist policy to maximize its power, its acquisition of S-400 and deployment at Pakistan border is destabilizing the regional stability. S-400 is "mobile air-defense system" that has the capabilities to engage the cruise missile, aircrafts and ballistic missiles. S-400 attracts many states to buy because of its advanced technology. It has engagement radar, surveillance radar and can fire four types of missiles, including short range up to 40km, medium range up to 120km, long range up to 250km, and missiles up to the range of 400km. India has been trying hard to acquire the S-400 air defense system. The only hindrance was the danger of sanctions imposed by US under CAATSA (Countering American Adversaries Through Sanctions Act), which allows the US President to impose sanctions on states that engage in arms deal with Russia. New Delhi is Washington's partner in countering Beijing. India has got waiver from the US because Washington cannot impose sanctions on New Delhi as it would create ill-feelings against America in India. US needs India in

the Indo Pacific. It is major non-NATO ally of the US being part of the QUAD that is meant to counter China in the region. There are several ambitions that have pushed New Delhi to acquire S-400. Obviously, military might is considered as major determinant to acquire hegemony in the region. As Mearsheimer states, the "states must accumulate maximum power for themselves and should contend to flip the balance of power in their favor"; India is thus following the same hegemonic designs. It has found this as state-of-the-art weaponry which can strategically upgrade its military. In addition to this, New Delhi wants to establish multi-layer air defense over Mumbai and the capital. It is using indigenous air defense systems i.e. "Prithvi Air Defense" (PAD) and "Advanced Air Defense" (AAD). S-400 will provide India a second layer of air defense.

Moreover, India wants to deter Pakistan's aircrafts as stated by Air Chief Marshal (ret'd) B S Dhanoa, who says the purpose of the S-400 missile system and Rafale is to hit Pakistani aircrafts inside the Pakistan air space and not when they come inside the Indian territory". The deployment of S-400 would make India think that it is invincible and this feeling would lead to aggressive postures by India. New Delhi will further in-

crease the threats to Islamabad. The recent firing of missile in the territory of Pakistan from India is an example of any adverse event that can give rise to war between the two rivals. India can exacerbate any such situation because now it has a solid defense system. In addition to this, New Delhi has though "No-First-Use-Policy", yet recent statements by Indian officials suggest that India can change this policy. The country that can face the aggressive designs of India is Pakistan. There are multiple options for Pakistan. First, it can follow New Delhi and purchase the same defense system although, given the condition of Pakistan's economy, it is currently not possible for Islamabad. Another option for Pakistan is to develop the delivery systems that can exhaust the Indian defense system. The recent achievement of Pakistan was the development of "Ababeel" like Multiple Independently Targetable Reentry Vehicle (MIRV). It has a range of 2,200 km and can target multiple missiles that can exhaust the S-400. Moreover, the indigenous missiles of Pakistan have capabilities to bypass the S-400. Another option for Islamabad is to develop hypersonic missiles that cannot be detected by S-400. In addition to this, Pakistan can develop the electric technologies that can be used to jam the S-400 radars. In nutshell, Pakistan will definitely be impacted by the deployment of S-400 air defense system by India. But, the threat needs to be countered as immediately as possible. It is not insurmountable, however. Pakistan would have to take the above measures in order to counter the Indian air defense system in case of any hostility.

LAHORE: Former chairman of the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB), Ramiz Raja, has said that India has the mindset to limit Pakistan. Raja was dismissed as the PCB chief in December after a 14-member committee, led by Najam Sethi, was established by the government. In an interaction at the Government College University in Lahore on Tuesday, the former cricketer said: "India's mindset is to limit us. The International Cricket Council (ICC) gets revenue from India and it becomes influential. The Asian Cricket Council (ACC) gave us the Asia Cup, and I took a strong stand when it came to taking it away." It must be noted that in October last year, former PCB chairman Ramiz Raja said that Pakistan will not go to India for ICC World Cup 2023 if India pulls out of Asia Cup 2023 in Pakistan. The statement came out after BCCI secretary Jay Shah stated that India will not go to Pakistan for the Asian event. His announcement caught Pakistan by surprise, with PCB officials warning that the move

could "split" the international cricket community. Under the new management committee, the PCB Constitution 2014 was restored while the legislation of 2019 was repealed. The former batter criticised the restoration of 2014's constitution, claiming that it has brought Pakistan cricket to a "dark age". "I did not come here to fight my case. For a year and a half, I focused on continuity and growth. It's an abuse that you come forward by bulldozing the constitution. This is an abuse of youth, as they will con-



der what is going on here," he added. Raja also lauded the achievements of Pakistani white-ball teams in recent times and suggested not to tweak the team as it will cause negative results. "There have been attempts to force things. A great team has been made for white-ball cricket as many stars have been developed. If you change the team, it will get negative results and nothing will be achieved. Pakistan has played in the final of the World Cup, is it a small thing? Babar and company's focus is on cricket," he said. The former commentator also said that

he had no respect for players that engage in fixing. "Those involved in fixing and that are tainted are not regarded well. Such people have no regard in my book. I am from an era when nine players were fighting for the win while two were just playing around." Raja also spoke against Shan Masood being named as vice-captain of the ODI team for the New Zealand series, saying a player who is not part of the permanent team has been made Babar's deputy. "It means you're tweaking things unnecessarily, putting the white-ball team under pressure. There is no point in this. The white ball team is extraordinary," he stated. Moreover, the former PCB chief also opened up about Sarfaraz Ahmed's exclusion from the national team. The wicket-keeper batter returned to the Pakistan team after almost four years and performed exceptionally well, scoring 355 runs in four innings against New Zealand. "Sarfaraz Ahmed has always been a part of the team. The coach and captain have to choose from 16. I have tried to make the captain strong," he remarked.

France captain Lloris retires from int'l football

PARIS: The Tottenham captain's decision comes three weeks after France were beaten by Argentina on penalties in the 2022 World Cup final on 18 December. Lloris had captained his country to World Cup victory four years earlier when they won the 2018 tournament. "I've decided to stop my international career, with the feeling that I have given everything," said Lloris. Speaking to French publication L'Equipe, he added: "I think it is important to announce this now, two-and-a-half months before the start of Euro qualifying." France have been drawn with Gibraltar, Greece, and Republic of Ireland in their Euro 2024 qualifying group. Lloris made his international debut in a friendly against Uruguay in November 2008. He won his 145th cap in the World Cup final defeat by Argentina which made him France's record appearance maker. Lloris captained France 121 times, which is also a record. "I have really been thinking about it since the end of the World Cup, but there has been something deep inside of me for maybe six months now and which grew during the competition, leading me to make this decision," he said. Lloris' decision has come after France manager Didier Deschamps extended his contract until June 2026. "There comes a time when you need to step aside. I have always said the French national team does not belong to any one person," added Lloris. — DNA



Harry Brook named ICC Player of the Month

LONDON: England's star middle-order batter Harry Brook has been adjudged by the ICC as Men's Player of the Month for December 2022 for his recent performances against Pakistan. Brook alongside Pakistan skipper Babar Azam and Australia's Tavis Head competed for the honour, and managed to edge the two top-class batters to clinch the award. The batter was crucial for England during its whitewash of Pakistan in the three-match Test series. The youngster finished the tour as the highest run-scorer with 468 runs in three matches. In Jonny Bairstow's absence, Brook proved to be the ideal replacement for the "BazBall" strategy and slid into the middle of the order with ease. Brook's runs were scored at a remarkable strike rate of 93.41. — APP



Wales' greatest, Gareth Bale departs

LONDON: It was a moment Welsh football had been dreading for what felt like an age, a long-looming inevitability that a nation had put to the back of its mind for fear that it might actually become true. And yet when it finally arrived, Gareth Bale's announcement of his retirement still came as a shock of seismic proportions. This was a day Wales could see coming - just not this soon. Speculation regarding Bale's future had raged for years, dominating the final stages of his glittering career at Real Madrid and following him at the past two major tournaments with Wales. Optimists clung to the fact that he had departed the World Cup with the vow that he would "keep going as long as I can and as long as I'm wanted". Some dreamed that he might even have carried on forever; there were times when he did seem immortal. But there is no escaping time. While 33 might be a relatively young age to retire, Bale had been showing signs of slowing as his body bore the toll of a superhuman 17-year career. Logic suggested

this day would come but, then again, Bale had kept defying logic to conjure moments of magic even as he appeared to be losing some of his powers of old. His retirement marks the end not only for arguably the finest player Wales has ever produced, but also the beginning of the end for the greatest era in the country's footballing history. Bale elevated Wales to new heights, embodying his nation's rise from lowly underachievers to major tournament regulars. In doing so, he transcended his sport, a phenomenal athlete whose global renown brought Wales to the world's attention. To quantify such an impact is a near-impossible task and, although boiling Bale's career down to numbers and achievements is reductive, they bear repeating. Real Madrid made him the world's most expensive footballer when they bought him from Tottenham for £85m in 2013 and, during nine years in Spain, he scored more than 100 goals on his way to helping Real win a staggering five Champions League and three La Liga titles. His trophy cabinet also includes a plethora of individual accolades, such as two PFA Player of

the Year awards and the Football Writers' Association Footballer of the Year. Then there is Bale's peerless Wales career, ending as his country's all-time leading male scorer with 41 goals from 111 appearances, another national men's record. Impressive as all those feats are, though, they are only part of Bale's story. You had to watch him in action to truly appreciate his brilliance. Bale was more than the leading character in a film of his blockbuster career; he was the man who kept writing his own barely plausible scripts and, most stunningly of all, kept bringing them to life with displays of otherworldly powers. To rewatch showreels of his goals for Tottenham is to be mesmerised by a heady cocktail of supreme athleticism, mazy dribbling and outlandish long-distance shooting. At Real Madrid, his goals were as awe-inspiring as they were important, from the audacious run from his own half in the 2014 Copa del Rey final win over Barcelona to the jaw-dropping overhead kick against Liverpool that helped clinch victory in the 2018 Champions League final, one of the greatest goals in the competition's history.

12 die in fresh clashes in south eastern Peru

LONDON: At least 12 people have died in a south-eastern Peruvian city during clashes between security forces and protesters reportedly trying to overrun a local airport. The fatalities were caused on Monday in the city of Juliaca. Those killed had gunshot wounds, an official at the local Calos Monge Hospital told a Peruvian TV channel. The dead included two teenagers, the local health ministry was quoted by Reuters as saying. At least 38 other people had also been wounded during the violence, the ministry added in a statement published on Facebook. "What is happening is Peruvians are slaughtering each other. I ask for calm," said Juliaca's Mayor Oscar Caceres. Demonstrators had already tried on Saturday to overrun Juliaca's airport, which is being protected by police and soldiers. Juliaca is located in the country's Puno region, which has proven to be a flashpoint for violence since the country started to experience its latest spate of political unrest, almost a month ago. The unrest began after former president Pedro Castillo was arrested and jailed amid his attempt to dissolve Congress and rule by decree. Castillo is serving 18 months of pre-trial detention on charges of rebellion. He denies the charges. The protesters have a whole host of demands, including departure of President Dina Boluarte, who has replaced Castillo, and the former head of state's return. —APP

Spain repatriates 15 including from Syria

MADRID: Madrid has repatriated two Spanish women who were married to Islamic State group fighters, flying them home from jihadist camps in Syria with 13 children, the government said on Tuesday. They arrived at Torrejon de Ardoz military airport near Madrid late on Monday, nearly two months after the Spanish government agreed to bring them home. "The government has just repatriated two women and 13 Spanish minors from Syrian refugee camps," a foreign ministry statement said. The two women were arrested on arrival and would be brought before a judge at the Audiencia Nacional, Spain's top criminal court, it said. A court spokesman confirmed the women would appear in court on Wednesday morning on "terrorism-related charges". The 13 children were taken into the care of the Madrid region's social services, it said. The ministry said the extradition had taken "several months" because of the "complexity (of the operation) and due to the high-risk situation in the Syrian camps". —APP

Belgium extends life of its nuclear power industry

BRUSSELS: The Belgian government announced on Monday it has signed an agreement with French energy company Engie to extend two of the seven nuclear reactors operated in Belgium for ten years, starting in November 2026. The two parties had been negotiating hard for months over the conditions of the extension, decided in March 2022 by Belgium to guarantee its energy supply beyond 2025, against a backdrop of uncertainties linked to the war in Ukraine.

The Belgian state and the energy company had already agreed to create a 50/50 joint venture to manage the two extended reactors, under a pre-agreement announced in July. Announcing the deal at a news conference in Brussels, the Belgian Prime Minister Alexander De Croo said it would allow the country to take back control of its "energy destiny". "This energy production which is naturally extremely efficient, is a form of energy which does not produce greenhouse gases and where the Belgian State will become an important partner," said Mr De Croo. —APP

EU, NATO sign joint call for co-op amid Russian threat

NATO was established during the Cold War, mainly with the aim of securing Western European countries against the threat of Soviet Union. It has 30 members today, and Ukraine's desire to join the alliance has long been a bone of contention for Russia

BRUSSELS: The European Union and the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) formally signed a joint declaration to strengthen partnership to counter Russia's war on Ukraine and boost security in the broader region. The European Union Commission President Ursula von der Leyen and European Council President Charles Michel, along with NATO's Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg, signed the joint declaration to improve co-operation between the two institutions at the NATO headquarters in Brussels, Belgium. This joint declaration is the third between the two organizations and builds on the previous two declarations signed in 2016 and 2018, respectively. Stoltenberg said that the three officials met almost a year ago in the same place — NATO headquarters — after Russia invaded Ukraine last February. "Putin wanted to take Ukraine in a few days and divide us. On both counts, he failed," Stoltenberg said.



The NATO chief said that Russian President Vladimir Putin wants a different Europe and his ambition would have long-term consequences for the region for which they need to prepare. He said they "recognize the value of

a stronger and more capable European defense that contributes positively to global and transatlantic security and is complementary to, and interoperable with, NATO." Stoltenberg added he was determined to take partner-

ship between the EU and NATO to the "next level" as security threats keep evolving in scope and magnitude. European Council President Charles Michel said "Putin wanted less NATO, but he has achieved the opposite,"

referring to the pending accession of Sweden and Finland to the alliance. "We are closer today than ever," Michel said, adding that the EU was determined to contribute more effectively to the security in the broad-

er Euro-Atlantic area. Von der Leyen said the bloc would keep pressure on Russia for "as long as it takes" and that Ukraine should get all the military assistance that it needs. She said the EU would extend sanctions to "those who military support Russia," naming Belarus and Iran. The joint call makes clear that the North Atlantic Treaty "remains the foundation of collective defense" for the region and the broader Euro-Atlantic area, officials said. The principle of collective defense, which states that an attack on one member of NATO is an attack on all its members, is the cornerstone of the US-led military alliance. Both NATO and the EU have played important roles since Russia's war on Ukraine started. The EU was established after the Second World War and has expanded significantly since then, with 27 members part of the group today. NATO was established during the Cold War, mainly with the aim of securing Western European countries against the threat of Soviet Union. It has 30 members today.

'Italy, Japan to forge strategic partnership'

ROME: Italy and Japan are to forge a strategic partnership, Premier Giorgia Meloni said after talks in Rome Tuesday with Prime Minister Fumio Kishida. Saying that ties between the two countries would be raised to that new level, Meloni hailed the already high level of bilateral trade, at 12 billion euros. "We had a long talk starting from the excellent bilateral relations that exist between Italy and Japan, which have trade of 12 billion euros a year," said the Italian premier. "I recall the launch on 9 December together with the United Kingdom of a programme aimed at developing a sixth generation vehicle on civil sectors and scientific

research. "We agreed to elevate our relationship to the status of strategic partnership, a significant step and a strengthening of our contacts with the opening of new opportunities". Meloni went on: "In addition to ensuring full support to Ukraine, we want to work with the Japanese presidency (of the G7) on certain priorities proposed by Japan, such as the protection of the rules-based international order, strengthening economic security, protecting supply chains and upping the fight against climate change. "These are all challenges on which there is a lot of work to be done, we will deepen these issues related to international politics, starting with the consequences of the war in Ukraine". The partnership would entail a mechanism of bilateral consultations on foreign policy and defence which will cover "all the areas of global and regional themes of mutual interest," Meloni added. Among the fields of heightened cooperation, Kishida, speaking through an interpreter, cited diplomacy, investment, railways and cinema. The Japanese leader began a tour of key Western partners on Monday after unveiling his country's biggest military buildup since World War Two as Tokyo weighs steps to counter China's growing power. Kishida hosts a summit of the Group of Seven (G7) industrial powers in May, which he said would reiterate the G7's commitment to helping Ukraine in its efforts to repel Russia's invasion and also focus on the security of the Indo-Pacific region. Last month Japan, Italy and Britain announced the Global Combat Air Programme (GCAP) venture to develop by 2035 a next generation jet which would combine the British-led Tempest project with Japan's F-X programme. —Agencies

UK businesses to see energy bills soar amid subsidy cuts

LONDON: The UK government is set to scrap the energy subsidies for businesses in the next financial year by 85 percent, leaving small businesses in a dire economic situation, as the cost-of-living crisis squeezes Britons' lives. British businesses will see their energy bills soar from April after the government announced the stoppage of the current bills support scheme for firms at the end of March when the price caps for energy bills will expire. Describing the current level of support as "unsustainably expensive", the government has decided to reduce the support rate from £18bn to £5.5bn in the planned six-month period. Speaking to the House of Commons on Monday, Treasury Minister James Cartledge was at pains to confirm that: "It is not sustainable for the exchequer to continue to support large numbers of businesses at the current level." "No responsible, serious government anywhere in the world can permanently shield businesses from this energy price shock," Cartledge said, acknowledging the soaring energy costs across the country. Cartledge also insisted it was necessary to "cap the taxpayer's exposure to volatile energy prices" rather than providing open-ended support. According to the government's own calculations, a typical bill will see its bills rise by almost £3,000 a month when the new scheme takes effect. —APP

Maduro '100% defeatable': Opposition

CARACAS: With the end of his symbolic interim government, which Juan Guaido hoped would push President Nicolas Maduro from power, the opposition leader is now proposing primary elections to reunify a fractured opposition, insisting that Maduro is "defeatable". "The problem we have today is to reunify the democratic alternative. Once the democratic alternative is reunited, Maduro is 100 percent defeatable," the 39-year-old said Monday in an interview with AFP in Caracas, ahead of presidential elections slated for 2024. Guaido, who is the target of numerous judicial processes in his country, hopes the primaries can take place in the first half of this year. Riven by divisions, the opposition itself has recently eliminated the "interim government" that in January 2019 had been recognized by the United States and fifty other countries due to challenges to Maduro's re-election a year earlier. - Are you disappointed with the old allies who withdrew support for the "interim government"? "We are focused on what we have demanded from early on: free elections, a presidential election that we have been owed since 2018, and the pending task is to reunify the democratic alternative, which is the majority."

Myanmar jails more than 100 Rohingya

YANGON: Myanmar authorities have sentenced 112 Rohingya, including a dozen children, to between two and five years in prison for attempting to travel to Malaysia "without legal documents", state media reported Tuesday. The group were arrested last month in the southern Ayeyarwady region and sentenced on January 6, according to a report by the Global New Light of Myanmar, which cited local police. The children were transferred to a "youth training school" near commercial hub Yangon on January 8, the newspaper reported, without giving further details. The report referred to the group as "Bengalis," using a pejorative word for the Muslim minority, who are denied citizenship in Buddhist-majority Myanmar and often require permission to travel. A military crackdown in Myanmar in 2017 sent hundreds of thousands of Rohingya fleeing into neighbouring Bangladesh with harrowing stories of murder, rape and arson. Myanmar is facing genocide accusations at the United Nations' top court following the mass exodus. —DNA

11 people killed in Philippine storms

MANILA: At least 11 people have died in storms across the Philippines in the past week, with more heavy rain expected in already sodden regions of the disaster-prone country, authorities said Tuesday. Bad weather has plagued the country's southern and central islands since the Christmas weekend when downpours triggered flooding and landslides that left 52 people dead and forced hundreds of thousands to flee their homes. Since January 3, back-to-back storms have killed 11 people as floodwaters swept through houses, cut roads and swamped crops, the civil defence office said. The state weather forecast warned Tuesday of "serious flooding" in low-lying areas and landslides in the mountains of the central island of Samar. Heavy rain has already inundated villages, with water levels reaching three metres (10 feet) in some places. So far, one person was missing and more than 2,200 people had been evacuated from their homes, said Josh Echano, Northern Samar provincial disaster officer. The number of evacuees was expected to rise. "The flood is progressing since yesterday, it's not subsiding," Echano said. "This could be fatal. This could be one of the worst (floods)." The Philippines is ranked among the most vulnerable nations to the impacts of climate change. —APP

Extremist movements' are biggest threat to democracy, peace

OVIEDO: Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez warned about the dangers of "extremist movements" after thousands of supporters of former President Jair Bolsonaro raided Brazil's Congress and presidential offices. "The news from Brazil reminds us that the biggest threat to democracy, peace and prosperity around the world — from north to south, east to west — is the resurgence of extremist movements willing to destroy everything," Sanchez said at an ambassadors' conference in Madrid. The Spanish premier broke down the methods of these "extremist" movements, which he said follow the exact same pattern in nation after nation. "First, the systematic use of lies to get more followers. Second, resorting to insults and verbal violence to poison harmonious societies ... and finally, an attack of democratic institutions and democratic legality." He argued that values like democracy, gender equality and international law are the "best antidotes" to the "repulsive phenomenon" that triggered assaults on both Washington and Brasilia. Sanchez emphasized his support for Brazil's President Lula da Silva and said Spain would continue promoting democratic values with "intense" foreign policy activities in 2023. In the second half of the year, Spain will assume the presidency of the Council of the EU. —APP

CARACAS: Venezuela's President Nicolas Maduro has denounced the US parallel institution policy in his country, calling Washington's attempt to assault and replace the public institutions of his country a "failure." Maduro made the remarks during the opening ceremony of Venezuela's now-defunct opposition-led National Assembly (NA) session in the new year, according to TeleSur TV website. Criticizing the US attempt to shift political powers in his country, he said the "Trumpist policy against Venezuela of assaulting and replacing the public powers of appointing us a president, to name us a National Assembly, to name us a judicial power from outside failed." "The US

Empire and its representatives in Venezuela have no shame in criticizing themselves and saying that we made a mistake and failed in Venezuela," the Venezuelan president asserted. "Venezuela knows that the one who makes the laws, who legislates, who appoints, who governs in parliament in Venezuela is the National Assembly elected in December 2020, installed on January 5, 2021, which with this new board of directors enters its third year of five years of unappealable period". He urged Brian Nichols, the US Deputy Secretary of State for the Western Hemisphere, to learn about ways of legislation in Venezuela by visiting the Latin American country. President Maduro further called on the Venezuelan opposition and its backers in the US to stop stealing government resources through fake

institutions. The Venezuelan head of state broke off relations with the US when the administration of then-president Donald Trump said it would refuse to recognize the Latin American nation's election results of the previous year, which had reinstated Maduro in power. Washington instead began throw-



ing its weight behind opposition figure, Juan Guaido, as Venezuela's so-called interim president. Last month, Venezuela's US-backed opposition voted to remove the so-called "interim government" led by Guaido in a sign that Washington has conceded it cannot overthrow the democratically-elected government of Maduro. The opposition groups are reportedly seeking a "united front" ahead of presidential elections tentatively scheduled for 2024 after failing to remove Maduro, who won re-election to a six-year term in 2018. The US, along with dozens of allied countries — mainly in Western Europe — have refused to recognize the democratically-elected Maduro government in Venezuela, terming it "fraudulent", while backing the opposition-led so-called interim government. Also in November 2022, Washington

lifted its oil embargo on Caracas by allowing the second-largest US oil company to resume production in Venezuela and to import the South American country's crude into the United States. Chevron Corp received an expanded US license to revive existing oil projects in the US-sanctioned country and bring new oil supplies to refiners in the United States. However, it restricts cash payments to Venezuela, in order to control the amount of money entering the country. President Maduro, in his remarks on Monday, also extended his solidarity to his Brazilian counterpart, Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva, following attacks from the extreme right that he said "does not accept the legitimate power of the people's votes, that does not accept the sovereignty of countries."

Dutch grant licence to exiled Russian TV channel

THE HAGUE: The Dutch media regulator has granted a licence to Russian independent channel Dozhd, or TV Rain, the network said Tuesday, after Latvia revoked the broadcaster's permit. The channel, which moved to Latvia after Russian authorities blocked its broadcasts for critical coverage of the war in Ukraine, was barred after Latvia accused it of breaching local laws. "TV channel Dozhd received a European licence for broadcasting. It was given by the Dutch media regulator for five years," the network said on messaging app Telegram. "This means Dozhd may return to the cable network from which it was disconnected because of the revocation of its licence," the network said. Dozhd said it would move its editorial offices to Amsterdam and the studio there "will become the main one as soon as employees receive work permits in the Netherlands". It will however maintain some staff in Riga as Latvia remains "the most important" country for the channel in terms of editorial strategy. Latvia had accused Dozhd, which was founded in 2010 as the main opposition TV channel in Russia, of multiple violations that included allegedly supporting Russian soldiers fighting in Ukraine. The channel was also accused of showing the annexed Crimean peninsula as part of Russia and failing to ensure Latvian language translation. - APP

India set to demolish buildings in Himalayan town

NEW DELHI: Hundreds of people in the northern Himalayan town of Joshimath have been evacuated and authorities are set to demolish some of the damaged buildings, Indian officials and local media reported on Tuesday. In early January, large cracks began appearing on the roads and buildings in the town. This was due to a process called land subsidence, which is a gradual sinking of the ground due to movement of materials underground, according to the US National Geodetic Survey (NDS). The NGS states that the usual causes are due to "the removal of water, oil, natural gas or mineral resources out of the ground by pumping, fracking or mining activities." The exact cause of the land subsidence in Joshimath remains unclear. However, experts and residents have blamed the damage on large scale construction projects undertaken by government-run companies. Nearly 700 houses have suffered cracks and close to 400 people have been moved to safer locations. "We will demolish some unsafe buildings based on the recommendation and under the guidance of federal experts," Himanshu Khurana, a senior district official in the region, told Reuters.

KYIV: Ukrainian forces are facing waves of assaults by Russian forces on the small salt-mining town of Soledar, Kyiv officials said on Tuesday, as Moscow strives to make its first breakthrough in the east in months. Britain's Defence Ministry said Russian troops and mercenaries of the Wagner group were probably now in control of most of the town after advances in the last four days. Seizing Soledar would give an advantage to Russian forces as they fight to capture the city of Bakhmut, a few kilometres (miles) to the southwest. NATO, EU vow more support for Ukraine

BRUSSELS: NATO and the EU vowed Tuesday to bolster their backing for Ukraine to fight off Russia's invasion and ramp up cooperation between Europe and the US-led alliance. Longstanding designs by NATO and EU to forge greater cooperation have gained impetus from the West's support of Ukraine. "We must continue to strengthen the partnership between NATO and the European Union. And we must further strengthen our support to Ukraine," NATO chief Jens Stoltenberg said after signing a joint declaration with the EU's top officials. Countries in NATO and the EU - which share 21 members - have funnelled billions of dollars of arms to Kyiv that have helped it push back Moscow's forces. The United States, Germany and France have announced they will now also supply Ukraine with armoured fighting vehicles - but Kyiv has pleaded for modern heavy tanks to be sent as well. "I think that Ukraine should get all the necessary military equipment they need and they can handle to defend the homeland," European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said. "This means of course, advanced air defence systems, but also other types of advanced military equipment, as long as it is necessary to defend Ukraine." Stoltenberg said Kyiv's Western backers will meet next week with Ukraine's defence minister "to discuss exactly what types of weapons are needed and how can allies provide those weapons". "This is not only about adding more systems, more platforms, more weapons, but also ensuring that the platforms, the weapons we have already provided, are working as they should," he said. Moscow's attack on Ukraine has upended the European security order and spurred calls for the EU and NATO to work more closely together to protect the continent. - APP

SHC rejects MQM-P's petition against delimitation

KARACHI: The Sindh High Court (SHC) on Tuesday turned down a petition filed by the Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P) against delimitations for second phase of local government elections in Karachi and Hyderabad. A larger bench of the high court issued the verdict after hearing arguments from the MQM-P ahead of the LG election in the port city and Hyderabad on Jan 15. The MQM-P counsel claimed the Sindh government made the delimitation of towns and union councils (UCs) keeping in view its own political benefits. It also sought orders for the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) to conduct fresh delimitation. While rejecting MQM-P's petition, the SHC remarked that it had already issued verdict on the political party's plea against the ECP notification on delimitation in Karachi, adding that it was also upheld by the Supreme Court. Earlier, a two-member bench sent a petition of the MQM-P seeking a larger bench to the chief justice. A day earlier, the top electoral body rejected a petition of the MQM-P, seeking use of new voter lists for the Karachi and Hyderabad local government elections.

Canada announces additional US\$25 mln for flood victims

ISLAMABAD: Harjit S. Sajjan, Minister of International Development and Minister responsible for the Pacific Economic Development Agency of Canada, has announced an additional US\$ 25 million in funding in response to the flooding in Pakistan, which will support development projects focused on recovery, reconstruction, and resilience. The minister announced financial support at the International Conference on Climate Resilient Pakistan, held in Geneva, Switzerland, said a news release issued here by the Canadian High Commission Islamabad on Tuesday. The focus of the conference was on mobilizing financial and technical support for flood response and recovery. Canada's participation underscored its continued engagement in and response to the ongoing situation in Pakistan. The funding announced by Minister Sajjan will go toward supporting projects aligned with the Government of Pakistan's Resilient Recovery, Rehabilitation, and Reconstruction Framework. This multi-sectoral strategy for climate-resilient rehabilitation and reconstruction in response to floods was presented at the conference in Geneva. It is pertinent to mention here that Minister Sajjan visited the flood-hit region in September 2022 and observed the humanitarian response underway to gain a better understanding of what the people of Pakistan face.

Differences emerge among Wazirabad JIT members

LAHORE: Differences have emerged among the members of a joint investigation team (JIT) tasked with probing the attack on former prime minister Imran Khan. The differences emerged after Capital City Police Officer (CCPO) Lahore Ghulam Dogar - who is leading the probe - has assigned the key responsibility of interrogating the suspect to anti-corruption officer Anwar Shah and no other member of the probe panel is given access to the attacker. The four members of the JIT have shown differences and shared their reservations with the Home Ministry and Punjab Police chief. They have written a letter to the Home Department highlighting the problems. The JIT members who expressed concerns are Khurram Shah, Naseebullah, Ehsanullah and Malik Tariq Mehboob. The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) chairman was attacked on November 3 in Wazirabad while he was leading the "Azadi March" against the Shehbaz Sharif-led government demanding snap polls. The law enforcement agencies (LEAs) apprehended suspect Naveed from the crime scene - who also confessed to opening fire on the PTI leadership. - DNA

US dollar pushes Pak rupee further down

ISLAMABAD: The rupee was depreciated by another nine paisas against the US dollar in the interbank trading on Tuesday apparently ignoring the positive outcome of the Geneva conference where billions of dollars were pledged to rebuild Pakistan's flood-affected regions. According to currency dealers, the greenback continued its upward trajectory during morning trading activity and appreciated by nine paisas. It was traded at Rs227.50. Yesterday, the PKR slid 27 notches down letting US dollar to settle at Rs227.41 towards the close. The local unit is constantly under stress due to bleak macro indicators, dwindling forex reserves and delay in the IMF's tranche. But after yesterday's Geneva conference, it is hoped that the country would get a respite. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Monday asked the IMF for a pause in its demands for economic reforms before releasing more financial aid, as the country tries to rebuild after catastrophic floods. "We had to again connect with the IMF and resurrect an agreement which was violated by the previous government - and accept even harsher conditionalities," said Shehbaz. He said Pakistan was complying with the IMF's conditions "as best as possible" but asked "how on earth" the additional burdens could be shouldered by the country's poorest.

Mushahid Hussain lambasts int'l community on G-20 moot in IIOJK

ISLAMABAD: Chairman of the Senate's Standing Committee on Defence Mushahid Hussain Sayed on Tuesday lambasted the world community for its double standards and silence over India's attempts to hold the Group of Twenty (G-20) Summit 2023 in the disputed territory of Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJK). It was rather incumbent upon the world to foil such Indian attempts in solidarity with the oppressed innocent Kashmiris facing the worst state-sponsored human rights abuses, he said while talking to a private news channel. Senator Mushahid said, "If the world is much concerned then G-20 forum should hold its session in Kyiv, the capital of Ukraine, which is under Russian attack." He said the inter-

national community should not turn a blind eye to the plight of Kashmiris facing the worst violence and persecution at the hands of Indian occupant forces. But its silence over the Kashmiris' loud cries for justice and the just right to self-determination, and India's unilateral decisions on the disputed territory's issues showed its duplicity, he added. The Group of Twenty (G-20) is a leading international economic cooperation forum that has played a key role in shaping and strengthening international governance and framework on all major international economic issues. India got its presidency for a year on December 1, 2022. According to the G20 official website, the summit logo was inspired by the

colours of Indian national flag - saffron, white and green, and blue. It juxtaposes the planet Earth with the lotus, India's national flower that reflects growth amid challenges, it said. "The theme of India's G20 presidency is 'One Earth-One Family-One Future' that affirms the value of all life - human, animal, plant, and microorganisms - and their interconnectedness on the planet Earth and in the wider universe," the website said. The 18th G-20 Heads of State and Government Summit will take place on September 9-10, 2023 in New Delhi. The summit will be a culmination of all the G20 processes and meetings held throughout the year among ministers, senior officials, and civil societies. - APP

China suspends visas for Japan, South Korea

BEIJING: China suspended issuing short-term visas in South Korea and Japan on Tuesday, after announcing it would retaliate against countries that required negative COVID-19 tests from Chinese travellers. China has ditched mandatory quarantines for arrivals and allowed travel to resume across its border with Hong Kong since Sunday, removing the last major restrictions under the "zero-COVID" regime which it abruptly began dismantling in early December after historic protests against the curbs. But the virus is spreading unchecked among its 1.4 billion people and worries

over the scale and impact of its outbreak have prompted Japan, South Korea, the United States and other countries to require negative COVID tests from travellers from China. Although China imposes similar testing requirements for all arrivals, foreign ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin told reporters on Tuesday entry curbs for Chinese travellers were "discriminatory" and China would take "reciprocal measures". In the first retaliatory move, the Chinese embassy in South Korea suspended issuing short-term visas for South Korean visitors. It would adjust the policy subject to the lift-

ing of South Korea's "discriminatory entry restrictions" against China, the embassy said on its official WeChat account. The Chinese embassy in Japan later announced a similar move, saying that the mission and its consulates had suspended the issuing of visas from Tuesday. The embassy statement did not say when they would resume. The move came soon after Japan toughened COVID-19 rules for travellers coming directly from China, prescribing a negative result of a PCR test taken less than 72 hours before departure, as well as a negative test on arrival in Japan. read more With the virus let loose, China has stopped publishing daily infection tallies. It has been reporting five or fewer deaths a day since the policy U-turn, figures that have been disputed by the World Health Organization and are inconsistent with funeral providers reporting surging demand. - Agencies

China-Pakistan joint drills strengthen ties: Naval Chief

BEIJING: Chief of Naval Staff of Pakistan Admiral M Amjad Khan Niazi has said that the interaction between the navies of Pakistan and China provided an opportunity to enhance interoperability, share experience to optimally utilize common sensors, iron out procedures and "further elevate our relations." In that regard, the Sea Guardian series of exercises serve the objectives of fostering interoperability and sharing professional experience to deal with contemporary traditional and non-traditional security threats, he said in an exclusive interview with Global Times. Pakistan Navy plans to host the AMAN-23 multinational maritime exercise in February this year, with the Chinese Peoples Liberation Army (PLA) Navy, having taken part in previous editions, are again expected to participate. China and Pakistan have been maintaining close naval and maritime exchanges and cooperation in re-

cent years, including joint drills. Elaborating briefly on the upcoming exercise, Admiral Niazi said that Exercise AMAN was the premier multinational maritime exercise of Pakistan Navy which "has been conducted biennially since 2007." "The exercise is conducted with the aim to develop synergy between participating naval units to tackle maritime security challenges by enhancing interoperability between regional and extra regional navies at different levels of technological prowess", he added. He said that the eighth series of Exercise AMAN would be held in Karachi from February 10 to 14, this year. "The format of the exercise has two distinct phases: First, the harbor phase which will be held from February 10 to 12, followed by the sea phase from February 13 to 14", he added. During the harbor phase, various professional and social activities will be conducted to share experiences on

contemporary maritime security challenges and coordinate modalities of sea exercises. The sea phase includes exercises and an international fleet review to demonstrate unified resolve against maritime terrorism, piracy, and other prevalent illicit activities at sea. Admiral Niazi said that Pakistan Navy was expecting a wide range of participation from across the globe, as 43 countries participated in Exercise AMAN-21, despite COVID-19 restrictions. He expressed the confidence that Exercise AMAN-23 would contribute significantly in fulfilling the common desire of participating maritime nations for regional peace and shared prosperity through such collaborative efforts. Regarding purpose and goals for conducting the exercise, he said that there were a number of non-traditional threats that prevailed in the wider Indian Ocean region such as terrorism, piracy, drugs smuggling, and arms trafficking. - APP
