Premier's Abu Dhabi visit bears fruit as Shehbaz Sharif says "begging bowl broken"

DUBAI: In a major development, the United Arab Emirates (UAE) has announced allocating \$10 billion for more investments in Pakistan, the Prime Minister's Office said Thursday, as the cash-strapped South Asian nation seeks foreign influx of cash amid financial straits. The move came during Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's meeting with UAE President Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan in Abu Dhabi, the capital of the Gulf state, where the premier is on a day-long visit. The decision has been take "to strengthen the Pakistani economy, support it, and enhance cooperation between the two countries", UAE's WAM news agency reported. Pakistan is seeking investment from brotherly nations to boost its economy as the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N)-led government explores avenues to boost reserves and reduce high inflation. Saudi Arabia, as per federal ministers, has also pledged to expedite \$5 billion in investment, while the kingdom's foreign minister said last month that Riyadh would be "moving ahead significantly" to invest in projects in Pakistan. Earlier today in his maiden visit as elected prime minister, Shehbaz Sharif also told an event that Pakistan is seeking collaboration with friendly nations as "gone are the days" when officials will visit brotherly countries with begging bowls. "Gone are the days that I will go to our brotherly countries with begging bowl. I have broken that bowl," the premier said. The country's total foreign exchange reserves stand at a comfortable position of \$14.5 billion, as of May 17, while the State Bank of Pakistan-held reserves are at 9.15 billion after a meagre increase. Pakistan also last month completed a short-term \$3 billion programme, which helped stave off sovereign default, but the government of Prime Minister Shehbaz

Business friendly policies ensuring private sector's development: PM

DUBAI: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif Thursday said the government's business friendly policies and its support to the foreign investors were yielding positive results in promoting the private sector's development and attracting foreign investment. MASHHAD: Iran's late President Ebrahim Raisi was laid to rest in his hometown of Mashhad that hosts the holy shrine of the eighth Shia imam, Imam Reza (AS). The body of Raisi arrived in Mashhad on Thursday morning, with huge crowds of people gathering for his funeral procession that reached Imam Reza's holy shrine where the late president was laid to rest. According to Mohammad-Reza Ghalandar, the mayor of Mashhad, an estimated three million people have taken part in the mourning ceremony, including those from other Iranian cities as well as neighboring countries of Iraq, Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Turkiye. Millions of people in Iran's Khorasan Razavi Province have gathered to bid farewell to President Ebrahim Raeisi and two of his companions who embraced martyrdom in a tragic helicopter crash in the country's northwestern province of East Azarbaijan. Traffic police in action against two stroke rickshaws

PESHAWAR: The city traffic police have started a crackdown against twostroke rickshaws in the district and impounded around 500 such three-wheelers to ease the traffic chaos and disorder. According to traffic police, these rickshaws were not being allowed renewal of permit and registration for the last many years adding that most of these rickshaws were plying on roads without valid and proper documents. Besides, the traffic police said these two-stroke rickshaws were also a main source of noise and air pollution and created traffic problems in the city. Most of the drivers of these rickshaws apply lubricants in their fuel tanks that result in smoke emissions and have a bad impact on the city's environment. Adding his comments, the SP Traffic Peshawar said a seven-point agenda was signed between the rickshaw union and traffic police in 2022 to gradually shift from two-stroke rickshaws to four-stroke that are less hazardous to the environment. However, with the passage of time rather than a decrease in such rickshaws, its number was further increased causing problems in streamlining the traffic flow and discipline. The traffic police said around 500 two-stroke rickshaws having no proper documents have been impounded and the campaign would continue till achiev-

KARACHI: U.S. Ambassador to Pakistan Donald Blome, and Sindh Minister for Health and Population Dr. Azra Fazal Pechuho launched a collaborative initiative aimed at addressing tuberculosis (TB), a significant health challenge in Pakistan. This joint effort between the United States and Pakistan signifies a crucial step forward in combating this disease Funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), the newly launched program, named the Tuberculosis Local Organization Network (TB-LON), is an investment of \$9 million over five years. Its primary goal is to provide expert guidance and resources for Pakistan to effectively tackle TB. Through direct engagement with affected communities and individuals, the program will tailor solutions to meet specific needs. TB-LON will treat more TB cases in Sindh and significantly reduce the number of people affected by the disease. Ambassador Blome emphasized the strong partnership between the U.S. and the Sindh government stating, "Tuberculosis is not just a disease affecting millions in Pakistan; it's an illness that disrupts lives, livelihoods, and communities. Pakistan ranks fifth among countries with the highest rate of TB, but I am proud to say, we are changing that with this groundbreaking \$9 million initiative that will provide expert guidance and resources to help eradicate TB, exemplifying



our constant commitment to the resilient people of Sindh." Dr. Pechuho expressed appreciation for the ongoing support from the U.S. government and reaffirmed the Sindh government's commitment to enhancing healthcare services. "We are confident that our joint efforts in addressing critical health challenges will bring a positive change in the lives of people of Sindh," she added, emphasizing the importance of joint efforts in

Plantation of canopy trees vital to control temperature, air pollution

PESHAWAR: Assembled under a Shisham tree for collective meal after crushing of wheat, Kamal Ali along with his brothers and fellow farmers were seen sewing wheat sacks by using shads of canopy trees to avoid scorching heat. Repeatedly asking his brothers and co labourers to hurry up to sew all 100 bags and shift it to godwon at home before sunset at village Mohib Banda Nowshera, Kamal told APP that trees plantations was the hobby of his late father Hamyun Khan and today his love for trees is greatly help protect them from the sizzling heat. Followed the footprints of his father, the motivated farmer had planted 500 Shisham saplings on my farm lands keeping in view of its enermous benefits especially averting of

heat in Pakistan. Pakistan is a unique country in South Asia blessed with numerous varieties of indigenous tall canopy trees including Shisham extremely beneficial to increase chances of rains besides mitigating the adverse effects of climate change, global warming and air pollution. An abode to world tallest shady trees mostly found in Hamalya, Karakuram to Hindokush mountains ranges, Pakistan's coastal areas of Karachi and Gwadar. alpine pasture Malakand, Hazara, Muree, AJK and GB beside arid zones of DI Khan, DG Khan, Cholistan, Bahawalpur and Tharparker, are acting as purifiers of environment by significantly enhancing chances of rain, producing oxygen, absorbing carbon dioxide,

controlling temperature and air pollution in the country. The national tree of Pakistan, Deodar and other famous species including Kail, Spruce and Walnut are being found in relatively cold climate areas of Swat, Chital, Kohistan, Dir, Gilgit Baltistan and AJK whereas Puniab and KP are the enicenters of native Shisham, Siris, Pipal, Bakin, Amaltas, Poplar, Mulberry, Phulai, Alstona, Kachnar, Bottle Brush, Gul e Nashtar and Jaman, Kikar, Neem, Beera at Sindh and mangroves at coastal areas of Karachi, Thatta and Balochistan endangered juniper trees at Ziarat near Quetta are easiest sources to counterbalance growing effects of climate change and air pollution besides bolstering chances of rains in Pakistan.

"Pakistan is bestowed with more than 200 native trees and nine different forest ecological systems hardly found in any other country of world," Muhammad Tehmasip, former Project Director, PTI Government's Billions Trees Afforestration Project (BTAP) told APP. He said, "one healthy shady tree provides oxygen to two to four persons and 1075 plants on one nectare land absorb six to eight tons carbon dioxide on daily basis." "Trees are a main source of absorbing carbon dioxide and producing oxygen for people and bolstering chances of rains," he said. Due to increase in global warming, he said, change had been witnessed in normal patterns of rains in recent years across the globe including Paki-

ic growth, and social transformation. Kyrgyzstan's Honorary Consul Meher Kashif Younis expressed these views while talking to reporters here on Thursday. He added that technology for development was crucial for Pakistan striving to accelerate its progress and enhance quality of life. Given that a significant portion of Pakistan's population relies on agriculture for their livelihood, these improvements can have a profound economic and social impact. He was of the view that adopting the new technology for development was not just an option but a necessity for Pakistan. "By leveraging technological advancements, we can foster inclusive growth in all sectors especially in healthcare, improve public services, and enhance overall national development in every sphere of life". Meher Kashif Younis said fostering a robust tech-driven entrepreneurial ecosystem could stimulate job creation and innovation. Supporting startups and tech enterprises through favorable policies, incubation centers, and access to funding can position Pakistan as a hub for technological innovation in the region.-DNA

Solar projects reduce carbon footprint

ISLAMABAD: 270 MW soand a 200 MW hybrid plant near the Dhabeji Grid Station significantly contribute to the city's energy mix, promoting sustainability and reducing the carbon footprint. In February 2023 last year, three Gorges Group of China (CTGSAIL) and K-Electric signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) to collaborate in the development of about 1,000MW of renewable energy and hydropower projects across the country including Azad Jammu & Kashmir. Under the MoU, the two sides agreed to collaborate on exploring renewable energy including hydro projects across the country. Both companies planned to develop a roadmap for the installation of grid-scale Battery Energy Storage Systems into KE's network. A significant focus of the approved plan is the integration of renewable energy, Gwadar Pro reported on Wednesday. K-Electric (KE) has now secured approval from the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) for

gramme (PAP) for the period FY 2024-2028. KE aims to add 1,282 MW of renewable energy, including solar and wind projects, by 2030. This includes a notable 270 MW solar PV project in Karachi and a 200 MW hybrid plant near the Dhabeji Grid Station. These projects are expected to significantly contribute to the city's energy mix, promoting sustainability and reducing the carbon footprint. The recent approval from NE-PRA represents a pivotal development in KE's strategy to enhance the reliability and sustainability of power supply in Karachi. KE's submission of the PAP on March 20, 2023, outlined a comprehensive plan to ensure a stable power supply by integrating renewable energy, local fuel, and power off-take from the National Grid. This ambitious programme aligns with the NEPRA approved IGCEP 2022-2031, National Electricity Policy 2021 and the National Electricity Plan 2023-2027. Moonis Alvi, CEO of K-Electric, expressed his appreciation for NEPRA's decision, stating, "We welcome the decision by NE-PRA on our Power Acquisition Program, providing us a clear roadmap for the next 5

years. Integrating clean en-

ergy is vital to driving a sustainable energy ecosystem, balancing affordability with reliability." He said, "Over the past few months we have been garnering a great deal of global interest on our 640 MW renewable energy projects, which indicate the repute that KE enjoys as a brand. This decision enables us to invest in innovative, sustainable technologies, ultimately contributing to the betterment of Karachi and ensuring a brighter future for its residents." Additionally, the PAP includes capacity addition on local coal which will diversify the energy mix and reduce reliance on imported fuels. The PAP also details KE's agreements to import additional power from the National Grid which will also improve grid utilization, benefitting the regulated consumers as well as the sector at large. This approval marks a significant milestone for KE as it endeavors to meet the growing energy needs of Karachi while promoting sustainability through increased reliance on renewable energy sources. CAT upholds CCP penalty on M/s Irshad **Trading**

ISLAMABAD: The Competition Appellate Tribunal (CAT) decided to uphold PKR 5 million penalty imposed by CCP on M/s Irshad Trading Corporation for deceptive marketing practices. The penalty was imposed by CCP on Irshad Trading for fraudulently using its competitor, Polycon Pakistan (Pvt.) Limited's trademark, violating Section 10 of the Competition Act, 2010. Polycon lodged a formal complaint with the CCP, alleging that Irshad Trading Co. was unlawfully using its registered trademark and brand name to manufacture, market, and sell water storage tanks, and was also misrepresenting itself as a joint venture of Polycon. The CCP's enquiry committee established the violation of Section 10 by Irshad Trading. During the proceedings, Polycon confirmed that Irshad Trading had been its authorized distributor until September 2018, after which the distribution agreement was terminated. Despite the agreement's termination, Irshad Trading continued to manufacture, market, and sell products with Polycon's logo until February 2019. Irshad Trading stopped the practice after the CCP's show cause notice, but the unauthorized use had already harmed Polycon's business interests.

Elites pose the greatest threat to national integrity

ISLAMABAD: Murtaza Mughal, President of Pakistan Economy Watch (PEW), said on Thursday that the biggest threat to the country's integrity is not terrorism or climate change but ruthless elites. The elites have been loot ing the country's resourc es with both hands for decades and transferring capital out of the country, he said. He added that the elites responsible for the destruction of the economy pose the greatest obstacle to its recovery. In a statement issued here, Dr. Murtaza Mughal said that the economy would have fully recovered due to the pressure put on the people in the shape of utility prices and inflation. However, the limping economy still needs to recover due to the theft of a significant amount of public capital. Therefore, the situation is only slowly improving, resulting in frustration. He observed that the masses would continue to suffer due to the elite's unabated corruption, and the people's anger would continue to increase. Murtaza Mughal asserted that party workers had transformed nearly every department in the country into a recruitment center. Now, the politicians were bringing important departments under their control that were previously safe from their loot. He said that a complete ban on new recruitment is part of the solution to political interference in government departments. The federation should stop giving unnecessary funds to provinces that receive more than they need. It is an open secret that many provinces receive funds and later waste them. He said that the process of decorating the offices and houses of top officials and purchasing new vehicles should be stopped. Free housing, free electricity and gas, telephone, overseas treatment, foreign visits, and an army of staff should not be given to anyone. Infrastructure projects should be initiated through a public-private partnership. A voluntary pension scheme should be introduced, and national and provincial assembly members should not receive funds for development schemes that end up in the pockets of the corrupt. He noted that politicians who do not receive development funds will resort to other means to enrich themselves instead of using politics.

Confronting Terrorism: strategies for Pak in 2024

Ambassador Syed Abrar Hussain, a former envoy to Afghanistan, underscored the need for bilateral and regional diplomatic engagement with neighbouring countries to mitigate terrorist threats. He proposed a three-pronged strategy: direct action against terrorists, addressing root causes, and diplomatic engagement

ISLAMABAD: The Centre for Aerospace & Security Studies (CASS), Lahore, hosted a seminar titled "Confronting Terrorism: Strategies for Pakistan in 2024" on Thursday, 23 May 2024. The event focused on examining the multifaceted challenges posed by terrorism to Pakistan's national security and exploring effective strategies to combat this menace. In his introductory remarks Air Commodore Khalid Iqbal (Retd), Director at CASS Lahore, identified three streams of terrorism confronting Pakistan: anti-China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) disruptive assaults, sporadic activities of separatist terrorists, and ethno-sectarian clashes. The keynote speaker, Dr Syed Kaleem Imam, former Federal Secretary and former Inspector General of Police, spoke about mapping Pakistan's terrorism landscape and its impact on national security and development. He examined the origin, motivation, and impact of terrorism in the country, highlighting how it stems from both internal and external factors, including political, ideological, and religious motivations. Dr Muhammad Feyyaz, an academic on counterterrorism, spoke about the need for countering terrorism through combative measures.



He stated that terrorism is an enduring phenomenon, which requires a nuanced understanding through the identification of three interconnected factors: a rigid strategic mindset, a mismatch between the discourse surrounding terrorism and counterterrorism, and a lack of adequate attention to social sciences in analysing political violence. Ambassador Syed Abrar Hussain, a former envoy to Afghanistan, under-

scored the need for bilateral and regional diplomatic engagement with neighbouring countries to mitigate terrorist threats. He proposed a three-pronged strategy: direct action against terrorists, addressing root causes, and diplomatic engagement. In his concluding remarks, Air Marshal Asim Suleiman (Retd), President, CASS Lahore, stated that terrorism continues to impede

decades of efforts to counter it. He noted that the recent surge in terrorist attacks has affected both civilians and security personnel, besides fuelling sectarian strife. He said that external threats from hostile neighbouring states complicate the situation. The President stressed the need for a comprehensive strategy focused on national unity and proactive engagement with allies, alongside diplomatic efforts to prevent regional territories from becoming sanctuaries for terrorists. The seminar highlighted the need for national harmony, unwavering resolve and ironclad political will for the across-the-board implementation of the rule of law to choke the terrorists financially and logistically. It was urged that flawless border management be ensured and informal monetary transactions be stopped.

Another 92 meters disconnected

ISLAMABAD: Sui Northern Gas Pipelines Limited (SNGPL) has disconnected another 92 connections, during its ongoing crackdown against gas pilferers in Punjab, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Islamabad, and imposed Rs 2 million fine. According to a spokesman of the SNGPL, in Lahore and Sheikhupura, the regional teams disconnected 45 connections on illegal use of gas and imposed fine of Rs 960000 against gas pilferers. In Multan and Bahawalpur, 12 connections were disconnected on illegal use while in Faisalabad and Gujrat, 3 connections were disconnected. In Peshawar the company disconnected 32 connections on account of direct use of gas and illegal use of gas and amount of Rs 0.5 million have been booked against gas theft cases.-APP

Randhawa directs to resolve traffic jam issue

ISLAMABAD: Chairman of the Capital Development Authority (CDA), Muhammad Ali Randhawa, on Thursday directed the Member Engineering to develop a plan for addressing the traffic congestion at PTCL Chowk. During his visit to PTCL Chowk on Jinnah Avenue, Muhammad Ali emphasized the need for immediate short-term and long-term plans to resolve the traffic issues at this intersection. "A plan for a permanent solution should be prepared and submitted for approval to the relevant forum as soon as possible," he stated. He further instructed that work on the plan should commence immediately after its approval. The Chairman highlighted that new public interest projects will be initiated alongside the completion of ongoing projects in the federal capital. He underscored the urgency of the situation, noting that citizens are facing significant distress due to traffic jams at PTCL Chowk, and stressed that work on the project should begin on a priority basis.-APP

CDA anti-encroachment drive lauded

ISLAMABAD: Shahid Rasheed Butt. the former president of the Islamabad Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ICCI), stated on Thursday that the business community supports the Capital Development Authority's (CDA) anti-encroachment drive. He added that this drive will help clean up encroachments in markets and residential areas, relieving the people living in Islamabad. In a statement issued here today, Shahid Rasheed Butt said that anti-encroachment operations are being conducted across the city on the instructions of the Chairman, CDA so that the city could be kept free from illegal constructions and encroachments. The district administration and Islamabad police must fully support the Enforcement Directorate in these operations while commoners should extend full cooperation, he said. . This operation must be conducted throughout the city, demolishing several encroachments and illegal constructions and retrieving government land worth billions of rupees. He said that removing fruit and vegetables stalls and clearing both sides of the roads are necessary to clear traffic flow of disruption. This is a questionable move, as businesses cannot depend on the government's electricity supply, which is unreliable at best. The CDA has asked all such businesses to remove the generators without realizing that these electricity generators are not hindering traffic or pedestrians.-APP

'Israel' never had the right to exist

TATES have no intrinsic right to exist. Neither the Austro-Hungarian Empire, Senegambia, Czechoslovakia, nor the current Kingdom of Spain has the right to exist. The existence of states is only a fragile condition of possibility depending on the presumed consensus of the inhabitants of the territory. However, in the case of political organizations imposed through violence by foreigners, it is an obligation to confront them to their demise; whether it is a puppet regime built during a war (Manchukuo, Vichy regime) or an entity created by the invasion of settlers against native populations (Rhodesia, Cochinchina, Bechuanaland, South Africa with apartheid, or "Israel"). It is immediately gripped by decades of false axioms and propaganda from the West to sustain its colony in Palestine. Sunak's summer UK election gamble

K Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's political track record is one of a cautious, conservative leader. Yet on Wednesday he took an extraordinary gamble, calling a July 4 general election he is likely to lose, potentially very badly. This will be the United Kingdom's first July national election since 1945. That year was a very poor one for the Conservatives with wartime leader Winston Churchill losing by a landslide to Labour. Recent polls indicate that the Labour Party, more than 20 percentage points ahead, will win a significant majority in the House of Commons. According to the most recent Electoral Calculus forecast, based on these opinion surveys, the probability of a Labour majority is 98 per cent. Meanwhile, the likelihood of Labour being the largest party is 100 per cent. This offers an outside possibility that Labour might win a majority comparable to 1945, or its last landslide year in 1997. To be sure, polls may tighten in the coming weeks, but the direction of travel appears clear towards Labour being the largest party again in the House of Commons. However, Sunak - a former US green card holder - seems to believe July 4 (Independence Day in the United States) might be a lucky day that will allow him to defy the polls. His announcement on Wednesday is based on his belief that, bad as the political landscape looks now for the Conservatives, it could be even worse in the autumn.

First, UK inflation has fallen from double digits last year to 2.3 per cent, near the Bank of England's 2 per cent target, and the lowest level in around three years. Second, after a series of tax cuts in recent budgets, it is unlikely that the UK public purse can stretch any further in an autumn fiscal event. At the same time, Sunak might have feared that if he delayed the election till the autumn or winter, several adverse developments could occur. His flagship Rwanda policy, which aimed to send asylum seekers to that African nation, might be frustrated by legal delays. Also, the migration challenges his government faces from small boats crossing the English Channel may intensify during the summer. Thirdly, Sunak remains worried by the political challenge to the right of the Conservatives from the populist Reform UK party. He might have been especially fearful that, if he waited beyond the summer to call the election, there would be an increasing possibility that Nigel Farage, who helped lead the Leave campaign during the 2016 Brexit referendum, would head the Reform campaign. Understanding the complexities behind their intervention necessitates a nuanced appreciation of the evolving landscape in both the Middle East and South Asia. Firstly, the Gulf states have strategic interests in fostering stability in South Asia, given its proximity to nergy-rich region they inhabit. Instability in the Indian subcontinent could have ripple effects on global energy markets, which the Gulf economies heavily rely on. Additionally, Saudi Arabia and the UAE seek to position themselves as key players in regional diplomacy, enhancing their geopolitical stature and influence on the world stage. Furthermore, both countries have historical ties with Pakistan, shaped by shared religious affiliations and longstanding economic partnerships. However, they also maintain significant relations with India, the world's largest democracy and a crucial trading partner. By advocating for peace between Islamabad and New Delhi, Saudi Arabia and the UAE aim to navigate a delicate balancing act, maintaining cordial relations with both countries while promoting regional stability. Moreover, the Gulf States' involvement in mediating the India-Pakistan conflict reflects a broader trend of increased diplomatic activism in the region. As traditional power dynamics undergo shifts and new geopolitical fault lines emerge, Saudi Arabia and the UAE are seeking to assert themselves as key arbiters of peace and stability, not only within the Middle East but also in neighboring regions.

The relationship between Pakistan and Saudi Arabia extends beyond economics to encompass strategic and security dimensions. Pakistan played a pivotal role in training "holy warriors" alongside Saudi Arabia and the US to combat the Soviet Union's presence in Afghanistan following its occupation in 1979. Furthermore, during the Iran-Iraq war in the 1980s, Pakistan stationed tens of thousands of troops in Saudi Arabia. Military collaboration, including training and arms exports, has been a consistent feature of Pakistan's engagement with Saudi Arabia and the UAE. Additionally, Pakistan, along with Saudi Arabia and the UAE, supported the rise of the Taliban in Afghanistan during the early 1990s, perceiving it as a buffer against India. This stance contrasted with India and Iran's backing of the multi-ethnic Northern Alliance, reflecting broader regional power dynamics. Despite its close ties with Saudi Arabia and the UAE, Pakistan also seeks to maintain relations with Iran, mindful of its significant Shi'a minority. Iran was the first country to recognize Pakistan's independence, and both nations enjoyed closer security cooperation during the reign of the shah, particularly through their involvement in the Baghdad Pact. However, the 1979 Iranian revolution altered the geopolitical landscape, fracturing alliances and cing Pakistan to navigate a divided by the rivalry between Iran and Saudi Arabia. Pakistan found itself embroiled in a sectarian proxy war, exacerbated by the rise of Sunni militant groups nurtured by Saudi and American support for the Afghan jihad. Consequently, sectarian tensions have become entrenched within Pakistan, posing challenges to its internal stability.

In recent years, Pakistan has made concerted efforts to strengthen its ties with Iran, albeit hindered by American sanctions on Iran and concerns regarding cross-border militancy. The prospect of being drawn into Saudi-Iranian proxy conflicts has further complicated Pakistan's diplomatic stance, notably demonstrated by its 2015 parliamentary decision against joining the Saudi-led coalition aimed at combating the Iranian-backed Houthi rebels in Yemen and reinstating Yemen's internationally recognized government. This neutrality in Yemen's conflict was a difficult choice for Pakistan, given its historically strong relationship with Saudi Arabia, which has provided crucial diplomatic and financial support, particularly during times of international isolation following Pakistan's nuclearization in response to India's tests in 1998. Former Prime Minister Imran Khan's efforts to foster alliances with Muslim-majority countries such as Qatar, Turkey, and Malaysia have strained Pakistan's ties with traditional Gulf allies, particularly Saudi Arabia and the UAE. These tensions have inadvertently allowed India to enhance its trade and security relations with the Gulf states. While India's engagement with the Gulf historically revolved around energy imports and labor exports, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has sought to deepen bilateral ties, both economically and strategically, with countries like Saudi Arabia, the UAE, and Iran. Pakistan, recognizing the shifting dynamics, has attempted to mitigate strains with its traditional Gulf partners. For instance, former Army chief Gen. Raheel Sharif assumed leadership of the Islamic Military Counter Terrorism Coalition, comprising 42 nations, in 2017. However, Prime Minister Khan's decision to forgo participation in

the alternative Muslim Summit in Malaysia in 2019, seen

tensions. Meanwhile, India's growing clout in the region was underscored by the UAE's decision to confer its highest civil honor on Prime Minister Modi, even amidst controversy over India's Citizenship Amendment Act, which discriminates against Muslim refugees. Despite Pakistan's pleas, Saudi Arabia and the UAE have refrained from openly opposing India's actions, including the revocation of Kashmir's special status in 2019. However, the fluidity of bilateral relations in the region suggests that these dynamics are subject to change. The interplay between major Middle Eastern powers and South Asian states, particularly India and Pakistan, is increasingly influenced by broader strategic considerations amidst the emerging great power competition between China and the United States. As such, the geopolitical landscape in the Middle East and South Asia remains in flux, with implications for regional stability and global power dynamics.

The intensifying rivalry between China and the United States in the Middle East and South Asia has significantly heightened regional insecurities while simultaneously resenting unforeseen opportunities for reconciliation. As China seeks to challenge American dominance in the Middle East, India, too, endeavors to expand its influence to counterbalance China's growing presence in the region. India's collaboration with Iran, exemplified by its investment ahar seaport, to China's investment in Gwadar via the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor. Conversely, China's substantial investment plans in Iran signal its ambition to deepen ties in the region, further solidifying its status as Iran's largest trade partner and facilitating Iran's integration into influential regional blocs. Despite Pakistan's aspirations to mediate between Iran and Saudi Arabia, China achieved a significant breakthrough by brokering the restoration of diplomatic ties between the two Middle Eastern rivals.

While the US appears open to increased Saudi and UAE investments in Pakistan, it is concerned about Islamabad's growing reliance on Beijing. With the US bolstering military cooperation with India to counter China, its neutrality in potential Indo-Pakistani crises is increasingly questioned. Consequently, the US may encourage regional actors with influence over both India and Pakistan to establish crisis management mechanisms to prevent cross-border escalation. Secret talks facilitated by the UAE between Indian and Pakistani intelligence officials, along with Saudi statements advocating dialogue on the Kashmir dispute, suggest a regional push for conflict resolution. While Indian media views such statements as endorsing its stance against third-party involvement in Kashmir, Pakistan interprets them as a show of solidarity against India's reluctance to engage in Kashmir talks. Despite diplomatic overtures, challenges persist, including India's upcoming elections and the delicate security situation in Kashmir. Despite the potential benefits of reconciliation for India and Pakistan, the current political climate may not favor immediate rapprochement. India's domestic politics and security concerns, coupled with ongoing tensions in Kashmir, present obstacles to meaningful dialogue. However, incremental confidence-building measures and continued international encouragement, particularly from Saudi Arabia, the UAE, and the US, could pave the way for constructive engagement between India and Pakistan, reducing Pakistan's dependence on China and fostering regional stability and cooperation.

Raisi's unfortunate death will not alter Iran's foreign policy on 'Israel'

BRAHIM Raisi, the spiritual ideologue and President of Iran died in a shocking helicopter crash in the East Azerbaijan province. His death came alongside the demise of his cohorts, guards, and Foreign Minister, Hossein Amir-Abdollahian, which resulted in a massive outpouring of grief in Iran and condolences pouring in from every nook and corner of the world. Flags in certain countries were flown at half-mast with domestic and international reflections on his legacy taking center stage in international coverage. Yet despite the gravity of Iran's loss, Tehran's foreign policy and outlook towards the world and the Middle East, will not change. In fact, Raisi's legacy is set to continue.

The reasons are obvious. Contrary to unfounded speculation in the West, EbrahimRaisi's legacy is deeply entrenched in the political system of Iran where there is unanimity of purpose on subjects such as "Israel's" barbaric genocide in Gaza. Iran is also not a totalitarian regime where the death of a key figurehead, particularly one close to spiritual leader Ayatollah Khomeini, results in regime change or a breakdown of the social contract between the country's population and their rulers. In fact, the upcoming race in the 2024 elections in less than 50 days is about candidates vying for closeness to the spiritual leader, not ideological clashes which have plagued other countries, particularly in the Western world. EbrahimRaisi's successor is also current President and former Vice President. Mohammad Mokhber who is known for supporting Iran's ideological leanings, particularly when it comes to supporting Russia against an aggressive Ukraine.

Mohammad Mokhber's caretaker role though, will be followed by another President who will continue to pursue the agenda of the Iranian establishment which constitutes the Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Khomeini, the Guardian Council, the Council of Experts, and the Revolutionary Guard Corp. The establishment is solely geared towards ensuring that a peaceful Middle East materializes with an independent Palestine in the absence of aggression and nefarious designs from genocidal regimes such as "Israel" who are responsible for displacement, deaths and destruction in Gaza. There will hence, be no letup in Iran's unequivocal support for the Palestinian cause nor will there be any softening of tone with regard to suspicions of American influence in the region, which according to Tehran, run counter to peace and prosperity in the region. In fact, the post-Raisi era will ensure that Iran's decision-making continues as an Islamic theocracy, not an authoritarian state. In principle, a theocracy combines religious injunctions with consultative decision-making, allowing for unanimity in approach towards matters of national importance, particularly foreign affairs. This is precisely why and much to the chagrin of "Israel", rapprochement with Saudi Arabia brokered by China with Raisi at the helm of affairs is set to continue as well as greater economic and military engagement between Iran, China, and Russia. For "Israel", these are troubling times. On the genocidal regime, the policy is clear. The Zionist regime must seize its proclivity for war crimes against innocent Palestinians or risk being attacked either by Hamas or by Tehran itself. This stance is evident with Hamas mourning Raisi's death as a great loss for its resistance movement and Houthi rebels in Yemen equating his demise as a great loss for the Islamic world, Gaza, and Palestine.

Another key component of Iran's foreign policy is its outlook towards regional nuclear non-proliferation which it maintains is being degraded due to "Israel's" clandestine nuclear weapons program through enrichment activities at the Shimon Peres Negev Nuclear Research Center in the city of Dimona, Also, Iran's distrust of the 2015 ICPOA nuclear deal is anchored in the rise of populism in the United States under the Presidency of Donald Trump who uprooted years of sensible, strategic, and visionary diplomacy between the Western world and Tehran. This lays to rest speculations on whether Iran would alter its stance on domestic nuclear enrichment in the post-Raisi era given that national nuclear policy is set by the Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Khomeini, and the Supreme National Security Council, not the president. The establishment's stance indicates that hostility towards "Israel's" opaque program which is spurring Iran's legitimate right to domestic nuclear enrichment will continue. The scrapping of the 2015 nuclear deal due to American recklessness also entails that Tehran will enhance its enrichment activities in the face of Western criticism and lead domestic discussions on whether religious injunctions forbid the development of nuclear weapons altogether. The message is clear- if "Israel" develops nuclear weapons in an opaque manner, Iran will respond with its own enrichment activities over nuclear proliferation concerns. For Iran, it's a matter of deterrence and compulsion, not aggression. In terms of resistance movements in the Middle East, support for Hezbollah will continue as the group is considered a legitimate political movement rather than a terrorist organization as erroneously characterized by the Zionist genocidal regime. The legacy of Raisi's Foreign Minister, Abdollahian which is based on closeness with the IRGC, outreach to the Gulf states and managing relationships with figures such as Hassan Nasrallah will also continue. Again, this indicates that Iran's proclivity for regional deterrence against "Israel" barbarism is set in stone. For "Israel", these are disturbing times. The hurried reaction of denial from Tel Aviv to Raisi's death is an indication that the Netanyahu regime is in insecure waters amid rising domestic and international discontent over his genocide. Had he been alive, Raisi would have also welcomed the ICC's Prosecutor General's decision to pursue arrest warrants against Netanvahu and his cohorts which is consistent with the Iranian establishment's stance. What is clear is that the foreign policy of Iran is anchored in its establishment, not individuals. Raisi however, was the personification of Tehran's foreign policy which is stridently against "Israel" and pursues the Palestinian cause with utmost dedication.

Pakistan narrowly averted default last summer, and its \$350 billion economy has stabilised after the completion of the last IMF programme, with inflation coming down to around 17% in April from a record high 38% last May. It is still dealing with a high fiscal shortfall and while it has controlled its external account deficit through import control mechanisms, it has come at the expense of stagnating growth, which is expected to be around 2% this year compared to negative growth last year. Pakistan is seeking at least \$6 billion and request additional financing from the Washington-based lender under the Resilience and Sustainability Trust.

Djokovic secures victory on birthday to advance at Geneva

The 24-time Grand Slam champion, is participating in the ATP 250 tournament in Switzerland for the first time

GENEVA: Novak Djokovic clinched a victory on his 37th birthday as he defeated Germany's Yannick Hanfmann in a rain-interrupted match to advance into the quarter-finals of the Geneva Open. Diokovic, a 24-time Grand Slam champion, is participating in the ATP 250 tournament in Switzerland for the first time as part of his preparations for the French Open and secured a 6-3 6-3 win. This places him as only the third player - following Jimmy Connors and Roger Federer - to reach 1,100 wins on the ATP Tour. Following the match, the crowd sang 'Happy Birthday' to Djokovic and he was also presented with a chocolate birthday cake by tournament officials. My birthday wouldn't have been the same

if I had not won the match," said Djokovic. "I'm very grateful for all the people that came out to support me and thank you for the birthday song, that was very special for



me." The top-ranked player in the world has not yet made it to a final in 2024 and will next encounter either Canada's Denis

Shapovalov or Dutch sixth seed TallonGriekspoor. In the first round, Hanfmann secured a 7-5 6-2 victory against Britain's Andy Mur-

ray, who was competing in his first ATP Tour-level match since sustaining ankle ligament damage at the Miami Open in March. However, the 32-year-old German, ranked 85th in the world, had his serve broken by Diokovic in the sixth game and then failed to convert two break-point opportunities soon after. With Djokovic serving for the set at 5-3, Hanfmann missed four break points before the match was paused at deuce in the ninth game, marking the beginning of a rain delay lasting more than an hour.

When play resumed, Djokovic swiftly secured the set, although Hanfmann subsequently broke his serve at the beginning of the second set, taking a 3-0 lead. He had an opportunity to secure a double break but failed to capitalise on it, as Djokovic managed to level the match in the following game, assisted by a superbly executed sliced drop shot that Hanfmann couldn't retrieve. Djokovic, bolstered by two superb cross-court winners in the ninth game, went on to win six consecutive games to clinch the victory.

Bayer Leverkusen coach Xabi Alonso was happy for his side's European record unbeaten run but will try to use the pain of Wednesday's Europa League final defeat to motivate them for another final in three days time.

TEHRAN: The Chief of Staff of Iran has given an eye witness account of the crash. The chief of staff was present in the 3rd helicopter. He said, "After our noon prayers, we departed towards the direction of Tabriz. The weather was clear, there was no weather condition to be worried about. After half an hour being in the air, prior to reaching the Sungun copper mine, there was a small patch of clouds; interviewer asks: "So there was no fog?" He replied, not at all. There was fog on the ground, but not in up the air where we were advancing with the helicopters. However in one small compacted area, there was a

small patch of clouds above a cliff. In terms of height, this cloud was on the same height as our flight's height. It was there when the now-martyred helicopter pilot, who was also the commander of the fleet, that told the rest of the pilots to ascend above the clouds. We were the 3rd pilot, behind the president's helicopter. We came above the clouds, we advanced for approximately 30 seconds. Our pilot suddenly realised that the main helicopter carrying the president is missing. Interviewer asks: "You didn't see the helicopter anymore after ascending?" He replied, yes exactly, after ascending above the clouds, we didn't see the main helicopter. The ascension itself didn't feel difficult or hard. Sometimes, when we use the plane we feel turbulence but we didn't feel anything at all inside the helicopter this time, when ascending. And after we ascended there were no other clouds. Interviewer asks: "So beyond this, there were no weather forecasts mentioning any disturbances in the weather to make it unsafe?" He replied, no there wasn't any. Shortly after, we were able to see beneath us and there were no clouds anymore and we had reached the area of the copper mine. We realised however that our pilot is making an U-turn suddenly so I asked him why? He said that one of our helicopters is missing. We estimate that they made an emergency landing, because we also have no radio contact with it anymore. So I asked him when was the last

time contact was made? The pilot answered: "A minute and 30 seconds ago, when the pilot told us to ascend above the clouds.' Our pilot circled around the area a couple of times, but the area with the cloud patch was also invisible to us and it was too risky to enter that area. We failed several times to make any radio contact. We were forced to make a landing after 30 seconds at the Sungun copper mine to investigate. During the flight, we had continuous cell phone calls with the passengers, including the bodyguard, Mr. Abdollahian, the governor of East-Azerbaijan and the Friday imam of Tabriz. However we tried calling all of them without luck. After some tries, calling the cellphone of

the captain accompanying the president, someone picked the phone. It was Ayatollah Hashem, the friday imam of Tabriz. He told us that I'm not feeling well. He didn't tell us anything special. I asked him what exactly has happened? He told us that he didn't know what has happened, when asked on his whereabouts, he said that he didn't know. He only described what he could see, described to us what he saw, e.g. surrounded by trees. I asked him about the condition of the others, the Ayatollah replied that he's alone and couldn't see anyone else and he's alone. Armed bandits kill around 20 in Niger

NIAMEY, NIGER: Armed bandits killed around 20 people in a village in Niger's restive Tillaberi region earlier this week, public radio reported on Wednesday. The news came a day after the defence ministry said suspected Militants had killed seven soldiers in the region plagued for years by rebels linked to Al-Qaeda and the Islamic State group. "The Tillaberi region... was plunged into mourning following an attack perpetrated by armed bandits on Monday May 20, 2024" on the village of Djambala, La Voix du Sahel radio station said. Will CM Punjab be able to implement merit and rules in the forest dept?

he forest department in Punjab has long been plagued by political pressure, leading to the inappropriate posting and transfers of forest officers. Influential officers often use their Political connections to secure postings in their preferred areas, where they remain for extended periods regardless of their performance or the needs of the department. This phenomenon is particularly evident in cities like Lahore and Rawalpindi, where officers such as Chief Conservator Rawalpindi Sheikh Saqib and Con-Rawalpindi servator Abid Gondal have held positions for decades. One of the key issues highlighted in the case of Punjab's forest management is the lack of adherence to tenure rules.

According to regulations,

In Punjab, individuals like Sheikh Saqib and Abid Gondal exert significant influence over decision-making processes. Their long tenures in favored areas not only perpetuate inefficiencies but also undermine the merit-based system of promotions and transfers. The consequences of political interference in forest management extend bevond administrative inefficiencies. The misallocation of resources and the neglect of certain regions can have profound environmental implications, including deforestation, habitat loss, and biodiversity decline. of accountability and transparency in decision-making processes undermines public trust and participation in con-

servation efforts. Addressing the systemic issues within Punjab's forest department requires comprehensive reforms that prioritize meritoc-

racy, transparency, and environmental sustainability. Chief Minister Punjab Maryam Nawaz has a critical role to play in initiating these reforms and resisting political pressure in the appointment and transfer of forest officers. A full shuffling of officers based on merit rather than political considerations is essential to revitalizing the department and safe-

Objective criteria, such as performance evaluations, expertise, and the needs of different regions, should guide decision-making processes. Regular rotations of officers between regions should be enforced to prevent the development of vested interests and to promote cross-regional learning and collaboration. The use of technology, such as Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and remote sensing, can improve monitoring and enforcement efforts, reducing the incidence of illegal logging and encroachment.The degradation of forest resources in Punjab, Pakistan, due to political interference in forest management poses a significant threat to environmental sustainability and public welfare. Addressing this challenge requires bold reforms that prioritize meritocracy, transparency, and accountability within the forest department. By implementing merit-based transfers, promoting environmental governance, and investing in capacity building, Punjab can pave the way for sustainable forest management practices that benefit both present and future generations. Minister Maryam Aurangzeb suspended the forest officers of South Zone on a complaint. But why it is still hidden from his eyes that the influential forest officers are posted in the same area for decades.

The former South Carolina governor, 52, abandoned her White House ambitions in March after suffering several heavy defeats in primary contests - and had not previously indicated whether she would support the man who referred to her repeatedly as "birdbrain." Despite having made withering criticism of the scandal-plagued ex-president, Haley said at an event for the Washington-based Hudson Institute, a conservative think tank, that she was urging Trump to make nice with her support base. "Trump would be smart to reach out to the millions of people who voted for me and continue to support me and not assume that they're just going to be with him. And I genuinely hope he does that," she said. More than two months after ending her White House campaign, Haley has continued to scoop a significant chunk of votes in presidential primary contests - underlining a persistent refusal among a sizable bloc of Republicans to get behind Trump. "I put my priorities on a president who's going to have the backs of our allies and hold our enemies to account, who would secure the border - no more excuses - a president who would support capitalism and freedom, a president who understands we need less debt, not more debt," she said. "Trump hasn't been perfect on these policies. I've made that clear, many, many times. But Biden has been a catastrophe. So I will be voting for Trump. Trump and Haley traded at times vicious barbs during the state-by-state nominating contests, when the former UN ambassador warned that nominating her one-time boss would spell general election defeat for Republicans. She said a majority of voters were opposed to a rematch between "chaos" candidate Trump and Biden, two men aged 77 and 81 respectively who she said were past their prime. "He's getting meaner and more offensive by the day," Haley said ahead of a defeat in her home state of South Carolina in February. "He's completely distracted, and everything is about him. He's so obsessed with his demons in the past that he can't focus on the future Americans deserve," she told supporters. Haley criticized Trump's comments attacking NATO nations and referred repeatedly to the many court appearances he has been making as he faces multiple criminal indictments and lawsuits. "It's not normal to spend \$50 million dollars in campaign contributions on personal court cases," Haley said. "It's not normal to threaten people who back your opponent, and it's not normal to call on Russia to invade NATO countries." Trump returned the compliment by categorically ruling her out of contention to be his running mate. Trump has failed to make inroads with Haley's moderate backers, and will see her public show of support as a huge boon ahead of the Republican nominating convention in July. The tenacity of the Haley vote long after she quit the race for the Republican presidential nomination prompted US media to refer to her ongoing presence on the primary stage as a "zombie campaign." The primaries laid bare Trump's key shortcoming - his lack of appeal among the moderates, independents and voters with college degrees he will need to prevail against Biden. Meanwhile the Biden campaign had been reaching across the aisle, hoping to attract Haley voters. It released a TV spot in April targeting suburban battlegrounds with the message: "If you voted for Nikki Haley, Donald Trump doesn't want your vote."-DNA

Sunak, **Starmer hit** campaign

LONDON: British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak and his rival, Labour Party leader Keir Starmer, kicked off their election campaigns on Thursday, each arguing that only they can snap the country out of its economic and political malaise.

Sunak, whose Conservative Party has trailed Labour by around 20 percentage points in opinion polls since he became PM in October 2022, shocked and angered many in his party when he gambled on a July 4 election, calling it months earlier than expected.

He argued on Thursday that the economy was turning a corner and he had a plan to tackle illegal immigration. But with prices in the shops up 21 per cent in the last three years and the national health service buckling under record waiting times, it may be hard to persuade voters that Britain is on the right track. Sunak also admitted the first flights sending illegal migrants to Rwanda, a flagship policy, would not take off before the election. Legal challenges are already lined up. The former investment banker announced his decision in the pouring rain in Downing Street on Wednesday, having to shout over protesters blaring the song "Things Can Only Get Better" - an anthem associated with Labour's crushing 1997 election victory under Tony Blair that ended the last long period of Conservative rule. - Agencies

BHC disposes of treason petition against Imran

QUETTA: The Balochistan Court (BHC) on Thursday disposed of a petition seeking high treaproceedings against PTI founder Imran Khan. BHC's two-member bench comprising Chief Justice Hashim Khan Kakar and ShaukatRakhshani Justice announced the ruling on the petition filed by Advocate Amanullah, alleging the former prime minister of dissolving the National Assembly unconstitutionally.

The petitioner had pleaded the court to start proceedings against Khan under Article 6 of the Constitution. During the hearing, the PTI founder's lawyer raised objections over the jurisdic tion of the high court, arguing that the case did not fall under the BHC jurisdiction. The high court later declared the petition non maintainable after accepting the arguments presented by defence lawyer over jurisdiction matter.

Aleema Khan to continue 'fight for justice'

RAWALPINDI: Aleema Khan, the sister of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan, has said her fight for justice will go on. Talking to the media at the high court, she said she came to hear good news but the prosecutor started reading the 'entire booklet, he prepared to delay the decision'. "We came to hear good news. We went to the courtroom but to no avail. The govern ment lawyer started reading the entire booklet," she said. She added: "The prosecutor prepared a book for Justice Amir Farooq's reply. "I think we have heard 10 per cent of the book today. She called Rauf Hasan attack a murder attempt and cited the PTI founder as saying 'enough is enough.' She called upon authorities to bring to book the attackers.

Israel occupation forces launch deadly Gaza strikes

Top UN court to rule today on South Africa Gaza ceasefire bid

GAZA: Israel launched devastating air strikes on Gaza early Thursday while also saying it is ready to resume stalled talks on a truce and hostage release deal with Hamas to pause the war raging since October 7. The Gaza Strip's civil defense agency said two pre-dawn air strikes had killed 26 people, including 15 children, in Gaza City alone. Agency spokesman Mahmud Bassal said one strike hit a family house, killing 16 people, in the Al-Daraj area, and another killed 10 people inside a mosque compound. There was no immediate comment from the Israeli military.

Fierce street battles also raged in Gaza's Jabalia and Rafah where the armed wings of Hamas and its ally Islamic Jihad said they had fired mortar barrages at Israeli troops. International pressure for a ceasefire has mounted on Israel and its Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu as three European countries said Wednesday they would recognize a Palestinian state.

The week started with the International Criminal Court's prosecutor seeking arrest warrants on war crimes charges against Netanyahu and his defense minister as well as three Hamas leaders. Israel has angrily rejected those moves, voicing "disgust" over the ICC request and labelling any recognition of Palestinian statehood a "reward for terrorism." But domestic pressure has also Resistance front officials convene in Tehran

TEHRAN: The representatives of the region's anti-Israeli resistance groups held a meeting in Tehran, attended by senior commanders of the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC). A number of officials representing the resistance groups assembled in Tehran on the sidelines of a formal ceremony held to pay tribute to late Iranian President EbrahimRaisi and his entourage, who died in a helicopter crash on May 19. The high-profile gathering of resistance groups was participated by IRGC Commander Major General Hossein Salami and Commander of the IRGC Quds Force Brigadier General EsmaeilQaani. Tasnim has obtained information about the topics discussed in the meeting, which revolved around the latest political, social and military developments in Gaza, the Al-Aqsa Storm operation against the Israeli regime, and the role of the resistance front in the region. The attendees at the meeting emphasized the need for the continuation of the fight and struggle until the Palestinian resistance's complete and ultimate victory in the Gaza Strip with the participation of all resistance groups and fronts across the region. A host of foreign heads of state and authorities traveled to Iran on Wednesday to pay tribute to President Raisi and his entourage. A helicopter carrying President Raisi and seven others crashed in northwestern mountainous forests of Iran on May 19. The tragedy killed President Raisi, Foreign Minister Hossein Amirabdollahian, Friday prayers leader of Tabriz Ayatollah Mohammad Ali Al-e-Hashem, Governor of East AzarbaijanMalek Rahmati, the commander of the president's security team, two pilots and a flight crew. - Agencies

The three-minute clip, taken from a militant's body camera footage, was released by the Hostage and Missing Families Forum on Wednesday after the Israeli army lifted censorship on it. As the US-backed Israeli genocidal war on the Gaza Strip artillery strikes continued to pound and target different areas and massacre more civilians, especially in northern Gaza.

Reporters for the Palestinian Information Center (PIC) said that the Israeli occupation army continued to bomb homes in different areas of Gaza during the past 24 hours, amid ongoing attacks in Rafah and Jabalia. According to media sources, Diaa al-Din ash-Sharfa, deputy chief of the national security forces in Gaza, was martyred in an Israeli aerial attack in al-Saraya area in Gaza City. Four other officers, who were with him, also suffered injuries.

Three civilians were injured, one seriously, when the Israeli army bombed displaced families in the Ghazi ash-Shawa School in Beit Hanoun, north of Gaza. Israeli gunboats also opened machinegun fire at fishermen off the shores of al-Qarara area, northwest of Khan Yunis, injuring two of them. 10 civilians were martyred, including a mother and five children, and many others were injured when the Israeli army bombed a mosque and a religious school sheltering families in al-Daraj neighborhood in Gaza City. 16 other civilians were massacred, including 10 children, when a five-story house was reduced to rubble in an Israeli airstrike in al-Daraj neighborhood in Gaza City. A warplane also bombed an apartment near the Yarmouk soccer arena in Gaza City, killing and injuring a number of people.

COAS Asim meets civil, military leadership in Germany visit

RAWALPINDI: Chief of Army Staff (COAS) General Syed AsimMunir has held meetings with civil-military leadership while paying a visit to Germany, Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said Thursday. During the visit, he was received at the Federal Ministry of Defence by General Carsten Breuer, chief of defence, where he was presented with the guard of honour by the contingent of German Armed Forces. During the meetings with the civilian and military leadership, matters of mutual interest came under discussion. The German leadership acknowledged the Pakistan Army's role in the fight against terrorism and in maintaining peace and stability in the region. Beijing launches military drills encircling Chinese Taipei

The drills are the first substantive response from China to swearing-in of Taiwan President Lai Ching-te on Monday, after he won the election in January

BEIJING: Beijing has launched a two-day military drill in the waters and airspace around the self-governing island of Chinese Taipei, as "punishment" for what it called the "separatist acts" of holding an election and inaugurating a new president. The Chinese state-run Xinhua news agency reported that the Eastern Theater Command of the People's Liberation Army (PLA) started the drills on Thursday early morning in the Taiwan Strait, the north, south and east of the self-ruled island, as well as areas around the islands of Kinmen, Matsu, Wuqiu and Dongyin. The drills are the first substantive response from China to

swearing-in of Taiwan President Lai Ching-te on Monday, after he won the election in January. Both Lai and his predecessor, Tsai Ing-wen, are from the pro-sovereignty Democratic Progressive party (DPP), which Beijing considers to be separatists. In Lai's first address to the public after taking his oath, he said that "the Republic of China, Taiwan, is a sovereign and independent nation with sovereignty resting in the people" and stressed that his government would make no concessions on its democracy and freedoms. Dozens of fighter jets armed with live missiles were part of the mock strikes, code-named Joint Sword-2024A that targeted high-value military assets, such as ships and warplanes, Chinese military Eastern Theater Command spokesperson Naval Colonel Li Xi told CCTV. Li called the drills a "strong punishment" for "separatist acts," adding that the exercises are "a stern warning against the interference and provocation by external forces," Xinhua reported. China's military said its drills focus on joint sea-air combat-readiness patrols, precision strikes on key targets, and integrated operations inside and outside the island to test the "joint real combat capabilities" of its forces. On the other hand, the Ministry of Defense in the self-ruled island has condemned China's military exercises around the self-ruled island, adding that Taipei has dispatched naval, air, and ground forces to "defend the [island's] sovereignty." The ministry said it had placed its military on "high alert" in response to China's drills, which it described as "irrational provocations and actions that disrupt regional peace and stability.'

Moreover, China's Taiwan Affairs Office (TAO) issued a statement on Wednesday, firmly stating its stance against any form of "Taiwan independence' separatist activities" and vowed to take action against the DPP authorities for collaborating with external forces in their pursuit of independence. China has stepped up military activities around the island ever since Tsai Ing-wen was elected for her first term as president in 2016. It has often taken more aggressive measures during meetings between Taiwanese officials and US politicians, a crucial ally of Taiwan, and initiated an unprecedented set of military exercises after a visit by former US House Speaker Nancy Pelosi in August 2022.
