

Reserved seats case CJP Isa says PTI 'committed suicide' by merging with SIC

Those holding press conferences are pardoned, others targeted; everybody knows facts: Justice Minallah

ISLAMABAD: Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa wondered on Monday why Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) "committed suicide" when it decided to merge with the Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC) following the February 8 elections. The CJP's remarks came during a hearing of the petition filed by the SIC, which is an ally of the PTI, against the Peshawar High Court's (PHC) verdict denying reserved seats for women and minorities in the national and provincial assemblies. A full court 13-member bench, headed by CJP Isa, also comprises Justice Syed Mansoor Ali Shah, Justice Muneeb Akhtar, Justice Yahya Afridi, Justice Amin-ud-Din Khan, Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhail, Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar, Justice Ayesha A Malik, Justice Athar Minallah, Justice Syed Hassan Azhar Rizvi, Justice Shahid Waheed, Justice Irfan Saadat Khan and Justice Naeem Akhtar Afghan. "Why did the independent candidates leave PTI when it is a political party? Why did you commit suicide by joining another party which goes against your arguments?" asked the chief justice. The CJP said that had the independent candidates stayed with the PTI, there would have been no problem today. Following the today's proceeding, the Supreme Court said PTI leader Kanwal Shuzab's counsel Salman Akram Raja and SIC counsel Faisal Siddiqui have completed their arguments in the case.

CJP Isa directed the counsels of other respondents to keep their arguments concise as the court will not allow more time as the counsels for PPP, ECP and the Attorney General for Pakistan (AGP) will present their arguments in the next hearing. The top court adjourned the hearing of the case till tomorrow (Tuesday). The PTI-backed independent candidates who emerged victorious in the February 8 elections had joined the SIC in a bid to claim seats reserved for minority and women. However, this did not help the

IHC suspends ECP's order of tribunal change

Issued show cause notice on contempt of court to Anjum Aqeel

ISLAMABAD: Islamabad High Court (IHC) has suspended the Election Commission of Pakistan's (ECP) order to change election tribunals hearing Pakistan Muslim League Nawaz (PML-N) leaders cases of electoral rigging. IHC's Chief Justice Aamer Farooq heard the petition filed by Ali Bukhari and others challenging election tribunals change. PML-N leaders Anjum Aqeel, Tariq Fazal Chaudhry, and Khurram approached the ECP to transfer tribunal judge hearing reviews in Islamabad's three constituencies. They noted in the application they fear they will not receive justice due to perceived bias and undue haste shown by the tribunal. The petitioners argued that the tribunal's actions compromised their right to a fair trial, a fundamental right protected under Article 4 of the Constitution. They stressed that every Pakistani was entitled to a fair trial. ECP bench, led by Chief Election Commissioner Sikandar Sultan Raja,

Training of Pakistanis by Huawei to start next month: Shaza

Minister for IT Shaza Fatima said that the present govt is taking effective steps to promote Information and Communications Technology in the country

ISLAMABAD : Minister for Information Technology and Telecommunication Shaza Fatima Khawaja Mondav said that the training of young Pakistanis in information technology and artificial intelligence, with assistance from Huawei, will begin next month. Participating in the budget debate, she said that during Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's visit to China, it was agreed that Huawei would train 200,000 young people in the information technology sector. Shaza Fatima said that the present government is taking effective steps to promote Information and Communications Technology (ICT) in the country. She said that under the vision of the Prime Minister of Pakistan, the youth of the country are

being given training in information technology. She said that the youth make up 70 percent of the country's population and the government is determined to equip them with IT training so they can secure jobs. She said that the government would train around 150,000 young people in the IT sector, who will then play a vital role in the country's economy. The minister said that a three to six-month IT course would enable the youth to earn a respectable income in both local and international markets. She recalled that during the government of Muhammad Nawaz Sharif, about 100,000 young people were trained. Shaza added that during the same period, youth were provided with interest-free loans and scholarships. The minister mentioned that students were given laptops by the then-government on merit and without any dis-

crimination. The minister said that during the last government, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif had distributed 100,000 laptops among the youth of the country. She recalled that as Chief Minister, Shehbaz Sharif had established E-Rozgar centers and E-libraries for the youth. She said that funds have been allocated in the PSDP for the establishment of IT parks in Islamabad and Karachi. Due to steps taken by the government, IT exports have reached 2.6 billion dollars and are expected to reach 3 billion dollars next year. The minister said that the government is determined to increase IT exports to 25 billion dollars. She said that Huawei would start work on the Islamabad smart city and safe city projects for other cities. She said that the gaming industry would be promoted in the country.

PESHAWAR : Minister for Agriculture Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Major (Retd) Muhammad Sajjad Barakwal has said the provincial government will take all possible measures to remove a sense of deprivation among people of the southern districts. As part of efforts, the provincial minister said during his visit to Karak Press Club, that the water crisis being faced by the district would be resolved. He also congratulated the newly elected cabinet of the Karak press club. In this regard, a feasibility study for an uplift canal from

the Indus River via Shakardara and providing canals from the Kurram Tangi Dam and other southern districts would be conducted, resulting in agricultural revolution to the area. He mentioned that construction of a medical college and an institute of medical sciences would begin in Karak this year. Similarly, he added that all obstacles to the establishment of the gypsum city had been removed and work on it would commence soon. He also revealed that approval has been given for a 32-kilometer Khwara Road to access the mineral-rich Sheen Ghar mountains, enabling the district to get control over its mineral re-

sources. He added that the chief minister had increased the royalty fund for Karak's oil and gas from 10 percent to 15 percent. He revealed that efforts were underway to release Kohat Division's royalty arrears amounting to Rs 17 to Rs 20 billion. He also said an inquiry would be conducted into the Rs7 billion taken by SNGPL for the gas project from the royalty money. He expressed concern over SNGPL's demand for an additional Rs 14 billion rupees for provision of gas to houses and it had caused destruction to streets and roads. He emphasized that the royalty fund would be spent

on mega projects that generate revenue for the district. The provincial minister also criticized the decision to give MOL Company 10 percent control. He alleged that oil companies were extracting more oil and gas than agreed upon, demanding a third-party gauge to determine the actual daily extraction. He also said that besides upgrading Ahmed Wala Agricultural Farm and two more agricultural research sub-farms in Ghundi Shehbaz Khan and Tehsil Banda would be established. They plan to conduct experimental saffron cultivation, which, if successful, will be highly profitable.

LAHORE : The Sui Northern Gas Pipelines Limited (SNGPL) has cut off another 66 connections during its on going crackdown against gas pilferers in Punjab, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Islamabad, imposing Rs1.8 million fines. According to a spokesman

for the SNGPL, Lahore and Sheikhupura regional teams severed 10 connections on illegal use of gas and imposed a fine of Rs 0.9 million on pilferers. In Multan and Faisalabad, 17 connections were cut off on illegal use while in Sahiwal and Bahawalpur, 4 connections were severed.

Pakistani mangoes arrive in China DNA

ISLAMABAD: Chinese con-

sumers are able to enjoy the sweet taste of Pakistani mangoes, as 800 cartons of the prized fruit arrived in China, Gwadar Pro reported on Monday. This shipment, weighing over 3 tons (3,200 kilograms), marks the latest collaboration between Zhitong Batie Ltd in Guangzhou, China and MERA P C Solutions in Pakistan. The mangoes, renowned as the "King of Fruits" in Pakistan, are available for purchase through various Chinese e-commerce platforms, including JD.com's Pakistan Pavilion, Douyin shops, and WeChat accounts. This is the first batch of mangoes imported by Zhitong Batie company this year. They hit the shelves in China at a price of 168 yuan per carton, inclusive of express delivery. Each carton contains mangoes with a net weight of 4 to 4.2 kilograms. Cindy Chen, regional director of the company, explained that they had carefully selected two varieties, Sindhri and Chaunsa, which are widely considered the tastiest in Pakistan. "Pakistan boasts over 300 mango varieties. We partner with premium mango orchards, providing guidance on variety selection, cultivation techniques, harvesting, and packaging,' said Chen. "Pakistani mangoes are grown naturally, using traditional methods and naturally fermented fertilizers without artificial growth enhancers or bagging. This ensures a pure mango flavor that Chinese consumers love." To maintain the unique taste of Pakistani mangoes while ensuring smooth logistics, a rigorous process is followed from orchards to consumers. Mangoes are harvested, heat-treated and packed before being transported by cold chain to Pakistani airports for air shipment to China. Domestic delivery in China is then handled by SF Express, ensuring freshness and quality. The company once faced challenges in preserving the freshness of mangoes during transportation. These issues were addressed through various trials, including proper packaging, employment of air cushions and specialized preservation methods.

Excise deptt brings vehicle registration, essential services to Fatima **Jinnah park**

ISLAMABAD: The Excise Department will be setting up a mobile facility at Fatima Jinnah park in the federal capital on Monday, in a bid to made essential services more accessible. Pakistan's regional exports increase 20% in 11 months

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's exports to the seven regional countries witnessed an increase of 20.61 per cent in the first eleven months of the financial year (2023-24) as compared to the corresponding months of last year. "The country's exports to the regional countries including Afghanistan, China, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, India, Nepal, and the Maldives account for a small amount of \$4043.371 million, which is 14.09 per cent of Pakistan's overall exports of \$28,678.265 million during July-May (2023-24)," State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) reported. China tops the list of countries in terms of Pakistan's exports to its neighbouring, leaving behind other countries such as Bangladesh and Afghanistan. Pakistan carried out its border trade with the farther neighbour Sri Lanka, India, Nepal, and Maldives. Pakistan's exports to China witnessed an increase of 35.61 per cent to \$2,553.481 million in eleven months of this year from \$1,889.195 million last year while exports to Afghanistan also witnessed an increase of 6.12 percent from \$478.614 million to \$507.935 million. The country's exports to Bangladesh decreased by 14.56 percent to \$605.744 million this year from \$709.050 whereas exports to Sri Lanka rose by 36.68 percent to \$361.690 million from \$264.608. The exports to India increased to \$3.552 million from \$0.769 million in the previous year. Exports to Nepal decreased by 7.83 per cent to \$2.552 million from 2.769 million while to Maldives increased by 8.99 cent to \$8.419 million from 7.724 million, it added. On the other hand, the imports from seven regional countries were recorded at \$12,454.030 million during the period under review as compared to \$9,344.623 million during last year, showing an increase of 33.27 per cent. The imports from China during July-May 2023-24 were recorded at \$12,148.884 million against the \$9,039.079 million during July-May 2022-23, showing an increase of 56.33 per cent during the period. Among other countries, imports from India are worth \$189.075 million against the imports of \$173.499 million, an increase of 8.97 per cent while imports from Afghanistan decreased by 33.56 percent from \$15.277 million to \$10.150 million.-DNA

A land of milkshakes and money

hen, earlier this month, the Conservative chairman was imposed by the national party as its candidate in the safe seat of Basildon and Billericay, one Cabinet minister told reporters that the decision had gone down with local supporters "like a bucket of cold sick". Meanwhile, the leader of the Scottish Conservatives announced he was planning to stand for election in a constituency whose MP had been barred from standing on the grounds of ill health. One reporter at his press conference observed: "It looks like you've sacked a sick man who wanted to stay as a candidate and put yourself in there. Does that not look quite callous?" Within a few days, the politician was forced to quit his role as leader of the Conservative Party north of the border. This was hardly the first Tory misstep in a campaign which has at times seemed like it's been scripted by a malicious master of farce. He'd chosen to leave this high profile international event, and by doing so to alienate so many of his party's grassroots supporters, in order to take part in interviews back home defending his claims about Labour's tax policies. The D-Day gaffe was described by the BBC's political editor as an "extraordinary own goal". It was an opportunity which the nationalistic Reform UK was quick to exploit. A fortnight into the campaign, opinion polls were showing the Conservatives under pressure from a resurgent Reform party after the surprise return to frontline politics of the notoriously bombastic Nigel Farage as that party's leader. Mr. Farage's popularity among his diehard fans didn't even appear to have been dented by a rocky start to his campaign, whose first day had included a series of increasingly ill-tempered broadcast interviews and a member of the public throwing a banana milkshake in his face. Of course, that didn't stop him laying into Mr. Sunak for his unpatriotic conduct, during his first appearance of this campaign in a live TV debate. More worrying for the Prime Minister, his decision to leave the beaches of Normandy was also condemned as "completely wrong" by the Cabinet colleague he'd chosen to represent him at that debate. The following week, Rishi Sunak was still being quizzed by reporters as to whether he'd resign. This was surely an unprecedented question for reputable journalists to ask a serving premier in the middle of a general election campaign. What further absurdities might unfold? What might he be asked next? "Mr. Sunak, are you a CIA spy?" "Prime Minister, are you a homicidal robot built by Elon Musk and controlled by AI?" "Are you a Martian space-warrior just fallen from the sky?" As of writing, we have no conclusive evidence to support any of those suggestions. But, given the ways in which insanities have piled upon insanities over the past few weeks of British politics, it would take a brave commentator to dare rule anything out. Faced with this unremitting onslaught, Robinson's victim froze like a deer caught in the headlights of a juggernaut. In short, Rishi was increasingly looking like political roadkill. The following morning, one of his senior Cabinet members suggested that people should vote Conservative, not in any hope of his party being in a position to implement its manifesto promises, but in order that a few remaining Tory MPs would be able to hold to account a Labour government sustained in parliament by what he called a "supermajority".

The peace deal that never was

S everal weeks ago, the Biden administration insisted that it had obtained a "ceasefire proposal" backed by "Israel" to end the war on Gaza. The White House took no time to hammer forward this narrative, getting both the media and allies alike to back it. Soon, a resolution was passed at the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) affirming calls for a ceasefire, which the US had otherwise vetoed previously so many times in its unconditional backing of Tel Aviv. The idea of this proposal, as mentioned in a previous article, was to "box" Benjamin Netanyahu in, who had never in fact agreed to the idea, by trying to set the political paradigm around him, as opposed to directly relying on him, to thus make him resigned to it. It did not take long for this deal to lose momentum and fade away. Now, it's worth questioning if it's ever going to be implemented. Within that time, Minister Benny Gantz, described as a "centrist", withdrew from Netanyahu's coalition government. That changes the balance of power, leaving Netanyahu more contingent upon far-right hardliners who are fundamentally opposed to a ceasefire. Moreover, Netanyahu has subsequently dissolved the war cabinet, a political move that is not tailored toward actually ending the war but amassing more power for himself. To put it bluntly, Netanyahu has no political incentive to end it. First, the proposal that Israel "withdraws all troops from Gaza" and therefore the ceasefire "returns to the pre-October 7 status quo" is deemed unacceptable. Benjamin Netanyahu placed all stakes in this war on destroying Hamas and building a "new security regime" in the Gaza Strip, which we should understand as de-facto military occupation in all names. For a ceasefire to be accepted, which amounts to a "reset", in political terms, this amounts to a "defeat" for him and the ultimate end of his political career. His government fundamentally rejects the "two-state" solution and therefore is happy to bring Gaza under its sphere of control, especially amid the wide publicization that settlement activity would resume afterward. Benjamin Netanyahu sees his only route to "political survival" as changing the status quo in "Israel's" favor. History shows us that when sovereign military control over a territory is secured, it is never relinquished unless major political concessions go with it. Hence, if "Israel" will not de-occupy the West Bank in defiance of international law and condemnation, why would it de-occupy Gaza? It will bring the Strip under similar control and incrementally squeeze it. Second, the United States is not prepared to take any serious actions to force Netanyahu to the negotiating table, and any supposed "measures" against "Israel" throughout the course of this war have been bluster at best. For example, any talk about "blocking aid" to the entity is largely symbolic, for as reported back in May: "The Biden administration has told key lawmakers it plans to move forward on a new \$1 billion sale of arms and ammunition to Israel, three congressional aides say." Similarly, Netanyahu, several days ago, told the press that "Secretary [of State Antony] Blinken assured me that the administration is working day and night to remove these bottlenecks. I certainly hope that's the case.

China's hardline stance intensifies Taiwan conflict

n a stunning and perhaps desperate move, China has issued judicial guidelines on imposing criminal punshment on diehard "Taiwan independence" separatists for organizing, plotting, or carrying out schemes of "de jure independence," or seeking independence from China in collusion with any foreign government, overseas institution, organization, or individual, and has set severe punishments. The issuance of judicial guidelines signifies a hardening stance on Taiwan's independence movement which included allowing for trials in absentia underscoring China's determination to deter any steps towards Taiwanese independence by defining legal repercussions more clearly and harshly. For Taiwan and its separatists, these guidelines represent an escalation in the legal and political pressure from Beijing. They signal that China is prepared to take more aggressive legal action against those advocating for Taiwan's independence, potentially increasing risks for Taiwanese leaders and activists. The threat of harsher penalties and trials in absentia could also create a chilling effect on pro-independence activities and rhetoric within Taiwan. For the United States and Western countries, this development is likely to be seen as a challenge to their support for Taiwan's autonomy. It could complicate diplomatic relations and necessitate stronger statements or actions in defense of Taiwan. The guidelines might also impact U.S. and Western citizens or organizations interacting with Taiwan, as they could be perceived as colluding with separatists under China's broadened definitions. Countries supporting the "One China" policy, like Pakistan, might find themselves in a more delicate position. While they recognize Beijing's sovereignty over Taiwan, these nations must balance their diplomatic relations with both China and other countries supporting Taiwan. The guidelines could pressure these countries to publicly reiterate their commitment to the "One China" policy and distance themselves from any perceived support for Taiwanese independence to avoid political or economic repercussions from China. This move is an obvious reaction to the unjust consistent and outright support of the United State of America and the West to the Taiwan separatists diplomatically and equipping them for violent struggle. The United States and its Western allies support Taiwan separatists through diplomatic, economic, defense, and advocacy measures. Diplomatically, the U.S. and Western countries maintain unofficial relations with Taiwan through trade offices and cultur-

Speaker Nancy Pelosi's visit in 2022. They advocate for Taiwan's participation in international organizations like the World Health Assembly. Economically, the U.S. and Taiwan have agreements like the Trade and Investment Framework Agreement (TIFA) and collaborate in critical industries such as semiconductors, where Taiwan's TSMC plays a key role. Financial support includes investments in tech startups and infrastructure projects. Defense and security measures include significant arms sales, such as the \$2.2 billion sale in 2019, which included Abrams tanks and Stinger missiles, and military training and advisory support. The Taiwan Relations Act commits the U.S. to provide Taiwan with the means to defend itself, exemplified by regular naval patrols in the Taiwan Strait. Advocacy efforts focus on promoting Taiwan's democracy and human rights, with public statements and support for Taiwanese civil society organizations. Educational and cultural exchanges, such as the Fulbright Scholarship, enhance ties and mutual understanding. These comprehensive measures help Taiwan resist Chinese pressure and maintain its de facto independence. They are helping Taiwan separatists to employ diverse strategies domestically and internationally. Domestically, they influence public opinion and policy through democratic elections and legislative actions, while also promoting a distinct Taiwanese culture and identity. Internationally, they engage in informal diplomacy, seek participation in global organizations, and strengthen security ties, particularly with the United States, to bolster their defense capabilities. Additionally, Taiwan focuses on economic measures like trade diversification and technological advancements to reduce reliance on China and increase its global standing. Despite their efforts, Taiwan separatists face significant challenges from China's diplomatic, economic, and military pressure aimed at isolating Taiwan and discouraging its independence. Internal divisions within Taiwan also complicate the independence movement, as opinions vary on the issue. Moreover, the international community's adherence to the "One China" policy limits Taiwan's formal recognition as a sovereign state. Nonetheless, the movement persists in its pursuit of greater international support and recognition, striving to maintain Taiwan's democratic values and autonomy. China's new judicial guidelines targeting Taiwan separatists will likely provoke strong defiance from Taiwanese independence advocates, who

al exchanges, with high-level visits such as U.S. House may increase their activism despite the risk of harsher penalties and trials in absentia. These nations might also face challenges balancing their ties with China and Western countries supporting Taiwan, while domestic public opinion could shift, pressuring governments to address human rights concerns more transparently. China aims to reinforce its sov ereignty claims over Taiwan and deter moves toward independence by imposing harsh penalties on separatists, thereby intimidating pro-independence activities and discouraging foreign support. To control the fallout, China will engage in diplomatic efforts to reassure and strengthen bilateral ties with countries supporting the One China policy through trade deals, investment agreements, and strategic partnerships. Additionally, China will offer economic incentives, such as increased trade and participation in the Belt and Road Initiative, conduct military exercises to demonstrate its readiness, and use public diplomacy to justify its policies. Dr. Asim should be recognized as "an academic equivalent to Ibrahim Raisi" for Pakistan, being the first to pioneer work on the concept of a resistive economy within the country. In his previous book "Romanticizing Afghanistan, Iran and Pakistan: A Region through the Lens of Resistive Economy", he not only presented a detailed feasibility report for establishing a joint administrative market at the tri-borderland between Afghanistan, Iran and Pakistan but also meticulously assesses. Such an initiative could challenge the dominance of US unipolarity and West-inclined international financial institutions, ultimately undermining Western socio-cultural and economic hegemony. Additionally, Dr. Asim astutely highlights Afghanistan's rational approach to seeking sustainable development since August 15, 2021, and Iran's similar path since 1979, attributing this progress to the implementation of resistive economic mechanisms. He draws attention to the pivotal role of current Iranian President Ibrahim Raisi, who designed such mechanisms during the Iranian Cultural Revolution, leading Iran to its current sustainable stage.

Conversely, Dr. Asim underscores the detrimental impact of irrationality within Pakistan's power nexus, particularly within the military and bureaucratic spheres, which poses a significant hurdle to the country's socio-political and economic development. By adhering to colonial legacies and prioritizing personal interests over national and regional concerns, these sectors have perpetuated policies that align with Western interests, neglecting the broader welfare of Pakistan or US. Despite the exposure of these flawed policies, particularly evident after the ousting of Imran Khan from government, Dr. Asim asserts that entrenched practices persist. Drawing on the insights of Craig Murray, former British ambassador to Pakistan, Dr. Asim illustrates how the CIA launched a regime change operation in Pakistan with the assistance of COAS Qamar Javed Bajwa. This operation was prompted by Pakistan's refusal to provide stations or bases to US troops post-Afghanistan withdrawal, adoption of de-dollarized barter trade through cabinet ratification on February 24, 2022, neutrality in the Russia-Ukraine conflict, adherence to Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah's policy on Palestine, and rejection of COAS-backed US-sponsored initiatives regarding Israel and Indian-held Jammu and Kashmir.

Dr. Asim's book precisely examines how Pakistan's current administrative, constitutional and political system acts as a significant impediment to its political development. He highlights that while the Objectives Resolution of 1949 remains a preamble to the constitution, its principles often disregarded in the drafting process. Through a detailed analysis of this resolution, Dr. Asim reveals its alignment with the themes of the Charter of Madina and the prerequisites for implication of resistive economic mechanism(s) in any third world country like Pakistan. He advocates for the adoption of a new social contract or constitution based on these principles, presenting 12 articles derived from the 12 clauses of the Objectives Resolution. These articles, further elaborated through specific clauses, founded on the Charter of Madina, resistive economic mechanisms and 20 essential points essential for national building and socio-economic growth. In my personal judgement, Dr. Asim's proposed constitutional draft extends beyond Pakistan's borders, offering a transformative framework applicable to other third-world countries grappling with corruption and authoritarianism.

BARBADOS: South Africa beat West Indies by three wickets (DLS method) on Monday in a thrilling contest at the Sir Vivian Richards Stadium, North Sound, Antigua. South Africa became the second team to qualify for the semi-final from Group 2 of Super 8 after England. Chasing a revised target of 123 runs in 17 overs, since the

match was affected by rain, the Proteas reached home in 16.1 overs for the loss of seven wickets. Marco Jansen played a crucial unbeaten cameo of 21 runs in 14 balls to take his side over the line. He smashed a six on the first ball of the final over when his side needed five runs to win.

Tristan Stubbs (29 off 27) and Heinrich Klaasen (22 off 10) also chipped in with important contributions. South Africa were 77-3 at one stage but the Windies picked up quick wickets to crawl back in the game. However, the late strikes weren't enough to keep the co-hosts in the tournament. Roston Chase was the standout bowler for the home side with figures of 3-12 in four

overs. South Africa have now won seven

matches in a row during the ongoing event and make it to the semi-finals in the T20 World Cup for the first time since 2014.

Earlier, West Indies were restricted to 135-8 in 20 overs after South Africa won the toss and decided to bowl first during a crucial match of the ongoing T20 World

Cup 2024 Super 8. However, the target was reduced to 123 in 17 overs after rain interrupted the match when South Africa were 15-2 in two overs. South African spinners, Aiden Markram, Tabraiz Shamsi and Keshav Maharaj, kept the Windies batters in check as they conceded only 79 runs in



12 overs at an economy rate of 6.58 while also picking up five wickets.

Shamsi was the pick of the bowlers with figures of 3-27 in four overs. "I am sweating, and I was not even out there. Quite nervy out there but that has been the theme this World Cup. We have been finding ways to win and tonight was another one of those," Shamsi said after bagging the Player of the Match award. "The people out there, our supporters, would probably like bigger wins. But things like this, it keeps us in check. We have been able to overcome such [pressure] moments and that keeps us in good stead," he added. Chase, who was dropped on 11 and 14, was the top scorer for Windies with 52 runs in 42 balls.

FRANKFURT : They all jumped for the ball in a frantic late push for the goal that would save Germany from its first loss at the European Championship, against an impressive Switzerland team. Defender Nico Schlotterbeck leaped up, next to the even more imposing center-back Antonio Rüdiger, who reached highest of all. In front of them both was substitute Niclas Füllkrug. The German trio was circled by three Swiss opponents trying to protect a 1-0 lead two minutes into stoppage time. Six pairs of feet off the ground in unison, straining to be the one to head the ball.

It was Füllkrug who won the contest, guiding the ball crossed from another substitute David Raum back across Switzerland goalkeeper Yann Sommer into the top corner of the net. The match ended 1-1.

Hungary knock Scotland out of Euros 2024

STUTTGART : Kevin Csoboth scored in the 10th minute of added time as Hungary snatched a 1-0 win over Scotland to stay in the hunt for a place in the last 16 of Euro 2024. A sickening collision led to Hungary striker Barnabas Varga being stretchered off in front of his visibly shocked team-mates in the second half, but Csoboth's late winner kept them alive in the tournament. It was a bitter end to Scotland's bid to reach the knockout phase of a major tournament for the first time as they were caught out pressing for a goal of their own right at the death. Germany finished top of Group A after a 1-1 draw with Switzerland, who will go through as runners-up. Hungary must rely on other results if they are to advance as one of the best third-placed sides. Scotland came last with just a point as their wait for a first European Championship win since 1996 goes on. Coach Steve Clarke made one enforced change for Scotland as Scott McKenna replaced Kieran Tierney, who was stretchered off with a hamstring injury in the 1-1 draw with Switzerland. English-born Callum Styles got the nod in Hungary's midfield, coming in after shaking off an injury, with Endre Botka also making his first appearance of the tournament on the right side of a back three. John McGinn revealed the team skipped their pre-match nap as thousands of Scotland supporters gathered outside the hotel, belting out songs in anticipation of what they hoped was a historic night. Hungary arrived at the Euros with increased expectations after a 14-match unbeaten run between November 2022 and March of this year. They also beat England twice in the last UEFA Nations League, as well as Germany away. But back-to-back defeats had punctured confidence and left Marco Rossi's side needing to beat Scotland to keep alive their hopes of reaching the knockout rounds. Scotland goalkeeper Angus Gunn shovelled away a dipping drive from Bendeguz Bolla that bounced awkwardly in front of him, with Styles and then Willi Orban booked for cleaning out McGinn in a first half full of endeavour but limited in genuine chances. - Agencies

Record rainfall of 337.8 millimetres (13.3 inches) early Saturday morning at a town in hilly Hunan province led to "severe waterlogging", state news agency Xinhua reported. "As of Monday morning, four have been killed, with another missing." The report came after state media said Sunday that heavy rains elsewhere in the province caused a landslide that ripped through village homes, killing eight people. Continuous heavy rain is forecast until Thursday in several provinces across central, eastern and southern China, the National Meteorological Center (NMC) said Monday. It also issued a red alert – its highest-level warning - that "extremely heavy rains" could occur in parts of Anhui, Jiangxi and Zhejiang provinces until 2 pm (6 am GMT) on Tuesday. Such areas could see 250-270 mm of rainfall, the

NMC said. Following days of persistent rain in Huangshan, a popular tourist city in eastern Anhui province, more than 54,000 people had been evacuated by mid-afternoon on Sunday, state news agency Xinhua reported. The current round of heavy downpours in the area began on June 18, Xinhua said, adding that dozens of attractions had been closed. China has been experiencing extreme weather conditions and unusually high temperatures in recent months. Scientists say climate change driven by greenhouse gas emissions makes extreme weather events more frequent and intense.-DNA

Germany's FM calls for cease-fire in Gaza

BERLIN : German Foreign Minister Annalena Baerbock on Monday called for an immediate cease-fire in Gaza, and warned that a further escalation in the Middle East would be a "catastrophe" for all the people in the region. Speaking to reporters during an EU meeting in Luxembourg, Baerbock said she will be heading to Israel later in the day to discuss diplomatic efforts for a cease-fire in Gaza, and ways to increase humanitarian aid for Palestinians. "We're thinking of the hostages, the images from Gaza, they are heartbreaking. That's why it's definitely not an option for us, and our partners, to bury our heads in the sand now, we need this cease-fire," Baerbock said, and underlined that more should be done to end the suffering of Palestinian civilians. "It is absolutely clear that Israel can only live in safety if Palestinians live in safety, and Palestinians can only live in safety if Israel is secure," she said. Baerbock called on the Palestinian Hamas group to release all the Israeli captives and accept the cease-fire proposal backed by US President Joe Biden last month. She underlined that a cease-fire in Gaza is "more urgently needed than ever before" amid the latest developments in the region, and growing tensions between Israel and the Lebanese Hezbollah group.-APP

Israel has killed more than 37,500 Palestinians, most of them women and children, in Gaza since the Oct. 7, 2023 Hamas incursion. Israel and Hezbollah have been engaged in border fighting since the start of the Gaza conflict. The tensions have recently escalated, with both sides saying they are ready to go to war. Belgium's Foreign Minister Hadja Lahbib said, for her part, that the EU must take all the measures to force the parties to stop

hostilities. "We absolutely must progress on a peace process, and on talks that must lead to the implementation of the twostate solution," Lahbib stressed. War in UkraineBorrell emphasized that while many countries gathered in Switzerland to discuss diplomatic solutions to the war in Ukraine, Russian President Vladimir Putin's "answer" was to travel to North Korea and "everywhere where he can get arms," since he is "clearly preparing for a long war." The bloc's foreign policy chief also said they must increase the support for Ukraine. ABUJA : Gunmen have attacked a village in northwestern Nigeria, killing at least seven people and abducting more than 100 others, residents and police say. According to residents, gunmen on motorbikes arrived in Maidabino village in the Danmusa local government area of Katsina, and began firing sporadically, forcing residents to flee. Hassan Aliyu, one of the residents, told Reuters by phone that the attack took residents by surprise and dozens of women and children were confirmed missing. "They killed seven people, including burning two children," he said, adding, "They spent more than six hours destroying our properties." Auwalu Ismail, another resident, said the gunmen first blocked all roads leading to the village before the attack. "They burned down our shops, vehicles, and took away our livestock. They also kidnapped my wife and more than 100 women and children," he said. State police spokesperson Abubakar Aliyu Sadiq confirmed the attack and the seven deaths. But he refrained from commenting on the news of missing people, saying investigations are underway. The remaining men who did not flee are living in fear ... and waiting to hear news about their abducted loved ones. Muhammad Sani, whose sister was kidnapped, said. Nigeria's northwest and central regions have seen the largest mass abductions for ransoms in recent years.-Agencies

Turkey wildfire toll reaches 15 NAIROBI : Protests against Kenya's proposed high taxes, amid faulty

toll from a massive wildfire that ripped through Turkey's mainly Kurdish southeast last week has risen to 15, hospital sources said on Monday with experts pointing to faulty wiring as a possible cause. The blaze, which broke out on Thursday between the cities of Diyarbakir and Mardin, killed 12 people outright and left five more fighting for their lives. Three of those succumbed to their injuries on Sunday, the Anadolu state news agency said. Hospital sources confirmed the toll on Monday, saying two people remained in intensive care. Hundreds of animals also perished in the blaze that roared across the dry landscape. The government said "stubble burning" was the cause but the Diyarbakir branch of the Chambers of Turkish Architects and Engineers (TMMOB) ruled that out and pointed to faulty electric cables as the likely trigger. "The fire could have been caused by the power cables," it said in a report released late on Sunday.-APP

Kenya's Ruto offers talks to protesters on tax bill

which continued across the country for the sixth consecutive day, forced President William Ruto on Sunday to express his readiness to engage in dialogue with demonstrators led by a youth group. Ruto hailed the youth for speaking out on political issues that affect them while attending a church service in Nyahururu, central Kenya. The president said, "Our young people have stepped forward to engage in the affairs of their country. "They have done a democratic duty to stand and be recognized, and I want to tell you that we are going to have a conversation with you to identify your concerns and work together as a nation." Kenyan youth, particularly those from Generation Z, have been leading protests against the proposed Finance Bill 2024 through digital platforms known as "Occupy Parliament," as well as demonstrations, the largest of which took place in all major cities and towns across the country on Tuesday. Anadolu contacted some of their vocal Generation Z members to respond to the president's offer of negotiations, which they declined due to fear of repercussions, as several youth leaders have been arrested in the last six days in various cities. The protests are primarily driven by concerns over proposed tax hikes and economic policies that many believe disproportionately affect the younger population. Once dismissed as "keyboard warriors,' dozens of young Kenyans marched around the Central Business District (CBD) in Nairobi on Sunday, carrying placards to express their opposition to the proposed taxes. The protest was witnessed across the East African country where pockets of demonstrations were held. Youth have been actively disrupting events attended by members of parliament who voted to support the controversial bill. Thousands of Kenyans have taken to the streets since Tuesday to demand that the controversial bill be withdrawn. The demonstrations were mostly peaceful, but there were reports of police using tear gas and water cannons to disperse crowds, resulting in casualties and arrests. Two people were shot dead by police, and more than 200 were injured, with human rights organizations expressing concern about law enforcement's use of force and calling for an investigation into alleged violations.-DNA

RABAT ; Morocco extinguished a massive fire on Sunday that spanned 12 hectares of land near the city of Tangier. The civil protection units contained the raging inferno near the town of Al-Jadid, through the use of three large water tanker trucks. While the fire did not result in any casualties, it caused extensive damage to trees and vegetation due to strong winds and high temperatures. The National Agency for Water and Forests had earlier issued a warning about the risk of widlfires to residents near forests in 10 provinces. The North African country faces annual wildfires that af fect forests covering about 12% of the country's land area. For the sixth consecutive year, the nation is experiencing drought, posing risks to the agricultural sector, a crucial part of the national GDP.-APP

Apple holds talks with Meta over AI

WASHINGTON: Apple is talking to major rival Meta about integrating the Facebook parent company's generative AI into its products, as it tries to catch up with rivals on artificial intelligence, the Wall Street Journal reported Sunday. The report comes after Apple also struck a deal with OpenAI, the creator of ChatGPT, to help equip its Apple Intelligence suite of new AI features for its coveted products. For months, pressure has been on Apple to persuade doubters on its AI strategy, after Microsoft and Google rolled out products in rapid-fire succession. It has developed its own, smaller artificial intelligence but said that it will turn to others such as OpenAI to boost its inhouse offering. According to the Journal, which cited sources close to the matter, Meta has held discussions with Apple over integrating its own generative AI model into Apple Intelligence.

Apple senior vice president of software engineering Craig Federighi said in early June that Apple also wanted to integrate capabilities from Google's generative AI system, Gemini, into its devices.-Agencies

GENEVA : The United Arab Emirates has signed an agreement with the UN World Food Programme (WFP) to contribute \$25 million in emergency food assistance to those affected by the crisis in Sudan and South Sudan, the Emirates News Agency (WAM) has reported. The assistance will be provided to those directly affected by the crisis, including refugees, internally displaced people and returnees impacted by the war, the agency said on Sunday. Since mid-April 2023, the Sudanese army and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) have been engaged in a war that has resulted in nearly 15,000 deaths and around 8.5 million displaced persons and refugees, according to the United Nations. The agreement was signed on behalf of the UAE by Sultan al Shamsi, the assistant minister for international development affairs, and by Matthew Nims, executive director of the WFP's Washington office. According to the agency, some 17.7 million people in Sudan and 7.1 million in South Sudan are facing acute food insecurity because of the war in Sudan. To help alleviate this crisis, the UAE has committed a total of \$25 million in aid: \$20 million for Sudan and \$5 million for South Sudan, the agency said. On Wednesday, the WFP said that "as Sudan's crisis drags on, the fallout is growing in neighbouring countries," adding that "of the more than two million war-displaced people now living outside Sudan's borders, more than half are in Chad and South Sudan, countries already grappling with soaring hunger of their own." In 2011, South Sudan separated from Sudan through a popular referendum.-DNA

KYIV : President Volodymyr Zelenskiy told the new chief of Ukraine's state guard service to clear its ranks of people discrediting it after two of its officers were accused of plotting to assassinate senior officials. The state security service (SBU) said last month that it had caught two guard service colonels accused of cooperating with Russia to plot the assassination of Zelenskiy and other officials, including military intelligence chief Kyrylo Budanov. The guard service provides security for various governement officials. Introducing Colonel Oleksiy Morozov to the staff on Monday, Zelenskiy said his main task was to ensure that only those who see their future tied with Ukraine join the agency - his first comments since the agents were arrested.

Meanwhile, Ukraine is closer to EU dreamafter decade of war A veteran of Ukraine's 2014 revolution who is now fighting Russian forces, Yehor Sobolev knows the price of Kyiv's decade-long drive to join the European Union as well as anyone. Having backed tough reforms as a lawmaker after the pro-democracy uprising 10 years ago, he says he will look on proudly from the front as formal accession talks open on Tuesday. 'We Ukrainians know how to fulfil

our dreams," said the 47-year-old deputy commander of a special army unit. The launch of talks, though largely ceremonial, is an important step for a nation that has spilled blood and pushed through the reforms required in its pursuit of EU membership. "Ukraine is returning to Europe, where it has belonged for centuries, as a full-fledged member of the European community," President Volodymyr Zelensky said on Friday. Kyiv filed its request to join the EU days after Russia's full-scale invasion in February 2022. It sees membership as validation of its fight to embrace European values. It now faces a lengthy path to accession, and needs to overhaul a bureaucracy still riddled with vestiges of Soviet days. The task will be complicated by the war with Russia that has no end in sight, with Ukrainian towns and cities under constant threat

of Russian air strikes that have killed many civilians as well as soldiers, forced millions from their homes and damaged critical and energy infrastructure. In many ways, Sobolev's story is a picture of Ukraine's trajectory over the past decade. He was a prominent figure in the Maidan revolution that toppled a Russia-backed leader after protests triggered by him breaking a promise to develop closer ties with the EU. Sobolev later worked on legislation that formed the foundation of Ukraine's anti-corruption infrastructure, central to securing financial aid and backing for Kyiv's integration with the EU. He also co-authored a law aimed at erasing traces of Ukraine's Soviet legacy and Russian influence by paving the way for the renaming of thousands of streets, towns and cities, and the removal of monuments. In 2021, Sobolev donned a uniform and rose from a rank-and-file Ukrainian soldier

to officer, as Russia broadened a war that Kyiv says began in 2014 after Moscow seized the Crimea peninsula and fueled an insurgency in the east. "The top corrupt officials that we dealt with on the Maidan are the same kinds of leaders of the 'Russian world' like (President Vladimir) Putin," he said. So for me it's one war." LONG ROAD AHEAD The accession talks are expected to start at a ministerial meeting in Luxembourg on Tuesdav. days before Hungary, which has closer ties to Russia than other member states, takes over the EU's six-month rotating presidency. Pointing out that flying fish can stay in the air for a long time, he said: "I want to warn our citizens and young people. Different and poisonous fish species are now found in our seas." "We should be careful when entering the sea. Let's not touch fish species we don't know. Among these fish, there are also spiny and poisonous ones. I warn everyone to be cautious about this," he added. Museum of Marine Life The flying fish caught in the Marmara Sea will be added to the Turkish Marine Life Museum. "Flving fish was one of the few species not in the museum," Balc said. "The flying fish has now been added to the museum, which has over 3,000 sea creatures. All the fish in our museum were caught in Turkish territorial waters."-APP

Gaza emergency services chief killed

GAZA: The Palestinian health ministry has said that Hani al-Jafarawi, director of its ambulance and emergency services in Gaza, was martyred last night following an Israeli airstrike on al-Daraj Clinic in Gaza City. In a statement on Monday, the health ministry mourned Jafarawi, saying he and his fellow ambulance workers were an exemplary model of steadfastness, determination and sacrifice and performed their humanitarian role to the fullest in evacuating casualties around the clock despite Israeli attacks.

The health ministry in Gaza said it would continue to assume its medical and humanitarian duty despite the systematic Israeli targeting and direct killing of its cadres, pointing out that the Israeli occupation army had killed 500 health personnel so far and kidnaped more than 310 others. The health ministry appealed to the international community and UN and human rights institutions to work on ending the Israeli aggression against Gaza and protecting its health system and workers.

Civil defense and medical crews recovered last night the bodies of two martyrs, including Jafarawi, and a number of wounded civilians after an Israeli warplane bombed al-Daraj Clinic in Gaza City. Meanwhile, The Hamas Movement has affirmed that the Israeli occupation army's bombing of the UNRWA headquarters in Gaza City today is a double crime against the Palestinian people and UN institutions. "The criminal occupation army's claim that the headquarters is used for military purposes is a blatant lie concealing the true intents of this fascist government towards UNRWA," Hamas said in a statement on Monday. Hamas accused the Israeli army of carrying out an artillery attack near the Red Cross headquarters in Rafah yesterday, claiming the lives of over 20 displaced civilians. The Movement affirmed that the Israeli army's persistence in targeting civilian objects reflects insistence on committing genocidal crimes, destroying all aspects of life in Gaza and flouting international calls for a halt to its military aggression.

It called on the international community and the UN to condemn such serious crimes and take action to hold Israeli leaders accountable for the genocidal war on the Gaza Strip. In a related context, UNRWA said on Sunday that the ongoing Israeli military operations in Gaza Strip have prevented some 39,000 high school students from taking their final exams, describing the educational process in Gaza as "horrific and sad." As the war drags on for over eight months, more than 500,000 Palestinian students have also been forced to leave schools, according to UNRWA director of planning Sam Rose. UNRWA runs 300 schools in the Gaza Strip, but two thirds were destroyed by the Israeli army. The ones that have survived Israeli attacks now serve as temporary shelters for displaced families - a situation that prevents the agency from initiating educational activities. According to UNRWA last Friday, over 76 percent of Gaza schools need rebuilding or large-scale repairs to become functional again.

Russia blames US for Crimea deaths and vows response

MOSCOW: Russia has blamed the US and vowed "consequences" for a Ukrainian missile strike on Sevastopol in occupied Crimea on Sunday, which officials say killed four people - including two children. Around 150 more were injured in the attack as missile debris fell on a beach nearby. Russia's defence ministry said the missiles used by Ukraine were US-supplied ATACMS missiles, and claimed they were programmed by US specialists. Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov called the strike "barbaric" and accused the US of "killing Russian children" He pointed towards comments by President Vladimir Putin, who recently vowed to target countries supplying weapons to Ukraine. Moscow said Sunday's deaths and injuries were caused by falling debris, after its air defences in Crimea intercepted five missiles loaded with cluster warheads launched by Ukrainian forces. Footage carried on Russian state TV showed chaos on the beach in the

Uchkuyevka area, as people ran from the falling debris and some injured people were carried away on sun loungers. Russia's defence ministry claimed on Sunday that all ATACMS missiles are programmed by US specialists and guided by American satellites. The US has been supplying ATACMS missiles to Ukraine for over a year. The system allows Ukrainian forces to strike targets up to 300km (186 miles) away, according to manufacturer Lockheed Martin. Moscow illegally annexed Crimea in 2014 and just a handful of countries recognise the peninsula as Russian territory. It therefore does not fall under the US demands that Ukraine refrain from using Washington-supplied weapons to strike Russian territory. But Mr Peskov told reporters in Moscow on Monday that the "involvement of the United States, the direct involvement, as a result of which Russian civilians are killed, cannot be without consequences".

"Time will tell what these will be," he added. The Russian foreign ministry summoned the US Ambassador Lynne Tracy on Monday, before issuing a statement accusing the US of involvement in an "atrocity" and vowing it would "not go unpunished". Moscow has repeatedly threatened to target countries supplying weapons to Ukraine, claiming that they are legitimate military targets. "We see very well who is behind this," Mr Peskov told reporters on Monday. "[Mr Putin] just last week talked about who is aiming these absolutely technologically complex missiles at targets, who is providing these launches. These are not Ukrainians." Earlier this month, Mr Putin renewed the threat during a meeting with international news agencies.
