PM to host APC on Gaza

Pakistan to observe **Palestine Solidarity** Day on October 7

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif met with Chairman Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Bilawal Bhutto Zardari and a delegation of Jamaat-e-Islami led by Ameer Jamaat-e-Islami Hafiz Naeem ur Rehman at the Prime Minister's House, where it was decided to convene an All Parties Conference (APC) in solidarity with Palestine. According to a statement from the Prime Minister's office, Bilawal Bhutto Zardari and Hafiz Naeem ur Rehman met with Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, and the political parties present decided to express national solidarity with Gaza and the Palestinians. It was decided during the meeting to hold an APC hosted by the Prime Minister to raise a unified voice against the ongoing oppression in Gaza and for the rights of the Palestinian people. The political leaders also agreed to observe a day of solidarity with Gaza and the Palestinians on October 7, condemning the brutal oppression faced by the defenseless Palestinian Muslims at the hands of Israel. A committee was approved to organize the day of solidarity and the APC. The committee for the APC will include Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar, Sherry Rehman, Khawaja Saad Rafique, and Nayyar Bukhari.

It was also agreed to hold gatherings and seminars across Pakistan on October 7 to raise voices against the Israeli brutality and express solidarity with the Palestinian brothers and sisters. According to the Prime Minister's office, President Asif Ali Zardari and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif will attend the APC. Bilawal Bhutto Zardari strongly supported the solidarity day for Palestine and Gaza, and the Jamaat-e-Islami's stance on standing with the oppressed Palestinian brothers and sisters was appreciated. Bilawal Bhutto Zardari lami leader expressed gratitude and requested

Imran Khan's sisters arrested as marchers adamant to reach D Chowk

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad Police on Friday arrested PTI founder Imran Khan's sisters Aleema Khan and Uzma Khan in D-Chowk. According to details, Aleema Khan and Uzma Khan were arrested in D-Chowk during the PTI protest call as Section 144 was already imposed in the federal capital. Both the sisters of former prime minister were shifted to the police station. Earlier, several incidents of clashes were reported between the PTI workers and police. The police also fired the tear gas shells to disperse the PTI workers who were adamant to reach the D-Chowk. At least 30 protesters have been arrested as police fire tear gas to disperse PTI protesters attempting to reach Islamabad's D-Chowk for a planned party rally. Incarcerated PTI founder Imran Khan earlier again called on his supporters to gather for a "peaceful protest" as his party amped up preparations for

today's demonstration despite a ban on gatherings. Another one is also scheduled for Lahore's Minar-i-Pakistan on Saturday. The PTI has carried out multiple rallies across the country in recent weeks, protesting against the "illegal" imprisonment of its founder and the Election Commission of Pakistan's delay in implementing the reserved seats verdict, as well as

to "save the Constitution". Ahead of its rallies in Islamabad and Lahore earlier this month, the government had issued a set of strict guidelines, which the PTI failed to follow fully, sparking clashes between its workers and the authorities. The PTI today shared updates of its caravans departing various cities, despite being warned by Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi a day ago not to hold any rally in Islamabad due to several high-profile visits by foreign dignitaries. Jamiat Ulema-i-Islam-Fazl Maulana Fazlur Rehman, with whom the PTI has

Ombudsman launches awareness campaign in Hazara division

ABBOTTABAD: In an initiative to enhance public awareness about the Federal Ombudsman's institution, Advisor In-Charge regional Ombudsman office Abbottabad Rashid Ahmed on Friday has launched a campaign in Hazara Division. Awareness posters have been displayed in various federal and provincial departments, and letters have been sent to the chairmen of all union councils, urging them to refer local grievances for prompt resolution. Rashid Ahmed emphasized that the Federal Ombudsman, established in 1983 under a presidential decree, operates with 18 regional offices nationwide, with its headquarters located in Islamabad. The institution aims to address mismanagement in federal and provincial departments and resolve the legitimate rights of citizens that are pending. Federal Ombudsman functions as a public court, allowing complainants to submit their grievances simply by writing them down on paper along with required documents. For added convenience, complaints can also be filed online through the Federal Ombudsman's website or mobile app

receiving complaints, notices are promptly issued to the senior officials of the relevant departments, ensuring that a decision is reached within 60 days after a 45-day investigation period. Importantly, individuals do not require legal representation, and no court fees are involved in the process. Rashid Ahmed urged the residents of Hazara Division to take advantage of the Federal Ombudsman's services for immediate redress of their legitimate rights, highlighting a commitment to ensuring that justice is accessible to all, particularly those in remote areas.—APP

Dengue cases surge in KP as 141 new cases reported

PESHAWAR: A notable surge has been witnessed in dengue cases across the province including in provincial metropolis as according to the Health Department Khyber Pakhtunkhwa on Friday, 141 new cases were reported during the last 24 hours. With 141 new cases, the tally of dengue cases in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa has reached 511, the Health Department report said, adding that the number of total so far reported cases was 1222 in the province. Till date it said 709 dengue patients have recovered while only 34 were under treatment at various hospitals. About the district-wise numbers of dengue cases, the report said that from Peshawar, 373 cases were reported while from Abbottabad, from Hangu 115, from Mansehra 104, from Nowshera 100 cases, from Charsadda 59 cases and from Kohat 49 cases such cases were reported. Likewis, from Haripur district 36 cases were reported while from Bannu 25, from Mardan 36, from Bajaur 25 and from Swabi district 36 dengue fever cases were reported. The dengue fever has caused two deaths in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa till date, the report said.-APP

CM Maryam launches first govt-led autism school

In addition to the autism school, Punjab CM Maryam Nawaz launched the Himat Card program, which will initially provide 65,000 deserving individuals with a quarterly allowance of Rs. 10,500

LAHORE: Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz laid the foundation of Pakistan's first government-run autism school and launched the Himat Card program, which aims to support differently-abled individuals Both initiatives reflect her commitment to improving the lives of those with special needs across the province. During her visit to the site of the autism school, CM Maryam Nawaz was briefed on the state-ofthe-art facilities being constructed. The school will feature a ground and first floor, with 11 classrooms for the junior section and 10 for the senior section. In addition to classrooms, the school will include a cubical speech session room, therapy room, pre-vocational training room, a daily living activity room, and a computer lab. The first floor will house three classrooms, a multi-purpose hall, committee room, library, and resource room. Notably, the building is designed to accommodate two additional floors for future expansion, ensuring capacity for growth. Security features, such as fire alarms and a telephone exchange, will also be installed, and construction is set to be completed within one year under Maryam Nawaz's direction. The chief minister has also instructed the immediate recruitment of autism experts and emphasized that consultation with specialists will shape the school's operational plans. Expressing her dedication to the cause, Maryam Nawaz said that autistic children deserve "kindness, empathy, and love" and that the school holds a special place in her heart. In addition to the autism school, CM Maryam Nawaz launched the Himat Card program, which will initially



provide 65,000 deserving individuals with a quarterly allowance of Rs. 10,500. The Himat Card will also serve as a travel card, enabling free rides on the Orange Line and Metro Buses in Lahore, Multan, and Rawalpindi, starting from October 15. At the launch event, the chief minister announced that more cards would be made available through applications sent directly to her office. In a symbolic gesture of inclusivity, she invited differently-abled individuals to sit beside her, while ministers and officials were seated behind them. Maryam Nawaz distributed the Himat Cards to attendees and personally engaged with recipients, highlighting her affection for the children present. One young boy, Muhammad Azeem, expressed his gratitude by gifting the CM a pencil drawing, calling the Himat Card a "blessing"

for him and his peers. The chief minister emphasized the importance of the Himat Card for those unable to earn a livelihood, noting that it would alleviate financial burdens for families. She reassured attendees that artificial limbs and other assistive devices would also be provided to those in need. During the ceremony, CM Maryam praised her team for their efforts in launching the Himat Card and acknowledged the resilience of differently-abled individuals, applauding their hope and courage. "The Rs. 10,500 may not seem substantial, but it provides essential support," she said, affirming her dedication to improving the lives of differently-abled people. She also highlighted the achievements of the PML-N government, stating that welfare and progress initiatives have

been consistently prioritized despite economic challenges. The event featured a documentary titled Hope and Success Journey, showcasing the Punjab government's initiatives, including the Himat Card project. Attendees were also treated to a presentation of the national anthem in sign language, celebrating the differently-abled community. Notable attendees included Senator Pervez Rashid, Senior Minister Marrivum Aurangzeb, and other provincial ministers and officials, all of whom expressed their support for these impactful programs. Earlier this month, Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz Sharif officially launched the registration process for the Honahaar Scholarship Programme

tance to deserving students seeking

Date to encash withdrawn prize bonds extended up to Dec 31

KARACHI: The Government of Pakistan extended the last date for encashment, conversion or replacement of withdrawn prize bonds of Rs40,000, Rs25,000, Rs15,000 and Rs7,500 denominations up to December 31, 2024. The State Bank of Pakistan's Banking Services Corporation advised all commercial banks to accept requests for encashment, conversion or redemption of cited denominations from general public at all branches till the extended date. The Rs. 40,000, Rs. 25,000, Rs. 15,000 and Rs. 7,500 denomination National Prize Bonds (bearer) were withdrawn from circulation in June 2019. However, the government has kept extending the deadline to facilitate the holders of the withdrawn bonds. For the last time, the Finance Department has fixed June 30, 2024 as the final date for the purpose but for another time the last date of encashment, conversion or replacement of the mentioned denominations of the bonds was extended up to December 31, 2024. The investors of aforesaid prize bonds have three options i.e. Encashment at Face Value; Conversion to registered Premium Prize Bonds; or Replacement with Special or Defense Savings Certificates (SSC and DSC). The prize bonds can be redeemed from SBP Banking Services Corporation office and branches of commercial banks across the country till the final date.—APP

BISP, WFP sign agreement to extend Benazir Nashonuma programme

ISLAMABAD: Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP) and United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) have extended their partnership for another two years under the Benazir Nashonuma Programme.

The agreement was signed

The agreement was signed in a ceremony held today nessed by Senator Rubina Khalid, Chairperson of BISP Secretary BISP Mr. Amer Ali Ahmad and Ms. Coco Ushiyama, Country Director and Representative of WFP exchanged the agreement documents. This collaboration highlights the critical need to address malnutrition in Pakistan, where nearly 40% of children under five suffer from stunting due

to poor nutrition. Benazir Nashonuma Programme aims to reduce stunting among pregnant and lactating women (PLW) and their children under two years of age by providing additional cash support to BISP beneficiary families. PLW and boy child will receive PKR 2,500 per quarter, while girl child will receive PKR 3,000 per quarter. Speaking on the occasion, Chairperson of BISP, Rubina Khalid emphasized the significance of this new agreement, describing it as a key step in the country's fight against malnutrition. She said "The Government of Pakistan is proud to strengthen this vital partnership with WFP. Our commitment to the Benazir

Nashonuma Programme remains unwavering, and we are dedicated to expanding its reach and effectiveness to ensure that every child in Pakistan gets the opportunity of a healthy start in life, setting the foundation for a brighter and more prosperous future". The first phase in June 2024, and under the second phase, the program will expand to cover 157 districts with 562 facilitation centers. WFP will continue to implement the program following the approved design and protocols, with an increased focus on quality. The second phase will run for two years, concluding in June 2026. The key participants at the signing ceremony included Ms.

Rathi Palakrishnan, Deputy Country Director; Mr. Eric Kenefick, Head of Programme; Ms. Rie Ishii, Head of Supply Chain; Ms. Mamoona Ghaffar, Programme Policy Officer; Dr. Yasir Ihtesham, Head of Nutrition; Dr. Asma Badar. Rain to lash upper parts of the country from Oct 05-08: PMD

ISLAMABAD: After the days-long hot and dry weather across the country, the Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) has forecast rain-wind/thunderstorm for the upper parts of the country As per the synoptic situation, a westerly wave was likely to approach upper parts of the country on October 05. Under the influence of this weather system, rainwind/thunderstorm with isolated hailstorm are expected in Islamabad, Rawalpindi, Murree, Galliyat, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Lahore, Kasur, Okara, Sheikhupura, Sialkot, Narowal, Hafizabad, Wazirabad, Khushab, Sargodha, Mianwali, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Chiniot, Faisalabad during from October 05, October 07 and October 08 with occasional gaps. While rain-wind/thunderstorm is expected in Sahiwal, Pakpattan, Dera Ghazi Khan, Layyah and Bhakkar from October 06-08 with occasional gaps. In Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, rain-wind/ thunderstorm with isolated heavy fall /hailstorm are expected in Chitral, Dir, Swat, Kohistan, Shangla, Battagram, Mansehra, Abbottabad, Haripur, Buner, Malakand, Bajaur, Mohmand, Khyber, Peshawar, Swabi, Charsadda and Nowshera from October 05-08. While, rain-wind/thunderstorm is expected in Mardan, Kurram, Orakzai, Kohat, Hangu. Bannu, Lakki Marwat, Waziristan and Dera Ismail Khan from October 05-07 with occasional gaps. In Kashmir, rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated moderate to heavy rainfall/hailstorm are expected in Neelum valley, Muzaffarabad, Rawalakot, Poonch, Hattian, Bagh, Haveli, Sudhanoti, Kotli, Bhimber and Mirpur from October 05-08. In Gilgit-Baltistan, rain-wind/thunderstorm with few heavy fall is expected in Diamir, Astore, Skardu, Gilgit, Hunza, Ghanche and Shigar from October 05-08. In Balochistan, rain-wind/thunderstorm is expected in Quetta, Zhob, Barkhan, Lasbella, Panjgur and Awaran on October 06 and 07. In Sindh, hot and dry weather is expected in most parts of the province. About the possible impacts, the PMD said that moderate to heavy rains may increase flow in local nullahs or streams in Murree, Galliyat, Mansehra, Abbottabad, Kohistan, Chitral, Gilgit-Baltistan, Kashmir, Dir, Swat, Mala Kand, Shangla, Bajaur, Mohmand and Khyber during the forecast period. Landslides may disrupt roads in the vulnerable points of upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Murree, Galliyat, Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan during the forecast period. Windstorm and lightning may affect/damage weak structures like roof/wall of Kacha houses, electric poles, bill boards, vehicles, and solar panels etc. during the forecast period. -APP

Federal govt to hand over Green Line Bus Service to Sindh govt


KARACHI: The Federal government will hand over the Green Line Bus Service to the Sindh government in December 2024. During the meeting, Sharjeel Inam Memon directed the swift completion of the project connecting the Line with the Orange Line. The meeting also covered discussions on the Sindh Government's ongoing operations in the public transport sector, utility services, and subsidies for the Green Line Bus Service. Speaking at the meeting, Sindh Senior Minister and Provincial Minister for Information, Transport, Mass Transit, Excise, Taxation, and Narcotics Control, Sharieel Inam Memon, emphasized that the Green Line project is a vital component of Karachi's public transport system.-APP

ISSI hosts special talk on Pak investment landscape

ISLAMABAD: The China Pakistan Study Centre (CPSC) at the Institute of Strategic Studies Islamabad (ISSI) organized a Special Talk on "Pakistan's Investment Landscape: Challenges, Opportunities and Way Forward." The Guest Speaker on the occasion was Mr. Azfar Ahsan, former Minister of State & Chairman Board of Investment (BOI). In his remarks at the outset, Director General ISSI Ambassador Sohail Mahmood outlined Pakistan's unique advantages, emphasising the country's strategic geographical location at the crossroads of key regions such as the Middle East, Central Asia, and South Asia. Export of sport goods increases 4.27% to US 61.982 m

ISLAMABAD: The export of sport goods from the country witnessed an increase of 4.27 percent during the first two months of the current fiscal year (2024-25) as compared to the export of corresponding months of last year. The country exported sport goods worth US\$ 61.982 million during July-August (2024-25) as opposed to the export of US\$ 59.442 million during July-August (2023-24), showing growth of 4.27 percent, according to the data released by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS). Among the sports products, the exports of footballs rose by 8.35 percent, surging from US\$ 35.728 million last year to US\$ 38.713 million during the current vear. The gloves exports, however, dropped by 1.38 percent by going down from US\$ 9.429 million last year to US\$ 9.299 million during the current year, the PBS data revealed. Likewise, the exports of all other sports goods also dipped by 2.21 percent to US\$ 13.970 million from US\$ 14.285 million last year. Meanwhile, on a year-on-year basis, the sports goods export witnessed a decrease of 2.18 percent in August 2024 as opposed to the export of

the same month of last year. Awareness about viral infections stressed

ISLAMABAD: Health experts on Friday stressed the importance of being aware of viral infections, particularly conjunctivitis or Pink Eye during changing weather patterns.

Talking to a Private news channel Prof Tipu Sultan MD Children Hospital said that continuous changes in weather conditions and rapid temperature fluctuations between day and night can have severe health consequences. He explained viral infection prevention awareness is essential to safeguard public health. The fluctuating temperatures, humidity, and wind patterns create an ideal breeding ground for viruses, increasing the risk of outbreaks, he added. Respiratory tract infections, conjunctivitis (pink eye), and gastrointestinal viral infections are among the most common viral infections that spread rapidly during this time.—APP

Briefs Pak, China ink material transfer to boost citrus industry

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan, China inked a material transfer agreement to boost citrus industry. The Material Transfer Agreement (MTA) signed between Huazhong Agricultural University, Wuhan (HZAU) and the University of Agriculture, Faisalabad (UAF). According to Gwadar Pro on Friday, the signing ceremony for citrus rootstock and scion budwood was held at UAF on September 30. Prof. Dr. Liu Yongzhong, a collaborative scientist from HZAU, handed over nine citrus varieties budwood to Prof. Dr. Iqrar Ahmad Khan, Vice Chancellor of UAF, under the Higher Education Commission-funded project (CEPC-CRG-447). The agreement marks a major step in the ongoing collaboration between the two universities aimed at enhancing the citrus industry in Pakistan. Last year, UAF and HZAU signed a memorandum of understanding to establish a China-Pakistan Horticulture Research and Demonstration Center with the urgent objective of improving citrus production and fruit quality and ultimately increasing profitability. Citrus holds a prominent position among the thirty fruit crops grown in Pakistan, ranking first in terms of area (approximately 200,000 hectares) and production (2.29 million tonnes). In 2021, Pakistan generated \$171 million through citrus fruit exports, accounting for one-third of the total value of fruit exports. Punjab stands out as the largest citrus producer in the country, contributing over 95% of the total production. The mandarin fruit 'Kinnow' is the most cultivated citrus variety in Pakistan, accounting for over 80% of other citrus genotypes, due to its attractive peel color, size, ease of peeling, high juice



content, and excellent taste and aroma. However, citrus trees are sensitive and prone to both biotic and abiotic stresses. Climate change poses serious challenges to citrus growth and productivity due to abiotic stresses. Additionally, recent years have seen an increase in insect pest infestations on fruit plantations. Pakistan's citrus production per unit area is significantly lower (11.4 tonnes/hectare) compared to developed countries (25 tonnes/hectare), with

reduced tree lifespan and compromised fruit quality adversely affecting export po-

Only 10% of the total citrus production is exported, leading to severe financial constraints for citrus producers who must sell their produce locally at lower prices. Moreover, the Kinnow mandarin, a late variety, has a short harvest window of 2-3 months, further limiting production and export opportunities. The MTA signed

between UAF and HZAU aims to address these challenges by introducing new citrus varieties and technologies that can improve productivity, manage diseases, extend the harvest window, and diversify varieties to reduce the risk associated with Kinnow monoculture. This collaboration is expected to have a significant positive impact on the citrus industry in Pakistan, ultimately benefiting farmers and the economy.

Devastating consequences of climate change on Wildlife warned

ISLAMABAD: A renowned wildlife biologist, Dr Uzma on World Animal Day on Friday sound the alarm for ending cruelty and raise public awareness about animal welfare, emphasizing the urgent need for collective action to improve standards globally. In an interview with a private news channel, she highlighted how climate change exacerbates existing threats, such as habitat destruction, pollution, and human-wildlife conflict. She further explained that sea-level rise is also destroying coastal habitats, droughts are decimating food sources and extreme weather events are shattering delicate balances within ecosystems. The consequences are far-reaching with climate change projected to wipe out up to 1 million species by 2050, she added. immediate collective action to mitigate climate change, protect natural habitats and support climate-resilient conservation efforts. 'The future of our planet's precious biodiversity hangs in the balance; we must act now to ensure a livable world for all species," she stressed. As a wildlife expert, I have witnessed firsthand the Habitat destruction, polludevastating impact of human activities on species and ecosystems, she said. tion, climate change and wildlife trafficking threaten the very survival of countless animals, she mentioned. Moreover, billions of animals suffer in factory farms, laboratories, and entertainment industries, subjected to inhumane conditions and treatment, she added. To address this crisis, I call upon individuals, organizations, and governments to take practical concrete steps, she appealed. "We must promote compassion, empathy and sustainability in our daily choices, supporting eco-friendly practices and cruelty-free products" she further stressed. Governments must strengthen laws and enforcement to protect wildlife and domestic animals, while organizations should prioritize animal welfare in their operations and advocacy, she mentioned. Together, we can create a world where animals are valued, respected, and protected for generations to come, she added. Replying a question, she lamented that iconic species like the Nayab Markhor and colorful parrots are rapidly disappearing in Pakistan due to relentless poaching, habitat destruction and climate change. Nayab Markhor, Pakistan's national animal is endangered due to hunting and habitat loss, while parrots are being captured for the pet trade and suffering from deforestation. Other species, such as the snow leopard, Indus dolphin and Himalayan brown bear are also facing extinction, she mentioned. Human activities like deforestation, pollution, and infrastructure development are pushing these majestic creatures to the brink, she explained Furthermore, she stressed that there is urgent need to pay attention for animals in rural areas and conservation efforts, stricter laws and community engagement are necessary to protect these precious species and preserve

US blaming China

OMETIMES you just don't know whether to laugh or cry when you read comments about China made by US officials. They must think most of us can't add 2 + 2 together. The latest is made by Kurt Campbell, the on-his-way-out deputy secretary of state, about Beijing's diplomatic - rather than military - response to almost year-long attacks made by the Yemeni Houthis on cargo ships in the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden. It would have been amusing but for the background to his remarks. And that has to do with the United States' potentially criminal complicity in suspected war crimes, crimes against humanity and genocide alleged to be committed to this day by its closest ally, Israel, against the civilian population in Gaza for a year. In a wide-ranging interview, Campbell – who is most responsible for Joe Biden's Indo-Pacific strategy – also complained about Chinese state propaganda and twisted narratives. Of course, when he and his US colleagues say it, it's information. But when you say something else, it's disinformation. "We realised that what the Chinese had tried to do - rather than joining with any kind of international naval consortium - would be to instead take actions to communicate directly with the Houthis about, 'look, these are our ships, these aren't our ships, target different ships'," he said. "Now that's just profoundly unhelpful, and suggests an approach to the global commons that we have real concerns over." What "international naval consortium"? What "global commons"? The real point is the singular failure of the Biden administration to put together an international naval consortium. So why just pick on China? Actually, most of the world simply refused to join any US-led naval countermeasure against the Houthis. And most did it not because they failed to recognise or contribute to the "global commons" of international shipping lanes, but because they recognised a higher morality and obligation - which is to stop or at least not condone or support potential genocide. What the Yemeni Houthis, usually portrayed as Iranian puppets or Islamic terrorists in the Western news media, have been doing is, in reality, form a blockade - the poor man's version of sanctions - and try to stop the mass killings of fellow Muslims in Gaza. It has caused minimal casualties, unlike hi-tech sanctions imposed by the US against some poor countries. The Houthis are no longer militants, but an actual governing body that controls most Yemeni territories. Many countries outside the Anglo-American sphere recognise the fundamental justice of the Houthis' cause. That's one reason Biden failed to put together an international naval mission in January, and ended up issuing his embarrassing White House statement with just 13 countries, that is, the usual faithful followers of Washington: "A Joint Statement from the Governments of the United States, Australia, Bahrain, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Germany, Italy, Japan, Netherlands, New Zealand, Republic of Korea, Singapore, and the United Kingdom." Japan and Korea were token signatures to make the list of countries appear longer. Bahrain did provide logistical support and local amenities such as room, board and food to European naval officers. Notice the absence of France, which actually has a naval base in Djibouti, a country strategically located at the intersection of the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden. Incidentally, the French base is within spitting distance of that of China's.

'Israel's' terror plot in N. Gaza

SRAELI occupation Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu is reportedly considering a plan to force Palestinians out of northern Gaza and push for the 'surrender' of the Palestinian Resistance. This criminal plot, proposed by a series of retired Israeli military generals, aims to transform Palestine's northern Gaza into a so-called 'military territory.' Talk of surrender is nothing new: the occupation uses this rhetoric to threaten Palestinian solidarity, when the Resistance - and its regional allies - stand united in defense of Palestinian lives, liberties, and inalienable rights. Several factors merit consideration as dozens of occupation parliament members - including three sitting ministers - press on Netanyahu to adopt the siege plan. First, "Israel's" unwarranted strikes in Yemen, continued bombardment of Lebanon, and attempts to dial-up terrorism in northern Gaza, are all part of a larger, multifront war of "Israel's" own making. Second, the plan is also a sign of growing domestic desperation for Netanyahu. His administration is keen to divert attention to the North, as striking failures on hostage release appear clear as day. The pressure is mounting. Families of Israeli hostages continue to oppose Netanyahu's hostage release rhetoric, and see it as an excuse to expand "Israel's" onslaughts across Gaza and even Lebanon. Netanyahu's latest plan to step up occupation terrorism in the north is an extension of this brutal approach and is overwhelmingly focused on retaining power at home. Scores of Israelis rallied once again in Tel Aviv, demanding a hostage swap deal while Netanyahu pushes for outright obliteration. By contemplating occupation-backed terrorism in northern Gaza, the war criminal is simply adding to his collision course with the public. After all, it doesn't change the fact that Netanyahu has consistently failed to paint himself as a champion of hostage releases, given his own role in scuttling indirect negotiations. Thus, Israeli plans to terrorize and lay siege on northern Gaza could expose more falsehoods in Netanyahu's domestic hostage rhetoric, and extend more strategic rationales to a multifront resistance to act on. Let there be no doubt about "Israel's" broader genocidal motivations in the North. For instance, the occupation is adamant on leveraging survival resources, such as food and water, as weapons of war against Palestinians once again. Early signs include condemnable remarks from GioraEiland, a former occupation general, who has threatened to hold back supplies for Palestinians that wish to stay in the north. By opting for these measures in the name of combatting threats, Israel is willing to acquire a carte blanche for occupation-sponsored terrorism. Ramped up terrorism in the north also serves wider Israeli goals to control key corridors within the Gaza Strip, a condemnable move that runs counter to demands for a full Israeli withdrawal. There is no justification for Washington's criminal silence over "Israel's" potential onslaught on Palestinians. Efforts to declare northern Gaza as a 'closed military zone' aim to entrench the occupation, derail future negotiations, and force occupation control over Palestinian lands. This is important because during indirect ceasefire talks, Washington has been very quick to call on parties to remove obstacles to a potential deal. And yet, it is making a criminal exception for "Israel's" ongoing plans.

Supreme Court's 2022 Ruling vs. 2024 Ruling on Article 63-A

HE controversial bench of the Pakistan Supreme Court recently overturned an earlier ruling announced in May 2022, which had declared the defection of a political party member to another party or voting against the declared policy of their party as unlawful. However, the formation of the review bench was questioned from the outset on legal, constitutional, and ethical grounds, casting doubt on the integrity of the proceedings. Critics argued that the inclusion of certain judges, particularly those who had previously dissented in the original decision, raised concerns about impartiality and fairness. This led to objections that the review process lacked a solid legal or ethical foundation, contributing to the perception that the case's proceedings were shaky and undermining confidence in the judiciary's handling of the matter. The controversy was sparked primarily due to the inclusion of judges Justices Mazhar Alam Khan Miankhel and Jamal Khan Mandokhail-both of whom had expressed opposition to the 2022 decision and conveniently easing out Mr. Justice Munib Akhtar who was part of the majority judgment. This raised objections, particularly from PTI, whose lawyer, Ali Zafar, argued that the participation of these judges compromised the impartiality of the bench. Zafar and PTI questioned whether judges who had already voiced their dissent in the earlier decision could fairly review the ruling.

The ruling criticized the 2022 ruling for placing excessive power in the hands of party leaders and undermining the autonomy of individual lawmakers. It pointed out that defection is not necessarily a betrayal of voters but can sometimes reflect individual conscience or political strategy, as is allowed in other democracies like the UK and Canada. The court found that labeling horse trading as a "cancer" in the 2022 ruling was inappropriate, indicating that such language was politically charged and not legally grounded.

The 2024 ruling was diametrically opposite to the original ruling of May 2022 ruling headed by the supreme court Mr. Justice Umar Ata Bandial, CJ, Mr. Justice Ijaz ul Ahsan, Mr. Justice Mazhar Alam Khan Miankhel, Mr. Justice Munib Akhtar, Mr. Justice Jamal Khan Man-

dokhail. The ruling declared that any vote cast by a defecting member of a political party (in specific cases like elections of the prime minister, votes of confidence or no-confidence, budget votes, and constitutional amendments) would not be counted. The court also disqualified defecting members, forcing them to vacate their seats. This decision aimed to prevent defections, or "floor crossing," which was characterized as a form of horse trading that destabilizes political parties and weakens parliamentary democracy. The ruling emphasized that such defections eroded party discipline, undermined democratic processes, and allowed undue influence over lawmakers. The 2022 judgment sought to protect the integrity of parliamentary democracy by penalizing defections harshly. Defection was seen as a betrayal of the voters' mandate, which was granted based on party affiliation and policies. The 2022 ruling aligns most closely with Bangladesh's and India's approaches to controlling defections but even exceeds their stringency by invalidating votes outright. These countries aim to maintain party discipline, yet they respect the principle that all votes cast by elected representatives should be counted before any punishment is imposed. However, in established democracies like the UK, US, and Australia, there is greater emphasis on individual autonomy, with no legal consequences for defectors. The 2024 ruling allowed defectors' votes to be counted, marking a significant shift towards protecting legislative autonomy, aligning it more closely with international practices in countries like the UK, USA, and Australia. In these democracies, the right of individual legislators to vote freely is respected without the immediate legal threat of disqualification. However, the ruling also aligns to some degree with India and Bangladesh, where votes are counted before lawmakers are disqualified, maintaining a balance between party discipline and individual rights. In Pakistan, where the political landscape is marked by the influence of undemocratic forces, including coercion, threats, and manipulation of parliamentarians, interpreting Article 63-A to protect democracy is a nuanced issue. The environment in Pakistan, unlike established democracies such as the UK, US, or Australia, is more prone to "horse trading" (the buying and selling of votes) and manipulation by powerful establishments. In this context, both interpretations of Article 63-A-those of 2022 and 2024offer different paths for safeguarding democracy, but their effectiveness depends on the specific challenges of the political system. In a political environment like Pakistan's, where lawmakers can be coerced or bribed to switch allegiances, this 2022 ruling aimed to prevent destabilization by ensuring that defectors'

votes did not count in critical decisions, such as votes of no confidence or prime ministerial elections. This strict approach reflected an attempt to shield democracy from manipulation by undemocratic forces. It sought to enforce party loyalty and avoid external actors' influence on parliamentarians, which has historically undermined governments that do not fully reflect the people's mandate. However, this interpretation has drawbacks in terms of limiting individual legislators' autonomy. It centralizes power within party leadership, giving party heads significant control over their members and potentially stifling internal dissent or independent decision-making. While it tries to prevent external coercion, it could reinforce internal party coercion, as lawmakers are forced to toe the party line under threat of disqualification. The 2024 interpretation in the Pakistani context. where coercion and horse trading are rampant, risks enabling the very destabilization it seeks to avoid. If votes by defectors are counted without strict penparty structures to manipulate outcomes, especially in situations where the government does not reflect the genuine electoral mandate.

This interpretation might provide more legislative freedom, but in an environment where coercion is common, it could weaken democratic institutions by making them more susceptible to external manipulation. The decision leaves the control of defections to party leaders, which may not be sufficient to protect the system from widespread political engineering. In a fragile democracy like Pakistan's, where undemocratic forces often play a decisive role in political outcomes, the 2022 interpretation might provide a stronger bulwark against destabilization by enforcing party discipline and minimizing external interference.

Although it limits individual lawmakers' freedom, it better insulates the democratic process from coercive forces that undermine the people's mandate. Conversely, the 2024 interpretation, while more aligned with democratic principles in theory, risks exacerbating instability in the Pakistani context by allowing more room for horse trading and external interference. Thus, the 2022 interpretation—despite its limitations on individual autonomy—may better protect Pakistan's democracy from manipulation in the current political climate, while the 2024 interpretation, although more democratic in principle, may expose the system to greater risk of coercion and undue influence.

Sirbaz becomes first Pakistani to conquer 14 world's highest peaks

This remarkable achievement places him in world's most accomplished high-altitude mountaineers

KARACHI: Pakistani mountaineer Sirbaz Khan has made history by becoming the first Pakistani to summit all 14 of the world's 8,000-metre peaks, a feat accomplished by only a few elite climbers globally. Khan's latest triumph came on Friday when he scaled Shishapangma, an 8,027-meter peak in Tibet, marking the completion of his 14th "eight-thousander." This remarkable achievement places him in the ranks of the world's most accomplished high-altitude mountaineers.

Hailing from Hunza, Khan began his 14-peak journey in 2017 when he successfully summited Nanga Parbat, a notoriously dangerous 8,126-meter peak. This marked the start of his journey to scale all of the world's highest mountains. Over the years, he has conquered some of the most challenging peaks, including K2 in July 2018 and Lhotse in May 2019, where he became the first Pakistani to summit the 8,516-meter peak.

In July 2019, Khan added Broad Peak to his list of accomplishments, reaching its 8,051-meter summit without the use of supplementary oxygen, a feat that would become a hallmark of his climbs. Later that



lu in Nepal, becoming only the second Pakistani to reach its 8,163-meter summit. Khan's determination was unwavering, and in April 2021, he became the first Pakistani to summit Annapurna, one of the deadliest mountains in the world. The following month, he successfully summited Mount Everest, the highest peak on the planet, standing at 8,849 meters. In July 2021,

Khan led an all-Pakistani team to the summit of Gasherbrum II, standing at 8,035 meters, further cementing his reputation as a leader in high-altitude mountaineering. Just a few months later, in October 2021, he became the first Pakistani to summit Dhaulagiri, an 8,167-meter peak.

Finally, with his successful ascent of Shishapangma on October 4, 2024, Khan completed his mission, becoming the first Pakistani to conquer all 14 of the world's highest peaks.

Khan's extraordinary achievements, including summiting 11 of these peaks without supplementary oxygen, have brought him national and international recognition. His iournev is a testament to his skill, determination, and resilience, making him a true icon in the world of mountaineering.

Libya to resume oil production after central bank dispute ends

CAIRO: Libya's state-run oil company said Thursday it was restarting full oil production, almost two months after shutting down operations in two of its major fields amid a political crisis. The National Oil Corporation said in a statement that it would resume production at the Sharara and El-Feel oil fields, and export shipments from Es Sider, the country's largest port. In August, the company declared "force majeure," a legal maneuver that lets a company get out of its contracts because of extraordinary circumstances. As part of the review of the force majeure situation, NOC confirmed in its statement that it "can resume the operations of crude oil production and exporting operations to its customers." The National Oil Corporation previously blamed the shutdown on the Fezzan Movement, a local protest group. It came as the country's rival authorities were locked in a dispute over the governance of its Central Bank, which distributes the country's oil revenues. In August, the UN warned that the country was poised to face even greater instability due to the dispute. But that was resolved in recent days, when the country's parliament appointed a new governor to the bank. Libya produces more than 1.2 million barrels of oil per day, and Sharara is the country's largest field, producing up to 300,000 barrels per day. It was exporting most of it. In September, exports averaged 460,000 bpd according to oil analytics firm Kpler. The oil-rich country has been in political turmoil since a NATO-backed uprising toppled and killed longtime dictator Muammar Qaddafi in 2011. Since then, Libya has been split between rival administrations in the east and the west, each backed by militias and foreign governments. NOC declared force majeure on Aug. 7 at Sharara oilfield - one of Libya's largest production areas with a capacity of about 300,000 barrels per day - and on Elfeel oilfield on Sept.2. Sharara is located in southwestern Libya and operated by a joint venture of NOC with Spain's Repsol, France's TotalEnergies, Austria's OMV, and Norway's Equinor. Elfeel has a capacity of 70,000 barrels per day and is operated by Mellitah Oil and Gas, a joint venture between NOC and Italy's Eni. Two engineers at the field told Reuters the oilfield resumed production but not with full capacity due to maintenance work. Earlier, three engineers said there were some "technical problems' at Elfeel. The government in Benghazi in the east said oil production and exports would resume normal operations, after the rival authorities agreed last month to appoint Issa as new central bank governor. Authorities in the second-largest city had closed oilfields and halted most of crude exports on Aug. 26 in protest against a move by the Presidential Council, which sits in Tripoli in the west, to replace veteran central bank chief Sadiq Al-Kabir. The head of the Presidential Council, Mohamed Al-Menfi, met with Issa on Wednesday and stressed "the need for the central bank governor to commit to the technical role of the bank, stay away from politics, and not surpass the legal jurisdictions of the board of directors." The United Nations Support Mission in Libya UNSMIL welcomed in a statement NOC announcing the lifting of force majeure on oil production. The mission emphasized that "it is essential that revenues from this vital resource be channeled through the appropriate institutional framework, and ultimately to the Central Bank of Libya." Indian FM meets Sri Lanka's new leadership, assures support in economic rebuilding New Delhi: India's Foreign Minister S. Jaishankar arrived in Colombo on Friday to meet Sri Lanka's new president and government and assure New Delhi's continued support. Sri Lanka's new President Anura Kumara Dissanayake took office on Sept. 23, after winning the country's first presidential vote since its financial collapse in 2022. A day later, he appointed his three-member government and dissolved the parliament, clearing the way for new parliamentary elections scheduled for Nov. 14. The Indian foreign minister is the first top foreign official to pay an official visit to Sri Lanka since its regime change. He took to X after meeting Dissanayake, Prime Minister Harini Amarasuriya and Foreign Minister Vijitha Herath. "Discussed ways to deepen ongoing cooperation and strengthen India-Sri Lanka ties for the benefit of people of two countries and the region," Jaishankar said, as he also expressed "India's continued support to Sri Lanka's economic rebuilding." The Indian Ministry of External Affairs said the visit aimed to "further deepen the longstanding partnership" between the countries under India's Neighborhood First Policy and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's geopolitical framework of cooperation in the Indian Ocean region. Dissanayake, the country's first Marxist-leaning leader, took over the job on the promise of change, as the island nation of 22 million is still reeling from the crisis and austerity measures imposed by his predecessor as a part of a bailout deal with the International Monetary Fund.-APP

France, Italy launch project to exchange migrant trafficking information

PARIS: The interior ministers of France and Italy signed a declaration on their intention to exchange information related to migrant trafficking, the French interior ministry said on Friday. The project will be modeled after a similar deal between France and Britain, launched in 2020 in the north of France in a bid to stop attempts to reach the United Kingdom. France's new Interior Minister Bruno Retailleau, a law-and-order politician from the conservative Republican party (LR), said it was his priority to further toughen immigration laws, echoing remarks from the prime minister who said the country needed to control its border better. Immigration is also a tense domestic issue in Italy, where far-right Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni has pledged to drastically curb entries, though has not yet proved successful. "Its objective is clear: to trigger judicial investigations, often combined, aimed at dismantling the networks underpinning the illegal flow through Italy to the rest of the European Union, in which France remains a sought-after destination," the French interior ministry said in a statement. In November 2022, tensions flared between France and Italy after Italy refused to let a charity ship with migrants dock, forcing it to go instead to a port in southern France. The countries share a 500 km (300 mile) land border, mainly cutting through the Alps. Both countries are in the EU's Schengen area with no border controls between them, though individual countries are responsible for asylum seekers who arrive in them.-APP

Most of Lebanon's displacement shelters are full: UN

GENEVA: UN officials said on Friday most of Lebanon's nearly 900 shelters were full and that people fleeing Israeli military strikes were increasingly sleeping out in the open in streets or in public parks. "Most of the nearly 900 government established collective shelters in Lebanon have no more capacity," the UN refugee agency's Rula Amin told a Geneva press briefing. She said that they were working with local authorities to find more sites and that some hotels were opening their doors. "People are sleeping in public parks, on the street, the beach,' said Mathieu Luciano, the International Organization For Migration's office head in Lebanon. He confirmed that most shelters were full, including those in Beirut and Mount Lebanon.-APP

Sentiment in the occupied Jammu & Kashmir to defeat BJP

Muslim policies, and issues such as unemployment and security were major concerns of the people of IIO-JK. Kashmiri leader Altaf Hussain Wani emphasized the importance of preserving Kashmiri identity

amidst the pressures of political hegemony. "The fight isn't just about the number of voters; it's about ensuring our voices are heard and our rights are preserved," Wani remarked. Short term inflation goes up 0.44%

ISLAMABAD: The weekly inflation, measured by the Sensitive Price Indicator (SPI), witnessed an increase of 0.44 percent for the combined consumption groups during the week ended on October 03, the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) reported on Friday. According to the PBS data, the SPI for the week under review in the above-mentioned group was recorded at 319.17 points as compared to 317.76 points during the past week. As compared to the corresponding week of last year, the SPI for the combined consumption group in the week under review witnessed an increase of 13.18 per cent.

Likewise, SPI for the lowest consumption group of up to Rs 17,732 witnessed increase of 0.68 per cent and went up to 313.20 points from last week's 311.09 points. The SPI for consumption groups of Rs 17,732 to 22,888; 22,889-29,517; Rs 29,518-44,175 and above Rs 44,175, increased by 0.63 percent, 0.53 percent, 0.49 percent and percent respectively. During the week, out of 51 items, prices of 21 (41.18%) items increased, 10 (19.61%) items decreased and 20 (39.21%) items remained stable. The items, which recorded major decrease in their average prices on a week-on-week basis included eggs (1.45%), sugar (1.39%), diesel (1.32%), bananas (1.29%), potatoes (1.08%), petrol (0.81), pulse mash (0.80%), gur (0.59 %), basmati (0.53%) and pulse masoor (0.38%). The commodities which recorded major increase in their average prices on weekon-week basis included tomatoes (18.51%), onions (5.89%), chicken (3.72%), wheat flour (3.63%), garlic (2.47%), gram (1.41%), LPG (0.98%), match box (0.97%), pulse moong (0.92%), mustard oil (0.58%), firewood (0.51%) and cigarettes (0.10%). Onyear basis, the commodities that witnessed decrease included wheat flour (35.67%), petrol (23.51%), diesel (22.48%), chilies powder (20.00%), electricity charges for q1 (13.47%), sugar (12.65%), cooking oil 5 litre (10.74%), rice basmati broken (10.34%), pulse masoor (7.90%), vegetable ghee 2.5 kg (6.04%), gur (5.66%) and LPG (3.94%).-

Kim Jong threatens to use nukes if attacked

PYONGYANG: North Korean leader Kim Jong Un said his country would use nuclear weapons "without hesitation" if attacked by the South and ally the United States, state media reported on Friday. Relations between the two Koreas are at one of their lowest points in decades, with Seoul this week staging a military parade where it showcased its bunker-busting "monster" missile and President Yoon Suk Yeol warned Kim that using nukes would mean the end of his regime.

Pyongyang has also been bombarding the South with balloons carrying bags of trash, and a fresh flurry was seen floating over Seoul early on Friday by AFP reporters. Seoul's military confirmed it had detected the balloon launches overnight. If an enemy's forces were "encroaching upon the sovereignty" of the North, Pyongyang would "use without hesitation all the offensive forces it has possessed, including nuclear weapons," Kim said, according to the official Korean Central News Agency. Images in state media showed Kim, clad in his customary leather jacket, speaking at a training event for special operations forces. There, he slammed Yoon for his "end of regime" comments and "clamouring" about his country's alliance with the United States. - Agencies

LAHORE: The protest by blind people in Lahore has entered its 12th day as the demonstrators continue to demand the fulfillment of their rights. The talks initiated by the Punjab government on the direction of Punjab Chief Minister Punjab with the protesters a day ago remained fruitless as the blind people were adamant about continuing their protest until their de-

mands were addressed. They blocked a main road leading to the CM secretariat on Mall Road, significantly disrupting traffic flow in the city. While they opened one lane at Club Chowk to allow partial traffic movement, the sit-in continues outside the secretariat, causing serious inconvenience to the city's residents. Citizens are facing delays, with traffic in the area moving slowly due to the blockade. The protesters, who had previously held a sit-in at Faisal Chowk near the Lahore Press Club, have now shifted their demonstration to the CM Secretariat.

Despite facing police action in recent days, including reported violence, the blind individuals have refused to back down, emphasizing that they will not be silenced by intimidation.

Malaysian PM concludes Pak visit with 'productive outcome'

ISLAMABAD: Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim departed on Friday after completing his three-day state visit to Pakistan which he said held a "great personal significance". Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, who had received his Malaysian counterpart on his arrival on Wednesday, also saw him off at the airport, accompanied by Deputy PM and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar, federal cabinet members and senior officials. During the visit, Ibrahim, accompanied by a high-level delegation of ministers, deputy ministers and senior officials, held a oneon-one meeting with PM Shehbaz, led the delegation-level talks and held a "productive discussion" with President Asif Ali Zardari. Following the visit, PM Ibrahim wrote on his X timeline that the "engagements with my counterpart Shehbaz Sharif and President of Pakistan Asif Ali Zardari, alongside discussions with industry representatives, resulted in productive outcomes encompassing a wide array of mutual interests." He said that these interactions underscored the commitment of the highest leadership to enhance relations.

Both sides signed three MoUs to enhance bilateral cooperation in varying sectors. It was also agreed that Pakistan would export halal meat worth \$200 million and 100,000 tonnes of Basmati rice to Malaysia

"Certainly, there will be increased cooperation in all areas of trade and agricultural technology including meat, rice and palm oil imports by Pakistan, and the two countries will also expand cooperation in the skilled worker sector through critical areas



such as artificial intelligence (AI), digital and semiconductors," Ibrahim added. In another X post, he said: "The state visit to Pakistan holds great significance for me and the delegation, given the longstanding history of friendship between our two countries over the past 67 years.

Premier Ibrahim was also conferred the Nishan-i-Pakistan award by President Zardari in a special investiture ceremony. He was also conferred an honorary PhD Degree by the National University of Science and Technology, where he also delivered a public lecture. Later, PM Shehbaz said that during the visit. Pakistan and Malaysia agreed to further strengthen the bilateral relations and that the visit would usher in a new era of bilateral cooperation, according to a PM Office press release. Mentioning the positive outcome of the Pakistan-Malaysia Business Forum, he said that the enhanced bilateral trade would help boost exports and create job opportunities. Shehbaz said both countries signed MoUs

to promote trade and investment. Pakistan would increase its processed meat and rice export to Malaysia and ensure ease in the processes. The premier detailed that both sides agreed to enhance IT cooperation, manufacturing of electric vehicles and enhancement of bilateral trade. Punjab minister says she believes interior minister will not let PTI protestors enter federal capital

ISLAMABAD: Following the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI)'s insistence on holding a rally at Islamabad's D-Chowk today despite Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi's warning against it, Punjab Minister for Information AzmaBokhari on Friday said the party was a not a political party and it should be treated as a terrorist entity. 'The [PTI] is not a political party," Bokhari said during an

interview on a private news channel. To a query, the information minister said she heard the interior minister last day and she believed he would not let the PTI supporters enter the federal capital. Naqvi on Thursday warned the PTI against holding the public gathering as visits of foreign dignitaries were planned in Islamabad, including the Malaysian prime minister. Amid its anti-government campaign, the former ruling party - founded by Imran Khan is holding protests for the "independence" of the judiciary and the release of the former prime minister from jail. The protest will coincide with the final day of the Malaysian prime minister's visit to Pakistan and the upcoming Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit . The authorities have already enforced Section 144 and "the Peaceful Assembly and Public Order Act, 2024", regulating holding of public assemblies at certain places in Islamabad. "The PTI's top leadership should review its protest call [...] No one will be allowed for an onrush on Islamabad," the security czar said while addressing a presser along with officials of the federal police. Meanwhile, the provincial information minister the PTI

had always worked against Pakistan's development. "The country is progressing and inflation is dropping, but they cannot sit with peace," she said. She blamed PTI of using teargas shelling on police officials during last protest, adding that they would not have been stopped if they held peaceful protest. But they came for creating anarchy, she maintained. "The people of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa should ask

them why they did not do work. You cannot use public resources for vandalism," she said.

Israel to receive 'harsher' response, warns FM

BEIRUT: Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi vows that Iran will deal the Israeli regime with a "harsher response" if it takes any further aggressive measures against the Islamic Republic. The top diplomat made the remarks on Friday, addressing reporters in the Lebanese capital Beirut, to which he has travelled to hold bilateral meetings with senior Lebanese officials.

"We do not intend to continue [our] attacks," he said, adding, "If Israel takes any further action against Iran. our response will be harsher, and we will definitely retaliate." He highlighted that Iran's retaliation against such violation would be "proportionate and completely calculated."

The remarks came after the Islamic Republic launched hundreds of missiles towards the Zionist entity's military, and espionage and intelligence bases all over the occupied Palestinian territories as part of Operation True Promise II on Tuesday in response to the regime's deadly aggression against the country and other regional nations.

The aggression has seen the regime waging a genocidal war against the Gaza Strip, escalating its deadly attacks on Lebanon, and violating regional countries' sovereignty to carry out targeted assassination operations against senior regional officials. The atrocities have claimed tens of thousands of lives, including those of Hamas chief Ismail Haniyeh, Hezbollah's leader Sayyed Hassan Nasrallah, and Abbas Nilforoushan, a senior commander of Iran's Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC).

Hezbollah launches barrages of missiles at Haifa

BEIRUT: Lebanon's Hezbollah resistance movement has launched barrages of missiles at Haifa in the northern part of occupied territories. In a statement issued on Friday, Hezbollah said it fired missiles at Krayot, north of Haifa City,

at 07:00 am local time. The statement noted that that attack took place in solidarity with the Palestinian people who are subjected to a genocidal war in Gaza, and in retaliation for the Israeli strikes on Lebanon that claimed the lives of hundreds of civilians. According to Israeli media, sirens were sounded in Haifa, Caesarea, the Western Galilee, the Lower Galilee, Acre (Akko) and Nahariya. The resistance fighters also launched a barrage of missiles on mortar emplacements in southern KiryatShmona. They also fired a missile at a Merkava tank in the vicinity of Malkiya post, leaving its crew members either killed or injured. - Agencies

Russia has decided to remove Taliban from terror group list

Russia has been slowly building ties with the Taliban since it seized power in Afghanistan in August 2021 as US-led forces withdrew after 20 years of war but the movement is still officially outlawed in Russia

MOSCOW: Russia's Foreign Ministry said on Friday that a decision to remove the Taliban from a list of terrorist organizations had been "taken at the highest level," the state TASS news agency reported. The decision needs to be followed up with various legal procedures in order to make it a reality, President Vladimir Putin's special representative on Afghanistan, ZamirKabulov, was quoted as saying. Putin said in July that Russia considered Afghanistan's Taliban movement an ally in the fight against terrorism. Russia has been slowly building ties with the Taliban since it seized power in Afghanistan in August 2021 as US-led forces withdrew after 20 years of war but the movement is still officially outlawed in Russia. No country has formally recognized the Taliban as the country's legitimate leadership, although China and the UAE have accepted its ambassadors. Russia added the Taliban to its list of terrorist organizations in 2003. Removing it would be an important step by Moscow toward normalizing relations with Afghanistan. The Taliban's acting foreign minister Amir Khan Muttaqi said in a speech in Moscow that recent decisions by Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan to remove the former insurgents from a list of banned groups was a welcome step. "We also appreciate the positive remarks by the high-ranking officials of the Russian Federation in this regard and hope to see more effective steps soon," he said. In separate comments on Friday, Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov said Moscow was convinced of the need to maintain "pragmatic dialogue" with the current Afghan government. "It is obvious that it is impossible to

solve problems or even discuss an Afghan settlement without Kabul," Lavrov said. "Moscow will continue its course on developing political, trade and economic ties with Kabul," he added, speaking at a meeting in Moscow with Muttaqi and representatives of neighboring countries.
