Weapons left by US in Afghanistan fuel terrorism in Pakistan

WASHINGTON: Terrorists who attacked the Jaffar Express train in Balochistan last month used weapons left behind when United States forces withdrew from Afghanistan, an investigation by an American newspaper revealed on Monday. The Jaffer Express was attacked on March 11 when Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) terrorists ambushed the Peshawar-bound train carrying 440 passengers, opening fire and taking hostages. Consequently, the security forces initiated an operation that lasted two days. Inter-Services Public Relations Director General Lt Gen Ahmed Sharif Chaudhry said on March 12 that the Jaffar Express clearance operation launched a day after the train's unprecedented hijacking, was complete. He added that all terrorists, 33 in total, at the site of the attack had been killed. According to newspaper, an M4A1 carbine rifle built by American manufacturer Colt was recovered from the site of the attack. The rifle's serial number indicated that it was part of billions of dollars worth of weaponry sent to US forces in Afghanistan, who abandoned much of their equipment when withdrawing in 2021. "Many of the weapons wound up across the border in Pakistan, at arms bazaars and in the hands of insurgents, illustrating how the consequences of America's failed war continue to reverberate years after the fall of Kabul to the Taliban," newspaper wrote. The publication wrote that Pakistan is now trying to contain terrorism in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan, where fighters are equipped with American weapons and gear. US rifles, machine guns and night-vision goggles, originally meant to help stabilise Afghanistan, are now being used by the Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) and other groups to carry out attacks, newspaper reported citing weapons traders and government officials.

ISLAMABAD: Senate Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs Chairman Irfan Siddiqui says the relations between Pakistan and Afghanistan are on the mend. Pakistan remittances reach alltime high

UAE, Saudi Arabia lead March remittance inflows to Pakistan, shows SBP data

KARACHI: Pakistan's workers' remittances surged to a record \$4.1 billion in March 2025 - the first time monthly inflows have crossed the \$4 billion mark, the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) said on Monday. This historic inflow represents a 37.3% year-onvear increase from March 2024 and a 29.8% month-onmonth rise compared to February 2025. It is the highest level of monthly remittances ever recorded in the country's history. According to Mustafa Mustansir, Director of Research and Business Development at Taurus Securities Limited, the surge

PESHAWAR: As the forced repatriation of Afghan nationals from Pakistan continues, the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) has reduced its cash assistance to Afghan families holding Proof of Registration (PoR) cards, compounding the challenges faced by thousands of returnees. Previously, the UNHCR provided \$375 to each Afghan family with PoR documentation upon their return to Afghanistan. However, this amount has now been slashed to \$140, payable at the main entry points such as Jalalabad and Kandahar. When contacted, UNHCR Communications Officer Qais-


arAfridi confirmed the reduction in financial assistance, citing a sharp decrease-approximately 80 percent-in contributions from donor countries and member states. "Due to significant cuts in funding, we've had to adjust our financial support to returning Afghan families," Afridi explained. Importantly, this assistance is limited only to those Afghans who possess valid PoR cards and are repatriating voluntarily. Those without proper documentation-or even those holding Afghan Citizen Cards (ACCs)-are not eligible for any financial support from UNHCR.

Meanwhile, the mass evacuation of Afghans from Pakistan remains ongoing. Afridi revealed that between April 1 and April 13, 2025, over 63,616 Afghans crossed back into Afghanistan via the Torkham border. Of these, 17,055 individuals were forcibly deported after being detained by police

timated 917,000 Afghan nationals have been deported from Pakistan, many after spending days in detention facilities. This has raised serious humanitarian concerns among local and international observers. Despite assurances from the Taliban-led government in Kabul about facilitating returnees with shelter, transportation, and other support, ground realities paint a different picture. Insider reports suggest that 80 percent of the returnees lack proper housing, employment, and basic resources upon their return.

The Afghan government is currently offering 31,000 Afghanis (approx. USD 400) per returning family to cover transportation and initial settlement costs at major crossing points such as Torkham and Chaman. In Kunar province-bordering Pakistan's Bajaur and Mohmand districts-the local administration has started distributing house allotment letters to the homeless returnees. Additionally, the Taliban administration has established temporary camps and transit centers in Jalalabad, Laghman, Kabul, Kandahar, Khost, Gardez, and other regions to assist families in reaching their final destinations. However, strong resentment and condemnation continue to grow, both domestically and internationally, against Pakistan's policy of forced deportation. A delegation led by former Afghan MP Fauzia Kofi-comprising ex-parliamentarians and civil society activists-recently visited Islamabad.



Over Rs 2.58b uplift project approved for South Waziristan

Pakhtunkhwa government has approved a development project worth over Rs. 2.58 billion for South Waziristan. The project, titled "Special Integrated Area Development Programme", is aimed at accelerating development activities in the merged districts, particularly South Waziristan. Initially, the project was estimated at Rs. 2.18 billion, but under the revised PC-1, an additional Rs. 400 million was added, bringing the total to Rs. 2.58 billion. Currently, Rs. 900 million has been allocated for the project's initial phase. The project will be implemented



9 sheesha cafes shut, 64 held

ISLAMABAD:In a coordinated move, the district administration and police teams conducted surprise raids late Monday night, shutting down nine sheesha cafes operating illegally in Bahria Town's Civic Center.

The operation, aimed at curbing unauthorized indoor hookah services, resulted in the arrest of 60 men and 4 women allegedly linked to the businesses. FIRs have been registered against all the arrested accused, and further investigation is in progress. According to the spokesman of Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) administration, 110 hookah devices, along with flavoured tobacco products, were confiscated during the raids. The crackdown follows growing concerns over violations of public health regulations and indoor smoking bans. Officials emphasized that the cafes were operating without permits and failed to comply with safety standards. The spokesman said that the operation began shortly after midnight, with teams entering multiple establishments suspected of offering sheesha services discreetly. Patrons and staff present during the raids were detained for questioning. District officials highlighted that the action aligns with broader efforts to enforce anti-smoking laws, particularly in indoor spaces. "These facilities posed risks to public health and ignored legal guidelines," stated a spokesman. "We will continue targeting non-compliant businesses." Health experts warn that sheesha use, often perceived as safer than cigarettes, carries significant risks, including exposure to higher levels of toxic chemicals. Authorities confirmed that further inspections are planned across the district to identify similar operations. Residents have been urged to report illegal shisha services via dedicated hotlines. The crackdown marks a renewed push to uphold public health laws, with officials vowing zero tolerance for unauthorized hookah businesses. -DNA

ISLAMABAD: Chairman Capital Office FCCI Karim Aziz Malik has stated that food security has become a serious issue that authorities must address immediately. Merit-based selection of Moavineen-e-Hujjaj to be ensured

CTO pays surpriss visit to F-6 Markaz

ISLAMABAD: Chief Traffic Officer (CTO) Captain (R) Syed Zeeshan Haider paid a surprise late-night visit to F-6 Markaz to inspect traffic arrangements and issue onthe-spot directions to traffic officers on duty. A public relations officer told media that under the special direction of the CTO Zeeshan a comprehensive review of the traffic flow and management was conducted to ensure smooth vehicular movement. SC summons reports on forest lands across country

ISLAMABAD :The Supreme Court has summoned comprehensive reports from all provincial governments and the federal government regarding the forest land case. A five-member constitutional bench headed by Justice Aminuddin Khan, and comprising Justice Jamal Khan Mandokhail, Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar, Justice Syed Hasan Azhar Rizvi and Justice Shahid Bilal Hassan was conducting the proceedings. During the hearing, the apex court directed all provinces and the federal government to submit detailed reports, including data on encroached and reclaimed forest land.

Justice Jamal Mandokhail questioned the status of the forest land issue within Islamabad's jurisdiction, to which the ed that the matter had been resolved. Justice Mandokhail remarked that "We don't just want reports, we need to see

the reality,". Highlighting the harsh conditions in cold regions, Justice Mandokhail asked, "What should people in Ziarat do when temperatures drop to minus 17 degrees Celsiusshould they stop cutting trees without any alternative? Has the government provided alternate energy sources in cold areas?" The government counsel informed the court that LPG is being supplied to Ziarat. Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar then questioned whether any subsidies are being provided to the impoverished residents of mountainous regions. Justice Aminuddin Khan stated that it is the government's responsibility to provide better facilities to the people, while Justice Mazhar pointed out that reports have been submitted since 2018, but no significant progress has been observed. Justice Hasan Rizvi noted that forest land in Sindh is being eroded by the sea, and Justice Mandokhail added that it is not the Supreme Court's job to plant trees.—APP

ISLAMABAD, Speaker of the National Assembly Sardar Ayaz Sadiq on Monday reaffirmed Parliament's collective resolve to address the challenges faced by overseas Pakistanis, stressing that both the government and opposition remain united on the matter. Speaking at the inaugural Overseas Pakistanis Convention, he said that every member of the National Assembly, regardless of political party, fully supports the cause of the overseas community. "Our fellow Pakistanis living abroad are the true ambassadors of our country," he said. "Your support and partnership are crucial for building a

better future for everyone." He described overseas Pakistanis as the backbone of the nation, playing a key role in connecting Pakistan with the world. Your actions and words shape how the world sees our country," he added. The Speaker appreciated the Overseas Pakistanis Foundation for launching a new initiative to address the challenges faced by expatriates. He urged overseas Pakistanis to share their concerns so the government could respond with effective solutions. "Whether it's through business, education, or promoting Pakistan's image abroad, your contributions are significant," he said. Recalling his recent meetings with global dignitaries-including the Speaker of Saudi Arabia and

elected officials from the United States-he noted that many praised the achievements of Pakistanis living overseas. "When international leaders speak highly of our citizens abroad, it makes us proud. It reflects the hard work and integrity of our people," he said. "The purpose of this convention is to listen to your voices. The National Assembly belongs to you as much as it does to us," he said. "Although dual nationals are currently not allowed to contest elections, this issue needs fresh discussion in the parliament." He stressed the importance of recognizing those who send large amounts of money back home. "You send more remittances than the country earns through exports. If we

honor top exporters, why not top remitters?" he asked. He supported the idea of giving top remitters the honorary status of "roaming ambassadors."

Ayaz Sadiq also emphasized the importance of using formal remittance channels and ending the use of informal systems like hundi. "Money sent through legal means strengthens the economy, increases tax collection, and brings transparency. Those using official channels should not face unnecessary scrutiny or extra taxes," he said. He acknowledged the difficulties overseas that Pakistanis face at embassies, particularly in countries like the UAE, Saudi Arabia, and Italy. "People who send money home should be treated with the

same respect at embassies as ministers and MNAs. Why can't we offer them that dignity?" he asked. Calling for reforms, he urged the government to make it easier for returning expatriates to reintegrate into society. He suggested simplifying processes such as police verification, introducing a low-cost fee system, and offering fast-track certification. He also highlighted the serious problem of land grabbing, which affects many overseas Pakistanis. "There must be strict punishment for those who illegally seize their land-from the local patwari to police officers and even senior officials. These people invest their life savings with the dream of coming home. Losing their land is a national

shame," he said. He stressed the need to shift toward digital and paperless services, especially for documents like ID cards and embassy procedures. "If our children abroad can work remotely, why should overseas Pakistanis have to stand in lines at embassies?" he asked. He also pointed out the potential of medical tourism, saying, "Our doctors abroad are doing great. Why not encourage them to work in Pakistan, too? It would be affordable and efficient." Concluding his speech, he called for unity and action. "Let's move forward-together and with purpose-for those who support Pakistan from afar with their hearts, minds, and hardearned money."

Aun Chaudhry praises overseas **Pakistanis**



Obituary: Professor Khurshid Ahmad (23 March 1932 – 13 April 2025)

ISLAMABAD: Renowned statesman and thinker, political activist, economist, author, editor, and researcher Professor Khurshid Ahmad (born March 23, 1932, in Delhi) passed away peacefully on April 13, 2025, in Leicester, UK, surrounded by his family members. Inna lillahi wa inna ilaihi rajiun... Prof Khurshid Ahmad was among those distinguished Pakistani personalities recognized globally as thought leaders and advocates for Pakistan and the Muslim Ummah. He was a scholar and leader whose sincerity, intellectual depth. and patriotism were acknowledged even by those who held differing ideological and political views. He became politically active in his school days in Delhi as a member of 'Bachcha Muslim League' and took an active part in the Pakistan Movement. His family migrated to Karachi after the Partition, where his intellectual activism led him to the Islami Jamiat Talaba (IJT), an Islamist student organization, and his leadership role transformed it into one of the most vibrant student movements in Pakistan. He played a key role in the democratic struggle against President Ayub Khan's martial



law as IJT's Nazim-e-Aala (president) and was imprisoned. His intellectual and political leadership was one of the main contributors to the defeat of the student organizations inspired by the Leftist ideology and their retreat from major universities and colleges of Pakistan in the 1960s and 70s and eventually from the political scene of the country. Later, he rose through the ranks

of Jama'at-e-Islami and became one of the closest associates of its founder, Maulana Saiyyed Abul Aala Maududi, particularly within the top intellectual leadership of the Islamic movement. He started his academic career teaching economics at the University of Karachi and wrote several treatises on Islamic ideology and economics. He also inspired and gathered a large number of international scholars around him to organize a global intellectual movement for the Islamization of contemporary knowledge, especially in the policy arena. Prof Khurshid Ahmad served as a member of the Senate of Pakistan for more than two decades, from 1985 to 2012, with a brief interruption, and in 1978, he held the position of Federal Minister for Planning and Deputy Chairman of the Planning Commission of Pakistan, In 1979, he founded the Institute of Policy Studies (IPS) in Islamabad - the first non-government think tank of Pakistan - and continued to serve as its chairman until 2021. He was also a founding trustee of the International Islamic University, Islamabad; founding chairman of Islamic Foundation, Leicester, UK and president of

its Markfield Institute of Higher Education (the first academic centre of Islamic economics and finance in the Western world); founder chairman of the University of Management and Technology, Lahore; and patron and pioneering board member of several institutions and organizations across the Muslim world. Prof Khurshid Ahmad authored and edited over 130 books in Urdu and English. His books and articles have been translated and published in numerous languages, including Arabic, French, Turkish, Bengali, Japanese, German, Indonesian, Hindi, Chinese, Korean, Persian, and others. His scholarly statesmanship and publications contributed a lot in translating and transmitting the Islamic ideology, especially inspired by the works of Iqbal and Maududi into the mainstream national discourse of Pakistan. Many of his books are essential reads for higher education courses in the country and preparation of CSS exams. Doctoral dissertations on his intellectual contributions have been written at prominent universities in Malaysia, Turkey, and Germany.

Tariff flip-flops

A S of Sunday evening US Eastern Time, when this piece was being drafted, US President Donald Trump suggested that he is indeed considering a new sectoral tariff regime on smartphones, computers and other electronics that our lives depend on. This was the latest development, not long after US Customs and Border Protection uploaded a bulletin past 10pm on Friday night, notifying anyone who might have been refreshing the agency's site at that hour that those products would be exempt from Trump "Liberation Day" tariffs. If you're heavily invested in Apple, you might have been ecstatic when you read the news about the exclusion and perhaps bought another whack of shares in the maker of mostly made-in-China iPhones. And if you did, you surely would have been miffed to learn that Apple's marquee product could still face some level of tariff that may - or may not - be unveiled this week. Keep in mind that all of this happened after investors started dumping US Treasury bonds at a time when these instruments should have been seen as a safe haven; it was during that melee that Trump announced his 90-day pause on the Liberation Day tariffs. Each of these twists and turns has been chalked up to the supposedly ruthless attempts by America's friends and foes alike, during many US administrations, to exploit the country. However, what Trump leaves out is that these decades of alleged scheming by America's trade partners have clearly failed, considering how much others have envied the US' economy and technological innovation. The United States' economic dominance has been in place for so many decades that many people alive today have only known such a reality. Washington has dictated the rules for just as long, enforcing them with the power of its currency. Trump and the hardliners in his cabinet are right to be worried that Chinese companies have managed to muscle in on America's global economic and military dominance. China's advances in the most important industries of this century – such as artificial intelligence and green technologies, and the supply chains that support them - threaten the American exceptionalism that has attracted the world's brightest and most ambitious innovators.= Former US president Joe Biden's many orders restricting advanced technology exports to China failed to keep America's lead on this front intact and might even have hastened the country's vault to the technological forefront. For anyone concerned about China's growing global market share in electric vehicles and other products that consumers want worldwide - and no one should be more concerned than Trump if he is indeed a true American patriot more action is needed. But forget about carrots and sticks. Trump, in his inimitable form, has stepped up with a tariff bazooka aimed at allies, adversaries, investors and penguins - just about everyone except Russian President Vladimir Putin.= His shots have blown a hole in the course of world history by undermining the transatlantic alliance that kept the US and countries that were part of it safe and wealthy. Not even the sharpest analysts would have imagined the hostility that he has directed at Canada. That includes a gross mischaracterisation of the trade relationship that has served to expand the North American market, making it more attractive to investors.= The White House says that more than 75 countries are looking to negotiate new trade deals. In the home of the Oracle

RUMP, tariffs, and trust dominated the 10th Delphi Economic Forum in Greece which concluded on Friday. Since taking office last January, US President Donald Trump has left world leaders, economists, and political analysts struggling to predict the future. After all, the case was - and very much still is – that when America sneezes, the world catches a cold. One only has to imagine how friends and foes alike are rushing to think tanks, analysts, and lobbyists to try to decipher the announcements and executive orders coming out of Washington on a daily basis. It is, therefore, perhaps fitting that a large number of the global elite gathered at a mountain town believed by ancient Greeks to be the home of the Oracle. Legend has it that Delphi was an ancient religious sanctuary dedicated to the mythical Greek figure Apollo. Developed in the eighth century B.C., the sanctuary was home to the Oracle of Delphi, known throughout the ancient world for predicting the future. Opening the Delphi Economic Forum, Greek President Konstantinos Tasoulas did not mince his words, saying that his country "supports transatlantic ties, while it contributes to efforts for its strategic autonomy, and the de-escalation of the trade war that is harmful to everyone, always advocating for a unified European policy." As he noted, "in an era in which global upheavals and radical changes are already apparent in both geopolitics and geoeconomics, with a pre-war-style imposition of intense protectionism that is disrupting and worsening the postwar global free economic system, our country is called upon to walk on familiar and tried-and-tested paths." Many questions were raised about Ukraine, whether it would be abandoned, and in the absence of the Russian narrative, most people were left wondering what comes next. Well, the answer might emerge soon from Saudi Arabia if the peace talks succeed.= In fact, Saudi Arabia was the only other topic that competed with Trump, and not just in the context of Ukraine. When it comes to stabilizing energy prices and ending the war in Gaza, all hopes are on the solutions that may come out of Riyadh. This is thanks to the Kingdom's foreign policy, which has pursued a fine balancing act, staying close to the US and the West, while at the same time strengthening its relations with China and Russia, and trying to minimize or eradicate conflicts and disputes with countries such as Iran. Let us also not forget that Riyadh enjoys an excellent relationship with Trump due to the trust and respect built during his first administration. When you combine such a web of relationships with the religious clout and economic might that the Kingdom enjoys, one can only begin to imagine the sphere of influence it has which was and is being used to help resolve regional and international conflicts. However, there is an added element, too, for Saudi-Greek bilateral ties, which have grown tremendously in the past eight years. Early this year, the relationship was strengthened by the visit of Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis to Saudi Arabia. Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman received him in AlUla and he also visited the historic UNESCO World Heritage Site at Hegra. They discussed relations between the two countries as well as ways to increase cooperation in various fields. The crown prince and Mitsotakis also chaired the Saudi-Greek Strategic Partnership Council, which oversees areas of current and future cooperation.

Charity and self-reliance in Pakistan

N Pakistan, a vast network of public and private institutions provides free meals to thousands of individuals daily through community kitchens. The primary objective of these initiatives is to assist the poor and the deserving so that no one goes to bed hungry. While this act of generosity and social welfare is commendable, it also has a darker aspect-many beneficiaries are physically capable individuals who have become reliant on free meals rather than seeking employment. This raises an essential question; Are we truly helping them, or are we fostering a culture of dependence by discouraging self-reliance? According to available reports, nearly a thousand community kitchens and meal centers are currently operating across the country, run both by the government and private organizations. These initiatives provide free meals to thousands daily, with various charitable organizations playing a crucial role in distributing food in major cities such as Karachi, Lahore, Islamabad, Peshawar and other cities. Annually, billions of rupees are spent on these programs. While these efforts offer temporary relief, they fail to address the root causes of poverty and unemployment. A portion of these funds, if allocated to vocational training, small businesses, or industrial workshops, could yield more sustainable and long-term positive outcomes.

An analysis of Pakistan's socio-economic conditions reveals that unemployment, lack of education, and inadequate vocational training opportunities are major contributors to poverty. Countries that have successfully reduced poverty have done so by investing in human resources, skill development, and economic self-sufficiency. Pakistan must adopt a similar model. Economic self-sufficiency is essential for national dignity. While global cooperation is necessary, Pakistan's policies must prioritize self-reliance rather than perpetual dependence on loans and foreign aid. The nation possesses vast potential

in agriculture, energy, and industry. If uti- Islamic model. Instead of merely providing lized effectively, these resources can reduce reliance on external financial support. Promoting local businesses, increasing exports, and reducing unnecessary imports are key measures for economic stability.

The global economy is in turmoil. Now is the time to build a new order

E live in difficult times, and it is challenging to remain optimistic about the future. Climate change threatens human wellbeing and planetary health, and the window to secure a liveable and sustainable future for all is rapidly closing. Neo-fascism is spreading across continents. Militarism is on the rise. Genocide in Palestine continues to be livestreamed while war rages on from Sudan to Ukraine and Myanmar. Workers suffer under a worldwide assault on their political rights and freedoms. In short, we live in a world imperialist economy that continually reproduces inequality, poverty and war and is driven by the capitalist logic of ever-expanding accumulation that is pushing us towards planetary breakdown. We need alternative visions, and fast. With this in mind, the Havana Group of the Progressive International launched its Program of Action on the Construction of a New International Economic Order towards the end of 2024. The launch was timed to mark the 50th anniversary of its namesake. The Program of Action, adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in 1974, sought to establish principles for equality between nations and peoples, but it was undone by the oil and Global South debt crises, combined with United States-led resistance to its implementation. Arguably, the 2024 Program of Action stands a better chance. Many Global South countries have significantly increased their economic and political power over the past 50 years while the North is shaken by US President Donald Trump's economic policies in pursuit of his "America first". US unilateralism may well undo the Global North's decades-long coordinated action to maintain its dominant position. In this context, the updated 2024 programme proposes policies that can break the developmental divide between the Global North and South and deliver a "sustainable future" of "shared prosperity across the world".

To achieve these goals, the programme identifies five major areas for collective action by governments in the South: climate, industry, finance, technology and governance. Within each area, several objectives are set out, followed by implementable measures for how to get there. The 31 proposed measures contain a mix of the old and the new, from long-established efforts to improve the terms of trade, to new initiatives, such as resource recycling clubs to address waste and the coordinated development of a public digital infrastructure. The most notable new addition, and of no surprise, is climate. Here, the programme is bold and uncompromising in its objectives, demanding full sovereignty over resources, clean energy abundance, the end of economic dependency, ecologically equal exchange of materials and energy, environmental justice and climate reparations. Taken together, the programme's set of 31 proposed measures can be read as a suggestive roadmap for what the late Egyptian economist Samir Amin called "delinking". For him, the essence of the anti-imperialist strategy of delinking lies in the South, breaking from the demands imposed by the North and reorienting towards the priorities, needs and interests of its peoples. Amin noted that the core elements of a delinking agenda would entail industrialisation for the mass production of domestic goods, reviving peasant agriculture and reasserting sovereign control over productive activity and economic policy. All these aspects are in Progressive International's Program of Action. Central to each of the programme's 31 proposals is the need for coordinated action across the South to establish a range of clubs, agencies, networks, frameworks and commissions. In this, the programme is calling for a revival of "unity in diversity", one of the central principles of the Bandung Conference, held in Indonesia in 1955 and attended by 29 Asian and African states to promote a common agenda against colonialism and

neocolonialism. It is easy to dismiss all this as naive optimism, given various faultlines between regions and nations of the South. Equally, it is difficult to see past its centrality to breaking the North-South divide and building a more equitable and just future. There is also the question of whether we can rely on governing political elites to lead us into this new world. The programme suggests we can. Yet the increasing capture of the state and the ruling classes by the logics and demands of capital accumulation and the development of global capitalism can pose a major challenge.

Often, governing elites function as both promoters and beneficiaries of this trend. Governments in the Global South are not only – or not necessarily – mere victims of the ills of Northern capital. In many instances, they actively participate in and materially benefit from the reproduction of the existing global capitalist order. The task ahead lies not in awaiting salvation from the enlightened ruling classes but in building at home the economic and political power of what Guyanese historian and revolutionary Walter Rodney termed the "working people". Self-organised peasants and workers have historically played leading roles in anti-capitalist politics and liberation struggles against colonial and imperial subjugation.

Today, six in 10 workers globally are in informal employment, increasing to nine in 10 workers in the world's poorest countries. To reflect this reality, labourorganising must go beyond formal wage employment to include informal and self-employed labour as well as reproductive labour. Any collective flourishing within a new international economic order will once again depend on the determining role played by labour and popular forces, broadly understood. Without this, the excesses of global capital and the violence, impoverishment and inequality these reproduce will never be constrained.

The transgender community, in particular, has publicly refused to leave Pakistan. fearing severe marginalization and threats to their lives upon return. As forced evacuations continue and international aid diminishes, the plight of Afghan refugees-many of whom have lived in Pakistan for decades-remains one of the region's most urgent and overlooked humanitarian crises.

From Page 01 Hussain, 35, a special forces constable who was critically injured in a nighttime attack in KP last year, told newspaper, "They have the latest American-made weapons. "They could see us, but we couldn't see them," he added. The newspaper added that in May 2024, Pakistani officials gave the paper access to dozens of weapons that they said were seized from captured or dead terrorists. After months of inquiries, the US Army and the Pentagon confirmed to newspaper that 63 of the weapons that were shown to reporters had been provided by the US government to Afghan national forces. Most of the weapons were M16 rifles, alongside several more modern M4 carbines. Pakistani officials also displayed a handful of PVS14 night-vision devices, which are widely used by the US military but newspaper could not independent-US government property.

However, he accused Israel of obstructing progress toward a ceasefire. "The issue is not the number of captives,' Nunu said, "but rather that the occupation is reneging on its commitments, blocking the implementation of the ceasefire agreement and continuing the war." "Hamas has therefore stressed the need for guarantees to compel the occupation (Israel) to uphold the agreement," he added. Israeli news website Ynet reported on Monday that a new proposal had been put to Hamas. Under the deal, the group would release 10 living hostages in exchange for US guarantees that Israel would enter negotiations for a second phase of the ceasefire. The first phase of the ceasefire, which began on January 19 and included multiple hostage-prisoner exchanglasted two months disintegrating.

BRUSSELS: Red Bull motorsport adviser Helmut Marko says he has "great concern" about Max Verstappen's future with the team in the context of their current struggles. The four-time champion finished sixth in the Bahrain Grand Prix on Sunday, while Oscar Piastri scored McLaren's third win in four races so far this year. Dutchman Verstappen is third in the drivers' championship, eight points behind leader Lando Norris of McLaren. Marko told media: "The concern is great. Improvements have to come in the near future so that he has a car with which he can win again. We have to create a basis with a car so that he can fight for the world championship." Verstappen has a contract with Red Bull until 2028. But Marko told BBC Sport this month that it contains a performance clause that could allow him to leave the team. The wording of this clause is not known publicly but it effectively says that Red Bull have to provide Verstappen with a winning car. Verstappen won the Japanese Grand Prix a week before Bahrain but that victory was founded on a pole position lap that many F1 obovertaking was next to impossible at Suzuka, Verstappen was able to hold back the McLarens of Norris and Piastri and take his first win of the year. Verstappen has qualified third, fourth and seventh for the other three races in Australia, China and Bahrain. The Red Bull is on average over all qualifying sessions this year the second fastest car but 0.214 seconds a lap slower than the McLaren. Verstappen has complained all year about balance problems with the Red Bull, which is unpredictable on corner entry and has mid-corner understeer. Red Bull team principal Christian Horner admitted after the race in Bahrain that the car's balance problems were fundamentally similar to the ones that made the second half of last year a struggle for Verstappen. He won just twice in the final 13 races of last season, but managed to win his fourth world title because of the huge lead he built up when Red Bull were in dominant form in the first five races of the season. Horner also said the team were having difficulties with correlation between their wind tunnel and on-track performance. Essentially, the car performs differently on track than the team's simulation tools say it should. Verstappen had a difficult race in Bahrain including delays at both pit stops, one with the pit-lane traffic light system and one with fitting a front wheel. - Agencies

DUBAI: Title fights are nothing new to Alexander Volkanovski. His featherweight bout early Sunday morning against Diego Lopes was his 10th championship fight in a row, but Volkanovski had been in a slump in which he had lost three of his past four matches. He left little doubt against Lopes at UFC 314, winning by unanimous decision. Two judges scored the fight 49-46 and the other had it 48-47. "It's good to be back," Volkanovski said. "I promised my girls I would bring the belt back to them. It doesn't matter about bringing the belt back. The message was a lot of people counted me out." Volkanovski (27-4) had successfully defended his belt four times before moving up a weight class and losing to Israel Makhachev on Feb. 11, 2023. Then after reclaiming the featherweight title five months later over Yair Rodriguez, Volkanovski lost back-to-back matches. President Donald Trump, a longtime friend of UFC Presi-

dent and CEO Dana White and a fan of the sport, watched from the front row. Shaquille O'Neal approached Trump and shook his hand. Cabinet officials TulsiGabbard, Marco Rubio and Robert F. Kennedy Jr. also were in attendance as was X (formerly Twitter) owner and White House adviser Elon Musk. In the co-main event, No. 12 lightweight contender Paddy Pimblett continued his UFC rise with a technical knockout of No. 7 Michael Chandler at 3:07 of

the third round. Pimblett, a 30-year-old from Liverpool, England, has won all seven of his bouts since moving to the organization, giving him a 23-3 record overall. "I want that world title," Pimblett said. "Some say I'll never be champ, I'll never get run, I'll never be in the top 10. But what now?" At nearly 39, Chandler has some decisions to making after winning just two of his most recent seven bouts. He is 23-10. Featherweight Bryce Mitchell, who fought for the first time since praising Adolf Hitler and denying the Holocaust on a podcast, was also on the card. He later backed off his comments and though White heavily criticized Mitchell, he didn't discipline him. Mitchell was little match for Jean



Silva in their featherweight fight. Silva won by submission with a guillotine choke with 1:08 left in the second round. Volkanovski, despite getting cut below his right eye in the second and being floored by an overhand right in that round, dominated the first three rounds. But Lopes' glove caught Volkanovski's other eye in the fourth round and then pounced, but failed to put him away. That set up the fifth round and, barring a knockout, Volkanovski appeared on his way to victory even though Lopes spent much of the fight verbally challenging him and inviting him to box. Theatrics to the contrary, Volkanovski was the aggressor. Volkanovski had hoped to get another shot at Ilia Topuria and avenge his loss from more than a year ago at UFC 298. But Topuria moved up to the lightweight division, leaving the featherweight class vacant. In stepped Lopes, the third-ranked challenger, to take on Volkanovski, the 36-year-old from Australia. Lopes, a 30-year-old from Brazil, was in first title bout. "Maybe I came up short on the technical piece." Lopes said through an interpreter. "I can see myself coming back. I have only two years in this organization, and I think I'm going to train better. I'm going to get better." Volkanovski was a -160 favorite at BetMGM Sportsbook to defeat Lopes (26-7), whose five-match winning streak ended. In preparing for Lopes, Volkanovski said he fully committed himself by beginning training camp earlier than usual and focusing on the workout recovery process and dieting in addition to the physical demands. He said he has never been this lean going into a bout.

Turkiye seeks growing influence in

ISTANBUL: Turkiye has long sought to extend its influence in Africa by mediating in conflicts and building military partnerships with countries on the continent. Those efforts have picked up speed in recent months with diplomatic successes in resolving local conflicts, and as traditional powers such as France and the United States pull back from the continent, according to analysts and diplomats. An annual diplomacy forum in the southern Mediterranean resort of Antalya on April 11-13 drew many African officials, including the president of Somalia, as part of Ankara's efforts to consolidate its foothold in Africa. Today African countries are looking for alternatives, and Turkiye represents one of those options, so it has resonated well in Africa," Professor Eghosa Osaghae, director general of the Nigerian Institute of International Affairs, who attended the forum, told AFP. Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has boosted his international standing after backing rebels who overthrew Syrian ruler Bashar Assad and brokering a key Horn of Africa peace deal between Somalia and Ethiopia. Ankara, which also hosted two rounds of talks between Russia and Ukraine at the start of the war, has often said it is ready to support any initiative leading to peace between its two Black Sea neighbors.—APP

EU announces \$1.7b in new aid for **Palestinians**

LUXEMBOURG: The European Union on Monday announced a new three-year financial support package for the Palestinians worth up to 1.6 billion euros (\$1.8 billion) The fresh aid pledge came just ahead of a meeting between Palestinian prime minister Mohammed Mustafa and EU foreign "We are stepping up our support to the Palestinian people. EUR1.6 billion until 2027 will help stabilize the West Bank and Gaza," EU foreign policy chief Kaja Kallas wrote on X. The EU is looking to boost the Palestinian Authority (PA) as Israel has resumed its war in Gaza after a ceasefire largely put a halt to the fighting for two months. This will reinforce the PA's ability to meet the needs of the Palestinian people in the West Bank and prepare it to return to govern Gaza once conditions allow," Kallas said. Brussels – the biggest international donor to the Palestinians – said the package would include 620 million euros in grants for the Palestinian Authority.—APP

Paris denounces Algiers' order to expel 12 French officials

PARIS: France's foreign minister said Monday that Algerian authorities gave 12 French state officials 48 hours to leave the country. Jean-Noel Barrot denounced the decision, saying it appeared as "a response to the arrest of three Algerian nationals suspected of serious offenses on French soil.' French counterterrorism prosecutors said the Algerians were arrested Friday and handed preliminary charges of "kidnapping or arbitrary detention ... in connection with a terrorist undertaking." They are allegedly involved in the April 2024 kidnapping of an Algerian influencer, Amir Boukhors, or Amir DZ, a known critic of the Algerian government with 1.1 million followers on TikTok. An Algerian consular official is among the three arrested, according to French media. Barrot called on Algerian authorities "to abandon" measures to expel the French officials "who have no connection with the current legal proceedings," in a written statement. "If the decision to send back our officials is maintained, we will have no other choice but to respond immediately," Barrot said.-APP

Punjab governor bans Israeli products

LAHORE: Punjab Governor SardarSaleemHaider Khan has imposed a complete ban on the use of Israeli-branded, foreign beverages and products within the Governor House Lahore.

In a statement, the Governor emphasised that this decision came after the ongoing atrocities against innocent Muslims in Gaza and Palestine, saying, "My heart bleeds seeing the oppression in Gaza. As long as I serve as Governor, no foreign or Israeli-linked products will be used in the Governor House." He urged the public to boycott any products that financially benefit Israel or non-Muslim entities involved in such injustices. Governor Haider Khan also lauded his Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) for appointing Bilawal Bhutto Zardari as its young chairman, congratulating both the party and the people of Pakistan. The Governor held meetings with senior PPP leaders including former Prime Minister Raja Pervaiz Ashraf, Punjab Assembly Parliamentary Leader Haider Ali Gillani, Chaudhry Manzoor, and other party members.

Iran FM to head to Moscowto discuss nuclear talks

TEHRAN: Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi is set to visit Moscow this week to discuss recent nuclear negotiations with the United States held in Oman, the foreign ministry spokesman said on Monday, ahead of a new round of talks planned for Rome.

On Saturday, Araghchi held talks with US Middle East envoy Steve Witkoff in Muscat, the highest-level Iranian-US nuclear negotiations since the collapse of a 2015 accord. "Dr. Araghchi will travel to Moscow at the end of the week," said spokesman EsmaeilBaqaei, adding that the trip was "pre-planned" and would be "an opportunity to discuss the latest developments related to

the Muscat talks.' Iran and the United States separately described Saturday's discussions as "constructive." The negotiations came weeks after US President Donald Trump sent a letter to Iran's supreme leader Avatollah Ali Khamenei calling for nuclear talks while warning of possible military action if Tehran refused. Russia, a close ally of Iran, and China have held discussions with Iran in recent weeks over its nuclear program. - **Agencies**

Trump blames Zelensky,

Biden for war

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump has accused his predecessor Joe Biden and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky of failing to prevent the war in Ukraine. "President Zelensky and the corrupt Joe Biden did an absolutely terrible job when they allowed this farce to begin," Trump wrote on his Truth Social platform.

There were so many ways to prevent the outbreak of war, he continued - without explaining how the invasion of the neighboring country ordered by Kremlin chief Vladimir Putin in February 2022 could have been stopped.

The war between Russia and Ukraine is Biden's war, not his, the US President explained. He had only been in office for a short time and had had no problem prevent ing it during his previous term of office, as Russian President Vladimir Putin respected him. He repeated in capital letters: "I had nothing to do with the war, but I am working tirelessly to stop the death and destruction." Trump is pushing for an end to the war and maintains close contact with the Kremlin via his special envoy Steve Witkoff. Trump's government envisions a "deal" for an end to the war in several areas that is in Moscow's interest. - Agencies

ISLAMABAD: A political controversy has erupted within Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) over a missed meeting with a visiting US congressional delegation, after revelations that the National Assembly Speaker's Office extended invitations to PTI members-but the information was not relayed to the broader party leadership. According to insider sources, the Speaker's Secretariat had reached out to two key PTI figures—Chief Whip Aamir Dogar and party leader Barrister Gohar Ali Khan-to attend the meeting with the American delegation. However, instead of informing the party or its parliamentary committee, both officials allegedly kept the invitation under wraps. The issue came to light when an emergency meeting of PTI's parliamentary committee was convened to address the diplomatic lapse. All MNAs belonging to PTI and its allied Sunni Ittehad Council were present, and the atmosphere reportedly turned tense as questions were raised over why the party had no official representation in the

high-profile engagement. Sources claim that PTI lawmaker Aamir Dogar was attending the wedding of PPP leader Qamar Zaman Kaira's son at the time, while Barrister Gohar was "seeking confirmations" from different sources regarding the meeting's details. Barrister Gohar, defending himself during the parliamentary huddle, said, "I asked Rauf Hassan (PTI spokesperson) about the invitation, but we did not receive anything
