ISLAMABAD: In the wake of terrorist attack in Shangla district last month, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Friday directed authorities concerned to provide Chinese nationals foolproof security in Pakistan. The terrorist attack had targeted a vehicle, resulting in killing of a woman and five Chinese nationals, and a Pakistani driver. Work on the hydropower project is halted since the attack on March 26.

The victims were killed when an explosive-laden vehicle hit the bus carrying them on the Karakoram Highway in the Bisham area on March 26. Presiding over a meeting regarding the law and order in Islamabad, the premier ordered to devise a comprehensive action plan for regular audit of security standard operating procedures. He said he would personally oversee the meetings about security of Chinese national every month. The meeting was attended by the federal interior minister, heads of security institutes and relevant authorities. PM Shehbaz was briefed about the comprehensive security situation in the country. He vowed to continue waging war against terrorism till its annihilation. He also directed the interior ministry to boost cooperation with the provincial anti-terrorism departments. The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Home Department asked relevant authorities to upgrade the security for Dasu Hydropower Project after the March 26 terrorist incident which claimed six lives.



UN rights council demands halt of arms sales to Israel

UN rights body demands Israel be held accountable for possible war crimes

GENEVA: The United Nations Human Rights Council on Friday adopted a resolution calling for Israel to be held accountable for possible war crimes and crimes against humanity in the Gaza Strip, although Israel dismissed it as a "distorted text." Twenty-eight countries voted in favor, 13 abstained and six opposed the resolution, including the United States and Germany. The adoption prompted several representatives to the Council to cheer and clap. The resolution stressed "the need to ensure accountability for all violations of international humanitarian law and international human rights law in order to end impunity.' It also expressed "grave concern at reports of serious human rights violations and grave breaches of international humanitarian law, including of possible war crimes and crimes against humanity in the Occupied Palestinian Territory." The council also demanded a halt to all arms sales to Israel, highlighting warnings of "genocide" in its oppression and expressed solidarity with the sufferwar in Gaza, which has killed more than 33,000 people. ing Palestinian people. KP to be the first province to approve drug policy

PESHAWAR : Health Min ister Syed Qasim Ali Shah announced on Friday that Khyber Pakhtunkhwa would be the first province to approve a drug policy. He made this statement during a meeting of the Health Department. The minister emphasized the importance of pharmacist appointments in hospitals and highlighted that under the policy, pharmacy services would be integrated with health centers. He further stated that doctors would prescribe medications based on formulas rather than brands for patients, aiming to eliminate price manipulation and supply constraints from the drug market. The implementation of the policy is expected to reduce medication expenses for patients . Hospital pharmacist appointments under the policy will ensure the availability of standard medications at lower rates for the public. Additionally, assistance will be provided to reduce the harmful effects of medications through pharmaceutical vigilance and antimicrobial resistance in hospitals. A Drug Information and Poison Control Center will be established in the province to provide guidance on poisoning and medication overdoses through online or phone consultations as an emergency measure. The establishment of a drug testing laboratory at the divisional level was also proposed in the policy, along with the recommendation for the appointment of a drug inspector at the district level.-APP

250 years old water well to be restored in Peshawar

PESHAWAR : The district government of Peshawar has decided to restore a 250 years old ancient water well in interior Peshawar with the objective of apprising people, especially new generation, about the rich history of the city enjoying distinction of being the oldest living city in South Asia. The decision has been taken by Mayor of Peshawar, Haji Zubair Ali during his visit to interior city at Chah Kala area. Accompanied by Chairman Imran Naveed, Mayor Zubair Ali was briefed about the history of the well constructed around 250 years earlier for supply of water to the inhabitants of the city. Mayor Peshawar was apprised that according to some folklores about name of the well which among locals is called as `Kaley de Kohi' (Well of a black man), there was a Bhishti (a person who supplied water in leather bags) with a very black complexion and he used to supply water at homes. Due to black complexion of Bhishti, local people started attaching name of the well towards his natural appearance by saying `Kaley de Kohi'. The well became dry with passage of the time and is not in use for the last several decades.-APP

Shortage of car parking irksome for Eid shoppers

PESHAWAR : Like other districts of Khyber Pakthunkhwa, eid shopping activities have also reached to its peak in Peshawar especially after iftar where people along with families and children are being seen in large number to buy appropriate goods ranging from clothes, readymade suites to footwear to celebrate the festival in most befitting manner. Eid shoppers, who are coming in droves from adjoining districts, are facing great problems due to lack of vehicles parking facilities in most of the shopping centres and arcades besides traffic jams ahead of iftar. As few days left in Eidul Fitr celebrations,

ities in shopping centres and arcades, resulting in massive traffic jams in Peshawar ahead of iftar. The problem of parking is one of the great challenges for police and district administration to counter as the number of vehicles started increasing in Peshawar during last days of Ramadan and enlarged further on Chand Raat. "Traffic jams are a big issue these days in Peshawar. I came along with my family from Nowshera to Peshawar on Friday afternoon for shopping and spent about two hours at University Road due to traffic mess," said Qaiser Khan, a retired Wapda employee while talking to APP. He said disorderly park-

their vehicles on the roadside, footpaths and resultantly people spend hours on roads due to massive traffic jams before reaching their destinations and many break Iftar inside their vehicles. Qaiser said the absence of traffic wardens during iftar times has further exacerbated the traffic woes, contributing to an escalating problem. He said shoppers frequently get caught up in traffic snarlups, particularly in front of shopping centres such as Deans Trade Centre, CT Tower, Qissa Khwani and University Road due to lack of car parking. "Most of contractors of private car parking contractors are currently charging Rs50 to Rs100 per vehicle that cannot be afforded by middle class and low income groups," he said. Qaiser said that it was the responsibility of district administration, Peshawar Development Authority and police to ensure car parking facilities in all major plazas and arcades for facilitation of people and strict action should be taken against price hikers.-APP



Police arrest seven gamblers

RAWALPINDI: Rawalpindi district police arrested seven gamblers and recovered Rs 18,700 stake money, nine mobile phones, and other items from their possession, said a police spokesman here on Friday. Multinational Tobacco Company Violate Tax Laws

ISLAMABAD: The Centre for Research and Dialogue (CRD) has asked the finance minister for action against violation of the country's tax laws by multinational cigarette companies. The CRD pointed out blatan violations through a letter. The development comes at a time when the Ministry of Finance is struggling to broaden the tax net and plug the loopholes in the tax machinery. The letter urged prompt action against the violations of the Federal Excise Act 2005 after the multinational cigarette companies introduced new variants of the same brand family at significantly lower prices. According to the rules, no manufacturer or importer of cigarettes can introduce or sell a new variant of a cigarette brand at a price lower than the lowest actual price within the same brand family. Despite this regulation, PTC has launched a new brand, Capstan International, priced at Rs 164, substantially lower than its existing family brand, Capstan by Pall Mall, which is priced at Rs 212. Amjad Qamar, Di-rector of CRD, highlighted the implications of this violation, emphasizing that it not only breaches tax regulations but also contributes to making cigarettes more affordable, which is detrimental to public health and reportedly 337500 people lost their lives due to tobacco related diseases annually in Pakistan

IRSA releases 85,500 cusecs water

ISLAMABAD: Indus River System Authority (IRSA) on Friday released 85,500 cusecs water from various rim stations with inflow of 91,500 cusecs. According to the data released by IRSA, water level in River Indus at Tarbela Dam was 1421.23 feet and was 23.21 feet higher than its dead level of 1,398 feet. Water inflow and outflow in the dam was recorded as 20,800 cusecs and 30,000 cusecs respectively. The water level in River Jhelum at Mangla Dam was 1098.10 feet, which was 48.15 feet higher than its dead level of 1,050 feet. The inflow and outflow of water was recorded 33,200 cusecs and 18,000 cusecs respectively. The release of water at Kalabagh, Taunsa, Guddu and Sukkur was recorded as 29,100, 32,700, 30,000 and 7,600 cusecs respectively. Similarly, from River Kabul, a total of 23,000 cusecs of water released at Nowshera and 9.300 cusecs released from River Chenab at Marala.-APP

ISLAMABAD: To explore collaboration opportunities, a delegation from KATOP, a Chinese company specializing in solutions for lithium-ion batteries visited the National University of Science and Technology (NUST) and had detailed discussions with University officials. The delegation included the Vice President Zhou Yan, PMO Manager Aqeel Khan, Project Delivery Manager Wasif Noor, and Muhammad Javed Iqbal, an alumnus of SEECS 2012 and Representative of KATOP in Pakistan. According to Gwadar Pro, they held a meeting with NUST Leadership, including Pro-Rector RIC Dr. Rizwan Riaz and DG Projects Dr. Saeed Ur Rehman Sarwar and discussed potential areas of partnership. During their visit, the delegation toured various laboratories at US-PCASE where research on Energy Storage devices is currently underway. ASEAN, China ties

WAVE of visits to China can be witnessed among ASEAN countries. Indonesia's president-elect Prabowo Subianto made his first overseas visit to China after he secured a victory in the presidential election, and both sides agreed to promote the comprehensive and high-quality development of bilateral relations. This is followed by the separate visits to China by Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs of Laos Saleumxay Kommasith, Minister of Foreign Affairs of Vietnam Bui Thanh Son, and Minister of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation of Timor-Leste Bendito dos Santos Freitas from Tuesday to Friday. This is not only a true reflection of China-ASEAN relations getting closer, but also a vivid practice of regional countries yearning for peace and seeking development. Seventy years ago, China and Southeast Asian countries held high the Five Principles of Peaceful Coexistence, laving a solid foundation for regional peace, stability and economic prosperity. Over the past 70 years, guided by the Five Principles of Peaceful Coexistence, China has been continuously deepening political exchanges, economic and trade cooperation, humanistic exchanges with these countries, and striving to jointly build the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) and a community of shared future. It has been actively promoting its relations with ASEAN to reach new heights one after another. From a broader perspective, China and ASEAN have become an important force in maintaining regional peace and stability as well as international justice, as their bilateral and multilateral communication mechanisms have been increasingly enhanced and the two sides have reached more and more consensus on regional and international hotspot issues. This has not only consolidated the foundation of mutual trust in the relations between the two sides, but also provided a strong guarantee for building a China-ASEAN community with a shared future.

Economically, China and ASEAN stand as each other's largest trading partner. In 2023, bilateral trade continued to grow, reaching 6.41 trillion yuan (\$0.89 trillion). ASEAN has been China's largest trading partner for four consecutive years, while China has also been ASEAN's largest trading partner for several years. By July 2023, the two-way cumulative investment surpassed \$380 billion, and China has established more than 6,500 direct investment enterprises in ASEAN countries. Major infrastructure projects such as the Jakarta-Bandung High-Speed Railway and the China-Laos Railway have become the "gilded signboard" of China-ASEAN cooperation and have benefited people along the route. Against the backdrop of "fierce competition with China" pushed by the US, some Western countries have aired a twisted view of "de-Sinicizing" the production and supply chain, but the cooperation between China and ASEAN countries in this area hasn't seen "decoupling;" on the contrary, the two sides are deeply embedded in each other, embarking on a new path of integrated development. In 2023, China's imports and exports of intermediate goods with ASEAN reached 4.13 trillion yuan (\$570 billion). ASEAN has remained China's largest trading partner for intermediate goods for many consecutive years. The two sides have deepened cooperation in energy, electronics, agricultural products and other industries

NATO at 75

NE of the strengths of NATO, which has allowed it to survive to its 75th anniversary on April 4, is its capacity to adapt to changing geopolitical landscapes. That is also why it is no longer the NATO envisaged by the founding nations as a bulwark against the Soviet Union at the end of the World War II, and the start of the Cold War. It is a new NATO. This has brought changes in priorities and outlook, and it is on the cusp of evolving from a regional security alliance - whose main purpose used to be the mutual defense of its member states - to a global presence prepared to roll up its sleeves and charge headlong into conflicts in which its nations have no direct stake, but for which they are ready to restyle themselves as the world's police force. Is this even the job of NATO? One has to recognize that its intervention can often make things worse, not better. The organization's founding statesmen must be spinning in their graves. NATO itself now sees its mission as far removed from the original intent of the North Atlantic Treaty which created it in 1949. As the opening preamble of the treaty itself acknowledged, the alliance grew from the determination of member nations "to safeguard the freedom, common heritage and civilization of their peoples, founded on the principles of democracy, individual liberty and the rule of law." Crucially, it added: "They seek to promote stability and well-being in the North Atlantic area." It was believed that collective defense and mutual security were key to achieving these goals. Hence, Article 5 of the treaty declares that any attack on one ally can be considered an attack upon all, and that all can be called upon to come to its defense. This principle made NATO seem so strong in its youth, but now makes it so dangerous in maturity.

Contrast this with NATO's own understanding of its role in the world in 2024: "Essentially, NATO not only helps to defend the territory of its members, but also engages - where possible and when necessary - to project its values further afield, prevent and manage crises, stabilize post-conflict situations and support reconstruction." This changes its purpose from a straightforward security alliance into one which is intent on projecting its own worldview far beyond its borders, a political objective, not a military one. It is also extending the organization's geographical reach just as far as it or its members feel like. The Euro-Atlantic grouping has morphed into global NATO, with ambitions to become imperial NATO. The association eagerly talks about engaging outside of its borders in order to ensure "stability at home." It seems a pretty dodgy doctrine - in the sense that sometimes it might work, and sometimes it might blow up in NATO's face. Look what happened when terrorists attacked the US on September 11, 2001 and Article 5 was invoked for the first - and, so far, the only - time in its history. The 18 other treaty signatories all pledged to support the American response, which was to invade one of the world's poorest countries, and wage war there for 20 years before pulling out and returning the now even poorer country to the Taliban, the very people the invasion was designed to eject from power. The consequences of this action are still being felt around the world, and will continue to be felt for generations. NATO made the world a more dangerous place, an ironic achievement as one of its key functions on the world stage is "crisis management."

Iran and Israel: Is the denial game over?

The official news agency IRNA echoed that sentiment with the headline" The Whole Nation Demands Revenge". In an editorial on Tuesday IRNA suggested that "embassies and consulates of the Zionist enemy in several countries are ready targets for revenge." Ominously, it added: "the balance of terror must be restored". The official TV's chief strategic analyst Mahdi Kharratian surprised viewers by saying "If we do nothing this time, we ought to be prepared for the assassination of the highest officials in Tehran." The "enough is enough" message is echoed in sermons by some of the most radical mullahs. Ayatollah Hashem Husseini says "As the center of resistance, the Islamic Republic cannot show weakness especially now that Palestinian resistance...

ILL this time be different?" This is the question that haunts Tehran political circles as more body bags are flown in from Damascus. The body bags contain the mortal remains of 13 Iranian diplomatic and military officers including two senior commanders of the Islamic Revolutionary Grad Corps Gen. Muhammad-Reza Zahedi (alias Abu Mahdi) and Gen. Muhammad-Hadi Haj-Rahimi killed in an Israeli air raid on what was presented as a consular building in the Syrian capital.

To be sure this is not the first time that Israelis take out IRGC officers and Lebanese, Iraqi, Syrian, Pakistan, and Afghan mercenaries in Syria. The take-out operation started in 2015 and reached a peak in 2020. The last time an Islamic Republic official organ provided figures was in 2018 when The Foundation for Martyrs and Self-Sacrificers put Iran's losses at around 5,000. The figures didn't show how many were Iranian officers or mercenaries.

In the first three years of this deadly cycle

went unpunished.

Soleimani's strategy was to fight Israel and the US through proxies while dangling the promise of reining them in as a card in his deadly poker game with the "Great Satan" and the "Zionist entity." Has that fragile balance of terror come to its end? Vibes from Tehran suggest that it has. One reason is that there is no personality with Soleimani's charisma and access to huge financial resources to continue marketing his idea of "kill the enemy with a thousand cuts" and the use of mercenaries as human shields.

Another reason is that this time around Israel has bombastically admitted having carried out a punitive attack against the Islamic Republic. More importantly, perhaps, this is the first time that Israel has attacked a building flying the Islamic Republic's official flag. All previous attacks were on bases and buildings where Iranian officers and mercenaries were located as "advisers" to the official Syrian army.

Tehran could pretend that those attacks were against the Syrian Republic which had the responsibility to respond. This time the attack was against the Iranian consulate and the adjacent residence of the ambassador, both flying the Islamic Republic flag. In international law and diplomatic norms, an attack on an embassy or consulate is a casus belli (a cause for war). Another factor that might force Khamenei to respond differently this time is genuine anger among his followers, already uneasy about his refusal to back Hamas in the Gaza war. "How much longer should we wait for the promised hard revenge to happen?" demands Ibrahim Azizi vice-chair of the National Security Committee in the Islamic Consultative Assembly (Majlis). Announcing the sending of a special mission to Damascus to "see what happened" Majlis spokesman Nizameddin Mussawi says "taking revenge is a national demand that cannot be ignored."

Kharratian surprised viewers by saying "If we do nothing this time, we ought to be prepared for the assassination of the highest officials in Tehran." The "enough is enough" message is echoed in sermons by some of the most radical mullahs. Ayatollah Hashem Husseini says "As the center of resistance, the Islamic Republic cannot show weakness especially now that Palestinian resistance is rubbing the Zionist nose in the dust." Ayatollah Pour-Khaqani says Israel attacked the Islamic diplomatic mission in Damascus to hide its humiliation by Palestinians. IRNA echoes that theme by claiming that "Netanyahu has failed in his three objectives: Freeing Israeli captives, killing Yahya Sinwar and Muhammad Dhif, and destroying the Gaza tunnels."

Kamal Sajjadi, spokesman for The Followers of the Imam Movement suggests that the forthcoming Quds (Jerusalem) Day could be a proper time for revenge.

Newly elected Mailis member Hojat al-Islam Ali-Reza Panahyan says the Islamic Republic must maintain its military presence in Syria and this requires assuring the safety of "our Islamic heroes". The fact that Ayatollah Khamenei ordered a full session of the High Council of National Security, the first in more than two years, shows his concern about dissent in his core constituency and the perception that his "strategic patience" is a pretense for lack of resolve. Seen from his angle there is a growing danger that the radical elements in his camp will see him as an indecisive leader, and blame him for Israeli "audacity." Interior Minister Gen. Ahmad Wahidi says "Israel should expect a suitable answer" but adds that "the decision must come from the Leader of the Revolution" i.e. Khamenei. Islamic President Ayatollah Dr. Ibrahim Raisi, too, has promised "crushing revenge" but insists that the decision must come from Khamenei. The "Supreme Leader" is in a delicate situation. Israel has broken the tacit agreement that allowed both sides to cite plausible deniability about attacks against each other. If he does nothing he could anger his core supporters. If he orders attacks on Israeli and/or Jewish targets he won't be able to cite plausible deniability. And that, as the Islamic TV analyst suggests, could give Israel an excuse for attacks on big targets in Tehran itself.

Tehran used the transfer of body bags from Damascus as a propaganda ploy and organized mass rallies on the burial day of its "heroes of Islam." Later, when Tehran's losses grew the propaganda aspect was forgotten, and "heroes of Islam" were quietly buried in their native hometowns and villages.

Over time, partly thanks to the influence of late Gen. Qassem Soleimani Tehran decided to swallow the bitter pill and brag about "taking revenge" but not retaliate.

Soleimani would do everything to avoid a direct clash with either Israel or the US forces in the region. In fact, he may have established a channel of communication with the Israelis through his correspondence with Gen. David Petraeus, then the top US commander in the region.

In line with that tacit agreement Israel never officially admitted its more than 40 attacks spread over six years.

Tehran reciprocated by not directly blaming Israel, using the euphemism "enemies of Islamic Revolution" instead. Even when Israelis killed Gen. Hussein Hamadani, one of "Supreme Guide" Ayatollah Khamenei's favorite commanders, Tehran decided not to implement its threat of "taking hard revenge." UNSC ceasefire resolution is in place- where is its implementation

None of the three conditions have been met by "Israel". Bombardments and massacres continue in the holy month of Ramadan, while aid workers are targeted and a hostage deal remains elusive due to hubris from the Netanyahu regime. While it is true that the resolution was passed due to the United States abstaining, and it is considered binding despite American claims to the

contrary, it has not resulted in "Israel" mitigating violence or creating the necessary conditions for a ceasefire to take place ESPITE the passage of UNSC Resolution 2728 calling for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza, "Israel's" fascist war machinery continues to wreak havoc on Palestinians through the weaponization of starvation, bombardment of hospitals, killing of aid workers, and arresting worshippers in the holy month of Ramadan at the Al Aqsa Mosque. The far-right, irredentist Netanyahu regime is adamant that ethnic cleansing of Palestinians should continue unabated which explains "Israel" brazenly ignoring the resolution and its central tenets. The question then, ariseshow impactful would Resolution 2728 be in terms of yielding tangible results? Can such measures hold a genocidal regime to account?

There is reason for pessimism. Whether it is the International Court of Justice ruling or international pressure on Netanyahu to rescind his regime's senseless killing spree, "Israel" has conveniently rebuffed any prospect of an end to hostilities that is solely perpetrated by its occupation forces against a battered population. It is hence, worthwhile to examine whether the implications of resolution 2728 would be any different and whether its violation could result in action. The resolution makes three demands- One, an immediate ceasefire in the month of Ramadan respected by all parties leading to a lasting, sustainable ceasefire. Two- the immediate and unconditional release of all hostages; Three- urgently expanding the flow of humanitarian assistance to reinforce the protection of the civilians in the Gaza strip. Tabled by ten non-permanent members of the UNSC and passed unanimously by 14-0 with the United States abstaining, its impact so far has been limited.

None of the three conditions have been met by "Is-

For example, Netanyahu has been categorical in stating that the calls for a ceasefire are not contingent on the release of hostages, despite the resolution stating the contrary. Further rebuttals came from US State Department spokesperson Matthew Miller, who referred to it as 'non-binding' and clarified that it does not impose obligatory sanctions and actual requirements on people. The American and Israeli claims lack credibility but also point at how the resolution may not alleviate the suffering of the Palestinians. According to the President of the Center for International Policy in the United States, Nancy Okail, the resolution is more symbolic rather than substantial in its ability to end the war. Okail's claims come despite the fact that the UNSC resolutions are considered binding as previously emphasized by Chinese Ambassador to the UN, Zhang Jun, and Deputy UN Spokesperson Farhan Haq. Such academic and scholarly skepticism of the resolution's potential impact however exists despite the fact that Israeli violations can result in a follow-up resolution from the council which addresses the breach and calls for punitive action in the form of sanctions and the authorization of international intervention.

Here lies the catch, however. A punitive resolution

rael". Bombardments and massacres continue in imposing sanctions on "Israel" will not be supported by the Biden administration, rendering the prospect of accountability for genocide elusive. Realpolitik sets in, despite institutions seeking to abide by norms, customs and values enshrined in international law. Such realpolitik allows "Israel" to continue with the status quo given American support which has remained unwavering and ironclad despite recently abstaining from the UNSC vote. "Israel" has also previously gotten away with flouting UN resolutions in the past which includes the UNSC calling Israeli settlements on Palestinian lands illegal, (which was passed with 14 votes and the United States abstaining) and in 2023, when the UNGA passed a non-binding resolution calling for a humanitarian ceasefire which "Israel" also ignored.

What UN resolutions need to address is the genesis of the issue which is the nature of the Israeli state and its expansionist agenda. There is no letup in settlements on occupied land for example with new plans afoot in the West Bank. There are also calls and actions aimed at eliminationism by far-right demagogues ranging from Bezalel Smotrich to Itamar Ben Gvir. There is also no let up in arms supplies from the United States to "Israel" which is providing ammunition to the genocidal regime amid resisting calls of international accountability. All this comes with a failure to address forced displacement, sexual assault, apartheid and evictions that Palestinians face on a daily basis. While the UNSC resolution 2728 is a promising development, its implementation will be stymied by Israeli adamancy in maintaining the status quo, unwavering American support, and the genocidal nature of the Netanyahu regime.

KUALA LUMPUR: Malaysia's imprisoned former Prime Minister Najib Razak is seeking to serve the rest of his prison term under house arrest, two months after his sentence in a corruption case was reduced by half. His surprise application filed Wednesday said he had "clear information" that then-king Sultan Abdullah Sultan Ahmad Shah issued an order during the Jan. 29 pardon's board meeting, which cut his 12year jail sentence by half and sharply reduced a fine, allowing him to finish his sentence under house arrest. Najib asked the court to have the government verify and carry out the order. His application was due to be heard Thursday but was postponed to April 17. Sultan Abdullah hails from Naiib's hometown of Pahang. He ended his five-year reign on Jan. 30 under Malaysia's unique rotating monarchy system. A new king took office on Jan. 31. Najib, 70, has served less than two years of his sentence, supposed to end on Aug. 23, 2028, after his sentence was commuted. He was charged and found guilty in a corrup tion case linked to the multibillion-dollar looting of state fund 1MDB. In his application, he accused the pardons board, home minister and the attorney-general among seven entities of concealing the sultan's order "in bad faith."-Agencies

Japanese PM Prioritizes regional security cooperation with South Korea, Philippines, and US, including engagement with North Korea

TOKYO: Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida said he wanted to cooperate with South Korea and the Philippines, allies shared with the US, and even engage with North Korea to promote re-gional security. "The current security environment is tough and complex, and we are at a turning point in history," Kishida said in a group interview. "Cooperation between Japan and the United States and like-minded countries is a very important issue," he added. The Japanese leader spoke ahead of a planned summit next week with US President Ioe Biden, as the allies look for

ways to counter China's growing influence in Asia and deter it from resorting to military action to resolve its disputes in the region. The state visit to Washington, the first by a Japanese leader in nine years, is meant to showcase their close security and economic ties, with the two leaders expected to discuss cooperation on defence equipment and a possible upgrade in the US military command structure in Japan. That meeting will be followed by a trilateral summit with Philippine President Fer-dinand Marcos Jr. "Close cooperation between Japan, the US, and the Philippines is crucial for a free and open order based on the rule of law and for economic prosperity in the

region," Kishida said. Japan last year delivered four air defence radars to the Philippines and is negotiating a reciprocal access agreement with Manila that would make it easier for Japanese troops to train there. A separate trilateral meeting between Kishida, Biden and South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol in the US last year helped Tokyo mend relations with Seoul and bolster security cooperation. Kishida has said he is also willing to meet with North Korean leader Kim "without any preconditions" in a bid to improve strained relations with the nuclear-armed regime. Relations between the countries have been strained over disputes dating back to Japan's occupation in the first

half of the 20th century, and by North Korea's past abduction of Japanese citizens. "Establishing a fruitful relationship will not only benefit Japan and North Korea but will also contribute greatly to peace and stability in the region," Kishida said. Earlier on , South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol cast his ballot as two days of early voting for next week's parliamentary elections kicked off on Friday, in which his ruling party seeks to retake a majority in the opposition-controlled assembly. More than 2.2 million people, or about 5.1% of eligible voters, had cast their ballots at some 3,500 polling stations nationwide as of 11 a.m., according to the National Election Commission. It marked the highest turnout for parliamentary elections at this point since the early voting system was adopted in 2013. Yoon cast his ballot alongside several aides at a station in the southern port city of Busan, where he was expected to attend a business event. He has encouraged people to go to the polls for the April 15 elections, saying it is not only citizens' right but also responsibility. Stakes are high for Yoon as his People Power Party (PPP) is aiming to win a majority in the single-chamber, 300-seat assembly, though polls show the elections too close to call. A failure could undercut Yoon's key initiatives to boost the economy, fiscal health and birthrates, as well as to bolster trilateral security cooperation with the United States and Japan.

Turkiye urges NATO members support against terrorism: FM

Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan discusses counterterrorism, the next NATO secretary-general, the war in Ukraine and Palestine's Gaza following the alliance's meeting in Brussels

ANKARA : Türkiye's Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan has strongly urged NATO members to support Ankara in its fight against terrorism at a two-day foreign ministers meeting in Brussels, where he also held sideline talks with his counterparts. "We underlined that NATO member countries should fully and unconditionally support Türkiye in the fight against terrorism," Fidan told reporters in Brussels, on Thursday, following the meeting. The foreign minister also warned member countries which have been cooperating with the terrorist organisation to cease such activities, particularly in Syria, as it fell "against the spirit of the NATO alliance". "What is sad for them (European coun-

cussing the activities of the member of the alliance for PKK terrorist organisation in Europe. Fidan stressed that said countries should not only condemn the terror group's acts of violence against the Turkish nationals living in Europe, but also take "very serious" measures to combat it. "I see authorities increasingly becoming more sensitive in Europe. This is actually a pleasing issue. I see that tolerance towards PKK is gradually decreasing. This is important," he added. Fidan said he recently met with Dutch Prime Minister Mark Rutte, who has already garnered support from the United United Kingdom, France and Germany as the potential successor. "It is possible that he will visit Türkiye soon. We are working on a date," Fidan said. Recently, Turkish President

emphasised the need for the new secretary-general to best serve the security and interests of all members, especially in the fight against terrorism, and bolster the unity of the alliance while upholding NATO's core values and established practices. Japan to extend \$1 million aid to quake-hit Taiwan

TOKYO : The Japanese government pledged Friday to donate US\$1 million to Taiwan to assist with disaster relief and reconstruction after a magnitude 7.2 earthquake caused significant damage in eastern Taiwan. The donation was announced by Foreign Minister Yoko Kamikawa at a press conference in Tokyo. "We are deeply saddened by the extensive damage' caused by the strong earthquake that hit off the coast of eastern Taiwan on Wednesday, and "we would like to help in any way we can," she said. According to Kamikawa, the US\$1 million emergency grant will be provided to Taiwan via the Japan-Taiwan Exchange Association, through which the Japanese government facilitates various forms of cooperation with Taipei in the absence of formal diplomatic relations. "Japan and Taiwan have always been important friends, supporting each other whenever they faced difficulties,' she said, adding that "[Tokyo] will actively provide the support necessary to meet the needs of Taiwan" in its disaster relief and recovery efforts. Kamikawa also offered her condolences to those who had lost their loved ones during the disaster and said she prayed for the speedy recovery of those who were injured and for the speedy rescue of those who remained unaccounted for. In response, the Presidential Office and Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Taiwan thanked Japan for its gen erosity in separate press releases Friday afternoon. Taiwan and Japan "have overcome many challenges hand in hand in the past" given that both are prone to earthquakes, Lin said, adding that such mutual help had made the two "solid partners." Meanwhile, Taiwan's Foreign Ministry said in its statement that the donation from Japan would be put toward the reconstruction of disaster-stricken areas. As of 3 p.m. Friday, the earthquake -- the most powerful in Taiwan in a quarter of a century -- had resulted in at least 10 deaths, all of which were reported in Hualien County, and more than 1,000 injuries, according to data from Taiwan's Central Emergency Operation Center.-DNA

UNITED NATIONS: Myanmar's escalating conflict and worst violence since the military takeover in 2021 are having a devastating impact on human rights, fundamental freedoms and basic needs of millions of people – as well as "alarming spillover effects" in the region, UN officials said Thursday. Assistant Secretary-General for political affairs Khaled Khiari told the UN Security Council that "the civilian toll keeps rising" amid reports of indiscriminate bombing by Myanmar's armed forces and artillery shelling by various parties. The nationwide armed conflict in Myanmar began after the army ousted the elected government of Aung San Suu Kyi in February 2021 and suppressed widespread nonviolent protests that sought a return to democratic rule. Thousands of young people fled to jungles and mountains in remote border areas as a result of the military's suppression and made common cause with ethnic guerrilla forces battle-hardened by decades of combat with the army in pursuit of autonomy. Despite its great advantage in armaments and manpower, the military has been unable to quell the resistance movement. Over the past five months, the army has been routed in northern Shan state, is conceding swaths of territory in Rakhine state in the west, and is under growing attack elsewhere. –APP

Global food prices rebound: UN agency

WASHINGTON : The Food and Agriculture Organization's (FAO) price index, which tracks the most globally traded food commodities, averaged 118.3 points in March, up from a revised 117.0 points the previous month, the agency said on Friday. The February read ing was the lowest for the index since February 2021 and marked a seventh consecutive monthly decline. International food prices have fallen sharply from a record peak in March 2022 at the start of Russia's fullscale invasion of fellow exporter Ukraine. crop The FAO's latest monthly reading was 7.7% below the

year-earlier level, it said. In March, the agency's vegetable oil price index led gains, jumping 8% monthover-month, with all major oils registering increases. The dairy index gained 2.9% for a sixth straight monthly rise, driven by cheese and butter prices, while the FAO's meat index added 1.7%, reflecting higher poultry, pig and beef prices.-APP

Russia downs drones, Kremlin warns NATO over Ukraine Kremlin says Russia, NATO relations have slipped to the level of 'direct confrontation' over the war in Ukraine

MOSCOW Russia has downed 53 Ukrainian drones, the majority of which targeted the southern Rostov region, the Ministry of Defence said, as the Kremlin warned that Russia and NATO are now in "direct confrontation" over Ukraine. The ministry said that "terrorist attacks with aerial drones" overnight and on Friday morning were foiled, adding that 44 of them were downed or intercepted in Rostov, where Russia's Ukraine campaign headquarters is located. Vasily Golubev, the governor of Rostov, confirmed early on Friday that air defence units

had destroyed more than 40 airborne targets, though an electricity substation was damaged. Writing on the Telegram messaging app, he said the drone attacks had focused on the Morozovsk district, northeast of Rostov, which lies on Ukraine's eastern border. Golubev said work was under way to restore power supplies in the affected areas. Russian state news agency RIA reported that one drone was downed in the Saratov region, where an airbase for Russian strategic bombers is located. Other drones were downed over the Kursk, Belgorod and Krasnodar regions, RIA reported, citing the Defence Ministry. There were no reports of casualties. Ukraine

has for months launched drone attacks on several border regions as it tries to push back Russia's advancing forces. Russia also deployed several unmanned aerial vehicles targeting Ukrainian cities and towns overnight. In a message on Telegram early on Friday, Oleksandr Prokudin, the governor of Ukraine's Kherson, said at least 10 people were "poisoned" by fumes after a gas pipeline was damaged by Russian shelling. The extent of the damage was not immediately clear. Several residential buildings were affected. but there were no immediate reports of casualties, he said. Ukraine's military said on Telegram that it repelled "several waves of attack drones" flying

over the southern regions of Zaporizhia, Odesa and Dnipropetrovsk. The military said the Shahed-type drones entered its territory from occupied Crimea, damaging private homes and some commercial buildings. As the warring nations continue to exchange fire, United States Secretary of State Antony Blinken said more aid is urgently needed for Ukraine. Speaking to reporters at the sideline of NATO's 75th anniversary celebrations in Brussels on Thursday, Blinken said support for Ukraine is especially important as countries such as China, North Korea and Iran are helping Russia build its defence industrial base. NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg says "allies

understand the urgency" of the situation in Ukraine and the need for new additional air defences. Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov warned that relations between Russia and NATO "have now slipped to the level of direct confrontation". NATO was "already involved in the conflict surrounding Ukraine [and] continues to move towards our borders and expand its military infrastructure towards our borders", he said. The military alliance has expanded with the entry of Finland last year and Sweden in March ending decades of neutrality amid soaring concerns about Russia's aggression in Europe following its invasion of Ukraine.

Somalia abandons power-sharing, fears violence increase

MOGADISHU : An overhaul of Somalia's constitution, scrapping its power-sharing system and handing the president increased control, is threatening to destabilise the fragile country, as its wealthiest and most stable state refuses to recognise the changes. The amendments risk worsening violence, the information minister from the semi-autonomous state of Puntland has warned. Mohamud Aidid Dirir told the Guardian that "almost a totally new constitution" had been introduced without input from the state's leaders. He accused the Somali president, Hassan Sheikh Mohamud, of using parliament to "gather authority into his hands". Somali lawmakers voted overwhelmingly last weekend to adopt a slew of amendments to the constitution, which will reshape the political and electoral system and hand more power to the president. The parliamentary speaker, Adan Mohamed Nuur Madobe, called the move "historic".--APP



WASHINGTON: Former US President Donald Trump has said he would have personally alerted Russian President Vladimir Putin about a potential terrorist attack on Moscow's Crocus City Hall, if he had been in a position to do so. Trump made the remarks in an interview with US radio host Hugh Hewitt on Thursday. The journalist suggested that Washington "knew that the Moscow attack last week was going to happen,' and expressed doubt that US President Joe Biden had called Putin to inform him. Hewitt asked the former president whether he would have personally warned the Russian leader about the terrorist plot. On March 22, four gunmen stormed the Crocus City Hall concert venue just outside Moscow, going on a shooting spree and setting fire to the building. At least 144 people, including six children, were killed in the massacre and over 500 were injured. - Agencies

Senate chairman PPP nominates Yusuf Gilani A notification in this regard has been issued by Jamil Soomro

ISLAMABAD: PPP on Thursday nominated former prime minister Yusuf Raza Gilani as its candidate for the prized slot of Senate chairman. A notification in this regard has been issued by Jamil Soomro, political secretary to PPP Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari.

As per an agreement between the PPP and PML-N, the post of president, Senate chairman and governorship of Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa were given to the PPP, while the posts of Senate deputy chairman, National Assembly speaker and governorship of Sindh and Balochistan were given to the PML-N. At the moment, Gilani has the support of 24 senators from the PPP, 19 from PML-N, four from BAP, three from ANP, three independents and one from the National Party, taking the tally to 54. If he gets the support of three MQM-P and five JUI-F senators, then the tally will be 62 which suggests that the ruling coalition nominee will be in a comfort able position to win election.

Macron slams Moscow's claims of French role in terror attack Paris had earlier said it had no intelligence linking the Crocus City Hall shooting spree to Kiev

PARIS: French President Emmanuel Macron has dismissed claims that Paris may have been involved in the Crocus City Hall massacre outside Moscow, speaking to French media on Thursday. In a phone call on Wednesday with his French counterpart, Sebastien Lecornu, Russian Defense Minister Sergey Shoigu suggested that Kiev's Western backers, including Paris, may have been behind the attack.

The terrorist incident in March claimed over 140 lives, after armed gunmen stormed a packed music venue near the capital. The suspected shooters were apprehended by Russian law enforcement on the way to the Ukrainian border. The French and Russian defense ministers talked by phone on Wednesday. During the conversation, Lecornu repeatedly told his Russian counterpart that Western countries and Ukraine had no involvement in the massacre, the Russian MOD reported. Shoigu replied that he had intelligence to the contrary, saying, "the Kiev regime does

nothing without the approval of its Western backers." We hope that in this case the French intelligence services are not behind this," he added. Macron called the state-ments "ridiculous," "baroque and threatening." "It makes no sense," to say that France "could be behind [the Moscow terror attack] and that the Ukrainians are behind it," the president told the media on Thursday.

He added that the phone call was prompted by Paris' willingness to share "useful information" as a part of "joint work" among countries affected by terrorism.

Moscow also maintains that the terrorists had a "window" prepared for them to cross the border into Ukraine. While Islamic State's Afghanistan-based wing (ISIS-K) has claimed responsibility for the attack, the head of Russia's Federal Security Service (FSB), Aleksandr Bortnikov, suggested in March that the US, UK, and Ukraine may have been involved. - Agencies

British HC takes up security coop issues with Mohsin Naqvi


