returned to the country under a "deal". Speaking to media in Lahore, Ahsan averred: "Those who are doing a deal can take no time to withdraw it." He was of the view that the lawyers' elections should be held on the fixed dates. Sindh former minister Saeed Ghani said on Sunday that the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) will emerge as the largest party in Karachi. Speaking to media in Karachi, Ghani stated, "The PPP candidates will achieve success in both the Central and Korangi districts." PPP senior leader Saeed Ghani on Sunday asserted that the political landscape was favouring Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) supremo Nawaz Sharif. Expressing his thoughts in Karachi, Ghani said: "The PML-N had believed in empowering the nation to choose its own leaders. ISLAMABAD: In his affidavit submitted to the Supreme Court in connection with the infamous Faizabad sit-in review case on Mon-Pakistan Electronic Media Regulatory Authority (Pemra) former chairman ÀbsarAlamHaider accused then-Director General of Counter Intelligence (DG-C) at the Inter-Services Intelligence Major General Faiz Hamid and his subordinates of controlling the "TV Channel policy" through "unlawful means". Multiple pleas were filed challenging the verdict on the Faizabad protest staged by the Tehreeke-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP) in 2017 against the then-Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) government. Last month, the apex court - in response to a series of review petitions submitted against its previous ruling - had said that it would revisit the Faizabad sit-in case.



New migraine medications effective but costly

KARACHI: Cost of drugs and procedures to treat neurological disorders is very high and is constantly rising, not just in Pakistan but globally. The healthcare policymakers seem least concerned about this grave issue, President Epilepsy Foundation Pakistan and noted neurophysician of the country Dr Fowzia Siddiqui, at a South Asian Migraine Management Advisory Board meeting in Hong Kong, where she represented Pakistan. The advisory board meeting discussed about a new group of medications to reduce and treat migraine attacks.

ache, but a debilitating condition associated with high global disease burden. In a survey in 2019 it was shown that 1.1 billion people suffer from migraine and 42.1 million years were lived with disability globally. This makes it the 2nd largest cause of disability especially in women of 15-49 years worldwide. They said new treatments which are novel in action and modulate the genetic receptors that are activated during migraine known as CGRP antagonist monoclonal antibodies. CGRPs are tiny molecules that are found to be secreted in migraine attacks. Most of these antibodies are given in injection form and are very expensive. For example eptinezumab is in IV form given every three months to prevent migraine attacks from happening. -APP

Gunmen kill policeman, 4 labourers in alochistan

QUETTA; Police in Balochistan say four labourers and a Police Constable were martyred by unknown gunmen in Turbat on Tuesday. A police official said that the labourers had taken shelter in a police station due to security threats.

The slain labourers belonged to Punjab and had gone to Balochistan for work. Police suspect involvement of Baloch separatists behind the incident. In a statement, Caretaker Chief Minister Balochistan Mir Ali Mardan Khan Domki has strongly condemned the terrorist attack on labourers and a police constable. He said elements involved in the incident would be dealt with iron hands. He said sacrifices rendered by Security Forces will not go in vain.—APP

CTD claims arrest of target killer

KARACHI: The Sindh Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) Tuesday arrested an alleged target killer affiliated with MQM-London from Civil Lines Area and recovered an illegal pistol from his possession.

The arrested was identified as Rehman Qureshi alias Bablu, according to spokesman for CTD Sindh.

During initial interrogation, the arrested revealed that he was a member of North Karachi target killing team and had been involved in targeted killings of number of opponent political activists. The recovered pistol was sent to forensics division. Further investigations were underway. -APP

structions to all agencies and officials to treat women, children and elders with special care and respect"

the minster said, adding that the arraignments for food and medical facilities were made in the holding centers. The deadline for undocumented immigrants including Afghan refugees for voluntary return ended on October 31 after which the government's crackdown against them had started in full swing, he added. The National Database and Registration Authority (NAD-RA) has collected entire data of undocumented immigrants in the country through geo-fencing, the minister said, adding that those who still tried to escape government's amnesty would be caught from their hideouts. Bugti also warned of strict action against locals helping the immigrants and providing them shelter. "Any Pakistani who will rent his house to illegal immias partner in crime and treated equally according to the law," he added. The minister said that it was a national duty of Pakistani citizens to inform the government about illegal immigrants and their residences. "Now there are few hours remaining, whoever does not leave Pakistan by the specified time and does not have a valid visa and passport, he will be deported," he said.

He said that respect for women and elders was being considered during the evacuation, adding children were being treated with compassion, around two lakh illegal people had gone back during last two months. The minister said that illegal residents could go back to their countries to get legal documents and come back here to do business and meetings

Gov't defends hike in gas prices

LAHORE: Caretaker Minister for Power and Petroleum Muhammad Ali says decision to increase gas tariff was taken in the greater national interest. Addressing a news conference along with Minister for Information and Broadcasting Murtaza Solangi in Islamabad on Tuesday, he said the decision will not affect 57 percent of the gas consumers. He said 36 percent middle class consumers will pay the prices according to their gas consumption.

while only 7 percent rich class will be charged with high prices. The Minister said the government is also giving 139 billion rupees subsidy to the domestic gas sector, while 45 billion rupees subsidy is being given to Urea and fertilizer sector. He categorically stated that no increase in gas tariff has been made for Tandoors. Muhammad Ali said there are several factors which

compelled the government to increase in the gas prices. He said the gas reserves are declining for the past ten years and resultantly government imports LNG on cheap

prices to meet requirements. Sharing statistics about gas needs in the country, he said total gas requirement by OGRA in the country is of 916 billion rupees while it costs 513 billion rupee with a deficit of 403 billion rupees. He said had the gas prices not surged, the government would have to bear loss of over 400 billion rupee, which would have direct impact on our circular debt. Minister said the decision would also stop increase in the circular debt of gas sector, besides it will check sky rocketing price hike of commodities and foreign reserves position.

UN urged for lasting solutions in Palestine, Kashmir

ISLAMABAD Senate Muhammad Chairman Sajrani Tuesday called on the United Nations (UN) to take concrete steps for the lasting solution of Palestine and Kashmir issues as it was impossible to establish peace in the world without solving the two problems. During a meeting with a parliamentary delegation, led by President of the Rwandan Senate Dr Kalinda Francois Xavier, he said, "No human being in the world can remain silent on the atrocities and human rights violations that are happening in Palestine. The Senate chairman emphasized the universal nature of the issue. "The cruelty and brutality going on in Palestine is not related to any religion; it is cruelty to humanity," he said, , according to a

Senate Secretariat. Sadiq Sanjrani also stressed the importance of the Kashmir issue, stating, "The occupied Kashmir issue is a core issue of Pakistan," and called for its resolution in line with the UN resolutions. He advocated for the right to self-determination for Kashmiris. He urged the United Nations to adopt a common plan of action for immediate solutions to the two problems. He expressed the belief that negotiations were the solution to the problems and urged the UN to facilitate talks for resolving the issues. In a show of Pakistan's commitment to international cooperation and diplomacy, he noted, "Wherever there is a problem of humanity in the world, Pakistan definitely raises its voice." The Senate chairman advocated for peace and harmony through parliamentary diplomacy.

Pakistan Economy yielding positive results: Report

ISLAMABAD: The economic indicators of the first quarter of the current fiscal year (2023-24) show Pakistan's economy had set the growth momentum and was yielding positive results owing to the government's stabilization measures, the finance ministry said in its recent report released here on Tuesday. "Hard-earned gains on the fiscal and external accounts have started to translate into a pick-up in economic activity," said Caretaker Federal Minister for Finance and Revenue in the foreword of the monthly Economic Update and Outlook for October 2023. The narrower trade balance is supporting the current account which has recorded a deficit of \$ 947 million for July-September FY2024 as against a deficit of \$ 2.3 billion last year. Workers' remittances stood at \$ 6.3 billion (\$ 7.9 billion last year) posting a decrease by 19.8 percent during the period under review. However, on MoM basis, it increased by 5.3 percent mainly on account of shrinking wedge between interbank and open market exchange rate. During July-August FY2024, the performance of the fiscal sector remained satisfactory owing to a significant rise in revenues relative to expenditures. Although higher markup payments continued to be the major source of increase in current expenditures, but growth in non-markup spending was restricted to 7.4 percent. The fiscal deficit stood at almost the same level of 0.8 percent of GDP as last year whereas the primary balance posted a surplus of Rs 144.8 billion against the deficit of Rs 90.2 billion during the period under review. The report says that in the coming months, it is expected that overall economic activity will remain positive throughout the outgoing fiscal year due to a rebound in domestic economic activities and improvement in inflationary pressures. Moreover, recent coordinated efforts by the government organizations to address macroeconomic imbalances, will gear towards achieving stabilization in the coming months and realizing sustainable and inclusive economic growth in the

medium to long-term. The report

anticipated that inflation would be better contained compared to the elevated levels observed in the first quarter of FY2024. The projection of inflation is hovering around 27 to 29 percent for October 2023. It says, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation stood at 31.4 percent on a YoY basis in September 2023 as compared to 23.2 percent in September 2022. The major drivers include Food non-alcoholic beverages, Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Fuel, Transport and Furnishing & household equipment maintenance. Moreover, recent administrative and regulative action for curbing illegal activities in the FX market has narrowed down the gap between interbank and open market exchange rates and worker's remittances increased by 5.3% on MoM basis. All these components have been reflected in the current account deficit which decreased significantly by 95.1% on MoM basis and 97.8% on YoY basis.

"The government is pursuing economic revival measures to improve the near-term economic situation and taking policy, administrative, and relief interventions in order to control inflationary pressure in FY2024," it adds.-Agencies

Global warming: Our mountains

are losing ice

ISLAMABAD : Nepal's snow-capped mountains have lost close to one-third of their ice in over 30 years due to global warming, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said that after a visit to the area near Mount Everest, the world's highest peak - a phenomenon being witnessed across the region including Pakistan.

His statement came just days after a UN report warned that the glaciers which ensure sustained water flow in its rivers - were at risk, also threatening the millions people depending on them. "The 90,000+ glaciers of the Himalayas, Karakoram and Hindu Kush mountains are at risk, and so are the nearly 870 million people that rely on them," the report said. It is a clear reminder that climate change is affecting Pakistan and other countries in the region at an alarming pace, which requires coordinated efforts at global level to first arrest and then reverse the trend. We, in Pakistan, are already witnessing less snowfall and shorter winters since 1980s, meaning that glaciers are melting at a rate faster than the snow dumped over the mountains during winters. Climate scientists say the earth's temperature has increased by an average of 0.74 degrees Celsius over the past 100 years, but warming across South Asia's Himalayas has been greater than the global averages.—**DNA**

IRSA releases 106,700 **cusecs water**

ISLAMABAD: Indus River System Authority (IRSA) on Tuesday released 106,700 cusecs water from various rim stations with inflow of 57,400 cusecs.

According to the data released by IRSA, water level in River Indus at Tarbela Dam was 1524.52 feet and was 126.52 feet higher than its dead level of 1,398 feet. Water inflow and outflow in the dam was recorded as 29,100 cusecs and 52,000 cusecs respectively.

The water level in River Jhelum at Mangla Dam was 1203.55 feet, which was 153.55 feet higher than its dead level of 1,050 feet. The inflow and outflow of water was recorded 8.600 cusecs and 35,000 cusecs respectively. The release of water at Kalabagh, Taunsa , Guddu and Sukkur was recorded as 63,000, 41,300, 44,100 and 13,500 cusecs respectively. Similarly, from River Kabul, a total of 8,700 cusecs of water released at Nowshera and 5,600 cusecs released from River Chenab at Marala.-APP

Kashmiris, **Palestinians** must be allowed to exercise right of self-determination

ISLAMABAD: Special Assistant to Prime Minister on Human Rights and Women Empowerment Mushaal Hussein Mullick Tuesday appealed to the United Nations and other international rights organizations to give the people of Kashmir and Palestine their right to self- determination for permanent peace in the region. 

Enhancing Franco relations for fruitful engagement

nlike what its name suggests, the 24th China-France Strategic Dialogue, which just concluded in Beijing, was not about "deliverables" alone but rather about the orientation of bilateral ties. As a significant follow-up to the 12th European Union-China High-level Strategic Dialogue last month, the China-France engagement testifies to a shared interest in sustaining the mutually beneficial aspects of bilateral ties. The dialogue, featuring Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi and the French president's diplomatic counselor, Emmanuel Bonne, was reportedly "friendly and in-depth", and the consensuses were broad and upbeat. The verbal consensuses they reached are of great importance to both sides in these times of transformative changes. This dialogue and the earlier China-EU dialogue have injected new energy into China-France and China-EU cooperation while providing the anchor for the important relationships to weather the political turbulence sweeping across the world. Amid the strong headwinds of a divided world, a persistent China-France and China-EU bond would be critical to promoting world peace and stability. China is indeed under daunting pressure as Western economies impose technology blockade and try "de-risking" themselves from China-linked supply chains. Yet in this process, and in their effort to suppress China economically, France and the EU, too, have found their economies more than bruised. And even If the United States, which is seemingly behind all of this, is determined to do or pay whatever it takes for outcompeting China, much of the rest of the world is not ready to suffer collateral damage. As he did with EU foreign policy chief Josep Borrell, Wang Yi put considerable emphasis on the French and the EU's independence in terms of foreign, and economic and trade policies during his discussion with Bonne. Calling China and France "independent major countries", Wang told Bonne that China regards the EU as an independent and important part of the multipolar world, which echoes French President Emmanuel Macron's call for Europe's "strategic autonomy", and Borrell's for China to treat the EU as just that. What should be most consoling to Beijing are Bonne's words that France has confidence in China's economy, and has no intention of checking China's development. Never before had such a statement carried so much weight for Beijing. In spite of Brussels defining Beijing as a "systemic rival" and calling for corresponding economic "dependencies", Wang, as he did with Borrell, told Bonne that China and the EU are partners, not rivals, and their common interests far outweigh their differences. At the end of the day, France and the EU need to treat China "in a more pragmatic and rational manner, avoid external interference" in order to achieve mutual benefit.


Xiangshan forum: Seeking peace amid global power struggles

ome Western media outlets have tried to portray the ongoing Beijing Xiangshan Forum that started as a platform for China and Russia to display a united stance against the United States and its allies. That is a gross distortion of the annual defense and security symposium Beijing has been hosting since 2006, as it is by no means an occasion calling for confrontation, but a platform striving for peace. That Beijing and Moscow chose to openly lay their respective concerns with Washington on the table at the forum for candid communication with the US side indicates there remains space for military-to-military dialogue aimed at avoiding miscalculations and deepening mutual understanding. Both the Ukraine crisis and the Palestinian question demonstrate how misjudgment, if allowed to become the basis for decision-making, can result in devastating conflicts. These lessons must be heeded by the stakeholders in the Asia-Pacific, so that flash points such as tensions in the South China Sea and the Taiwan question do not flare into conflict. But what these regional flash points – with the Taiwan question being China's internal affair – have in common with the conflicts in Ukraine and Gaza is that the US is playing an ugly role in them all, inciting and then exploiting tensions with the purpose of maintaining its regional dominance and global hegemony. That makes the US delegation a focus at the Xiangshan Forum, which was attended by representatives of more than 100 countries, regions and international organizations. More and more developing countries, the "silent majority" that the US has taken for granted for long, would like to use the forum as a platform to have their voices heard. Although the US delegation, led by the US Defense Department's principle official for issues related to China, serves only as a messenger for the Pentagon at the event, the face-to-face communication with other stakeholders will leave them in no doubt as to how countries outside the US' "circle of friends' view its interventionism based on its sense of exceptionalism and might-isright security concept. Zhang Youxia, vice-chairman of the Central Military Commission of China, made clear in his opening address at the forum, that the Taiwan question is the primary concern of China. Zhang's warning that the Chinese military will take resolute action to defend the country's core interests on the Taiwan question, no matter who is trying to separate the island from its motherland, should not fall on deaf ears. The voices of nations critical of the US' single-minded pursuit of hegemony should remind Washington that the US should not seek to impose its own will on others, and make its interests the exclusive purview of global governance.

If the US continues to disregard the fact that it is a member of a global community with a shared future, like it or not, the modernizing of the "rules-based order" will be needlessly traumatic, and potentially catastrophic for all, including itself.

amas's unprecedented and lethal surprise attacks deep inside Israel, was surprising to everyone, given the potential for a strong response from Israel, backed by the USA and the West. It was the concern that I highlighted in my article titled "How Hamas Stunned Israel." I've been seeking an answer to this question since, and that answer came from none other than United Nations Secretary-General (UNSG) Antonio Guterres. His insights shed light on the intricate dynamics of this conflict, emphasizing the need for continued understanding and efforts to promote a peaceful resolution. UNSG, appalled by the killing of innocent Palestinian women elderly and children by the Israeli war machine sans mercy with heartless cruelty and brutality, said, "Hamas attacks did not take place in vacuum but they were the result of subjecting the Palestinian people to 56 years of suffocating occupation". He added, 'They have seen their land steadily devoured by settlements and plagued by violence; their economy stifled; their people displaced and their homes demolished. Their hopes for a political solution to their plight have been vanishing." The answer, while welcomed by many, simultaneously stirred deep unease within the entire Western community, most notably in the USA and Israel. The UN-SG's just and apt stance on this contentious and potentially explosive issue should have been received with openness and positivity. However, Israeli officials reacted with anger, a justification for terrorism. In retaliation, Israel canceled the scheduled meeting of Israeli Foreign Minister Eli Cohen with Guterres while Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust memorial, said the U.N. chief "failed the test." The Israeli Foreign minister said "I will not meet with the UNSG as after the October 7 massacre, there is no place for a balanced approach. Hamas must be erased off the face of the planet!" Israel went to the extent of refusing issuance of visa to the UNSG and its representative to Israel. Israel, true to its statement, has publicly conveyed its intentions to annihilate Hamas, destroy its war machine and reduce its capacity of launching any attack on Israel in future and to rescue over 200 Israeli hostages. The official statement added that Hamas only knows one language, the language of military might therefore it said that coupled with diplomatic pressure, all out air, land and naval attacks have been ongoing on the Gaza strip, whereas, joint US-Israeli military rescue mission by using sophisticated and state of the art technology has been conceived and will be launched very soon. The principle stand taken by the UNSG, in the meantime, has started reverberating in many societies around the world. These societies unfettered by their governments' reactions are reacting and protesting angrily in large numbers to the brutality and barbarism of Israel's retaliation which as if today have killed around 9000 civilians and 3800 children and fatally injured over 21,000 civilians. Israel war machines have reduced the Palestinian Urban centers in rubbles and underneath these rubbles humanity is crushed, dead and is rotting while the attacks continue unabated without any end in sight. While responding to the question of Israel's brutal attacks on hospitals in Gaza Strip, Israel Spokesperson said that Hamas is maintaining its command and control center under the hospitals and

other such civilian facilities therefore, all such facilities will be destroyed and raised to the ground. They once again warned and gave an ultimatum to the Hospitals and the patients, some of them on life support systems, many babies in incubators and many more crippled due to constant and uninterrupted Israel bombardments to evacuate immediately to the South of Gaza and while those who had the strength and means to evacuate, their caravans were attacked Israel fighter jets without any mercy. The statement of the UNSG was deeply rooted in the history of the Israel-Palestine conflict, a protracted and multifaceted dispute having historical, political, and territorial factors. It originated in the late 19th and early 20th centuries when Jewish immigration to Palestine, then part of the Ottoman Empire, increased, leading to tensions with the Arab population. The conflict was further fueled by the Balfour Declaration of 1917, which expressed British support for the establishment of a "national home for the Jewish people" in Palestine. After World War II and the Holocaust, led to international support for the creation of a Jewish state and led to the establishment of the State of Israel in 1948. This event triggered a series of Arab-Israeli wars and further territorial disputes, particularly in the West Bank and Gaza Strip and gave birth to two organizations Hamas and Hezbollah deeply supporting and promoting palestinian cause. The recent escalation of conflict between Hamas and Israel attack in response to a culmination of long-standing grievances, including Israeli policies, violence at the Al-Aqsa Mosque in Jerusalem, treatment of Palestinians, and the expansion of Israeli settlements. While Hamas justifies its actions as a response to these issues, Israel and the U.S. have rejected any moral equivalence between Hamas attacks on Israeli civilians and Israel's efforts to defend itself. Hamas anticipated that its actions would draw Israel into a protracted conflict, potentially undermining the diplomatic normalization efforts and generating international sympathy for the Palestinian cause. The timing of the attack took advantage of domestic distractions in the Israeli government, allowing Hamas to act while Israel was internally preoccupied Hamas, or the Islamic Resistance Movement, was founded in 1987 during the First Intifada (Palestinian uprising) against Israeli occupation. Hamas's core objectives include the establishment of an independent Palestinian state in the West Bank, Gaza Strip, and East Jerusalem, resistance against Israeli occupation, and the assertion of its Islamist ideology. Hezbollah, on the other hand, is a Shiite militant and political organization based in Lebanon. It was formed in the early 1980s with the backing of Iran as a response to the Israeli invasion of Lebanon. Hezbollah is considered more powerful than the Lebanese army, and has engaged in conflicts with Israel, notably the 2006 Lebanon War. While the USA, UK and rest of the western governments are standing astutely and resolutely with Israel, Russia stands with Hamas. This prompted the West to draw comparisons between Hamas's onslaught and Russia's war against Ukraine arguing that one was "a terrorist organization that attacked Israel" and the other "a terrorist state that attacked

Ukraine." The United States has historically been a strong ally of Israel and has often supported Israel in the Israel-Palestine conflict. This support includes financial aid, military assistance, and diplomatic backing. But on the other hand, Russia has long maintained close relations with Hamas and has never declared either wing of Hamas to be a terrorist group. Rather, eager to carve out a niche in the Middle East peace process, Russian diplomats have tried to unify different Palestinian factions, including Hamas, into a single political force in order to restart the peace process and promote a twostate solution. Unlike the west, USA and Russia, China has towed a neutral line since the war began and continues to call for a peaceful resolution to the conflict. In an official statement issued on October 8, the day after Hamas launched a surprise attack on Israel, China's foreign ministry called for a de-escalation in hostilities and for "relevant parties to remain calm, exercise restraint and immediately end the hostilities to protect civilians and avoid further deterioration of the situation". Iran plays a crucial role in supporting Hamas financial-

ly and politically, although Iran has denied any direct involvement in the recent attack. However, Iran in an intimidating strong statement warmed Israel of crossing the redline and threatened Israel of dire consequence if the war expand to other parts of Middle East espe-New Zealand, have only declared the military wing of Hamas-the Izz ad-Din al-Qassam Brigades-to be a terrorist organization. Others, such as the United States, have not made this distinction. The support of Iran, Russia, and Turkey for Palestine, contrasting with the backing of Israel by the USA and Western nations, has indeed starkly divided the world into clear-cut positions, painting many shades of gray within the conflict. This division intensifies the complexities of the situation. The deployment of two U.S. aircraft carriers in Middle Eastern waters sends a clear message, serving as a warning against any misadventures. This stern posture raises the stakes, particularly with Iran and other Middle Eastern countries, creating an environment of heightened tension. Yet, amidst these developments, Russia and Iran remain resolute and undeterred by such deployments. This scenario underscores the intricate global dynamics at play and the fragility of peace in the region. Certainly, conflicts, especially those involving powerful nations, can be brutal, causing immense suffering. The world often witnesses self-proclaimed champions of human rights backing their interests. In this ongoing conflict, some powerful nations support Israel while others stand by Palestinian civilians. Yet, history shows that even the bloodiest wars ultimately find resolution at the negotiating table. It's in the interest of all parties involved to put aside entrenched positions, attribute blame to the culprits, ensure justice for victims, and, most crucially, address the root causes, as underscored by the United Nations Secretary-General. Failure to do so could escalate this weeping conflict into a global conflagration, reminding us that the path to peace is always more desirable

The British public wants a general election now

The trend among the British electorate is in one direction only. People are fed up not only with the current Sunak government but with the past 13 years of Conservative rule and, for most, change cannot come soon enough. The magnitude of Labour's victories in these byelections means that, for the first time since 1997, it is being seen as the governing party in waiting. Although there is no legal obligation to hold the next general election until January 2025

K Prime Minister Rishi Sunak this month received the news of two thumping by-election defeats for his Conservative Party while he was on a trip to the Middle East, where he was trying - not very successfully – to defuse the volatile situation there. Considering the huge swings in both constituencies from Conservative to Labour, Sunak would probably rather be anywhere in the world but the UK, where support for his party is in complete meltdown. The trend among the British electorate is in one direction only. People are fed up not only with the current Sunak government but with the past 13 years of Conservative rule and, for most, change cannot come soon enough. The magnitude of Labour's victories in these by-elections means that, for the first time since 1997, it is being seen as the governing party in waiting. Although there is no legal obligation to hold the next general election until January 2025, the public is crying out for a change of government and, with it, a change of course for the country. These by-elections took place following the resignations of two Conservative MPs in undignified circumstances. In one case, former Culture Minister Nadine Dorries finally quit after a prolonged and less than humble tantrum at being denied a peerage by the government. And in the other, Chris Pincher, a former deputy chief whip, resigned his seat in the House of Commons in September after losing an appeal against his suspension from Parliament after he sexually assaulted two men at a private members' club last summer. Neither case covered the Tories with glory and further by-elections as a result of the party's MPs misbehaving are pending. The public is crying out for a change of government and, with it, a change of course for the country In both constituencies, the Tories lost a huge majority - 24,000 and 19,000, respectively. Consequently, it is very tempting to prematurely declare the result of the next general election in favor of Labour and Keir Starmer as the next prime minister, as it looks like there is no way Sunak and the Conservatives could win a general election if they cannot defend such "safe" seats. However, the earliest we can expect the UK to go to the polls is in the spring and this is

a rather long time in politics. It means there is plenty of time for Labour to become complacent. Instead, it needs to continue to design credible policies that will enable the party to hit the ground running in the likelihood of it forming the next administration. Although there is always the danger of reading too much into by-election results — especially as the nature of Dorries and Pincher's departures were scandalous and voters were keen to hand the government a bloody nose — the magnitude of the shift toward Labour suggests a profound change in the country's mood. Many Conservative supporters expressed their frustration with the government by staying away from the polling stations, while others went as far as switching their vote to Labour.

Naturally, fatigue creeps in when a party has been in power for so long, but on this occasion it is more than the public merely becoming tired with the same party. Rather, there is a sense that, in recent years, Conservative Party chaos, incoherence, incompetence and general medicority has taken the country backwards.

al mediocrity has taken the country backwards. The National Health Service is at breaking point, with waiting lists excessive to the point that they are detrimental to the public's health; the soaring cost of living is hitting most those who can afford it the least; the education system is suffering from a chronic shortage of resources; and infrastructure generally is underfunded, with public buildings crumbling due to a lack of maintenance. The Tories are equally in need of some time on the opposition benches to reflect, reassess and regroup So, it is not surprising that the public no longer believes the government's promises and expresses its anger in by-elections and opinion polls. One indication that even Conservative MPs no longer expect their party to win the next general election is that about 50 of them have already declared their intention not to seek reelection, including some former senior members of the Cabinet. The recent party conference season was probably the last before the next general election. Parties look to these gatherings to rally their members, attract donations and give them a boost in the opinion polls, but as far as the Tories are concerned their conference did nothing to change the huge polling gap in favor of Labour. One poll suggests that Labour's lead has been extended and stands at 47 percent to 24 percent. One forecasting model suggests that this might be translated into a landslide election win, possibly even greater than Tony Blair's 1997 victory. More significant is that approval ratings for Labour leader Starmer are becoming ever more favorable. In other words, voting Labour is no longer a protest vote against the mess that the Conservatives have got us all into, including Brexit, but a positive move demonstrating widespread support for Starmer's leadership and Labour's plans for governing the country. It is Starmer who keeps the party's feet on the ground, warning the entire party machine, including his shadow Cabinet, MPs and activists, that nothing has been won yet and calling on them to contest every seat as if it were the one that ensured a majority in the next parliament. As much as the country needs a change of direction and Labour is eager to return to power, the Tories are equally in need of some time on the opposition benches to reflect, reassess and regroup. They are divided on almost every issue that matters to the country. The party has been hijacked by an extreme-right faction that is parochial, populist and devoid of ideas for getting the country out of the crises it is mired in. Moreover, the party is led by a prime minister who fails to inspire anyone, especially as he vacillates on almost every issue and makes promises that all polls indicate no one believes will be fulfilled. Above all, the mortal sin for any Conservative Party in government is to increase the tax burden, which is currently the largest since the Second World War, something its core supporters cannot forgive, while the rest of the country is suffering from failing public services despite paying more for them than ever. Labour and its supporters are right to be cautious and to fight on the doorstep for every vote, but for now it is the government that is doing much of the work for them, as Starmer and his team progress toward a possible landslide. -Sourced by Arab news.

KOLKATA: Fakhar Zaman's brisk 81-run knock after a combined bowling effort propelled Pakistan to a thumping seven-wicket victory over Bangladesh in the ICC World Cup 2023. Opting to bat first, Bangladesh's batting lineup failed completely and could only raise 204 before bundling out in the 46th over despite Mahmudullah's half-century.

Pakistan ace pacer Shaheen Shah Afridi, alongside Haris Rauf, ran through Bangladesh's top-order to reduce them to 23/3 in six overs. Litton Das and Mahmudullah then anchored the innings with a gutsy partnership for the fourth wicket. The pair added 79 runs to the total before Iftikhar Ahmed got rid of Das in the 21st over to halt Bangladesh's progress.

Das fell shy of his well-deserved half-century, scoring 45 in 64 deliveries with the help of six boundaries. Mahmudullah then put together a brief partnership with captain Shakib Al Hasan before falling victim to a stunning delivery by Shaheen Shah Afridi. He remained the top-scorer for Bangladesh with a 70-ball 56. laced

2034 FIFA World Cup SA set to host after Aust does not bid

RIYADH: Saudi Arabia are set to host the 2034 FIFA World Cup after Australia confirmed it would not make a bid for the mega event on Tuesday's deadline day.

FIFA had invited bids from Asia and Oceania for the event by October 31. Football Australia (FA) boss James Johnson had said the country was "exploring the possibility" of 2034, but on Tuesday the governing body said it would instead focus on bids for the 2026 Women's Asian Cup and the 2029 Club World Cup. Australia's decision to not proceed with 2034 leaves Saudi Arabia as the only confirmed bidder.

Saudi Arabia announced it would bid only minutes after football's global governing body called for Asia and Oceania bids on October 4.

The president of the Asian Football Confederation, the sport's continental governing body to which Australia belongs, said "the entire Asian football family" would stand united in support of the Saudi bid.

A week after FIFA's invitation, Indonesia said it was in discussions with Australia about a possible joint bid along with Malaysia and Singapore – before saying a week later that it backed Saudi Arabia's bid.

week later that it backed Saudi Arabia's bid. Australia hosted a successful Women's World Cup this year but has never hosted a men's World Cup.

"We believe we are in a strong position to host the oldest women's international competition in the world – the AFC Women's Asian Cup 2026 – and then welcome the greatest teams in world football for the 2029 FIFA Club World Cup," FA said. "Achieving this ...would represent a truly golden decade for Australian football." FIFA awarded the 2030 World Cup to Morocco, Portugal and Spain, also adding World Cup centenary games in Uruguay, Argentina and Paraguay. – Agencies

China coop in **Balticconnector** investigation

OSLO: Finland's prime minister Petteri Orpo on Tuesday said China was cooperating in the Finnish investigation of the Hong Kong-flagged NewNew Polar Bear vessel's role in the Oct. 8 damage to the Balticconnector pipeline.

Finnish police leading the pipeline investigation have named the NewNew Polar Bear container carrier as the prime suspect in damaging the gas pipeline early on Oct. 8, and said it was too early to tell if this was an accident or a deliberate act. A large anchor, believed to belong to the NewNew Polar Bear, was found near the pipeline, and the investigators said the pipe was likely broken as it was dragged across the sea bed. "We have opened diplomatic discussions with the Chinese and also we have started cooperation with Chinese authorities. And they have promised, and they have said, that they want to do cooperation," Petteri Orpo told reporters in Oslo.

"We are starting to work together. And the next few days I think (will) show how it goes. But now we have to be patient. We have to get a clear picture of what has happened before (drawing) any conclusions."China has said it was willing to provide the necessary information in accordance with international law.-DNA

Advantest cuts profit forecast due to Smart phone

TOKYO: Japanese chip testing equipment company Advantest Corp (6857.T) on Tuesday downgraded its full-year operating profit forecast by 24% compared to July as recovery in the smartphone market takes longer than expected. Advantest sees operating profit of 80 billion yen (\$532 million) in the year ending in March, down 52%, pointing to softer demand for leading-edge test systems and higher costs. The com pany said it expects investment in generative artificial intelligence to boost tester demand over the medium term. "We will sustain our investment to address future technologies," CEO Yoshiaki Yoshida told an earnings briefing. Industry bright spots include demand for high bandwidth memory (HBM) chips which has boosted South Korea's SK Hynix (000660. KS) with rivals circling. "As we go into next year we are going to continue to see very large growth in HBM and we should benefit from our market position," Chief Operating Officer Douglas Lefever said.—Agencies

US to expel 4nations from trade program

WASHINGTON: U.S. President Joe Biden said on Monday that he intends to end the participation of Gabon, Niger, Uganda and the Central African Republic in the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA) trade program. Biden said he was taking the step because of "gross violations" of internationally recognized human rights by the Central African Republic and Uganda, He also cited Niger and Gabon's failure to establish or make continual progress toward the protection of political pluralism and the rule of law. "Despite intensive engagement between the United States and the Central African Republic, Gabon, Niger, and Uganda, these countries have failed to address United States concerns about their non-compliance with the AGOA eligibility criteria," Biden said in a letter to the speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives. Biden said he intends to terminate the designation of these countries as beneficiary sub-Saharan African countries under the AGOA, effective Jan. 1, 2024. He said he will continue to assess whether they meet the program's eligibility requirements. Launched in 2000, AGOA grants exports from qualifying countries duty-free access to the U.S. market. It is set to expire in September 2025, but discussions are already under way over whether to extend it and

to defend against Bakhmut offensive

KYIV: KYIV military officials said on Monday that Russia has bulked up its forces around the devastated city of Bakhmut in eastern Ukraine and has switched its troops from defence to offence, but Ukraine has been preparing to repel the attacks. Russia captured Bakhmut, theatre of some of the bloodiest fighting of the 20-month-old war, in May. Ukraine launched a counteroffensive in June aimed at retaking occupied land in the country's south and east, including Bakhmut. "In the Bakhmut area, the enemy has significantly strengthened its grouping and switched from defence to active actions," General Oleksandr Syrskyi, Ukraine's commander of ground forces, wrote on Telegram. Volodymyr Fityo, head of communications for Ukraine's ground forces command, said Russian forces had been preparing since early this month to retake positions around Bakhmut lost during the Ukrainian counteroffensive. "We saw this, the intelligence reported everything. We had been preparing, strengthening our defensive positions, engineering fortifications and pulling up reserves," Fityo told Reuters by telephone. "This does not come as a surprise for us." Both men said Russian forces were particularly active near the Ukrainian-held town of Kupiansk in the northeast, where Fityo said Russia had numerical superiority. In its nightly report, the Ukrainian General Staff said Kyiv's forces remained on the offensive near Bakhmut.-APP

Saudi climate tech startups \$68m investment

RIYADH: Saudi Arabia attracted \$68 million in venture capital investment for climate technology startups from 2018 through the first half of 2023, a report has discovered. The funds were spread across 21 deals, according to research by venture data firm MAG-NiTT. Titled "State of Climate Tech VC," the report disclosed the combined venture capital funding for the Middle East and North Africa region and Turkiye amounted to \$651 million over five years, distributed across 225 deals. The research emphasized the region's growing commitment to climate action, as evidenced by hosting two consecutive United Nations Conference of the Parties events. "In addition to COP, Saudi Arabia leads further efforts with the Middle East Green Initiative," the report added. The UAE emerged as the front-runner in funding value, amassing \$401 million from 45 deals. Moreover, startups in Turkiye secured \$124 million across 80 deals during the same timeframe. Egyptian ventures garnered \$42 million through 35 deals, while Tunisia saw a total of \$6 million from 6

The study also highlighted that climate tech now constitutes 5 percent of the region's total venture capital funding, marking an elevenfold growth over the last five years. The sector peaked last year, with \$270 million accumulated from 50 deals. In contrast, the first half of 2023 saw an investment of \$40 million spread over 30 deals.—APP

Hong Kong leader defends new election rules

HONG KONG: Hong Kong's leader defended the rules for upcoming local elections as open and fair after an electoral overhaul effectively barred the city's remaining pro-democracy activists from joining the race. The city's largest pro-democracy party, the Democratic Party, will be absent in December's district council election for the first time since its establishment in 1994. Party chair Lo Kin-hei said he and other members could not secure enough nominations under the new rules that authorities introduced to ensure that "patriots administer Hong Kong." Other smaller groups from the camp had the same problem. Chief Executive John Lee said at a weekly news briefing that candidates have to respect the decisions of the people they sought nomination from. "It is up to you to ensure that you can convince the person you want to convince," he said.

The district councils were the last major political representative bodies chosen by the public. Under the electoral overhaul, most directly elected seats in the municipal-level organization have been eliminated. The lack of participation from pan-democrats reflects the dwindling space for the city's pro-democracy movement under a government crackdown on dissidents following the anti-government protests in 2019. To enter the race, candidates have to secure endorsements from at least nine members of local committees that are packed with pro-government figures. Some pro-government politicians, including lawmaker Michael Tien, also said it was challenging for their groups to secure nominations. Elections for the district council seats typically draw little international attention as the councilors mainly handled municipal matters, such as organizing construction projects and ensuring that public facilities are in order. But the councils took on importance after the city's pro-democracy camp won a landslide victory in the last poll at the height of the 2019 protests. The camp then hailed its strong gains in the race as a victory for the Hong Kong people.-DNA

King Charles visits Kenya amid colonial concerns

NAIROBI: King Charles III and Queen Camilla began a state visit to Kenya on Tuesday, facing widespread calls for an apology over Britain's bloody colonial past. Although the four-day trip has been billed as an opportunity to look to the future and build on the cordial modern-day ties between London and Nairobi, the legacy of decades of British colonial rule looms large. It is the 74-year-old British head of state's first visit

to an African and Com-

Elizabeth II. The royal couple, who arrived late Monday, were welcomed at a formal ceremony on Tuesday by Kenyan President William Ruto, who has hailed the visit as a "significant opportunity to enhance collaboration" in various fields.

Masood khan slams murder of Pakistani doctor

WASHINGTON: Pakistan's Ambassador to the United States, Masood Khan, has strongly condemned the murder of Dr. Talat Jehan Khan, a Pakistani-American paediatrician, in a Texas town on Saturday, hoping that a swift inquiry into the case would deliver justice for the victim. In a statement issued on Monday, the Pakistani envoy said her killing in

Conroe, Houston, was "shocking" and a "senseless act of violence." Dr. Talat Jehan Khan, 52, a 1966 graduate of the Sindh Medical College, Karachi, was sitting on a picnic table near her home when she was stabbed multiple times to death, according to police. Authorities charged Miles Joseph Fridrich, a 24-year-old man, in her murder. Although his motive remains unclear, community members and organizations see it as a hate crime. "We have

not found any evidence to link this to a hate crime," Conroe Police Department Sergeant David Dickenson told CNN. He said the investigation is ongoing. However, a Muslim advocacy group and an anti-hate organization are calling for police to watch the case closely. "We are unsure at this moment if this was a hate crime; however, given the tragic circumstances, we are paying very close attention to the investigation,"

the Council on American-Islamic Relations' Houston office said in a statement. In his statement, Ambassador Masood Khan expressed his deepest condolences to the bereaved family, saying, "Dr. Talat Jehan Khan was a dedicated healthcare professional and a beloved member of the Pakistani-American community." He also spoke to Dr. Arshad Rehan, President of the Association of Physicians of Pakistani Descent

'Gas tariff hiked steeply due to circular debt'

ISLAMABAD: The caretak er government in a press conference on Tuesday said the reasons behind the caretaker cabinet's approval of the steep hikes in fixed monthly charges and consumer rates for natural gas would help ease the fiscal deficit. In a press conference, Energy Minister Muhammad Ali stated that for the past decade, Pakistan has been unable to meet the local demand for gas without the help of imports, which had resulted in a significant decrease in Pakistan's for eign exchange reserves.

"Because of rising fiscal deficit, we were prone to more borrowing," he stressed. "These loans are making us more vulnerable to inflation." For the past decade, most of the international companies for natural gas exploration- except for four - have left Pakistan because of losses, he said, rendering Pakistan unable to meet its demands without imports. "In January 2022 inflation was 13pc and in January 2023, it was 27pc." He emphasised – with the help of bar charts - the importance of curbing circular debt. "Circular debt has increased to Rs2,100 billion," he added. "And if we did not stop it, it would have gone to Rs2,400 billion." The energy minister further broke down how the increment in gas price rates affected different sectors.

Taliban asked to free 2 women activists

ISLAMABAD: UN experts the Taliban immediately release two women rights defenders who have been detention for more than a month with no reason given for their arrest. The Taliban have barred women from most areas of public life and work and stopped girls from going to school beyond the sixth grade as part of harsh measures they imposed after taking power in 2021, as US and NATO forces were pulling out of Afghanistan following two decades of war.

UN experts, including the special rapporteur on Afghanistan, Richard Bennett, described the release of Neda Parwan and Zholia Parsi and their family members as an urgent matter. They have not been granted legal representation, charged with a crime or

brought before a court. "We are increasingly concerned about their physical and mental wellbeing," the experts said in a statement. They urged Taliban authorities to demonstrate respect for rights and freedoms and said there was no justification for the detention.

HRCP fears Afghan deportations can trigger a 'humanitarian crisis'

ISLAMABAD: The Human Rights Commission of Pakistan (HRCP) on Tuesday expressed concern over the government's decision to expel undocumented foreigners - most of whom comprise Afghans - and urged the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) to ensure protection for Afghan refugees. OGRA announces reduction in LPG prices

ISLAMABAD: The Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (Ogra) on Tuesday announced reduction in Liquefied Petroleum Gas

(LPG) prices for the month of November. According to a notification issued by a regulatory body, the LPG price would go down by Rs9.95 per kilogram and it would now be sold out at Rs 260.98 per kilogram. For those using domestic cylinders, the price has seen a significant reduction as well. The cost of a domestic cylinder has been slashed by Rs 170.47. The Ogra's determination for November sets the price of an 11.8 kg cylinder at Rs 2,962. This marks a notable decrease from the previous month when the domestic cylinder was priced at Rs 3.079.64.

ISLAMABAD: Responding to the Pakistan Peoples Party's (PPP) concerns in connection with the level-playing field for all political parties, caretaker Federal Minister for Information and Broadcasting Murtaza Solangi on Tuesday clarified that equal opportunities would be provided to all political parties and every party had full right to participate in the elections. A day earlier, PPP senior leader Syed Khurshid Ahmed Shah - without naming the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) – said that the polls would have no credibility if one party was kept away from the electoral

process in the country.

With the time of general elections drawing close, the PPF has persistently voiced concerns regarding the absence of equal opportunities to prove itself ahead of the polls. Last month, PPP Chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari had laid the blame for being denied a level-playing field on the PML-N. On another occasion, without naming the PML-N, Bilawal had taken a subtle jibe at a political party, by saying that it is "really a weird thing that a certain party has given the date for the election". During a meeting with PPP Senator Salim Mandviwala today, the interim information minister said the caretaker government would provide all possible support and facilities to the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) in conducting free and fair elections. Matters of mutual interest, the current political and economic situation of the country including the upcoming elections were discussed in the meeting. The minister said the ECP was responsible for conducting elections in the country.

Cipher case: Court starts Īmran, Qureshi's trial


ISLAMABAD: A special court formed under the Official Secrets Act on Tuesday commenced the trial of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Imran Khan and Vice-Chairman Shah Mahmood Qureshi. The duo was indicted in the cipher case on October 23 despite filing a petition under CrPC 265-D to stop the indictment - after the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) booked them for violating the secret law by misusing and misplacing the diplomatic cable based on conversations between Pakistan's envoy to Washington and the US diplomat. The FIA, in its challan, stated that the former prime minister and the vice-chairman were found guilty in the matter and requested the court to conduct their trial and sentence them in the case. The investigation agency also maintained that Khan had a copy of the cipher but he did not return it. The controversy first emerged on March 27, 2022, when Imran, while addressing a public rally, waved a letter before the crowd, claiming that it was a cipher from a foreign nation that had conspired with his political rivals to have the PTI government overthrown.

During today's hearing, witnesses, of whom nine were present in the court, were unable to record their statements in the cipher case, sources informed Geo News. Meanwhile, PTI's legal team submitted four applications including the one seeking the provision of the witnesses' names before each hearing. Two applications were filed by Qureshi, one seeking adjournment of the case without a hearing, and another seeking adjournment based on a bail application filed in the Islamabad High Court (IHC).

Govt appeal on NAB laws adjourned

CJP Isa refuses to suspend NAB amendments verdict

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court of Pakistan on Tuesday indefinitely adiourned the hearing on the government's appeal against the apex court's verdict in the National Accountability Bureau's (NAB) law amendments case, subjecting it to the issuance of a detailed order on the top court's practice and procedure law. The SC, on the other hand, directed accountability courts to continue conducting hearings of NAB references, while barring them from issuing any decision until the apex court announces its ruling on appeals against NAB law amendments verdict. This was the first intra-court appeal filed following the implementation of the aforementioned act, the hearing of which was held by a five-member bench of the apex court headed by CJ Qazi Faez Isa and comprising Justice Amin-Ud-Din Khan, Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhail, Justice Athar Minallah and Justice Hasan Azhar Rizvi. It should be noted that a three-member bench — headed by former chief justice Umar Ata Bandial and comprising Justice Jiaz Ul Ahsan and Justice Sved Mansoor Ali Shah — had conducted more than 50 hearings in the case, declaring the most of the NAB amendments null and void on September 15 by a majority of 2-1. - DNA
