Vows to steer country out of crisis

Shehbaz Sharif back on the driving seat

Becomes 24th prime minister of Pakistan; secures 201 votes; Omar Ayub gets 92 votes

ISLAMABAD: The National Assembly on Sunday elected Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz's (PML-N) Shehbaz Sharif as the 24th elected prime minister of the country in a session hit by the ruckus created by the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI)-backed Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC) members. "Mian Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif has been elected prime minister with 201 votes. [While] Omar Ayub obtained 92 votes," announced Speaker Ayaz Sadiq. The speaker then invited Shehbaz, the only politician to be elected as the PM for the second consecutive time, to sit in the prime minister's seat and asked him to address the house.

As soon as the result was announced, the SIC lawmakers started causing a commotion and chanted slogans to disrupt the Shehabz's speech. Shehbaz's victory was expected as he enjoyed the support of seven other parties apart from the PML-N. The PM-elect has the support of the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP), Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P), Pakistan Muslim League-Quaid (PML-Q), Balochistan Awami Party (BAP), Pakistan Muslim League-Zia (PML-Z), Istehkam-e-Pakistan Party (IPP) and National Party (NP). Making his maiden speech as the country's 24th prime minister, Shehbaz – surrounded by party lawmakers – thanked PML-N supremo Nawaz Sharif for nominating him for the coveted post, and expressed gratitude to his allies including PPP and the MQM-P and others for supporting him.

Taking the opportunity to highlight the country's history of political turmoil, the prime minister-elect lamented the "judicial murder" of PPP

Asif Ali Zardari to face off against Mahmood Khan Achakzai in contest for president's office

ISLAMABAD:A joint session of the Parliament to elect the next president of Pakistan has been summoned on March 9 by newly-elected National Assembly Speaker Ayaz Sadiq. In a notification issued on Sunday, the speaker summoned the session at 10am, Saturday. The political stage is all set for a headto-head showdown between former president Asif Ali Zardari and Pashtunkhwa Milli Awami Party chief Mahmood Khan Achakzai as both leaders move to secure allies and numerical support on Saturday ahead of the contest. The nomination papers for both candidates were filed in IHC on Saturday. Farooq H Naik and Saleem Mandviwala filed Zard-

founder Zulfikar Ali Bhutto and paid homage to his daughter and ex-prime minister Benazir Bhutto for paying the ultimate price for democracy. Without taking any names, Shehbaz took a jibe at the PTI for hounding the opposition when it was in power, going against the country's national interests while resorting to levelling serious allegations against the armed forc-

ari's papers while PTI leaders Sardar Latif Khosa and Omar Ayub Khan filed the papers for Achakzai before IHC Chief Justice Aamer Farooq - the presiding officer for the presidential polls. Achakzai, backed by the recently forged alliance with the Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC), flexed his political muscles, seeking the support of JUI-F chief Maulana Fazlur Rehman in a meeting at the latter's residence. However, Fazl later decided not to participate in the voting for the president. Incumbent President Dr Arif Alvi is already on an extended tenure after completing his fiveyear term on Sept 9 last year. Article 44(1) of the Constitution says that the president will hold office for a term of five years from the day he assumes charge, but he continues to hold the office until a successor is chosen.

THE upcoming presidential election in Pakistan has stirred significant interest and speculation among political circles and analysts. With Asif Ali Zardari, former president and co-chairman of the Pakistan People's Party, facing off against Mahmood Khan Achakzai, the nominated candidate of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaaf (PTI) aligned Sunni Tehreek, the stage is set for a com-

pelling political showdown. Many are predicting an easy victory for Zardari, given his political stature and experience. However, the emergence of Achakzai as a presidential candidate has raised eyebrows, especially considering his association with PTI and the

historical context of political alliances in Pakistan. Achakzai's candidacy, although unexpected by some, is not entirely surprising given the complex web of political relationships in the country. In the past, Achakzai and Imran Khan were part of a three-party alliance, along with Jamaat-e-Islami, indicating a history of cooperation between their respective parties. Fazlur Rehman 'to vote for Achakzai'

Says masses will not remain silent in the face of such blatant disregard for their rights

KARACHI: Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam (JUI-F) Emir Maulana Fazlur Rehman has said that he wants to vote for Mahmood Achakzai the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI)-backed Sunni Ittehad Council's (SIC) candidate for the presidential election - but his party's decision demands otherwise. He, however, ruled out the possibility of joining hands with the allied parties, saying that the environment for a grand alliance is not yet there. "We will be where the opposition benches are. We will go to parliament and protest," he added while speaking to a gathering at Jamia Anwarul Uloom in Karachi on Sunday. Awami Party (PkMAP), has been nominated as the presidential candidate against Pakistan Peoples Party Co-chairman Asif Ali Zardari, who is a joint candidate of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) and other political parties part of the coalition set to form a government at the Centre. The National Assembly today elected PML-N President Shehbaz Sharif as the 24th prime minister of Pakistan in a ruckus-hit session. This will be followed by the election of the country's president on March 9, with Zardari as the strongest

candidate, having the support of several

Mini-Budget on horizon as FBR misses back-toback revenue targets

ISLAMABAD: In a concerning trend, the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has not met its revenue collection goals for the second consecutive month, leading to speculation about the government's potential recourse to emergency fiscal strategies. This persistent underperformance necessitates the generation of an additional Rs 18 billion monthly throughout the fiscal year 2023-24 to mitigate the shortfall. The situation is dire enough that a deviation exceeding 1% from the target could trigger the activation of a supplementary budget, as stipulated by an agreement with the International Monetary Fund (IMF). Official reports reveal that the FBR's revenue collection fell short by 1.3% and 4.6% in January and February 2024, respec Insider sources have disclosed that February's collections amounted to Rs 681 billion, significantly below the targeted Rs 714 billion, resulting in a Rs 33 billion deficit. January witnessed a shortfall of Rs 9 billion, cumulatively amounting to a Rs 42 billion loss over two months. This financial discrepancy has been attributed to FBR's resistance against the Finance Minister's proposed reforms aimed at enhancing the efficiency of the tax apparatus. Allegedly, this resistance has escalated to the point of calls for a strike by senior management of the FBR, undermining the institution's operational integrity. There is speculation within the FBR that revenue metrics will improve with the appointment of a new Finance Minister, suggesting that the current downturn is a strategic maneuver to assert dominance and negotiate favorable conditions with the upcoming fiscal leadership to avoid reforms at FBR. - DNA


CM initiates polio eradication campaign in KP

PESHAWAR: Chief Minister of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Ali Amin Gandapur on Sunday launched polio eradication campaign in the province. The administration was trying to provide relief to the three million population of Rawalpindi through the Rawat vegetable and fruit market, he said adding, the market was also promoting business activities at the regional level. The administration worked hard to set up the Rawat vegetable and fruit market, Deputy Commissioner Rawalpindi Hassan Waqar Cheema said. He informed that the administrative officers had been directed to remain present during the bidding process in the market.

The administration of the Rawalpindi vegetable and fruit market helped to ensure the supply of affordable and quality essential items at affordable rates, he added.

The citizens have urged the government to enforce stringent measures against vendors who are not selling essential commodities at the prices listed by the authorities. Talking to APP here on Sunday, a consumer Mrs. Farhat said that shopkeepers are not selling food items according to the government rates and there should be a constant check of district administration. She demanded strict action against the trespassers which are making the livelihood of the public difficult. According to details, the prices of various food items increased

with every passing day including Onion Rs 200 per kg, tomato Rs 140, white potato Rs 80, and red potato Rs 110 per kg. The prices of Peas Rs 170, okra Rs 240, garlic Rs 580 ginger Rs 600 per kg, Lemon 120, cauliflower 90, capsicum 220, and eggplant 120 per kg are being sold per kilogram in the market. As far as the rates of the fruits are concerned the price of fruits including Iranian apple 310 rupees per kg are being sold without following the official rate issued by the district administration. Malta Punjabi 280, Malta Swat 450 while Kino Rs 330 dozen are being sold, besides Guava Rs 280, Pomegranate Rs 400, and Bananas Rs 110 to Rs 180 per dozen. New govt to ensure prudent utilization of public money

ISLAMABAD: Ferozepur Road Industrial Association Lahore (FRIA) has said that in a bid to ensure prudent utilization of public money, the upcoming government should introduce an austerity plan that included ban on purchase of all vehicles and ban on purchase of machinery

and equipment. Fria senior vice chairman Shahbaz Aslam said that there shall be a complete ban on purchase of all vehicles except ambulances, buses for educational institutions, solid waste vehicles, tractors, fire fighting vehicles, motor bikes; and there shall be ban on creation of new posts under PSDP/current budget during Financial Year 2023-24. The government's austerity measure needed at the time when the country's budget deficit was increasing. The consolidated fiscal deficit has been recorded at 2.3 percent of GDP (Rs2407.8 billion) in first six months (July-December) of the current fiscal year FY2024 against 2.0 percent of GDP (Rs.1683.5 billion) last year. While a primary surplus witnessed a continuous improvement due to contained growth in non-mark-up spending relative to markup payments. Primary surplus improved to Rs.1812.2 billion (1.7 percent of GDP) during Jul-Dec FY2024 from the surplus of Rs.889.6 billion (1.1 percent of GDP last year. Total expenditures grew by 45 percent to Rs.9261.8 billion during Jul-Dec FY2024 against Rs.6382.4 billion last year. Within total, current spending increased by 41 percent mainly due to a 64 percent rise in markup payments during the first six months of the current fiscal year, according to the latest data of the ministry of

Shahbaz Aslam called for keeping check on government expenditure and high cost of debt servicing, as the federal government debt has surged to a staggering Rs64 trillion, reflecting an alarming increase of over 29 percent in just one year. He said that this unsettling trend has raised concerns about fiscal sustainability and the adverse impacts of steep currency devaluation come at a time when the World Bank has cautioned Pakistan about the growing risks of its macro-economic framework.

ISLAMABAD: Raising grave concern over the continued falling trend of Pakistan exports the Pakistan Industrial and Traders Associations Front (PIAF) said that Pakistan's exports European countries dipped year-on-year by 7.54 percent in the first seven months of the current fiscal year, mainly due to reduced demand for Pakistani goods in western, southern and northern Europe. PIAF Chairman heem-ur-Rehaman Saigol, quoting the latest figures, said that this decline in export proceeds indicated the challenges faced by Pakistani exporters in these

The PIAF Chairman said that in October 2023, the European Parliament unanimously voted to extend the GSP+ status for another four years until 2027 for developing countries, including Pakistan, to enjoy duty-free or minimum duty on exports to the European market. Western Europe, which includes countries such as Germany, the Netherlands, France, Italy and Belgium, accounts for the largest portion of Pakistan's exports to the EU. However, there has been a significant decrease of 13.85pc in exports to this region. The export value stood at \$2.393bn in the first seven months of FY24, down from \$2.778bn during the same period last year. While exports to western, southern and northern Europe have seen a decline, there is a silver lining in the form of an uptick in exports to eastern Europe. Exports to southern Europe saw a paltry decline of 0.22pc to \$1.743bn in 7MFY24 from \$1.747bn over the corresponding period of last year. In this region, exports to Spain saw a growth of 5.67pc to \$856.423 m in 7MFY24 from \$810.461m over the last year. Exports to Italy stood at \$649.433m 7MFY24 against \$661.932m over the last year, indicating a decline of 1.88pc. However, exports to northern Europe have not done well, recording a 7.59pc decline. The export value to this region stood at \$0.365bn this year, down from \$0.395bn over the corresponding months of the previous year.



ing business has been hurting the economic growth, as the inflation rate bounced back to 32.2% in concluding month, hurting the trade and industry the most, who faced the brunt of a staggering 520% increase in gas prices. Quoting the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, he said that the Consumer Price Index (CPI) surged to 29.2% last month compared to a year ago. The increase was more than market expectations and has less-

ened the prospects for a cut in the interest rates, which stand at the country's highest ever level of 24%.

Geocide in Palestine

E are entering the climax of the sadistic experiment to determine whether millions of Palestinians will be expelled from Palestine, or whether the Palestinians will hold on to their land. What happens will depend on whether Europe and the US secure another overseas colony or whether the Israeli colonial regime will fall in a few years in the face of greater native demography and resistance. In the status quo prior to the October 7 Gaza uprising, the Israeli regime was inevitably headed for collapse. In the three zones of Palestine (the occupied territories, Gaza, and the West Bank), nearly 8 million native Palestinians are witnessing a higher birth rate and a much younger population, compared to the Jewish Israelis, who number less than 7 or even less than 6 million, alongside increasing abandonment of the territory. To survive, this Western stronghold in Asia had to exterminate or expel millions of Palestinians from Palestine, and so I argued in other articles. "The televised genocide and mass ethnic cleansing of the Palestinians underscore a crucial agenda; the concerted efforts by Europe and the US to reshape Israel's trajectory and secure a permanent foothold in one of the world's key geopolitical arenas. Over the past two centuries, we've witnessed a form of colonialism that involves establishing Western strongholds by eradicating indigenous populations. This model is evident in countries like Canada, the USA, Australia, and New Zealand, reflecting the expectations that Europe and the USA harbor for Palestine. In their eyes, the Palestinians are deemed inconsequential, akin to ants, amidst the allure of significant geopolitical gains." Netanyahu himself, in his speech at the UN, in September, boasted about what could be the ultimate Israeli triumph. He showed a map from which the West Bank and Gaza had disappeared and on which he depicted the planned Ben Gurion Channel with an energetic stroke of a felt-tip pen. By the way, that speech at the UN made by Netanyahu is one of the factors in the Gaza uprising of October 7. The Ben Gurion Channel, a possible replacement for the Suez Channel with a course between "Eilat" and Gaza, is projected to run simultaneously in both directions, more than double the vessel capacity of the Egyptian channel, and would give "Israel" and the West a position of dominance over a large chunk of world trade. The stakes are high to establish dominance at one end of the Red Sea shipping corridor with the Ben Gurion Channel, so it is easy to understand why the other end of the Red Sea conveyor belt, Yemen, today continues to be bombed by the US and the UK as it has been for the past nine years. That is why this experiment of colonial engineering is carried out by a laboratory "technician", Netanyahu, who is neither crazy nor acting irrationally when he exterminates thousands of Palestinians, displaces hundreds of thousands inside the Strip, leads millions to starvation, and destroys all the bases of human survival. There are the masterminds of the experiment behind it, Europe and the USA, with an incessant supply of bombs or at least, with full institutional and economic backing.

Growing 'high fence' in US

ATIONAL security" is the most grandiose reason for the US to build a "small yard and high fence" type of trade and industrial protectionism, which has become the "conventional weapon" of the US strategy against China. Now the question is, can the industry inside the high fence be safe and sound to renew the dream of "making America great again"? Today, China's manufacturing can achieve results in the field of electric vehicles (EV), 5G equipment, drones, as well as many others, and produce the world's most inexpensive and market-oriented industrial products. The capability we are talking about here is not only the ability to make technological breakthroughs and the ability to fully support production and manufacture on a large scale, but also the ability of the Chinese people. This ability makes it impossible for the US to completely "decouple" from China, and even more impossible to completely replace Chinese manufacturing. Chinese EVs can be banned, but what about the spare parts, the machines and equipment, and the raw materials to produce them? Imagine, any piece of Chinese manufacturing, including toys, furniture, instruments, electronic equipment - as long as they are remote-control electronic devices or installed with AI accessories, they may become security issues related to the target of the crackdown. If the US government insists on blocking Chinese manufacturing as its main policy direction, we can expect that the next administration to be primarily focused on dealing with Made-in-China products. This singular focus will create a self-made vortex that will require a significant amount of energy and taxpayer money to address. Washington will need to design a new industrial system to protect national security, which will be a costly endeavor.

Curbing the entry of Chinese products into the US market has already proven to be expensive for the US government. The replacement of Huawei and ZTE equipment in rural and remote areas, where these products were prevalent, was a significant financial burden. The Federal Communications Commission has established a \$9 billion fund to expand 5G mobile broadband service to rural areas in the country. But to this day, most of that money is still floating in the air, while Huawei and ZTE have long started to work on 6G products. The list of Made-in-China products to be blocked in the US continues to grow, including EVs, drones, Xinjiang cotton, cargo handling equipment. While it is possible for US companies to manufacture these products, they may not be able to do so as cheaply or with the same level of quality as Chinese manufacturers. For example, according to the Association for Uncrewed Vehicle Systems International, Chinese drones dominate more than 90 percent of the US consumer market, 70 percent of the enterprise market and 92 percent of the first responder market. It raises the question of which US company is capable of replacing Chinese drone manufacturers in terms of market dominance and quality. It is accurate to say that Washington, while recognizing China's ability to make high-end breakthroughs, underestimated the ability of the Chinese people, specifically the explosive power of the combination of their ability and market stimulus.

USSIAN President Vladimir Putin undertook an unprecedented action last week took an unprecedented action last week when a two-hour press conference intended for the American public. It didn't quite fit the conventional definition of a press conference, as Tucker Carlson, a talk show host perceived as sympathetic to Russia, was the sole reporter present. Nor was it strictly an interview, as Putin predominantly spoke without the benefit of questions. In a way, this format enhanced its value, allowing Putin to articulate his views in a manner that might not have been possible with questions framed from an American perspective. What emerged was a distinctly Russian perspective on the war in Ukraine, presenting Putin as a seemingly reasonable and thoughtful individual. While he made some dubious claims, it's acknowledged that leaders often make such assertions, even those who project statesmanship. Putin's conduct conveyed to the American public that his position is not entirely baseless. He emphasized his role as a Russian patriot working in the interest of his country, discouraging any comparison to figures like Stalin. Furthermore, he demonstrated extensive knowledge, surpassing that of most politicians. Though aided by pre-prepared questions, Putin gave the impression of a sophisticated thinker, showcasing Russia as governed by an adept leader.

However, due to the interview's length and complexity, there's a possibility that some of the American public might have tuned out early, missing parts of the conversation. The historical context, the intended American audience and the remarkably detailed description of Russia and its history seem to be setting the stage for negotiations. In defense of Russian attack, Putin accused the United States and NATO of dishonesty and duplicity in dealing with Russia, which he argued was simply pursuing its historical imperative. This wasn't an ordinary program, nor

was it a self-indulgent rambling; Putin's emphasis on the failure of negotiations in Turkey at the war's outset makes this clear.

He argued that Ukraine had always been a part of Russia, both physically and linguistically. Though unstated, implicit in his argument was the notion that Ukraine is an integral part of Russia and the invasion represents a return to an older reality. Consequently, according to Putin, Russian actions in Ukraine constitute a special military operation rather than an act of war. He also touched on Poland, suggesting that Poland and Lithuania are renegades inseparable from Russia. The discussion on Russian history was lengthy but not merely academic. Putin's argument was that history connects a place to its environment and inhabitants, giving Russia the right, in this case, to make claims on foreign territory. He subtly slipped in claims to the region that could be dismissed or overlooked, laying the foundation for Russian claims in Poland. Some of Putin's statements were confusing. For instance, he claimed that the current Ukrainian government and its predecessors were Nazis and therefore enemies of Russia. He cited collaborators before concluding that Ukraine is a remnant of Nazi Germany and therefore hostile to Russia and other countries that fought against Hitler. This left me puzzled, as every German-occupied country had collaborators, from France to the Netherlands, etc. Some may have been ideologically aligned with Nazis, but all sought to survive or prosper. Putin has proven to be sophisticated, so he must understand what he says and likely depends on the world not taking his claims seriously.

Elsewhere, while expressing his willingness to negotiate, Putin mentioned that the United States

was harming itself by using the dollar to force foreign powers to align with its worldview. He then made disconcerting comments, stating that China's economy dwarfs that of the United States and that its economic future is bright. It's as if the reality of China has been overlooked in the two years since Ukraine was attacked. He said this in the context of claiming that a new economic order is emerging and that for that to happen, China must lead it. It's interesting that Putin's deeply analytical remarks, even if some parts are debatable, concluded with obviously erroneous claims, likely due to fatigue. Another point that caught my attention was his comments about Russian intercontinental hypersonic missiles. The speed and maneuverability of hypersonics make defending against an attack very difficult. The United States has not yet deployed a hypersonic missile and there is no evidence that it is developing an intercontinental version. If Russian intercontinental hypersonic missile is as capable as Putin suggested, then that may have been the most significant aspect of his statement. The remainder of Putin's comments comprised complaints about NATO and the United States and his insistence that the uprising in Kyiv in 2014 was the real start of the war. He did not explain how Russia could have ignored such a significant threat for so long. As the president of a modern nation-state, Putin is obligated to elucidate his policies to his people and seek to influence foreign governments and public opinions. The objective is not solely truthfulness, but rather persuasiveness, strategically applying pressure on other governments. It can be observed that Russia has embraced modernity, adeptly balancing the presentation of truth and myths, even allowing Carlson some opportunities for refutation. Putin perceived him as a friendly yet unpredictable figure, leading to a cautious approach with limited engagement.

HE immediate challenge facing the upcoming government of Mr. Shahbaz Sharif will be to provide urgent relief to the people bearing the brunt of high petroleum and commodity prices, soaring unemployment rates, and hyperinflation. The economic and financial advisors of the PML(N) and establishment are most likely considering a range of measures to alleviate these hardships. These measures may include stabilizing essential food supplies through targeted agricultural support, streamlined procurement processes, steady flow of food items to the market, providing targeted subsidies, improving distribution channels and enhancing transparency in supply chains. Additionally, Qingfa seeds has introduced high-quality seed production methods for canola crop and established farmer training centers, focusing on modern farming tech-

niques and advanced oil extraction facilities While significant milestones have been achieved, they have fallen short of expectations. To achieve the full potential of CPEC-2, a high level of political commitment is required from both the newly elected government and the establishment. Additionally, all stakeholders must agree to expedited implementation. Cummins hails Lyon, Green after victory in first NZ Test

Pat Cummins heaped praise on team-mates Nathan Lyon and Cameron Green on match-winning performances as his side secured a 172-run triumph over New Zealand

WELLINGTON: Australia captain Pat Cummins heaped praise on team-mates Nathan Lyon and Cameron Green on Sunday for match-winning performances as his side secured a 172-run triumph over New Zealand in the first Test. Lyon spun the visitors to victory in the morning session on day four in Wellington, taking six wickets as New Zealand crumbled to 196 all out.

New Zealand lost their last seven wickets before lunch for 70 runs, with four falling to off-spinner Lyon, who finished with figures of 6-65 off 27 overs and 10-108 in the match. The 36-year-old capitalised on spin-friendly Basin Reserve conditions and some meek batting from New Zealand, who began the day on 111-3 needing an unlikely 258 more runs to win.

Green's career-high unbeaten 174 on day one rescued Australia from 89-4, having been put into bat, to reach 383 and set up a decisive 204-run first-innings lead. It gave Green the nod over Lyon as man of the match and Cummins said that was a fair outcome. "Cam was amazing, he was really the difference in the end," Cummins said.



"I thought the way he went about it, with that intent, really put the pressure back on the bowlers on day one. "There was as much bounce as I've seen in any wicket for a long time but thankfully it spun which, with Nathan in our side, is always a pretty good thing." New Zealand pace bowler Will O'Rourke is a doubt for the second and final Test starting in Christchurch on Friday after leaving the field with a tight ham-

string on day three. Captain Tim Southee said he wouldn't rule out a shock recall for veteran pace bowler Neil Wagner, who retired last week.

The 37-year-old had been named in New Zealand's squad, but tearfully announced his retirement after being left out of the first Test side, ending a 64-Test, 260-wicket career. Southee ruled out calling up Trent Boult because he has only been playing white ball cricket of late, but was less adamant when asked about Wagner.

"Obviously the Test match has only just finished so we'll see how Will scrubs up and we'll go from there," Southee said. Cummins said Australia would be prepared if Wagner returned. "It'd be the world's shortest retirement.' he said of the short-ball specialist. "It'd be good to see his high energy." Southee hailed Glenn Phillips after the all-rounder top scored with 71 in the first innings and claimed career-best figures of 5-45 with his part-time off-spin as Australia were dismissed for 164 in the second. LeBron becomes first NBA player to reach 40,000 points

WASHINGTON: Los Angeles Lakers superstar LeBron James has achieved a significant milestone by becoming the first player in NBA history to reach 40,000 career points. This accomplishment took place on Saturday during the team's 124-114 defeat at home against the Denver Nuggets.

The all-time leading scorer in the NBA made the historic basket with a left-handed layup, drawing loud cheers from the spectators at Crypto. com Arena, with 10:41 remaining in the second quarter. Play continued for both teams after this milestone, until the Lakers called a timeout just over a minute later. This resulted in a standing ovation from the crowd for James, accompanied by high-fives from teammates as he headed to the bench. During the timeout, the Lakers paid tribute to James with a video, honoring his achievement.

Having surpassed Kareem Abdul-Jabbar's record of 38,387 points last that have come through the league

season to become the NBA's all-time leading scorer, the 39-year-old James has been in unprecedented territory. On the night of this milestone, the four-time NBA champion was just nine points away from reaching the 40,000 mark. "No one has ever done it. And for me to be in this position at this point in time in my career, I think it's pretty cool," James said on Thursday after the team's victory against the Washington Wizards. "Does it sit like one of the top of my things I've done in my career? No. Does it mean something? Of course, absolutely. Why wouldn't it? "Obviously, I'm never thinking about a milestone when I'm out there battling, but when it happens obviously we acknowledge it," James said on reaching the milestone. "Being the first player to do something is pretty cool in this league, because you just know the history, you know the greats

and then you see some of the greats on the floor tonight. It was just great to compete. "But for me the main thing is always the main thing and that's to win and I hate that, that had to happen in a defeat, especially versus a team that plays extremely well basketball and we played some good basketball tonight but weren't able to close it out. Bittersweet, but I enjoyed every moment tonight on the floor." James finished the game with 26 points, for a career total of 40,017 points, and nine assists, while also extending his NBA-record double-digit scoring streak to 1,205 games, dating back to January 2007. The Lakers sport a 33-29 record on the season and sit in 10th place in the Western Conference standings. Playing in his 21st season, James is averaging 25.3 points, 7.9 assists and 7.1 rebounds per game this season, becoming the first player in league history to be named to 20 NBA All-Star teams. - Agencies

These Olympic Games are taking place during our Centennial year, which makes it even more special for the global hockey community. We're looking forward to a fantastic event in Paris in a few months' time!" With an FIH Hockey Pro League workshop taking place in Lausanne on March 6 and 7, most of the Hockey National Associations participating in the Paris 2024 Olympics would attend the unveiling ceremony. - Agencies

Kipruto, Kebede win Tokyo Marathon in course record times

TOKYO: Kenyan Benson Kipruto won the men's Tokyo Marathon in two hours, two minutes and 16 seconds on Sunday, breaking former world record holder Eliud Kipchoge's course mark in perfect racing conditions on the streets of the Japanese capital.

Ethiopia's Sutume Asefa Kebede won the women's race ahead of Kenya's defending champion Rosemary Waniiru in 2:15:55, also bettering the best previous women's time over the course from Shinjuku to the Imperial Palace. Kipruto pulled clear of Timothy Kiplagat over the last few kilometres and finished 39 seconds ahead of his compatriot to add the Tokyo title to those he won in Boston in 2021 and Chicago in 2022.

The 32-year-old's time was almost two

minutes better than his previous personal best and made him the fifth-fastest marathon runner of all time in events approved by World Athletics.

Kiplagat had to be convinced not to pull out of the race by his coach after the death of his training partner, marathon world record holder Kelvin Kiptum, in a road accident last month. Vincent Kipkemoi Ngetich finished third in 2:04:18 to give Kenya a podium sweep, with Ethiopians Hailemaryam Kiros and Tsegaye Getachew in fourth and fifth places.

Kipchoge was struggling at halfway with the pace under the course record time of 2:02:40 he had set in 2022, and the double Olympic champion had slipped two minutes behind the leaders by the 30-km mark. He finished 10th. Kebede and Wanjiru had been in the leading group throughout the women's race, and it was only on the latter stages that the Ethiopian was able to pull clear of her rival to claim her first major marathon title by 19 seconds. Her time bettered Brigid Kosgei's 2022 women's course record of 2:16:02 and took more than two minutes off her previous personal best time of 2:18:12. Kebede's compatriot Amane Beriso was third in 2:16:58, more than a minute clear of Dutch Olympic long distance track champion Sifan Hassan in fourth place. Ichitaka Yamashita was the fastest Japanese man in a time of 2:06:31 to finish ninth, while Hitomi Niiya took the local honours in the women's race with a sixth-placed finish in 2:21:50. - **Agencies**

'170 people killed' in attacks on Burkina villages

BURKINA: Around 170 people were "killed" in attacks on three villages in northern Burkina Faso a week ago, a regional prosecutor said on Sunday as jihadist violence flares in the junta-ruled country. On that same day, February 25, separate attacks on a mosque in eastern Burkina and a Catholic church in the north left dozens more dead. Aly Benjamin Coulibaly said he had received reports of the attacks on the villages of Komsilga, Nodin and Soroe in Yatenga province on February 25, with a provisional toll of "around 170 people killed". He said his office ordered an investigation and appealed to the public for information. Survivors of the attacks told AFP that dozens of women and young children were among the victims. Local security sources said the attacks were separate from deadly incidents that happened on the same day at a mosque in the rural community of Natiaboani and a church in the village of Essakane.-APP

Google's removal of apps in India 'cannot be permitted'

WASHINGTON: The decision of tech giant Google to remove some apps from its app store in India "cannot be permitted," Indian Information Technology Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said in a statement, amid an ongoing dispute over service fee payments to the U.S. firm. Google on Friday removed from its Play Store many Indian apps, including Matrimony.com's popular Bharat Matrimony and job search app Naukri, saying the companies were not abiding by its in-app payment guidelines. Vaishnaw said he has held talks with Google and will meet the startups, which need protection in India. "This cannot be permitted. This kind of de-listing cannot be permitted," he said in a statement. Google declined to comment. The removal has sparked criticism from many startups who have for years protested and legally challenged many of the U.S. giant's practices, including its inapp fee. Google says the fees help develop and promote the Android and Play Store ecosystem.-DNA

Bangkok lab pioneers halal science

BANGKOK: For the last two decades, Dr. Winai Dahlan has helmed the development of halal research initiatives in Buddhist-majority Thailand to ensure food safety standards that conform with Islamic laws. The country's start in halal science began as an answer to increasing calls by Thai Muslims for scientific testing in halal food development in the late 1990s after the discovery of beef sausage products for Muslim consumers that were tainted with pork caused an uproar. The demands of Muslim consumers in the country, which make up about 5 percent of Thailand's 66 million population, along with increased awareness of halal standards, led to the establishment of a halal research center at the Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok. - Agencies

Work underway for Gaza peace before Ramadan: FM

Speaking at the closure of the ADF, Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan underlined that significant efforts were extended at the event toward achieving a cease-fire in Gaza before the start of Ramadan

ANKARA: Addressing the closing ceremony of the Antalya Diplomacy Forum (ADF) on Sunday, Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan said there was talk at the forum of unilateral steps for the delivery of humanitarian aid to Palestinian territories as the international community cannot wait for "some countries' authorization." Fidan also told reporters that there was dialogue and serious efforts underway to achieve peace in Gaza before the beginning of Islam's holy month of Ramadan in March. The three-day forum in Antalya brought together heads of state, top diplomats and other prominent figures from around the world. The Palestine-Israel conflict and the ordeal of millions of Palestinians under a barrage of Israeli attacks dominated the topics discussed at the event. Fidan said 4,700 people from 148 countries attended the annual event this year, noting that President Recep Tayyip Erdo an held talks with 11 heads of state while he himself held talks with 32 of his counterparts. He said they ex-

changed views on critical issues

at bilateral meetings. "High-level participation in the ADF is a testament to the power of Turkish diplomacy. We discussed common issues that humanity is facing," he said. "An end to the oppression in Gaza was the main topic at the center of the forum, and we utilized all diplomatic means on this matter," Fidan said at the news conference. "We discussed steps that need to be taken, the challenges blocking the solution and progress in (talks for peace). We see a serious desire and effort for accomplishing a cease-fire before Ramadan," he said, referring to Islam's holy month due to start on March 11. Last week, U.S. President Joe Biden claimed that Israel would halt its activities in Gaza during Ramadan as part of a deal being negotiated. Hamas officials, however, said the U.S. president's remarks were premature as it studies a truce offer.

"Ramadan is coming up, and there's been an agreement by the Israelis that they would not engage in activities during Ramadan, as well, in order to give us time to get all the hostages out," Biden said on NBC's "Late Night with Seth Meyers." Fidan said the forum also hosted panels in which



participants exposed the double standards of "certain international actors on different issues and their related approach that ignored international laws." Türkiye has been critical of the Western stance on the Palestine-Israel conflict. While most Western countries threw unconditional support behind Israel's actions in Gaza, Ankara has repeatedly pointed out that Tel Aviv's actions amount to "war crimes." Turkish officials, from President Erdo an to Fidan, have slammed countries for turning a blind eye to the plight of Palestinians despite the rights of life and freedom of millions being violated by Israel's ceaseless attacks since last October. The minister said hunger was haunting the people of Gaza, who

are in immediate need of humanitarian aid. "Waiting for authorization from some people to deliver aid to 2 million people in Gaza means playing a role in the slow and silent death of people. The international community believes in the need to take different, unilateral steps," he said as he reflected upon his meetings at the event. Answering a question at the news conference, Fidan said Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas will be in Türkiye this week upon invitation of President Erdo an and that they would discuss the course of the conflict. "Türkiye will have an opportunity to convey its recommendations at this meeting," he stressed. U.S.-Türkiye ties

On a question about his anticipated visit to the United States, Fidan said he would travel to the country next week upon invitation of his counterpart Antony Blinken. "Our president and President Biden formed a strategic mechanism in October 2021, and we formed subcommittees on energy, diplomatic matters and other fields. We will hold a strategic mechanism meeting in the United States. We will make an inventory (of progress) on many topics in our relations," Fidan told

reporters. U.S.-Turkish ties were strained on the different stances of the two countries on the Palestine-Israel conflict but Ankara and Washington otherwise enjoy close ties as two major NATO allies. Last week, the U.S. paved the way for final approval of the sale of F-16 fighter jets to Türkiye, an issue that dealt a blow to relations in the past. Blinken last visited Türkiye after the start of a new round of Palestine-Israel conflict. Due to Türkiye's criticism of U.S. support for Israel's attacks on innocent Palestinians, the visit was low-key compared to previous visits by high-ranking U.S. officials, while President Erdo an did not receive the visiting top diplomat, breaking the diplomatic tradition. Russia-Ukraine conflict he ADF in 2022 hosted the foreign ministers of Russia and Ukraine, a first during the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict. Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov was the only participant in the forum between warring sides this time. Answering questions on the conflict, Fidan expressed hope for talks for a cease-fire in Ukraine soon. "A dialogue for a cease-fire (in

France to enshrine abortion right in constitution

PARIS: France is preparing to become the first country in the world to put the right to abortion in its constitution. On Monday, parliamentarians from the upper and lower chambers will meet in special session in the Palace of Versailles, summoned by President Emmanuel Macron. If, as expected, they vote for the government's motion by a three-fifths majority, then the country's 1958 constitution will be revised to enshrine women's "guaranteed freedom" to abort. It will be the 25th amendment to the Fifth Republic's founding document, and the first since 2008. Spurred by the end of federal protection of abortion rights in the US two years ago, supporters are exuberant over the revision - which they see as insurance against any similar backpedalling in France. Polls show around 85% of the French public support the reform. Resistance from right-wingers in parliament has failed to materialize. On 1 February French protestors voiced their support for abortion rights from a balcony during a debate on a draft law on the constitutionalisation of the right to abortion at the Senate in Paris.-APP

Norway king returns home after Malaysia hospital admission

OSLO: Norway's King Harald has left hospital in Malaysia after being fitted with a pacemaker having fallen ill on holiday. He will continue his recovery in a Norwegian hospital, a statement said. "His Majesty will be on sick leave for two weeks," the royal palace said. "The crown prince will in that period be regent and take over the constitutional duties." At 87, King Harald is the oldest reigning monarch in Europe. He became king on 17 January 1991. He was taken to hospital after contracting an infection while on a private trip to the resort island of Langkawi. On Saturday, the royal palace said he had been fitted with a temporary pacemaker "due to a low heart rate". The king was discharged on Sunday and is flying home on a medical evacuation plane. The pacemaker "will make the return back home safer", the king's physician said.—APP

Sudanese humanitarian crisis overshadowed by Gaza conflict

Sudan's Deputy Foreign Minister Ali Al-Sadiq Ali speaks to media at Antalya Diplomacy Forum

ANKARA: A high-ranking Sudanese diplomat said the conflict in the Gaza Strip has put the humanitarian crisis in his country into second place, lamenting that Sudan is trying to cope with the little means it possesses. The conflict between the Sudanese army and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces since last April has led to thousands of killings, displacement and shortage of food and other essentials. Several cease-fire agreements brokered by Saudi Arabia and US mediators have failed to end the violence. Speaking at the Antalya Diplomatic Forum, Deputy Foreign Minister Ali Al-Sadiq Ali addressed several critical issues affecting the North African country, shedding light on the

ongoing civil conflict, humanitarian crisis and diplomatic relations. "It is true that this need has been eclipsed by

has been eclipsed by the war in Gaza in the right word, and also in Ukraine," he said. He stressed the displacement of millions of people due to the conflict. "Many individuals have been forced to flee their homes, leaving behind their belongings and requiring urgent humanitarian assistance. Despite efforts to provide aid with limited resources, the international community's response has been insufficient," the minister said. "Seven million people left Khartoum, to the surrounding states, they left everything behind because the houses were looted, their properties were stolen, and they need humanitarian assistance." Regarding the civil conflict. Ali empha-

sized the presence of multiple armed militias, and the refusal of some groups to integrate into the national army. The refusal has contributed to the perpetuation of the conflict, leading to widespread atrocities and destruction of infrastructure, including attacks on diplomatic missions and UN offices, he said. On diplomatic relations, the foreign minister touched on Sudan's decision to resume relations with Iran, arguing that it was made in the best interest of both countries and does not pose a threat to regional security. He condemned Israel's actions against the Palestinians, calling for global action to address ongoing atrocities and ending the occupation. The interview also addressed the status of peace negotiations between rivals factions in Sudan, with Ali expressing disappointment over the lack of progress

Artificial glaciers stave off drought in Kyrgyzstan

SYNTASH: In the Tian-Shan mountains of Kyrgyzstan, villagers have made an artificial glacier to provide water for their drought-hit farms.

Standing on the ice hillock, farmer Erkinbek Kaldanov said he was optimistic about harnessing nature to counteract climate change. "We won't have any more problems with water," said the farmer, who was worried for his sheep last year after some unusual temperature spikes. "When the glacier melts, there will be enough water for the livestock and to water the land in Svn-Tash," the surrounding district, he said. The glacier currently measures five metres (16 feet) high and about 20 metres long. At the height of winter it was 12 metres tall. Local residents made it over a period of two weeks in autumn by re-directing water from the peaks of Tian-Shan, which tower more than 4,000 metres high in northern Kyrgyzstan. Kaldanov and others are being forced to adapt since natural glaciers in Central Asia - the main water source for the region - are slowly disappearing due to global heating.-APP

Houthis accuse US, UK of disrupting Red Sea cables

Yemeni group says outage resulted from 'American and British hostile acts,' while there was no immediate comment from Washington or London regarding these accusations

SANAA: Houthi Yemeni group accused on Saturday the US and UK of causing an outage in international communication cables in the Red Sea.

This came in a statement issued by the Ministry of Transportation in the Houthi government (not internationally recognized), published by the Saba News Agency affiliated with the group. "The hostile acts against Yemen by naval military units belonging to Britain and the United States have caused an outage in the maritime cables in the Red Sea, jeopardizing the security and safety of international communications and the natural flow of information," the statement said. It considered that "such hostile acts pose a significant challenge to the stability of communication infrastructure and negatively impact technical, informational, and technological services that rely on these cables worldwide." The statement added that the United States and Britain "are using hostile and illegal methods in their war against Yemen to serve the Zionist enemy (Israel), in order to continue committing genocide against the Palestinian people

in Gaza." The ministry further emphasized that the Houthi group is "keenly interested in the security and safety of maritime cables in Yemeni waters and the interests of the countries associated with them, based on respect for international laws, agreements, and treaties, and the common interests between Yemen and other countries." The Yemeni group expressed its readiness "to provide all services and grant necessary permits to internet service provider companies to repair and maintain the outage in maritime cables in the Red Sea." There was no immediate comment from Washington or London regarding these accusations. On Monday, the international communications company SEACOM announced an outage in its infrastructure in the Red Sea, affecting the cable system in Africa. The international communications company said in a statement that the eastern African part of the cable system crossing the Red Sea malfunctioned on Feb. 24, affecting the flow of traffic (data) between Africa and Europe. An international coalition led by the United States has been conducting airstrikes targeting Houthi sites in various areas of Yemen since the beginning of this year in response to Houthi attacks in the Red Sea, a vital shipping lane and global supply

chains. In the face of airstrikes from Washington and London, the Houthis have announced that they now consider all American and British ships as military targets and condition the cessation of their attacks on

Israel ignored the International Court of Justice's provisional ruling and continued its attack on the Gaza Strip, killing at least 30,320 Palestinians, mostly women and children, and injuring 71,533 since Oct. 7, according to Palestinian health authorities. Israel has pounded the Gaza Strip since a cross-border attack by Hamas, which Tel Aviv says killed nearly 1,200 people. The Israeli war on Gaza has pushed 85% of the territory's population into internal displacement amid acute shortages of food, clean water, and medicine, while 60% of the enclave's infrastructure has been damaged or destroyed, according to the UN. Israel is accused of genocide at the International Court of Justice. An interim ruling in January ordered Tel Aviv to stop genocidal acts and take measures to guarantee that humanitarian assistance is provided to civilians in Gaza. Hostilities have continued unabated, however, and aid deliveries remain woefully insufficient to address the humanitarian catastrophe.

an ever-swelling cost of living, is holding referendums Sunday on two initiatives which would reshape pensioners' lives in different ways. A proposal to gradually raise the retirement age from 65 to 66 looks set to fail, but a second proposal seeking to boost pension payments could squeak through. That proposal, put forward by Swiss trade unions and entitled "Better living in retirement", calls for a 13th monthly pension payment each year, similar to the "13th month" salary many employees receive in Switzerland and other European countries. Opinion polls indicate that most Swiss voters favour the initiative, although the "yes" lead has dwindled, and the outcome remains unclear. Monthly social security payments in Switzerland can rise to 2,450 Swiss francs (\$2,780) for individuals and 3,675 francs for married couples. The payments do not go far in a country consistently ranked among the most expensive in the world. Rent for a typical two-bedroom apartment in Swiss cities is at least 3,000 francs, and a coffee costs upwards of five francs. If the Swiss approve the shift, they would not be the first in Europe - neighbouring Liechtenstein, another pricey nation which uses the Swiss franc, has had a similar system in place for years. "There is a purchasing power crisis," said Pierre-Yves Maillard, head of the Swiss Trade Union Federation (SGB) and part of the "yes" campaign. "Retirees are seeing their living standards erode," he told AFP last week. "The cost of living just keeps soaring," agreed Jakob Hauri, a retiree quoted by the campaign. Left-leaning parties support the initiative, but it is being fiercely fought by right-wing and centrist parties, and the Swiss government and parliament officially oppose it. The government has said the proposed hike would cost more than four billion Swiss francs a year, warning it would require tax increases and could threaten the financial stability of the social security system. It also maintains there

would be limited social benefit from the proposed change,

which would hand additional payments to all pensioners,

regardless of their financial situation.-APP

First fast 'likely' on March 12

Ramadan moon to be born on March 10 and will only be visible by next day, says weather expert

ISLAMABAD: With the country preparing for the upcoming month of Ramadan, which is less than two weeks away, it is likely that the holy month will commence on March 12 in Pakistan. As per weather expert Jawad Memon, though the moon for the month of Ramadan will be born on March 10, it will not be visible at the time and can only be seen via the naked eye by March 11.

"First taraweeh will be observed on the night of March 11 [whereas] its 95% probable that the first fast will be on March 12," Memon said. As per tradition, the Central Ruete-Hilal Committee would convene in Islamabad — with zonal committees meeting in their respective domains — to receive and assess moon sighting reports and announce the sighting of the moon.

The holy month, which is observed with religious fervour and zeal, will see millions of Pakistanis along with billions of Muslims around the world observing fast from dawn till sunset with the fasting hours falling between 12 to 17 hours – depending on the geographical locations across the globe. Like many other countries,

Ramadan, in Pakistan, is marked by increased charity and public food drives with the people establishing roadside stalls for people returning to their homes in the evening. The month, usually, also witnesses increased business activities due to religious festivities as well as shopping trends in the run-up to Eid ul Fitr.

He is projected to win all of the delegates available in Missouri and all in Idaho, according to CBS news, as well as all of those remaining in Michigan.

Deputy Head of Mission of the French Embassy Gillaume DABOUTS spoke on the occasion and introduced the artist to the audience. French Photographer Ferrante Ferranti presented his 40-year photographic exploration of civilizations "From Troy to Lahore" at French embassy in Islamabad. The exhibition provided a window into Ferranti's extensive global travels, drawing inspiration from the epic tales of The Odyssey and The Iliad as well as the works of Swiss writer and poet Nikola Bouvier. Ferranti's images have appeared in more than 60 books and been exhibited in a number of international cultural organizations, such as the Maison Open de la Photographie in Paris.

The current exhibition at the French embassy in Islamabad offered a short sample of Ferranti's extensive portfolio, highlighting his recent exploration of Pakistan. Last year, Ferranti participated in the Lahore Literary Festival and returned to Pakistan in July to further explore beauty of Khyber-Pakh-

tunkhwa and Gilgit Baltistan. Ferranti emphasized the significance of his visit to Pakistan, citing the country's rich history and cultural heritage as a source of inspiration for his work.

On the occasion, Ferrante Ferranti expressed gratitude to the embassy and the cultural section for their collaboration. He reflected on his journey, drawing parallels to the travels of historical figures like Alexander the Great and Nicola Bouvier.

The artists said in 1980, at the age of twenty, he set off on an initiatory trip to Greece, and the legend of Alexander the Great In the footsteps of mythological heroes Ulysses and Aeneas. Rather than awaiting Apollo's prophecies at Delphi, the navel of the Greek world, they instead consulted the oracles in the East at Didymus, in Minor Asia, on the West at Cumae. Not far from Vesuvius and in the south in the oasis of Siwa. There Alexander the Great, young emperor of Macedonia, consulted the oracle of Amen and received the prophecy that he would conquer Asia and set out for the East.

'Later, I went in search of the traces of this thousand-year-old palimpsest. In Anatolia and on the banks of the Euphrates, I took measure of the spiritual riches of these Territories at the crossroads between West and East. At Mount Nemrut, Greek Inscriptions told me the





story of a king born of Alexander's conquests. He added, Armenia, where he stepped off at ruined caravanserais, and to Georgia, where he visited churches overreaching the plains of Azerbaijan he had to wait until 1997 for a new guide to take him further East. 'Nicolas Bouvier burst into my life, and his book The Way of the World became the breviary of my travels. I followed in his feat steps in Iran, from Table to Persepolis, discovering Sufism', he added.

Famine deepening ISTACL hits Gaza amid truce push

GAZA: As the US-backed Israeli genocidal war on the Gaza Strip entered day 149 on Sunday, massive aerial and artillery strikes continued to pound neighborhoods, homes and shelter centers and massacre more civilians, mostly children and women. Delegations from Hamas, Qatar and the United States have arrived in Egypt for "a new round of negotiations" toward a truce in the Gaza war, statelinked Al-Qahera News reported Sunday. Cairo, Doha and Washington have mediated in weeks of talks aiming to pause the fighting in the almost five-months-old war between Israel and Hamas sparked by the October 7 at-

tack. Their goal has been to secure a truce by the start of the Muslim holy month of Ramadan on March 10 or 11, but hopes have been dampened by a series of failed talks since a one-week pause in November. A Hamas source on Sunday told AFP its delegation to Cairo is being led by senior leader Khalil Al-Haya. "The delegation will meet Egyptian mediators and deliver the group's response to the new Paris proposal," the source said, in reference to negotiations held last month in the French capital with Israel's presence. PIC said that the Israeli occupation army continued to attack different areas of Gaza, killing and injuring hundreds of citizens. Scores of Palestinians were killed and injured when the Israeli army dropped bombs on people collecting humanitarian aid from a truck in Deir al-Balah in the central Gaza. This is the second major Israeli attack in the last five days on displaced Palestinians in Gaza who are waiting for humanitarian aid. Hamas says Israel's targeting of relief convoys, the latest of which was an aid truck in Deir el-Balah in the central Gaza Strip, is "an affirmation and insistence on its part to continue the war of genocide". "The occupation's continued targeting of aid convoys expresses an unprecedented level of criminality and brutality in contemporary history," a statement from Hamas said on Sunday. Israel is practising systematic starvation and deepening the humanitarian catastrophe in the Gaza Strip in complete disregard for humanitarian laws, the statement added. Israel has withheld a delegation expected to go to Cairo for truce talks, after learning that Hamas had not provided the expected list of captives held by the group that rules Gaza, according to the Israeli media.

Govt stands by people in every hard time

Asad Toor sent on three-day remand

Asad Toor vowed not to surrender his mobile phone nor reveal his sources

ISLAMABAD: A district and sessions court of Islamabad on Sunday sent journalist Asad Toor to the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) remand for three days in the case pertaining to his alleged involvement in a vile social media drive against Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa, Geo News reported. The FIA had pleaded with the court to grant vlogger Toor's remand for nine days, while the latter's counsels opposed the request. After hearing the arguments, Duty Magistrate Abbas Shah reserved the verdict which approved the FIA's plea and granted the journalist's remand for three days. During arguments before the court, Toor said he would neither surrender his mobile phone nor reveal his sources as sources were the most important thing for a journalist. He apprised the court that he was on a hunger strike. They provided him food but he willingly did not eat anything, he said. A journalist present in the courtroom made Toor end his hunger strike. The vlogger was on a hunger strike since his detention by the FIA on February 27. "Toor has not eaten anything in the last 36 hours," his counsel had told the media about Toor's health on February 29.

Britain to bar entry to 'hate preachers' from Pakistan

Decision follows an impassioned speech by British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak at 10 Downing Street

LONDON: The UK government is formulating plans to prohibit the entry of hate preachers holding extremist views from countries like Pakistan, Afghanistan, and Indonesia, The Daily Telegraph reported. The government, expressing concern over a perceived "shocking increase" in extremist ac-

tivity, is actively working to identify the most dangerous extremists from abroad, intending to include them on visa warning lists. As per the proposed measures, individuals on these lists would face automatic refusal of entry to the United Kingdom. This development follows an impassioned speech by British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak at 10 Downing Street, where he highlighted the threat posed by extremists to the country's democratic and multi-faith values. Sunak asserted the government's commitment to preventing those aiming to undermine these values from entering the nation, stating, "The Home Secretary has instructed that if those here on visas choose to spew hate on protests or seek to intimidate people, we will remove their right to be here." In addition to addressing hate preachers, Sunak urged demonstrators protesting the Israel-Hamas conflict to ensure their actions are not exploited by extremists.

More than 30 killed in heavy rain in Pakistan

PESHAWAR: More than 30 people have died in rain-related incidents in Pakistan during days of heavy downpours, with thousands of schools closed, officials said Sunday. Widespread heavy rain since Thursday has caused severe disruption in some areas of the country, including the closure of all schools in Balochistan province until Thursday. Eighteen children were among 26 killed in northwestern Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province as a result of collapsed buildings. "As a result of continuous rainfall over the past four days in KP, a total of 27 individuals have lost their lives," said Taimur Ali Khan, the spokesperson for the Provincial Disaster Management Authority in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Another person was killed in a landslide and more than 150 houses were also damaged. In southern Balochistan province, five people were killed when buildings collapsed on Thursday and Friday, said Jahanzain Khan, head of the disaster management agency. Damaged roads, floods and landslides have cut villages off from main towns in Balochistan, while major roads were blocked in Gilgit-Baltistan, local media reported.
