## Law takes its course if anyone works for personal gains

Spokesperson of armed forces says the "military is a national army which has no political agenda"

RAWALPINDI: Director General Inter-Services Public Relations (DG ISPR) Lieutenant General Ahmad Sharif Chaudhry has said the law takes its own course if a person from the Pakistan Army "works for personal gain or promotes a specific agenda". He made these comments in light of former Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) chief Lieutenant General (retd) Faiz Hamid arrest by the army and inquiry over allegations of land grabbing and snatching valuables from the owner of a private housing society. "A petition was filed against Gen (retd) Faiz in the Top City case and a high-level court inquiry was ordered in April 2024," the army's top spokesperson told reporters during a press briefing held at the General Headquarters in Rawalpindi on Thursday. Lt Gen Chaudhry said action will be taken against whoever is involved no matter what position or status they hold. However, he added that who is court-martialed has the right to present evidence and to appeal.

The ISPR's director-general also stressed that the military is a national army which has no political agenda, adding that the Pakistan Army believes in the process of self-accountability. "Pakistan Army is neither against nor in favour of any political party," highlighted the Lt Gen, stressing there will be no compromise on national security. He added that the army's accountability system is comprehensive and transparent and it works on concrete evidence not on allegations. Speaking about the security situation of the country, the military spokesperson said the security forces and law enforcement agencies (LEAs) carried out 32,173 IBOs against terrorists and their facilitators across the country in the first eight months of the ongoing year - of which 4,021 were carried out in the last one month. Meanwhile, at least 90 Khawarij were sent to hell in the past 30 days in these IBOs, he said, adding that the army and LEAs have cleared an

## Govt, opp make major breakthrough in talks

## Imran Khan vows to resist 'forces of tyranny,' even in jail

Former PM accused the authorities of lacking wisdom and leading the country towards turmoil

RAWALPINDI: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan has vowed to resist the "forces of tyranny," even if it means dying in prison. In a candid conversation with journalists at Adiala Jail, Imran Khan criticised the country's decision-makers, claiming they lack wisdom and are leading the country into turmoil. "I am being told to explain how I dared to stand up to the powerful. Let me make it clear: I would rather die in prison than bow to the mod ern-day Yazid," the PTI founder said.

He also expressed his concerns about the state of Pakistani cricket, describing recent developments, including Bangladesh's win over Pakistan, as disastrous. He accused the authorities of making decisions without accountability and prioritising personal interests. The PTI founder believes the country is on the brink of revolution and suggested that the events of 8 February should have been a wake-up call for those in power. Further on, he condemned the treatment of his wife. Bushra Bibi, who has been in jail for seven months, claiming it was a means to teach him a lesson for standing

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Thursday strongly condemned the assault by the Israeli occupation forces on refugee camps in Jenin and Tulkarm cities of the occupied West Bank, calling it a breach and contempt for international laws. "Targeting individuals sheltered in refugee camps is yet another breach of international humanitarian law by the Israeli occupation forces, demonstrating their contempt for international law and basic tenets of decency and acceptable international behavior. Pakistan calls for an immediate cessation of these raids masquerading as military operations in the West Bank. We believe that the path to lasting peace cannot be achieved through aggression," Foreign Office spokesperson Mumtaz Zahra Baloch said at her weekly press briefing. The spokesperson also urged the UN Security Council to play its role to prevent Israeli occupation forces from further attacks against civilians, hold Israel accountable for war crimes, and take measures to protect the Palestinian people. 



## AJK Anti-Corruption Force gets new weapons to fight corruption



Heroes like Major Raja Aziz Bhatti, who received Nishan-e-Haider for his gallantry, became symbols of national pride. On the night of September 5-6 Indian army, without a

formal declaration of war, crossed the international border, launching attacks on Lahore and Kasur fronts. Pakistan's Army and Air Force halted the offensive, inflicting significant casualties on the aggressor. Besides Lahore and Kasur, an Indian Army Corps also launched a major thrust east of Sialkot with armored and infantry divisions, supported by gallant 3 Frontier Force and B Company 13 Frontier Force (Reconnaissance & Support). This prompted a swift response from Pakistan, with a 30mile front established to halt the enemy's advance at Chawinda front. This sector witnessed the largest tank battle since World War II, led by 6 Armored Division, valiantly supported by 24 Infantry Brigade Groups and 4 Corps Artillery. –APP

the historical evolution of the Pakistan Agricultural Research Council (PARC), its establishment as the National Food Security and Research Division, and its affiliation with the Ministry of National Food Security and Research (MNFS&R). Both organizations collaborate on research across various fields to enhance productivity. The committee was informed about the governance structure, which includes a board of governors, a chairman, an executive committee, and the IPARCC committee. Additionally, they learned about PARC's technical divisions, such as the PSD, NRD, ASD, and SSD. Financial briefings included details of the budget over


the past three years. For the fiscal year 2023-24, the total budget was Rs. 6,575.65 million, with Rs. 1,062.25 million allocated for operational expenses and Rs. 5,512.40 million for establishment costs. The staff at PARC/NARC includes 2,135 individuals, comprising 544 scientists and 435 para-scientific The committee staff. also reviewed research achievements, including advancements in plant genetic resources and the development and release of new varieties and hybrids. Financial updates since 2013 highlighted a research budget increase to Rs. 300 million in 2023-24, an educational stipend increase to Rs. 1.135 million.

## Six Israelis vs 41,000 Palestinians

N September 1, 2024, 27 Palestinian families woke up to mourn their loved ones, including at least 11 who were killed at a supposedly "safe" shelter, in Safad School in the al-Zaytoun neighborhood east of Gaza City. On the same day, the Israeli occupation military recovered the bodies of six Israeli captives, who were killed as a direct or indirect result of an Israeli incursion into a tunnel in Rafah. By the end of the day, the smiling faces and names of these six Israelis were prominently featured across digital and print media, while the murdered Palestinians were reduced to mere statistics, nameless and faceless. Both groups, however, share one tragic commonality: their demise was caused by the same killer. Indiscriminate bombing is a murder without distinction. Despite being warned of the risk of attempting to retrieve the captives by force, Netanyahu opted to sacrifice them to eliminate a political burden that could be seen as an obstacle to achieving his "war goals." Their disappearance - by a deal or death - would free Netanyahu's hand and ease pressure from the public, who otherwise supports his war of genocide in Gaza. Inarguably, there is an inherent interest for the Palestinian Resistance in prot cting the lives of the Israelis, simply to exchange them with Palestinian hostages held in Israeli jails. On the other hand, the Netanyahu coalition government has a political motive to reduce the value of Israeli captives in the hands of the Palestinians, and their death could be an option. The Israeli public protesting in the streets today, individually and collectively, is responsible for nurturing Netanyahu's unrealistic war objectives. The findings of a Pew Research poll conducted last March and April revealed that 67% of Israelis supported Netanyahu's "war goals." In fact, a staggering 86% believed Palestinians in Gaza should not have self-governance, not even the Palestinian Authority. Less than half of Israelis supported a prisoner exchange, and 60% opposed halting the war for any such exchange. In December 2023, support for Netanyahu's war goals was even higher, between 76 and 84%. It's significant to mention that the support for the war among Israeli Jews mirrored that of Jewish Americans. In the US, 62% of American Jews approved "Israel's" war conduct, compared to 38% of the general American population. These statistics reflect a broader issue of deep-seated Israeli-Jewish dehumanization of Palestinians. A bigotry germinated in the political Zionist culture, where in the Israeli religious and cultural plurality most Jews perceive themselves to be more equal than non-Jews. Before anyone from the professional victim pack cries out on October 7, this predominant attitude among Israeli Jews is neither an anomaly nor a new phenomenon. In a 2016 poll, an undisputed majority of Jewish Israelis (79%) believed that Jews are entitled to "preferential treatment" over non-Jews. When asked if Palestinians should be deported from their homes, the majority of Israelis agreed. Imagine, the American Jewish leadership protestation if 40% (1/2 of the Israeli percentage) of white or Christian Americans supported a preference over the other. In the meantime, progressive Americans can ruminate on their reaction if a similar percentage of Americans favored expelling Native Americans from their homes.

## Global stock sell-off

HE flash crash at the beginning of August saw the Hong Kong stock market fall by as much as 9 per cent in two weeks, bottoming out on August 5 after a sharp 3 per cent fall the night before in the US stock market. This caused a substantial fright among investors, occasioned by some difficult US employment numbers and talk of apparent weakness in the consumer sector. As we know, the markets quickly recovered, with investors using the biggest trawlers they could find to bottom-fish for investments. This has driven equity markets up - to close to their levels in July. On August 5, when market moods were darkest, David Roche and I talked about our views on RTHK's 5pm business programme, The Close. Roche is a revered market strategist, and a role model of mine over 30 years ago. Nowadays, we're happy to disagree with each other, as it makes for good radio. Yet we both had the independent conclusion that the market was not going to collapse much further. Since then, I have been trying to figure out why two widely experienced greybeards both came up with that conclusion within hours of the event. Some may say it was a guess; or maybe intuition borne from experience. But we both believed that the market was significantly overreacting to a limited piece of news. This instinct lies in the fact that market crashes require not just one bad narrative, but a combination of narratives coming together to cause a major disruption in the marketplace. This phenomenon is known as the multiple causation theory. Why investors can expect more market volatility after recent global stock sell-off Multiple causation can be observed in air crashes, where many factors line up to create a disaster. In 1989, for example, British Midland Airways Flight 92 crashed onto a motorway embankment when the pilots were attempting to make an emergency landing after the left engine failed. The experienced pilots of the almost-new Boeing 737-400 reduced thrust and subsequently shut down the right-side engine after smoke got into the air conditioning system. They had wrongly assumed that the right-side engine was at fault. On earlier models of the 737, the cabin ventilated from the right, but the 737-400 used a different system. Shutting down the rightside engine in this case did in fact reduce smoke and vibration coming from the left, and these symptoms reinforced the pilots' belief that the right-side engine was at fault. This left the aircraft with little thrust. The proximal cause was pilot error in determining which engine had failed, which is normally an easy task. This only happened because of multiple issues: limited pilot training on a new aircraft layout; the absence of a 747-400 simulator that could be used for training; the failure by the manufacturer to properly test a new engine type; and pilot checks being interrupted by air traffic transmissions. Ironically, the passengers and cabin crew could see that the left engine was on fire, but it was assumed that the pilots knew this. Multiple causation can also be described as being like a block of Emmental cheese with holes in it. You may not be able to see through the whole block because the holes don't line up but if you cut the cheese into slices and then move them around, you can align the holes to see right through the block. This analogy can also be observed in the stock market. Price movements, especially sharp ones, reflect how people behave. There are many parallels between market behaviour and behaviour in the natural and social sciences

And, to Washington's chagrin, at least 20 countries in the region have already joined China's Belt and Road Initiative. Brazil may be next. Commenting on the Belt and Road Initiative, General Laura Richardson, head of the US Southern Command, told the House Armed Services Committee in the US Congress last year: "We've got to pay more attention to this region. The proximity land. We are in a neighbourhood, these are our neighbours, and we have got to pay attention to them." Well, that's China barging in, and so Richardson explains, it must be deterred and turned back. Consider three regional examples - Bolivia, Honduras and Mexico - only because they have been in the news in the past few days when it comes to US "hegemonism". It also applies to most other Latin American countries. Bolivia With over 12 million people, Bolivia has the unfortunate distinction of having suffered more coups d'etat than any other country in the world in the two centuries since it gained independence from Spain. Depending on who's counting, it has had 36 to 39 coups during that time. Many of them from the late 19th century onwards had Washington's fingerprints all over them, including the 2019 coup that ousted Evo Morales, the country's first indigenous president. There was another coup in June, but it was poorly executed and quickly collapsed. To date, it's unclear who the plot's real backers were. Bolivia has the world's largest lithium reserves, a mineral essential to making rechargeable batteries in mobile phones and electric cars. That makes it highly strategic to the US. Speaking at the same hearing last year, Richardson made sure her congressional audience understood the significance of what she called the "lithium triangle" encompassing Bolivia, Chile and Argentina, which currently accounts for an es-

timated 60 to 75 per cent of the world's reserves, and the China threat. "China's aggressiveness and the ground game they have with lithium is very advanced and very aggressive," she said. Bolivia, though, takes a different view. It has just given Washington a wide berth. Its salt flat in Salar de Uyuni is home to the world's largest known lithium deposit. It is one of seven lithium-mining sites for which four foreign firms have been shortlisted this week in a government tender. These are China's CBC, Italy's Protecno, France's Eramet and Australia's Eau Lithium. CBC and several other lithium-related businesses from China have already had previous deals signed with the government of President Luis Arce. Maybe another coup la General Richardson is in order. Honduras Honduras, a country of slightly under 11 million, has the nfortunate distinction of being the world's second-most sued country at the World Bank's International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes. It has had nine investor-state dispute settlement (ISDS) cases against it, compared with No 1 Mexico, which has had 10. You may or may not have heard of ISDS but it is the best-kept secret of contemporary Western corporate capitalist imperialism. Yale historian Greg Grandin explains it this way in Empire's Workshop: Latin America, the United States and the Making of an Imperial Republic. "Today, countries are rced to agree to something called [ISDS], which that corporations can sue nations for future profit they might lose, due to regulations aiming to protect public health or the environment," he wrote. "Now common in trade agreements. [the] provision was first established in the Nafta treaty [between Canada, Mexico and the US]." For example, Próspera, a US company backed by Silicon Valley luminaries such as Peter Thiel and Marc Andreessen, launched an ISDS case against Honduras in late 2022 for US\$10.8 billion, equivalent to almost a third of its GDP. The reason? President Xiomara Castro - no relation to the Castro family in Cuba - repealed a "Zone for Employment and Economic Development" for Próspera, which enabled it to create its own non-criminal laws, courts, authorities and taxes. The zone was to have been, in a US magazine profile, a "crypto-libertarian paradise". If these zones sound familiar to Chinese, it's because they do somewhat resemble extraterritorial jurisdictions administered by Western imperial powers in China during the late Qing dynasty after the opium war, but repackaged in modern neoliberal economic terms. In March, the Castro government applied to exit the World Bank's arbitration body, which could set a precedent for other developing countries facing similar claims to follow. However, international commercial law experts think Honduras will still be on the hook with Próspera even if the exit proceeds. This week though, her government appeared to be on the brink. It has cancelled a 112-year-old extradition treaty with Washington after Laura Dogu, the US ambassador, complained that Honduran Defence Minister Jose Manuel Zelaya Rosales and military chief General Roosevelt Hernandez had met last month with Venezuelan Defence Minister Vladimir Padrino Lopez, whom she described as a "drug trafficker". Zelaya, who is Castro's nephew, has also resigned over an emerging scandal involving his family for allegedly taking money from drug traffickers more than a decade ago. Castro's husband, who has a similar name as the nephew, is a former president who was toppled in a coup allegedly backed by the Pentagon in 2009. It remains to be seen whether the current government will survive. If not, the next administration may be friendlier to the US. Mexico The story this week about Andrés Manuel López Obrador, known as AMLO in the Western mainstream media, is that on his way out of office, he is close to overhauling the country's judicial system, which will ensure judges run for elections and make it difficult for the country's Supreme Court to overturn presidential decisions. In typical fashion, Bloomberg calls it "the democratic backsliding". The Financial Times wrote: "[Legal] nightmares like this might happen in Russia but are not what you would expect in a partner of the US." The outgoing AMLO has been a thorn in the side of Washington, which has, of course, portrayed the judicial overhaul as the start of a new dictatorship. But AMLO, his successor Claudia Sheinbaum and their ruling Morena party are immensely popular. So perhaps ordinary Mexicans take a very different view about the court reform. Mexico has long been run by an oligarchy dominated by business elites and traditional wealth. Allied mostly with Washington, it fronts politicians to run for top offices, including senior judges and, of course, the presidency. The popularity of AMLO and Morena stem from their willingness and ability to take on this ruling elite. Reforming the judiciary and its ability to override executive decisions is a key part of their campaign. He never forgets that he lost two elections that were tainted with fraud, in 2006 and 2012, to candidates preferred by Washington. Both times, the country's Electoral Court dismissed his challenges despite clear evidence of voting irregularities. Washington has had no problems with stolen elections so long as the candidates it favoured won. As Ambassador Jesús Seade said in a Post interview, "Mexico needs diversification of its political, economic and commercial basket, and China is a key actor of that and a good friend for Mexico." ## Pakistan Navy: The pragmatic first responder

N 9 May 2024, PNS Yarmook, while on a routine maritime security patrol in the North Arabian Sea heard a distress call from a vessel. There have been, and probably, will be countless such operations necessitating the Pakistan Navy's, what I call the pragmatic first responder capability to bring into action. The navies, in fact are natural first responders, as these operate in a medium, that inherently is international in character affording maritime operations under the UN Convention on Law of the Sea, 1982. The sea provides reach, flexibility and ability to remain poised to the naval forces, without legal complexities and violation of sovereignty of other states. Air and land may be restricted for the passage of men and material, but the sea remains open even in a contested environment. This allows the navies to respond to domestic and international crises with speed and effectiveness. When it comes to 'sea-land binary,' we know that the activities at sea are too tightly connected with what happens over land as the situation in Palestine and Yemen signifies to this fact. This is exactly what Julian Corbett posited in 1910s that at the core of a maritime strategy was to 'influence events at land' by acting at or from the sea. When it comes to our part of the world, the Arabian Sea is of an immense geostrategic significance. Today it, arguably, has the largest presence of international navies and is surrounded by regions replete with conflicts and crises of diverse nature. The Arabian Sea has been witnessing an enhanced international footprint post-9/11, where the concerns of terrorism, piracy, narco-smuggling and gun running are feared high. Coupled with these sub-conventional threats

and challenges in the Arabian Sea, the non-traditional threats have also been becoming conspicuous, which include but are not limited to humanitarian assistance and disaster relief, non-combatant evacuation and ensuring maritime security. Under such an operating environment, the navies have to play roles beyond traditional warfighting and defence of maritime frontiers. Pakistan Navy, as part of its 'military operations other than war' construct has articulate response mechanics for non-traditional and sub-conventional threats. This requires the Navy's capacity to smoothly perform its roles from benign to constabulary roles. It is always in a 'ready mode' to transition across the roles, which means the gear, the human resource and the doctrinal clarity are always there empowering it to be the pragmatic first responder, irrespective of the task, the time and the locale at sea. The Navy was one of the first in the region to reach Mersin, Turkiye and Latakia, Syria to assist devastating earthquake victims in March 2023. PN ships Moawin and Nasr were ready to sail carrying massive relief goods within days of issuing instructions from the Government. In the catastrophic Tsunami of 2004, PNS Tariq was among the first naval ships to reach the Maldives and assist in rescue operations. Tariq was able to save 377 tourists within a short time. Later on, PN ships Moawin and Khaibar sailed from Karachi with substantial relief goods and field hospital equipment for humanitarian assistance operations in Sri Lanka and Indonesia. The Navy remains the frontline responder in domestic crises as well. Its role in Cyclone Yemyin, 2007; Cyclone Phet and Super Floods, 2010; and Floods, 2022, was particularly noteworthy. The Navy rescued thousands of people, provided medical relief and built shelters for the children and the homeless.

In June 2011, PN ships Babur and Zulfiquar, in a joint operation rescued MV Suez from the Somali pirates and brought the entire crew back home to safety. Though MV Suez sank because of the number of safety-related incidents human lives were saved. In April 2015, PN ships Zulfiqar and Aslat were deployed to rescue civilians from the war-ravaged zones of Yemen. The ships, acting with exceptional professional acumen and operational brilliance, were able to pull hundreds of people of various nationalities including eleven Indians. This

had a positive impact on Pakistan-India relations. From 2019 to 2022, Pakistan Navy undertook three distinct missions to circumvent Africa, with an objective to deliver relief goods to various African nations suffering from famine and natural disasters. PN ships Moawin, Nasr and Alamgir were tasked to sail from the Suez Canal to go around Africa and assist the African people in whatever way possible. PNS Nasr, in particular carried well over 1000 tons' food items to Benin and Niger in 2020 when these countries have had severe shortage of basic essentials to sustain human life. This unique feat hasn't been done before and Pakistan Navy can rightly claim the title of being the 'first responder' beyond its traditional operational space, the Arabian Sea. Apart from rendering humanitarian assistance, Pakistan Navy has the core job of 'preserving freedom of seas,' which is its guiding doctrinal creed. The Navy believes in working in a 'cooperative continuum,' where on one hand it ensures stable order in its on its own, and on the other it works in collaborative constructs so that our seas remain safe and secure for maritime activities. Domestically, Pakistan Navy and Pakistan Maritime Security Agency work through a joint collaborative mechanism that seeks to keeping the North Arabian Sea crimefree. On several occasions, drug smugglers, human traffickers and poachers have been captured or their attempts thwarted, thereby preserving good order at sea. Cumulatively, the humanitarian work and maritime security operations indicate that Pakistan Navy is the primary force to arrive at the scene of maritime emergencies or crises, not just in the Arabian Sea but at other locations in the Indian Ocean and beyond. As a Pragmatic First Responder, Pakistan Navy has provided and will continue to provide swift assistance, rescue and relief operations to protect lives, secure vessels and ensure the safety of life at sea, often before the arrival of other national or international support. This spirit truly makes Pakistan Navy not just a capable player in the Indian Ocean but, as Ken Booth asserts a true torch bearer of Pakistan's foreign policy.

Underscoring the ongoing efforts against terrorism, Lt Gen Chaudhry said that around 130 IBOs are carried out on a daily basis by the Pakistan Army, intelligence agencies, police and LEAs. Revealing the number of martyrs, who sacrificed their lives to defend the motherland in the last eight months, DG ISPR said that 193 officers and soldiers embraced martyrdom in counter-terrorism operations.Commenting on the recent unrest in Balochistan, the military's spokesperson recalled the attacks carried out by militants on the night between August 25 and 26 in the province. # Sinner beats Medvedev to set up Draper semi-final


There is now guaranteed to be a first-time US Open winner in both the men's and women's singles, with Americans Taylor Fritz and Frances Tiafoe contesting the second men's semi-final

NEW YORK: World number one Jannik Sinner beat former champion Daniil Medvedev in a topsy-turvy US Open match to set up a semi-final against Jack Draper. Italy's Sinner was a 6-2 1-6 6-1 6-4 winner over the Russian fifth seed in New York. Sinner, who won the Australian Open in January, and Medvedev were the only two major champions left in the men's draw and the match between them was highly anticipated. However, neither men were able to find their best tennis at the same time. Medvedev, a beaten finalist at Flushing Meadows last year and in 2019, hit six double faults and sprayed 57 unforced errors While Sinner was not at his most accurate, he was far superior on serve, closing out victory in two hours and 39 minutes. Sinner will now face his occasional doubles partner Draper in Friday's semi-final. "We know each other very well, we are good friends off the court," Sinner said of Draper. "It's going to be very tough - I'm just happy to be in the semis." There is now guaranteed to be a first-time US Open winner in both the men's and women's singles, with Americans Taylor Fritz and Frances Tiafoe con-



testing the second men's semi-final. Sinner and Medvedev have met at three of the four Grand Slams this year, but this match did not fully reach the high quality of their previous outings. Sinner came back from



two sets down against Medvedev to win his maiden Grand Slam title in Melbourne, while Medvedev got his revenge in another five-set match in the Wimbledon last eight in July. Asked to serve first, Medvedev was

immediately under pressure, having to save a break point before being broken to love a few games later. Sinner barely missed a step on serve before the start of the second set, when he was drawn into the longer rallies that Medvedev thrives on. The Russian went up an early break and doubled his advantage after a 10-minute game on the Sinner serve which ended with the Italian dumping a forehand into the net.

With the match level, the momentum swung towards Sinner, who reeled off five games in a row and had three set points on the Medvedev serve to register a dreaded 'bagel'. Medvedev managed to scrape one game in the third set and went off court to regroup, but immediately had to recover from 0-30 down in his first service game and a break of serve felt inevitable. Once Sinner secured the decisive break for a 4-3 lead, his quality came through, with victory secured with a stunning forehand winner. Sinner has lost only two hard-court matches this season and won four titles on the surface, including his Australian Open triumph. His most recent success was at Cincinnati in August, winning the title the day before news emerged he had been cleared of any wrongdoing after twice testing positive for a banned substance earlier this year.

Similarly, she said the OIC Contact Group on Jammu and Kashmir met on the sidelines of the CFM, also reaffirmed support for the Kashmiri people's struggle and called for an early and peaceful resolution of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute in accordance with the relevant UN Security Council resolutions and the aspirations of the Kashmiri people. "We welcome the pronouncements of the Council of Foreign Ministers and the Contact Group on the Jammu and Kashmir dispute," she remarked. She told the media that Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Muhammad Ishaq Dar, who was currently in the UK on an official visit, met with Secretary of State for Foreign, Commonwealth, and

and discussed the importance of a strong Pakistan-UK partnership, advancing the wide-ranging bilateral agenda, and promoting Pakistan-UK cooperation in the context of the United Nations and Commonwealth. On Thursday, she said the DPM would meet with the UK's Deputy Prime Minister Angela Rayner besides engaging with members of the UK Parliament and representatives of the Pakistani community in the UK. Spokesperson Baloch told the media that the 23rd meeting of the Ministers for Foreign Economic and Foreign Trade Activity of the SCO member states would be held in Islamabad on September 12. Pakistan has extended invitations to the heads of relevant ministries of all SCO member countries. Responding to a query on the recent statement made on Jammu and Kashmir by India's Minister for External Affairs, the spokesperson reiterated Pakistan's unequivocal rejection of any narrative that suggested that the Jammu and Kashmir dispute has been or can be settled unilaterally. She said that the Iammu and Kashmir dispute was an internationally recognized dispute that must be resolved in accordance with the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) resolutions and the wishes of the Kashmiri people. She told the media that Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif was expected to attend

Nations General Assembly, and like every year, Pakistan would highlight the issue of Indian atrocities in the Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir, among others. Responding to a statement by Bangladesh Chief Advisor Muhammad Yunus, Spokesperson Baloch said that Pakistan always wished to have robust and multifaceted relations with Bangladesh. There existed an immense goodwill between the people of both countries and the extended cooperation would further contribute to regional peace and friendship in the region, she added. She said Pakistan and China were all-weather strategic partners with multifaceted cooperation. Pakistan remains committed to further strengthening bilateral cooperation in all areas of mutual interest. Commenting on the new set of laws on women's rights introduced by Afghan Interim Government, she said Pakistan's position on women's and girls' right to education was consistent. Every man and woman has a right to education. As Pakistan's constitution guarantees rights to women, we wish similar rights for every woman. To a question about terror groups in Afghanistan, she said Pakistan, on numerous occasions presented pieces of evidence of activities of terror groups having hideouts in Afghanistan. This is not the concern of mere Pakistan as the UN reports also highlighted the activities of such groups in Afghanistan.

## Olympic runner dies after being set on fire

A local administrator revealed that the deceased and her ex-boyfriend were fighting over a piece of land

LONDON: Olympic marathon runner Rebecca Cheptegei has died following a brutal attack by a former boyfriend, who burned her from petrol on Sunday. The Ugandan athlete, who came 44th in the marathon at the Paris Olympics, was injured badly and received extensive burns. The authorities investigating in northwest Kenya reported that the 33-year-old wasj targeted after returning home from church with her two daughters. Additionally, a local administrator revealed that the deceased and her ex-boyfriend were fighting over a piece of land. It is worth noting that number of cases of violence against female athletes are reported in Kenya. Cheptegei is marked sixth to be killed since October 2021. Following her death, speaking to the journalists, her father, Joseph Cheptegei revealed that his daughter was a "huge support" for the family. Meanwhile, Dr Owen Menach, the head of Moi Teaching and Referral Hospital in Eldoret, told local media that the athlete had died after all her organs failed. In regard to the athlete's death, Uganda's athletics federation posted on their X handle: "We are deeply saddened to announce the passing of our athlete, Rebecca Cheptegei early this morning who tragically fell victim to domestic violence. As a federation, we condemn such acts and call for justice. May her soul rest In Peace." Earlier in 2022, Cheptegei, 33, was awarded with a gold medal at the World Mountain and Trail Running Championships in Chiang Mai, Thailand. - Agencies

## Wasim feels 'embarrassed' following Pakistan's defeat

LAHORE: Former captain Wasim Akram expressed disappointment following Pakistan's historic defeat against Bangladesh in second Test on September 3 at the Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium. "It's a huge setback and our cricket is at a crossroads," Akram told AFP. Before the series, Pakistan were ranked six, but these consecutive losses have caused them to slip below the West Indies to eighth, with 76 rating points. Continuing with the conversation, the Sultan of Swing revealed that he was embarrassed from Shan Masood-led side's performance. "For a former player and captain, and a lover of the game, I was left embarrassed at the way they have lost from good positions. I simply don't get it," he said.

He added a period to his statement by highlighting the recent continuous losses on home turf. "We are losing consistently on home turf, and that says a lot about the quality of our cricket," he concluded. Pakistan have now lost five straight Tests

- three against Australia and two against Bangladesh - in the ongoing World Test Championship. Previously, the national team faced a major setback in the round



stage of both ODI and T20 World Cups over the past year. Pakistan have been defeated by Afghanistan in ODI and the USA in T20I. Meanwhile, Pakistan will play their next Test series against England. LONDON: The upcoming Test series between Pakistan and England faces an uncertainty due to unfinished stadium preparations in Karachi, raising the possibility of shifting the venue to United Arab Emirates (UAE) or Sri Lanka. Preparing for the highly-anticipated 2025 Champions Trophy, stadiums in Rawalpindi, Lahore, and Karachi are under development, posing challenges for the Pakistan Cricket Board in hosting matches. This upcoming series is part of the ongoing International Cricket Council (ICC) World Test Championship (WTC) 2023-25. The first Test is

11 in Multan, the second Test from October 15 till 19 in Karachi, followed by the third from October 24 to 28 in Rawalpindi. Nevertheless, the construction delays acts as a hinderance in holding the series as planned. If the construction is paused, that will impact the mega event of 2025. SYDNEY: Australia surpassed South Africa after creating a new world record by scoring the most runs in a T20I powerplay during their match against Scotland on Wednesday at the Grange Cricket Club. The Baggy Greens scored 113 runs with only one wicket down in the first six overs. Mitchell Marsh-led side won the toss and decided to bowl, with Scotland making 154/9 in the first innings. George Munsey scored the highest runs; 28, to contribute to the total. Australia's Xavier Bartlett and Adam Zampa bagged two wickets each while right-arm fast-medium bowler Sean

Abbott dismissed three players. Rest was handled by Riley Meredith and Cameron Green, taking one wicket each. Continuing with the second innings, Australia had a very shaky start with opening batter Jake Fraser-McGurk getting a duck on the third ball of the first over. This

wicket brought captain Mitchell Marsh, while Head made 80 runs from 25 balls. who along with Travis Head turned the tide and scored 39 runs in 12 deliveries

The left-handed batter smashed five sixes and 12 boundaries, while the captain



hit five fours and three sixes, leading to a record-breaking 113 runs for the team within the powerplay.

This surpassed the previous record held by South Africa, who scored 102 not out against the West Indies in 2023. ### **Putin backs Harris for US** president. with wry **smile**

MOSCOW: Russian President Vladimir Putin said Thursday he supported Kamala Harris in November's US presidential election, an apparent wry remark a day after the United States issued indictments accusing Moscow of vote interference. Putin often comments on political and social issues in the United States, often in a mocking way. He said last year that the US political system was "rotten" and that Washington could not lecture other countries about democracy. US officials have repeatedly warned of efforts by foreign powers to meddle in the upcoming US election, accusing Moscow of seeking to influence US ballots dating back to the 2016 contest between Trump and Democrat Hillary Clinton.

"Firstly, (US President Joe) Biden recommended all his supporters support Mrs Harris," Putin said during a question and answer session at Russia's Eastern Economic Forum in Vladivostok.-APP

### Egypt's army chief inspects borders with Gaza

ISTANBUL: Egyptian Army Chief of Staff Ahmed Fathy Khalifa made a surprise visit on Thursday to his country's borders with the Gaza Strip to inspect the security situation there. A military statement said Khalifa situation there. inspected security measures along the border with Gaza, without providing any further details. "The armed forces are capable of defending the homeland's borders, a generation after another," Khalifa said during the visit. The visit came one day after a high-level Egyptian source accused Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu of hindering the Gaza cease-fire and prisoner swap negotiations by making claims about weapons smuggling through the Egypt-Gaza border.

The Philadelphi Corridor, a demilitarized area along Egypt's border with Gaza, has been a sticking point in Gaza cease-fire and prisoner swap negotiations between Israel and Hamas.

Netanyahu insists on maintaining a military presence along the axis, claiming that the corridor is a "lifeline" for Hamas to rearm. Egypt rejects any Israeli military presence on the corridor and has denounced Netanvahu's claims about weapons smuggling into Gaza through its territory. Last week, Israeli Defense Minister Yoav Gallant said that Israeli military withdrawal from the Philadelphi Corridor poses no security problem to Israel.

For months, the US, Qatar, and Egypt have been trying to reach an agreement between Israel and Hamas to ensure a prisoner exchange and a cease-fire and allow humanitarian aid to enter Gaza. But mediation efforts have been stalled due to Netanvahu's refusal to meet Hamas' demands to stop the war. Israel has continued its brutal offensive on the Gaza Strip since an Oct. 7 Hamas attack despite a UN Security Council resolution demanding an immediate cease-fire. –APP

### Floods kill more than 270 in Niger

BAMAKO: The continuous torrential rains in Niger have left some 273 people dead, either by drowning or by the collapse of their houses, according to an official statement on Thursday. The General Directorate of Civil Protection of the West African nation said the floods affected 710,767 people across 94,783 households and damaged 73,582 houses. It also highlighted other material damage, including the loss of large and small ruminants, and the collapse of schools, health huts, and shops. The southwestern regions of Tahoua and Maradi are the most affected with 87 and 86 deaths recorded respectively, while floods hit 201 of the country's 266 communes.-APP

TEHRAN: A ranking Iranian military official says the Israeli regime should not doubt the Islamic Republic's resolve to retaliate over the regime's assassination of senior Palestinian resistance leader, Ismail Haniyeh, which took place in Tehran in late July. The Iranian Armed Forces' Deputy Chief of Staff for Coordination, Brigadier General Ali Abdollahi made the remarks during a ceremony in the northwestern Iranian city of Koumeleh on Wednesday. "The Zionist regime should not dream that Iran would not respond to this atrocity...because the Islamic Republic has [already] proven its will to deploy all its capacities towards responding to enemies' violation of its soil and waters," he said.

The official quoted remarks made by Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei following the assassination, in which the Leader pledged that the Islamic Republic would deliver a "harsh reEU must pressure, sanction Israel to halt genocide BRUSSELS: Palestine's envoy to the European Union has urged the bloc to put pressure and impose sanctions on Israel to stop its genocidal war in the besieged Gaza Strip. The Palestinian ambassador to the EU, Adel Atieh, made the call on Wednesday, in an interview with Turkey's official Anadolu news agency. "Until today, the EU and its member states failed to adopt any complete measures, and this contributes to the situation where we can see that the two-state solution is increasingly problematic, and there is no serious prospect to ... to stop the war, genocide, in Gaza," Atieh said. He stressed that certain countries within the EU are openly and strongly backing the occupying regime and preventing the European bloc from reaching a unified stance on recognizing Palestine as a state. Atieh added that these countries within the EU also prevent imposition of sanctions on Israel for its genocidal war in Gaza and its expansion of illegal settlements in the occupied Palestinian territories. "Too many member states are opposing the work of the International Criminal Court to release arrest warrant against [Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin] Netanyahu and those responsible for the work of genocide in Palestine. Some of the countries are opposing the mandate of the International Court of Justice, which also released an advisory opinion regarding the illegality of the occupation," the Palestinian envoy said. Atieh also stressed that the current situation benefits Israel and enables it to persist with its "colonial policy", which diminishes the chances of achieving a socalled two-state solution. Since October 7, Israeli forces have killed more than 40,820 Palestinians, most of them women and children in the Gaza Strip, according to Gaza health officials.—Agencies

"The time of the response, however, will be determined by the Leader and the country's senior commanders," Abdollahi noted. Haniyeh, the late head of the Palestinian resistance movement Hamas' Political Bureau. was assassinated alongside one of his bodyguards in the Iranian capital Tehran on July 31, a day after he attended the swearing-in ceremony of Iran's President Masoud Pezeshkian, Abdollahi cited several instances of the country's successful retaliation against aggressors such as its steadfast defense of its soil during the 1980s in the face of former Iraqi dictator Saddam Hussein's invading army, which was being heavily armed by the West. Abdollahi also enumerated Iran's firing of volleys of ballistic missiles against United States-occupied bases in Iraq in January 2020 in response to Washington's earlier assassination of the Islamic Republic's senior anti-terror commander, Lieutenant General Qassem Soleimani.

Iran's response to the assassination came "while there had been no direct attack [like it] on the US's interests throughout the previous 70 years," the official stated. He also pointed to the country's retaliation of April 13 against a deadly attack by the Israeli regime that had targeted the consular section of the Islamic Republic's Embassy in the Syrian capital Damascus earlier that month. The reprisal saw Iran's Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) targeting the occupied Palestinian territories with a barrage of drones and missiles, inflicting damage on Israeli military bases there. "There are many countries that have [various type of] equipment and weapons, but having the will to deploy these is a different matter, and the enemy knows that Iran possesses the will to do so," Abdollahi said. "Our enemies have been humiliated and do not dare to violate the Islamic Republic's territory...," he added, asserting, "Therefore, we say this to the global arrogance that it should not test the Iranian nation's steadfastness once again."

history". "China is ready to deepen cooperation with African

countries in industry, agriculture, infrastructure, trade and in-

vestment," he said. "Over the next three years, the Chinese

government is willing to provide financial support amounting

to 360 billion yuan (\$50.7 billion)," Xi said. Over half of that

will be in credit, he said, with \$11 billion "in various types of

assistance" as well as \$10 billion through encouraging Chinese

firms to invest. He also promised to help "create at least one

### **Turkish FM** accuses **Netanyahu of** genocide

ANKARA: Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan sharply criticized Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Thursday, calling him the primary "culprit of genocide in Gaza." Fidan accused Netanyahu of perpetuating violence in Gaza to maintain political power. "Netanyahu continues to spread death and terror to stay in power," Fidan told a news conference in Skopje following a meeting with North Macedonian Foreign Minister Timco Mucunski. Fidan condemned Israel's ongoing military actions and highlighted the increasing attacks on Palestinians in the West Bank, as well as provocations at the Al-Agsa Mosque, which he claimed are exacerbating the crisis. The Turkish foreign minister also claimed that Netanyahu is undermining ceasefire efforts by imposing new conditions and obstructing negotiations. He called on the international community to act against Netanyahu, asserting, "Remaining silent on the massacre is equivalent to being complicit in the crime."—APP

### Belarus claims to have downed multiple drones

MINSK: Belarus claimed on Thursday that its forces shot down several drones that had violated the country's airspace overnight.

"On Sept. 5, a violation of the State Border of the Republic of Belarus in the airspace was recorded, presumably by unmanned aerial vehicles," Sergey Frolov, the first deputy commander of the Belarusian Air Force, said in a statement issued by the Defense Ministry.

All of the drones were shot down by Belarusian air defenses. Frolov said, adding that an investigation into the incident is currently underway. -APP

## **Rangers** arrest 4 suspects

trict East Police in a joint operation based on intelligence information in Sohrab Goth and Gulshan-e-Maymar, arrested four suspects involved in injuring 12 to 15 citizens during robberies and street crimes. According to a Rangers spokesperson on Thursday, the arrested individuals have been identified as Jawad Ali alias Iaved alias Farhan, Sajjad alias Jani, Rab Nawaz alias Rabu, and Abid Ali alias Fahad Bengali. Weapons and ammunition were also recovered from their possession. During interrogation, the suspects revealed that four different gangs are actively involved in robberies, motorcycle snatching, and thefts, and the arrested individuals are operating their own gangs. They admitted to committing over 400 armed robberies in Gadap Town, Gulshan-e-Maymar, and other areas of Karachi. -APP

## Michel Barnier named by Macron as new French PM

PARIS: French President Emmanuel Macron has named Michel Barnier as prime minister almost two months after France's snap elections ended in political deadlock. Mr Barnier, 73, is the EU's former chief Brexit negotiator and led talks with the UK government between 2016 and 2019. A veteran of the right-wing Republicans (LR) party, he has had a long political career and filled various senior posts, both in France and within the EU. He will now have to form a government that can survive a National Assembly divided into three big political blocs, with none able to form a clear majority. Known in France as

will be France's oldest prime minister since the Fifth Republic came into being in 1958. Three years ago, he tried and failed to become his party's candidate to take on President Macron for the French presidency. He said he wanted to limit and take control of immigration. He is set to succeed Gabriel Attal, France's youngest ever prime minister, who President Macron first appointed prime minister in early 2024 and who has stayed in post as caretaker since July.

It has taken President Macron 60 days to make up his mind on choosing a prime minister, having called a "political truce" during the Paris Olympics. But Mr Barnier will need all his political Monsieur Brexit, Mr Barnier weeks, with the centre-left

## **UNSC urges immediate** ceasefire in Gaza

NEW YORK: The United Nations Security Council has expressed outrage over the lack of progress in a ceasefire aimed at terminating Israel's months-long genocide against Palestinians in the besieged Gaza Strip. The 15-member body held its second emergency meeting on Gaza in less than a week on Wednesday, hearing a growing call for an immediate ceasefire in the besieged Palestinian territory as members discussed the humanitarian situation there as well as the escalating tensions in the occupied West Bank.

Council members voiced their frustration over Israel's refusal to accept the ceasefire outlined in Resolution 2735, which called for the release of captives and Israel's withdrawal from Gaza. "There is a sense of outrage felt around the globe," said Slovenia's Ambassador Samuel Žbogar, whose delegation holds the council's rotating presidency this month. "Outrage in Palestine that the international community is failing them; outrage on Israeli streets that the hostages continue being held in Gaza; outrage of the global public that this war does not stop." Žbogar reminded the 15-nation council that it is their job to push for peace. Rosemary Anne DiCarlo, the

United Nations Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peace-building Affairs, emphasized the need for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza and to speed up humanitarian aid deliveries to the besieged Palestinian territory. DiCarlo hailed the continued efforts of Egypt, Qatar and the United States to establish a ceasefire in Gaza, saying recent meetings in Doha and Cairo have attempted to bridge the gaps but major differences remain. - Agencies

### PIA's Igbal Javed Bajwa steps down

KARACHI: Pakistan International Airlines's (PIA) Deputy Station Manager in Birmingham Iqbal JavedBaiwa has reportedly stepped down after his educational certificate was found fake. A spokesperson of the national flag carrier told Geo News that the higher-ups had sought resignation from Iqbal, who is reportedly a brother of former army chief General (retd) Qamar Javed-Bajwa, for submitting "fake" educational certificates. He said that the official had been served a show cause notice on July 13, 2024, through the PIA's finance manager in Birmingham on allegations of possessing a fake degree. Iqbal had reportedly been asked to prove the authenticity of his Intermediate degree within seven days or face termination, for breaching relevant clauses of PIA's Employees Disciplinary Policy 2019.

## SHC suspends KU syndicate decision on J. Jahangiri's degree

Court stops authorities concerned from proceeding against the judge

KARACHI: The Sindh High Court (SHC) on Thursday suspended Karachi University's (KU) decision to revoke the law degree of Justice Tariq Mehmood Jahangiri, ruling in his favour as the court found that the university's syndicate had taken the action in his absence depriving him of the opportunity to defend himself. In its written order, the court ruled that the degree of the Islamabad High Court (IHC) judge was cancelled by KU's Syndicate and Unfair Means Committee during a meeting where the judge was not present, stating that it was a "violation of Article 10-A of the Constitution" (the right to a fair trial).

"Unfortunately, no opportunity of hearing was extended to Mr Justice Tariq Mahmood Jehangiri and the manner so adopted appears to be highly objectionable, illegal ... and without lawful authority," the court ruled.

The controversy erupted in July when a letter began circulating on social media purportedly from the KU controller of examinations regarding Justice Jahangiri's law degree. Last week, the issue resurfaced when the KU syndicate cancelled the degree and enrolment of Jahangiri, who obtained his LLB degree in 1991 under enrolment number 5968. The decision came a few hours after the detention of academic and syndicate member Dr Riaz Ahmed, who was picked up by police in what appeared to be an attempt to stop him from attending the key meeting. He was released in the evening only after the syndicate decided to cancel the degree. The petition filed with the SHC, a copy of which is available with Dawn.com, argued that Justice Jahangiri was "singularly targeted, with extreme mala fide intention, according to a premeditated and conceived plan to tarnish the reputation and destroy the reputation of the



honourable judge of the Islamabad High Court". It added that Jahangiri "was one out of the six honourable judges of the IHC who in their letter dated 25.03.2024 informed the honourable chief justice of Pakistan about the alleged interference by intelligence operatives in judicial matters". The petition also argued that Jahangiri was absent at the syndicate meeting and not called in person nor provided representation, thus making the decision to cancel the degree illegal. Jahangiri's counsel argued that KU's Unfair Means Committee was "formed illegally and not in accordance with the Rules of Respondent No.4, therefore at the very inception the formation was void, illegal and

illicit", rendering any of its recommendations void and illegal. The court ruled that the degree was cancelled "without hearing and by violating the basic settled principle of law", adding that the petitioners' claims "carry substantial weight". As Justice Jahangiri was not present at the syndicate's meeting, he was "condemned unheard" and the decision was "null and void." The court added that under Article 199 (the jurisdiction of the High Court), it has the power to order any institution to "refrain from doing anything that is not permitted by law to do". It ordered KU against taking "any coercive measures based on these decisions" until the date of the next hearing.

The SHC ordered that notices be dispatched to all respondents, including the Sindh attorney general, requesting responses within three weeks. The hearing A two-member bench, comprising SHC Justices Salahuddin Panhwar and Justice Amiad Ali Sahito, heard the case today. "Whose degree is it?" Justice Panhwar asked. "How many decisions of this nature has the university made?" The advocate responded by stating that KU had acted in a "non-transparent manner". When asked by the judge about when the degree was awarded, he replied that it was conferred 30 years ago. Justice Panhwar asked, "On whose request has all this happened? On whose complaint has action been taken? The letter was sent by the Islamia Law College," he added. Asked by Justice Sahito about the relation of the petitioners to the case, the advocates responded that it had been filed by lawyers and added that KU does not have the authority to make such decisions. "Only the Judicial Commission can make such decisions," the advocate stated. One of the advocates spoke about the detention of Dr Riaz Ahmed, upon which Justice Sahito told them, "Do not talk about politics here." He added that if someone's degree was being cancelled, then "he should be called and given notice".

### petition are correct." Ukraine names new foreign minister

KYIV: Ukrainian lawmakers voted on Thursday to appoint a new foreign minister and two new deputy prime ministers, as President Volodymyr Zelensky carries out his biggest government shakeup since Russia's Feb. 2022 invasion. AndriiSybiha, 49, an experienced diplomat who does not have a prominent public profile, takes the reins of the foreign ministry, replacing Dmytro Kuleba, who has been one of the best known public faces of Ukraine in the West in recent years.

The new foreign ministry leadership is not expected to affect policy significantly; Zelensky and his office have taken the leading role in foreign affairs during the war with Russia. The Ukrainian leader, who travels to the United States this month and hopes to present a "victory plan" to President Ioe Biden. has said that Ukraine needs "new energy" and that this autumn will be important for Ukraine in war. – **Agencies** 

## £190m case: Bushra Bibi's acquittal hangs in balance

Accountability court decides to announce reserved verdict on Bushra's acquittal along with final judgment

RAWALPINDI: An accountability court seized with £190 million settlement case has decided to announce verdict on PTI founder Imran Khan's wife Bushra Bibi acquittal plea along with a final judgment on the matter. A day earlier, accountability court Judge Nasir Javed Rana reserved the verdict on the former first lady acquittal's petition and the court was expected to announce the judgment today. The duo are accused of causing billions of rupees loss to the national exchequer in a case also involving a property tycoon. However, after the court resumed the hearing in the reference - also known as £190 National Crime Agency (NCA) scandal - against the former prime minister and ex-first lady at a makeshift court in Rawalpindi's Adiala Jail, the judge decided to defer the decision till the final verdict on the matter. The hearing was also attended by the couple who were produced in the courtroom and were represented by

their lawyers Zaheer Abbas Chaudhry and Usman Riaz Gul. National Accountability Bureau (NAB) Prosecutor General Sardar Mazhar Abbasi and Amjad Parvez along with their team were also present.

The defence lawyers cross-examined the NAB Investigation Officer Mian Umar Nadeem and the cross-examination of the anti-corruption watchdog official will be resumed at the next hearing. The hearing of the case has been adjourned till September 7 (Saturday). In the previous hearing, the cross-examination of the NAB IO could not be held due to the absence of the PTI founder's lawyer.

However, Bushra's lawyer Gul continued arguments on her acquittal yesterday. Subsequently, the court had also declared the contempt petition against the NAB chairman ineffective, stating that arguments on the plea for acquittal rendered the contempt petition irrelevant. The couple had secured post-arrest bail from the accountability court in the same case in early July, however, they remained imprisoned due to the iddat case – also known as the un-Islamic nikah case – at that time.

### Deputy Prime Minister meets the Dar appreciates UK's Deputy Prime Minister of the UK duty-free access for Foreign Desk



LONDON: Deputy Prime Minister / Foreign Minister Senator Mohammad Ishaq Dar met the Deputy Prime Minister and Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government of the United Kingdom Ms. Angela Rayner. Deputy Prime Minister Dar congratulated Ms. Rayner on her appointment as the British Deputy Prime Minister. He underscored the importance of a strong Pakistan-UK partnership for furthering the two countries' shared interests in the bilateral and regional domains. The Deputy Prime Minister lauded the contributions of British-Pakistani diaspora towards further enriching the longstanding

ties between the two countries. Recalling Deputy Prime Minister Rayner's visit to Pakistan in the aftermath of the 2022 floods, Deputy Prime Minister Dar expressed Pakistan's desire to work with the UK on climate action and mobilizing international assistance for climate-vulnerable countries. He noted that creating opportunities for young people, and enhancing bilateral trade and investment were other shared priorities of both countries. He also appreciated the UK's continued duty-free access facility for Pakistani exports. Deputy Prime Minister Rayner congratulated Deputy Prime Minister Dar on Pakistan's election to the UN Security Council. She also noted the positive role of the British Pakistani community in bringing the two countries closer together.

## Hamas: Netanyahu trying to 'thwart' Gaza truce

"We warn against falling into the trap of Netanyahu and his tricks, who uses negotiations to prolong the aggression against our people," Hamas statement added

JERUSALEM: Hamas on Thursday accused Benjamin Netanyahu of trying to "thwart" a Gaza truce deal, after the Israeli premier said the Palestinian militant group has "rejected everything" in negotiations. The blame trading comes as Netanyahu faces pressure to seal a deal that would free remaining hostages, after Israeli authorities announced on Sunday the deaths of six whose bodies were recovered from a Gaza tunnel.

"We're trying to find some area to begin the negotiations," Netanyahu said Wednesday. "They (Hamas) refuse to do that... (They said) there's nothing to talk about." Netanyahu maintains that Israel must retain control over the Philadelphi Corridor along the Egypt-Gaza border to prevent weapons smuggling to Hamas, whose October 7 attack on Israel started the war.

Hamas is demanding a complete Israeli withdrawal from the area and on Thursday said Netanyahu's insistence on the border zone "aims to thwart reaching an agreement." The Palestinian militant group says a new deal is unnecessary because they agreed months ago to a truce outlined by US President Joe Biden. "We do not need new proposals," the group said on Telegram. "We warn against falling into the trap of Netanyahu and his tricks, who uses negotiations to prolong the aggression against our people," the Hamas statement added.

US State Department spokesman Matthew Miller told reporters that Washington thinks "there are ways to address" the impasse. At Israeli protests in several cities this week, Netanyahu's critics have blamed him for hostages' deaths, saying he has refused to make necessary concessions for striking a ceasefire deal.


"We are just waiting for them to come back to us, to come back alive and not in coffins," said Anet Kidron, whose community of Kibbutz Beeri was attacked on October 7. Netanyahu said questions remain in truce talks over the Palestinian prisoners who Israel would exchange for hostages. Key mediator Qatar said on Tuesday that Israel's approach was "based on an attempt to falsify facts and mislead world public opinion by repeating lies." Such moves "will ultimately lead to the demise of peace efforts,' Qatar's foreign ministry said. The October 7 attack by Hamas resulted in the deaths of 1,205 people, mostly civilians including some hostages killed in captivity, according to official Israeli figures.

Of 251 hostages seized by Palestinian militants during the attack, 97 remain in Gaza including 33 the Israeli military says are dead. Scores were released during a one-week truce in November. Israel's retaliatory offensive in Gaza has so far killed at least 40,861 people, according to the health ministry in the Hamas-run territory. Most of the dead are women and children, according to the UN rights office. While Israel

presses on with its Gaza offensive, Defense Minister Yoav Gallant said the military should use its "full strength" against Palestinian militants in the occupied West Bank. "These terrorist organizations that have various names, whether in Nur Al-Shams, Tulkarem, Faraa or Jenin, must be wiped out," he said, referring to cities and refugee camps where an Israeli military operation is currently underway. The Israeli military said Thursday its aircraft "conducted three targeted strikes on armed terrorists" in the Tubas area, which includes Faraa refugee camp. A strike on a car left "five killed and (one) seriously wounded" in Tubas, the Palestinian Red Crescent Society said. Eyewitnesses told AFP they saw a large number of Israeli troops storming Faraa camp, where explosions were heard.

Israel has killed more than 30 Palestinians across the northern West Bank since its assault started there on August 28, the territory's health ministry says, including children and militants.

One Israeli soldier was killed in Jenin, where the majority of the Palestinian fatalities have been. "Panic spread as the army was blowing up everything around without taking into consideration that there were children," Hanan Natour, a resident of Jenin refugee camp, told AFP on Wednesday. Israeli troops have destroyed infrastructure in Jenin and elsewhere in the West Bank, with the United Nations reporting the military restricting hospital access and using "war-like tactics."
