



In an interiew at the time, journalist Roger Stryland explained that the main concern was nitrogen pollution affecting natural areas. The government, led by Mark Rutte, proposed radical measures, suggesting that 60 percent of farms either transition or cease operations to combat this phenomenon.

But the Netherlands has a high concentration of livestock, with 11 million pigs, 4 million cows and 100 million chickens for a population of 18 million people. Therefore, this decision understandably provoked frustration, putting about 30,000 farms in jeopardy. With the Netherlands being the world's second-largest agricultural exporter, the move also caused concerns about its impact on food supplies. The main issue is that all proposed transitions to less-polluting technologies require significant investments, which cannot be undertaken by the farmers alone. This

There is an urgent need for a comprehensive and coordinated response from the international community.
