

# President, PM condemn attack Suicide attack: 5 **Chinese engineers** Killed in Shangla

China urges Pakistan to 'severely punish perpetrators' of Shangla attack

SHANGLA: At least six people including five Chinese nationals were killed after their vehicle was attacked in Shangla's Besham city, said Malakand's deputy inspector general of police (DIG) on Tuesday. Confirming the number of casualties, the DIG said that a suicide bomber crashed his vehicle full of explosives into the car in which the Chinese nationals were travelling. He said that a Pakistani driver of the car was injured in the attack and was shifted to a local hospital. Later, the driver succumbed to his wounds during treatment.

The deceased Chinese engineers included a woman. The Chinese nationals were engineers who were going to Dasu camp, Kohistan from Islamabad, the official added. Meanwhile, a heavy contingent of security personnel arrived at the incident's site and cordoned off the area. Security forces have launched a search operation in the area for the suspects. 



ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Ulema Council (PUC) on Tuesday welcomed the United Nations Security Council resolution on Gaza, affirming that Israel's actions has constituted genocide in Gaza, surpassing even the brutality witnessed during the Second World War. 

# **Decision to shift TEXPO** to Karachi rotation violation

PHMA says Lahore, Faisalabad, Sialkot, Gujranwala, Peshawar exporters want equal chance to showcase products to global buyers

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Hosiery Manufacturers & Exporters Association Zonal Chairman Mian Farrukh Iqbal has said that the unilateral, un-consulted and abrupt decision to shift the venue of TEXPO-2024 from Lahore to Karachi is sheer violation of the rotational schedule of the Trade Development Authority of Pakistan (TDAP) and it must switch over to the previous schedule to provide equal opportunities to the apparel and hosiery exporters of Lahore, Faisalabad, Sialkot, Gujranwala and Peshawar to showcase their quality products to the international buyers by utilizing this im-

While using language, concepts, and terms as a false mask for what's happening instead of revealing it, Jonathan Glazer steals the spotlight with his succinct words upon winning the Oscar for the Best International Feature Film "The Zone of Interest." "Our film shows where dehumanization leads, at its worst," writer-director Jonathan Glazer said. # UK and big 'China threat'

ONDON'S concerns about the "China threat" are increasingly veering to-ward absurdity. On Monday, British Deputy Prime Minister Oliver Dowden publicly accused China in parliament, alleging that "China state-affiliated actors" were involved in two cyberattacks targeting British democratic institutions and lawmakers. He also announced sanctions on two individuals and one company. Some British media outlets claimed that China obtained personal details of 40 million voters. Dowden also mentioned that statements of support from the US and other allies were expected later in the day. This may be the start of yet another collective attempt by the West to smear China. Previously, in reports by British media, the widespread attention to "the disappearance of Kate Middleton" globally has also been linked to China. An article in The Telegraph, a British newspaper, without providing any evidence, claimed that "China and Russia are fueling disinformation to destabilize the nation" by spreading negative information about the British royal family. From stealing personal information of 40 million voters and deliberately undermining British democracy, to sensationalizing news about Kate Middleton and affecting the reputation of the British royal family and national security, it seems as though China has endless designs on the UK, doing nothing else all day but targeting the UK. This symptom of paranoia deserves a severe diagnosis. In recent years, the UK has become one of the most enthusiastic countries in the West to hype up the "Chinese spies" and "China threat." Chinese-made cameras have been banned under suspicion of being "spy cameras," Chinese-made electric cars are labeled as "four-wheeled Trojan horses" monitoring British citizens for Beijing, and even Hong Kong laundry workers with a long hiring history in the British navy have been dismissed due to alleged "spy risks." The bizarre accusations from the UK about "Chinese spies" and "China threats" are sufficient to compile into a comprehensive "paranoia casebook. In fact, it is not China but the UK that is focused on causing disruption and infiltration. China has previously reported a case where the British Secret Intelligence Service (MI6) used the head of a foreign consulting firm to gather intelligence related to China for the British side and look for individuals to be recruited by the MI6. British media have also reported that agencies like MI6 have advertised to recruit Chinese-speaking individuals for intelligence activities. This is why some British politicians are so sensitive and fearful of so-called Chinese infiltration and influence; it's a projection of their own thoughts and actions. The so-called "Chinese spies" and "China threat" are nothing but the paranoia of some anti-China extremist politicians hijacking the entire country. They deliberately stoke fear of China to advance their political agendas and achieve their political goals. On one hand, by hyping up the idea of "Chinese spies" and "China threat," they cover up their failures in addressing domestic issues in the UK and divert public attention. # "Will Israel comply with the UNSC's ceasefire resolution for Gaza?"

N a remarkable turn of events, Israel found itself facing unexpected diplomatic pressure as the United States chose not to exercise its veto power against a ceasefire resolution championed by ten nations led by Mozambique. The resolution garnered the support of 14 members of the UN Security Council, with the US abstaining. The resolution called for an immediate ceasefire during a sacred period, with the ultimate aim of achieving a permanent and sustainable cessation of hostilities. Furthermore, it demanded the immediate and unconditional release of all hostages, underscoring the necessity of humanitarian access to address their medical and other urgent needs. This development signaled a significant shift in the international community's stance on the conflict, highlighting a growing consensus towards prioritizing peace and humanitarian considerations in resolving the ongoing crisis. The shift in the US stance towards the ceasefire resolution primarily stems from multiple factors. Firstly, the enduring and relentless nature of Israel's military campaign in Gaza, Secondly, with impending elections on the horizon, the US President's concerns over potentially alienating Muslim voters, as well as support for a ceasefire from diverse religious, racial, and ethnic groups, influenced the decision-making process in Washington. The mounting frustration within US political circles at the Israeli Prime Minister's unwavering stance on military actions, particularly the planned Rafah attack, further compounded the situation. Moreover, Israel's ongoing massacre, hindrance of humanitarian aid deliveries exacerbated tensions and raised humanitarian concerns globally, prompting the US to reassess its approach. Israel incessantly and unlawfully pounding Gaza, hitting schools and hospitals and reducing large parts of neighborhoods to rubble. It unlawfully used white phosphorus in densely populated areas. Forced evacuation of all people from northern Gaza and displacing 1.9 million people. Unlawful killing of over 30,228 Palestinians most of them civilians, including 25000 women and children stemming from Israel's regular use of excessive lethal force and extrajudicial executions. The sweeping unlawful collective punishment by imposing restrictions on the movement of people and goods deprived the 2.2 million Palestinians in Gaza of their right to freedom of movement and opportunities to better their lives; severely limited their access to electricity, health care, and water; and devastated the economy. Israeli authorities also held 2,873 Palestinians in administrative detention, withpercent of the housing stock in Gaza. At least 342 schools have been damaged, 187 "attacks on health care" were carried out, damaging 24 hospitals.

These atrocities are in utter violation of the established principles of Geneva Conventions designed to ensure the protection and dignity of all individuals affected by armed conflict. Civilians, regardless of age, including children and the elderly, are entitled to special care and must be shielded from deliberate harm. Hospitals and medical personnel are protected. Civilian property such as households, places of worship, and industrial facilities are safeguarded from deliberate targeting. It prohibits collective punishment and emphasizes individual accountability for actions taken during conflict. The convergence of these factors ultimately compelled the United States to abstain from vetoing the ceasefire resolution, marking a significant departure from its previous staunch support for Israel's actions. Israel's response to international appeals, UN resolutions, and pressure from the US reflects a deep-seated determination to pursue its own strategic objectives in the Israel-Palestine conflict. Despite widespread calls for moderation and humanitarian considerations, Israel has remained steadfast in its military actions against Palestinians in Gaza. It even started hurling accusations at the US for US persistent advocacy for a two state solution and allowing humanitarian aid to enter into Gaza and warned that with or without the support of US, Israel would continue warfare and annexation of Palestinian territory, underscore Israel's uncompromising stance on key issues such as the two-state solution and the provision of humanitarian aid. By canceling a planned trip to Washington and rebuking the US for its perceived interference, Israel demonstrates its frustration with what it views as insufficient support for its military operations and broader objectives in the region. Big Question is what is next after the passing of the resolution if Israel refuses to abide by the resolution. This concern was put to writing by the UN secretary general, António Guterres, who in his tweet said quote, "The Security Council just approved a long-awaited resolution on Gaza, demanding an immediate ceasefire, and the immediate and unconditional release of all hostages. This resolution must be implemented. Failure would be unforgivable". Initially, diplomatic pressure and condemnation from the UNSC and other member states could intensify, urging the non-compliant country to honor the ceasefire agreement. Concurrently, economic sanctions may be imposed, targeting vital sectors of the non-compliant nation's economy to compel compliance. This combination of diplomatic and economic measures aims to exert significant pressure on the non-compliant nation and encourage a return to peaceful negotiations and adherence to the UNSC resolution.

In more severe cases where the refusal to comply persists, the international community may escalate its response. This could involve the authorization of military intervention by the UNSC to enforce the ceasefire resolution and restore order. Additionally, the non-compliant country may face further isolation on the international stage, with repercussions extending to legal consequences for breaches of international law. However, unfortunately, numerous resolutions passed by the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) including those passed on Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir have remained unimplemented for various reasons. These include the lack of enforcement mechanisms, political obstacles stemming from opposing interests among member states, resource constraints, challenges in securing cooperation among multiple parties, and the evolving nature of conflicts and geopolitical dynamics. Additionally, resolutions may face difficulties in implementation when they involve non-state actors or address issues bevond the control of the UNSC. Ultimately, the effectiveness of UNSC resolutions hinges on factors such as political will, international cooperation, enforcement mechanisms, and the evolving circumstances surrounding conflicts and crises. When these factors align, resolutions are more likely to be successfully implemented, but when they are lacking, resolutions may remain unimplemented or only partially implemented. The upcoming test will gauge the resilience and determination of the international community in confronting the actions of a single, albeit influential, nation: Israel. Whether the collective efforts of the international community will prevail over the policies of Israel remains to be seen, with time serving as the ultimate arbiter of this contentious struggle.

# Russia-Iran cooperation in the changing world

Russia, led by Putin, sees energy exports as a tool in its geopolitical competition... HE countries Russia and Iran are becoming closer in terms of security and defense. They are working on a long-term agreement to cooperate more in other areas. This collaboration covers various aspects including trade, investment and joint projects. The relationship between the two countries has strengthened especially since the conflict in Ukraine. Iran says that trade between them has doubled and Russia is now the largest foreign investor in Iran. Both the countries believe that the West poses a threat to their interests. They think that Western powers are limiting their actions on the world stage and supporting movements that aim to change their governments. Both Moscow and Tehran see the West as a common enemy. This shared perception of threat and common interests is the foundation of their growing cooperation. However, within Iran there is a disagreement about the value of Russia as a partner. Hardliners see closer ties with Russia as a way to protect against the West while others, including many Iranians, think that direct talks with the United States and a revival of the 2015 nuclear deal would be better for Iran. This division in opinion is not likely to go away soon and Western powers may try to take advantage of it. The moderate and pragmatic wing in Iran is doubtful about Russia's role and sees promises of strategic relations with Russia as unrealistic.

They see a common threat with Russia and believe that working together is crucial for their mutual security. Even though there are disagreements, they prioritize their strategic goals. The leaders in both Iran and Russia feel that not cooperating could be costly for both countries and there are benefits to working together. Russia is seen as a crucial supporter for Iran internationally especially in the tensions with the West. The war in Ukraine has increased the importance of the alliance for both nations.While there is no formal alliance but there are an unwritten commitment between Moscow and Tehran for mutual protection. Despite past obstacles, the two countries have started to strengthen ties particularly in the energy sector. Before 2022, Russian companies were cautious due to Western interests but this changed when a \$40 billion agreement was signed in July 2022.

The deal involves upgrading Iranian oil and gas sectors with a focus on projects like the North Pars gas field.However, questions arise about the reliability of the partnershipspecifically considering past withdrawals from projects. Iran also faces challenges in attracting foreign investment due to sanctions and economic issues. Despite assurances from Iranian officials, doubts exist about the long-term significance and success of the deal, given the geopolitical nature of the cooperation rather than purely commercial reasons.Someone from Iran criticized a deal between IranianOil Company (NIOC) and Russia's Gazprom. They questioned whether Russia would help Iran build the necessary infrastructure to export gas to Europe. The critics think it is not logical for Gazprom to invest in Iranian LNG (liquefied natural gas) infrastructure because they lack experience. They also doubt Russia's commitment to investing in Iran.

The criticism in Tehran is based on two points. First, Iran hasn't prioritized developing its LNG industry like Qatar. Second, there is feeling that Russia pressures Iran to stay out of the European gas market, as Russia doesn't want Iran to become an alternative energy provider to Europe. Russia, led by Putin,

sees energy exports as a tool in its geopolitical competition with the West. Russia has no reason to help Iran upgrade its energy infrastructure for European markets and some in Tehran believe Russia might invest in Iranian projects to gain control over them and slow down Iran's emergence as an alternative oil and gas exporter to Europe. There is a competition between Iran and Russia in Asian oil markets. Some in Iran suggest exporting more oil to Europe instead of competing with Russia in Asia. Those in Iran supporting closer energy ties with Russia argue that Iran should think globally and prioritize political ties over economic gains. They see Russia's separation from the West as an opportunity for Iran. They believe that aligning with Russia helps the survival of the Islamic Republic as an anti-American model.

It looks like the United States and Europe can't do much to stop Moscow and Tehran from getting closer. This is because they are working together in a way that makes leaders in both countries less worried about a big threat. Without a new nuclear deal and with Iran doing bad things, like violating human rights and hurting innocent protesters, becoming friends with the current leaders in Tehran seems unlikely. European countries might consider putting a lot of pressure and more tough actions on Iran. This could make Iran feel vulnerable and give them a reason to get closer to Russia. The same thing is happening on the Russian side. Russian actions in Ukraine have made it hard for them to become friends with the West in the near future. Instead, when the West puts pressure on Russia, it strengthens the reasons for Moscow to be friends with Iran. In simple terms, as long as the West keeps up the pressure on both Russia and Iran, Moscow and Tehran will probably work together more.

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan cricket team is set to visit Australia for a white-ball series scheduled for November this year as Cricket Australia (CA) on Tuesday released its international schedule for the 2024-25 season.The Pakistan cricket team will play three ODIs and as many T20Is against Australia on their tour Down Under.

Pakistan is set to return to Australia after nearly 11 months since competing in the Benaud-Qadir Trophy, featuring three Test matches held in Perth, Sydney, and Melbourne from December 2023 to January 2024. The three-match ODI series kicks off on 4 November at the Melbourne Cricket Ground, followed by matches in Adelaide and Perth on 8 and 10 November, respectively. The last time Pakistan played an ODI series in Australia was in 2016. Following the ODIs, Pakistan and Australia will also clash in a three-match T20I series. Pakistan last played a T20I in Australia in 2022 during the ICC Men's T20 World Cup final. **ODI series schedule:**

Meanwhile, Cricket Australia remains committed to exploring the possibility of arranging a match between India and Pakistan in Australia. However, Peter Roach, CA's cricket operations manager, noted that there wasn't an opportunity to organize a tri-series that would lead to a showdown between the historic rivals this season.

"We haven't got a tri-series in the FTP (Future Tours Program)," Roach said. "Going forward, we're always interested in opportunities for matches and content that will engage our fans. "It's fair to say that every country in the world would love to see India and Pakistan competing in their country. We're on record as saying that we're one of those countries that have asked the question. "There's no room in our sched-

ules to do that at the moment, but we'll keep talking to them and [consider] any other opportunities that arise. But in this specific example there is not going to be any change to the schedule.'

According to the international cricket schedule for season 2024-25 announced by Cricket Australia, a men's five-Test Match Border-Gavaskar Trophy Series and a day-night MCG Test Match as part of the Women's Ashes Series are highlights of the calendar. "This is one of the most highly anticipated summers of cricket in memory with the eyes of the cricket world focussed on the extended Border-Gavaskar Trophy Series and the multiformat Women's Ashes," Cricket Australia CEO Nick Hockley said.

"Fittingly, the Border-Gavaskar Trophy has been put on the same footing as The Ashes with a five Test Series for the first time since 1991-92 and we're confident the schedule will maximise viewership and attendances and there will be a tremendous atmosphere in stadiums across the country. "The first Women's Test match at the MCG since 1949, and the first day-night Test at that historic ground, will be a memorable occasion and another important milestone for women's cricket as we take more games to major stadiums including the SCG and Adelaide Oval.

"He's a great athlete," Alcaraz said of Monfils, "He reads almost every ball so I had to be patient but at the same time, with my forehand, my best shot, try to move him around the court, to get him tired a little bit and give myself the chance to dominate the point, get to the net, hit my best shot. "That's what I was trying to do in the match and it worked pretty well," he added. Alcaraz said he had enjoyed playing under the lights in front of stars such as Brazilian footballer Neymar and NBA star Jimmy Butler of the Miami Heat. But he expects a much tougher test from Musetti, who won an enthralling battle with American Ben Shelton in front of a raucous crowd on the Butch Buchholz court 6-4, 7-6 (7/5). "I know that Lorenzo is a really talented player so that's a really tough one," said Alcaraz. "But I am really happy with the level that I am playing, with the performance that I am bringing to the court," he added. Earlier, fourth seed German Alexander Zverev came through a tricky test against American Christopher Eubanks, winning 7-6 (7/4), 6-3. Zverev delivered a crucial break when Eubanks was serving for the set at 5-3 before breaking early in the second to go 3-0 up and see himself through to victory. - DNA

# UN chief Griffiths is stepping down for health reasons

UNITED NATIONS: UN humanitarian chief Martin Griffiths is stepping down for health reasons after nearly three years of trying to tackle mounting humanitarian crises in Ukraine, Gaza and Africa, the United Nations. UN Secretary-Gen-António Guterres eral praised Griffiths "for his tremendous leadership and service to the United Nations and the humanitarian community in advocating for people affected by crises and mobilizing resources to address their needs," UN deputy spokesman Farhan Haq said. Griffiths, 72, told The Associated Press earlier this month that he got a severe case of COV-ID-19 in October and is still suffering from long COVID. Griffiths took on the job of UN undersecretary-general for humanitarian affairs and emergency relief coordinator in July 2021 as crises were escalating around the globe and funds for humanitarian aid were shrinking.

A veteran British diplomat and seasoned negotiator with wide global experience, he served as the UN special envoy for Yemen for three years before taking on the UN's top humanitarian post.-APP

### France faces budget deficit strain as targets missed

PARIS : France's public sector budget deficit widened last year by more than the government planned, official data showed on Tuesday, putting pressure on Paris as it struggles to keep its deficit reduction plans on track. Statistics agency INSEE said the 2023 public accounts showed a fiscal shortfall of 5.5% of economic output last year, up from 4.8% in 2022 and significantly more than the government's target for 4.9%. In reaction to the data, Finance Minister Bruno Le Maire said that weaker than expected growth last year had translated into lower tax income, weighing on the deficit. Though the government had warned in advanced the deficit would be worse than expected, it is still bad news because it means further additional budget savings need to be found this year to meet a 2024 deficit target of 4.1%. The government has already flagged 10 billion euros (\$10.9 billion) in extra budget cuts this year and said it might need to pass legislation mid-year to come up with additional savings. "I'm calling for a collective wake-up call to make choices in all of our public spending." Le Maire said on RTL radio. He added he remained committed to reducing the deficit to below an EU limit of 3% by 2027 and ruled out increasing taxes.Rating agencies are due to provide updates in April and May. INSEE also said France's public debt stood at 110.6% of GDP at the end of the fourth quarter of 2023, versus 111.9% at the end of the fourth quarter of 2022.-APP

# China-Nauru ties open a new chapter in history: Xi

Chinese President Xi said China welcomes Nauru as another country to sign the Belt and Road cooperation document with China

BEIJING : Nauru's political decision to adhere to the one-China principle and restore diplomatic ties with China in January is a move that conforms to the trend of history and the times, Chinese President Xi Jinping told visiting Nauruan President David Adeang in Beijing. Xi said China-Nauru relations have opened a new chapter in history, and China is ready to work with Nauru to create a better future of China-Nauru relations and bring more benefits to the two peoples. Friendship, whenever it is started, will have a bright future. Cooperation, whatever its size, will be productive as long as it is sincere, Xi said, the Xinhua News Agency reported. Experts said that China's relationship with Nauru, which is based on mutual respect and support, is likely to serve as a model for the Pacific Island Countries (PICs). Moreover, the reason why the PICs have preferred deepening their relationship with China is that, unlike the West, China's approach is characterized by long-term commitment, equality, and genuine support for their de-



velopment, rather than driven by geopolitical competition. Xi said China welcomes Nauru as another country to sign the Belt and Road cooperation document with China. He said China is ready to expand practical cooperation with Nauru in trade, investment and

infrastructure construction, and provide assistance to Nauru for its independent and sustainable development without political strings attached. Adeang said that Nauru highly appreciates China's consistent adherence to the principle of equality among

all countries, and is willing to abide by the one-China principle, continuously deepen cooperation with China, take the resumption of diplomatic relations between Nauru and China as an important opportunity, observe mutual respect with China, enhance

#### sonnel exchanges and cooperation in various fields, learn from China's experience, and develop a fruitful and mutually beneficial partnership. The two sides signed various documents on cooperation under the framework of the Belt and Road Initiative, Global Development Initiative and in the fields of economy and agriculture. This is the first visit by a Nauruan president after the two countries resumed diplomatic ties in January 2024. "China's support and attention to these countries has been long-standing and unwavering," Ning Tuanhui, an assistant research fellow at the China Institute of International Studies, told media reporter on Monday. "In contrast, countries like the US have only recently begun to prioritize their engagement with the PICs, primarily as part of their geopolitical scheme to counter China," Ning said. In addition, China has adhered to the principle of equality among nations, regardless of their size. The majority of these island countries are small in terms of landmass and population, making them easily overlooked in

the international arena.

WASHINGTON : Conflict, climate and the demand for low-paid labour in countries such as Thailand and Malaysia, with corruption as a "major enabler", are driving the growth of the people smuggling trade in Southeast Asia, according to a new report from the United Nations Office for Drugs and Crime (UNODC). Tens of thousands of people from Myanmar as well as from other parts of Southeast Asia and from outside the region are smuggled to, through and from Indonesia, Malaysia and Thailand every year, the UNODC said in its report Migrant Smuggling in Southeast Asia, which was published on Tuesday. The report identified three key trends in people smuggling: the demand for workers willing to take on low-wage jobs and the limited channels available for people to fill these jobs legally; the existence of "substantial populations" of people in need of international protection but also with few legal ways to reach safety; and the prevalence of corruption among some public officials. The report noted that such corruption acted as a "driver and enabler of migrant smuggling, as well as contributing to impunity for perpetrators. Public officials share smuggling profits; are bribed to ensure compliance; and obstruct criminal investigations."-APP

### South Sudan on brink amid derailment of oil exports

KHARTOUM : Violence and insecurity could worsen in South Sudan after one of its key oil pipelines to international markets, which passes through neighbouring Sudan, was damaged last month, according to experts. The incident occurred in early February in Sudan's White Nile state, prompting the Dar Petroleum Oil Company to suspend loadings. The rupture happened in an area controlled paramilitary Rapid Support Forces, which is fighting the Sudanese army for power in the country. A team of technical experts has been unable to fix the pipeline due to ongoing fighting, raising fears that South Sudan's political economy could collapse. "The pipeline accounts for two-thirds or three-quarters of oil revenues. Unless [South Sudan] is able to get the pipeline working again, it will be a massive pull on South Su-dan's budget," said Alan Boswell, an expert on South Sudan for International Crisis Group, a non-profit dedicated to conflict resolution. Overall, oil is responsible for about 90 percent of the country's revenue, according to a 2022 World Bank report. Little to none of the oil proceeds go towards the national budget, the International Crisis Group says, with some 60 percent of production diverted by the oil companies as their share, and most of the rest paid to Sudan as part of the settlement reached upon independence, settling old debts, or into "special projects" overseen by the office of President Salva Kiir, which has been accused of corruption and diverting these funds.-APP

Ukraine peace talks without Russia will fail: Peskov

MOSCOW : Any global peace summit on Ukraine that excludes Russia is simply "absurd" and will fail, Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov said in an interview published on Tuesday. Peskov also told the news outlet Argumenty I Fakty that Russia was pursuing its two-year-old war on Ukraine to protect itself from the West. "Can the Ukrainian problem be resolved without Russia's participation? The reply is clear - it cannot," Peskov said in the interview conducted last Thursday, a day before the mass shooting at a concert hall outside Moscow. "Because Ukraine has been turned into an instrument in the hands of the collective West with whose help it intends, so it seems to them, to put more pressure on Russia, restrain Russia and abandon it to the fringes of development. And, should they succeed, to finish it off," he added. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy has called for an international peace summit, and earlier this year Switzerland said it would host the meeting, and that a date and the details were being discussed. Russian President Vladimir Putin has already denounced as unworkable a Ukrainian peace plan calling for the withdrawal of Russian troops and the restoration of Kyiv's 1991 borders, including Crimea, seized and annexed by Russia in 2014. # Senegal's Bassirou Diomaye set to become president

Faye's victory reflected frustration among youth with high unemployment and concerns about governance in the West African nation

DAKAR : Senegal's little-known, 44-year-old opposition leader Bassirou Diomaye Faye was named the country's next president , less than two weeks after being released from prison to run in the election. While official results of Sunday's vote were not yet available, the former prime minister who was the other frontrunner, and who was backed by incumbent President Macky Sall, conceded defeat based on preliminary results. Sall followed with congratulations, also naming Faye as the winner. Faye's victory reflected frustration among youth with high unemployment and concerns about governance in the West African nation. In his first speech delivered as president-elect late Monday, the former tax inspector promised to a fresh chapter following the months of violence and many political arrests that led

up to the election. "I pledge to govern with humility and transparency, and to fight corruption at all levels. I pledge to devote myself fully to rebuilding our institutions," he said, restating promises made during his campaign. Faye, who was backed by popular opposition leader Ousmane Sonko, has vowed to improve Senegal's control over its natural resources by promoting national companies to prevent the country from falling into what his campaign called "economic enslavement." He ran in the place of his close ally Sonko, who was barred from running due to a prior conviction. Sonko was also released on March 14 after months in prison to jubilant celebrations in the capital, following the president's announcement of a political amnesty. The outgoing president Sall, who triggered violent protests earlier this year when he unsuccessfully tried to postpone the election until the end of the year, described the



RESIDENT shook Senegal's reputation as a stable democracy in a region that has seen a wave of coups. Rights groups said dozens were killed in the protests, while some 1,000 people were jailed. The expected winner of the election, Faye is a former tax collector and was little known until Sonko named him as his heir. His roots lie in a small town in central Senegal. He is a practicing Muslim, and has two wives. Ahead of Sunday's election, Faye published a declaration of his assets, and called on other candidates to do the same. It lists a home in Dakar, and land outside the capital and in his hometown. His bank accounts hold roughly \$6,600. "I would even say that he is more honest than me. I place the project in his hands," Sonko told supporters at a joint news conference in March of last year. Weeks later, Faye was arrested and jailed on various charges, including defamation. Alioune Tine, founder of Afrikajom Center, a Senegalese think tank, said the outcome of the vote proved Senegal would survive after a difficult year that had undermined the population's faith in democracy. "From prison to the presidential palace," said Tine. "The only country in Africa capable of withstanding a disease of its democracy that has shaken all its institutions, profoundly shaken its society, only to recover from it." International analysts said a change in leadership in Senegal would come as a relief after months of violence,

but raised new questions about the foreign policy of the new government at a time when the coastal nation is becoming an oil and gas producer. On Monday night, Faye outlined some early foreign policy priorities, which included reforming the troubled West African regional bloc known as ECOWAS. "A win by the opposition also means major changes ahead in domestic and foreign policies," said Rida Lyammouri of the Policy Center for the New South, a Morocco-based think tank, adding that a promise to move away from former colonial power France could define the foreign policy of the country's new government. The ruling juntas have ended military cooperation with France, while turning instead to Russia for support.

**Turkiye targets** 7.2 GW nuclear capacity by 2035 ANKARA : Türkiye aims to

# of Netanyahuto achieve his malicious, undeclared war goals

GAZA CITY: There is no let-up in the Israeli aggression on the Gaza Strip despite a UN Security Council resolution demanding an "immediate ceasefire." Israel carried out air raids and artillery strikes on several parts of Gaza on Tuesday, hitting residential buildings and gatherings of displaced people, "killing and wounding hundreds of people", the Palestinian Information Center said. This brings the total number of Palestinians killed in the Israeli aggression on Gaza since October 7 to 32,414, in addition to 74,787 injured. Among the victims are 15 people, including four women and children, who were killed in an attack on a house in the neighborhood of Mosbeh, north of Rafah. Media reports also said that fighting on the ground continued unabated. That's while the UN Security Council on Monday adopted a resolution for an "immediate ceasefire" for the ongoing Muslim holy month of Ramadan. The resolution was put forward by the 10 non-permanent members of the UN Security Council. The US abstained and the 14 other council members all voted in favor of it. After the vote, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres wrote on social media platform X that failing to implement the resolution "would be unforgivable." Palestinian resistance movements

## Hamas chief in Tehran for talks

**TEHRAN: Hamas chief Ismail Haniyeh** is in Tehran for meetings with senior Iranian officials, just a day after the UN Security Council adopted a resolution demanding an immediate ceasefire in Gaza. The leader of the Palestinian resistance movement arrived on Tuesday afternoon and immediately sat down for talks with Iranian Foreign Minister Hossein Amir-Abdollahian. "Examining the latest situation of the war in Gaza and the ongoing aggression of the Zionist regime against the people of the Gaza Strip and the West Bank are among the most important agendas of the trip and the talks between the officials of the two sides," official news agency IRNA reported. Since the start of Israel's military aggression and genocide against the Palestinians, the Islamic Republic has used all its diplomatic power to stop the war and send immediate humanitarian aid to the people of Gaza. Political analysts believe the visit is of great importance as it takes place just one day after the ceasefire resolution was adopted. It is

the second visit of the head of the political bureau of Hamas to Iran since the outbreak of the Israeli war on Gaza in October. Meanwhile, Qatar said Tuesday that indirect talks between Hamas and Israel are still ongoing between technical teams. "We are continuing our mediation efforts with our part-Foreign Ministry spokesman ners," Majed Al-Ansari told a press conference in Doha. He cited "difficulties" on the ground related to the cease-fire negotiations. "There is no set timeline for the indirect negotiations," the spokesman said. The Israeli government on Tuesday pulled its negotiating team out of indirect talks with Hamas in the Qatari capital, accusing the Palestinian group of being "not interested in continuing talks" after allegedly rejecting a US-brokered compromise. Haniyeh, who is based in the Qatari capital of Doha, met Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei in November. Iran is a key supporter of Hamas although it has repeatedly declared that groups operating within the Axis of Resistance, including Hamas, act independently when it comes to policy-making and military performance.

have welcomed the resolution, but Israel's minister for military affairs Yoav Gallant said Israel will not stop its attacks in Gaza.

"We will operate against Hamas everywhere - including in places where we have not yet been," Gallant said. Israel's foreign minister, Israel Katz, also said in a post on X that the attacks will continue until all the captives taken by Hamas during its October 7 blitz are released. Meanwhile, The head of Yemen's Supreme Political Council says the country's maritime operations in the Red Sea against Israeli-affiliated commercial vessels will cease only if the Tel Aviv regime's crimes in Gaza stop.

Addressing a ceremony in the Yemeni capital city of Sana'a on the occasion of the ninth anniversary of the Saudi-led war on Yemen, Mehdi al-Mashat said that Yemenis have never sought a conflict and always advocated a peace process. "We assure that Yemen is not a danger to any party, and anyone who has an issue with the Sana'a government can solve it through dialogue," he said. "The only way to stop Yemen's operations is to stop genocide and violence against the oppressed people of Gaza," he added. More than 170 days into the Israeli war on the besieged coastal Palestinian territory, killing at least 32,300 Palestinians, famine looms over much of the blockaded territory as the regime continues to block food and basic supplies from entering the

**Israel continues strikes in Gaza Unity always** important, especially **in war**: Zelenskyy WEB DESK

> KYIV: Ukrainian President VolodymyrZelenskyy said unity is always important, especially in times of war and airstrikes that have been targeting multiple regions of the country, including the capital Kyiv.

"Last year we initiated a new tradition - to celebrate the holy Ramadan together ... I am very glad that we are here today in the same composition. Unity is always important, especially when life is overshadowed by war and the strikes of evil," Zelenskyy said during an iftar, or fast-breaking meal during the month of Ramadan, in Kyiv on Monday.

The dinner was attended by leaders of the Mejlis of the Crimean Tatar People and representatives of the Muslim community. Zelenskyy thanked Muslim soldiers in the Ukrainian army for defending the country. Russia launched a "special military operation" in Ukraine two years ago. The Ukrainian leader wished "peace and tranquility" to those who are "deprived of normal life and security" in conflict areas, especially referring to the people in Syria, Gaza, Libya and Sudan.

"In Ukraine, we wish everyone who values life ... We wish a just peace to all nations whose homes are being destroyed by war. We wish justice to our state of Ukraine and all other nations. KARACHI: The privatisation and restructuring plan of Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) on Tuesday was approved by its board of directors which was recently constituted. The 83rd meeting of the PIA's board of directors was held on March 25 during which the scheme of arrangement for the airline's privatisation and restructuring was approved, as per the official announcement.

The board of directors will coordinate with Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP), said the statement. Meanwhile, as per the sources, the plan also discussed different proposals regarding the future of the

organisation's employees. The government had appointed Ernst & Young – a global financial advisory firm – to prepare the plan for the loss-making firm which completed its task during the caretaker setup. The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has asked the Pakistani authorities to privatise the bleeding stateowned enterprises to revitalise the sick economy.

# **Announces restructuring of FBR** PM Shehbaz vows to bring economic stability

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif expressed the tune of Rs65 billion were made to the exporters and the resolve on Tuesday to bring macroeconomic stability and put Pakistan the path of growth. Addressing the Tax Excellence Awards ceremony in Islamabad, the premier said ensuring export-led growth through joint efforts was the only solution to make the country debt-free. The prime minister also said the government will strive to elevate productive sectors such as industries, information technology (IT), and agriculture. Referring to the new IMF programme, the premier said the government is taking the step to bring stability to the country's economy. "The state will also focus on addressing the issue of inflation while ensuring growth and creating job opportunities,' said PM Shehbaz, adding that the federal government along with the provincial governments will create an enabling situation for the private sector and address the issues faced by the sector. Shehbaz added that refunds to

expressed determination for timely payments of refunds in the future. The prime minister also vowed to provide electricity to industries at competitive rates with the aim of increasing productivity. ## Julian Assange wins temporary reprieve from extradition to US If Assange had been denied permission to appeal he could have been extradited within days to face espionage charges

LONDON: Julian Assange has been handed a reprieve in his fight against extradition to the US after two judges ruled the WikiLeaks founder could take his case to an appeal hearing - but only if the Biden administration is unable to provide the court with suitable assurances. The president of the king's bench division, Victoria Sharp, and Mr Justice Johnson said Assange had real prospects of success on three of the nine grounds argued, but adjourned the leave to appeal application to give the US government three weeks to provide reassurance on the relevant matters. If Assange had been denied permission to appeal he could have been extradited within days to face espionage charges. While the judges' decision means he avoids that fate it leaves him facing a further wait, with his future still unresolved. In a written judgment, handed down on Tuesday morning, Sharp said the concerns that had real prospects of success at appeal but which "may be capable of being addressed by assurances" were "that the applicant [Assange] is permitted to rely on the first amendment, that the applicant is not prejudiced at trial, including sentence, by reason of his nationality, that he is afforded the

same first amendment protections as a United States citizen, and that the death penalty is not imposed". At a two-day hearing last month, which Assange was too unwell to attend, his lawyers argued that he faced a "flagrant denial of justice" if extradited to the US to face charges relating to the publication by Assange and WikiLeaks of thousands of classified and diplomatic documents they said had exposed torture, rendition, extrajudicial killings and war crimes. His wife,

Stella Assange, expressed dismay at the judges' decision. "What the courts have done has been to invite a political intervention from the United States ... send a letter saying 'its all OK'," she said. "I find this astounding. "This case is a retribution. It is a signal to all of you that if you expose the interests that are driving war they will come after you, they will put you in prison and will try to kill you. "The Biden administration should not issue assurances. They should drop this shameful case that should never have been brought." Ahead of the decision there had been reports that the US government was considering a plea deal offer to Assange, allowing him to admit to a misdemeanour, which would enable him to walk free from
