The notification, issued by the Ministry of Interior, stated that the federal government has reasonable expensions and the state of the powers condered by Section 11B(D)(a) of the Anti-Terrorism Act, 1997 (XXVII) of 1997), the federal government hereby orders TLP to be a proscribed organisation in the first schedule to the said Act, "read the notification. 



Experts discuss shifting Sino-Indian dynamics at IRS roundtable

ISLAMABAD: The China Program at the Institute of Regional Studies (IRS), Inlamabad, convened a high-level roundtable titled. The Evolving Dynamics of Sino-Indian Relations', bringing together seasoned diplomats, scholars, and strategic experts to unpack the complete bytevene the relations of China and India and their impictations for Pakistan. Ambassador Janhar Saleem, President of IRS, opened the session by hghlinghting their importance of understanding the recent dynamics involving India's softening approach toward China, following the tariff-driven strains in its relations with the Prime Minister Modif's participation in the recent SCO Summit, by agreeing to visit China after a seven-year histure, did not signify a full rapprochement. Rather, it reflected a slight recentlibration in India's posture influenced by current circumstances which in should not be as a sa strategic shift. In the longer term horizon India would continue to ally with the West to compete with China, he observed. Ambassador Moin-ub-Haque, former envoy to China, traced the historical acc of China-India relations, from the early solidarity of "Hinds-China Biah Biat" to the rupture following the 1982 war and the more recent border clashes in 2020. He also underscored that while recent engagements, such as the Modi-X-i meeting on the sidelines of the SCO Summit, suggest a cautious thaw, deep-rool tensions persist. He pointed to India's far-right leader-ship, its strategic tilt towards where West, and unresolved trevitorial disputes with India as enduring fault lines that can hinder the relations between India and China. Erdogan seeks strategic alignment on Gulf tour

TURKISH President Recep Tayyip Erdogan embarked on a Gulf tour this week that included three stops: Kuwait, Qatar and Oman. While Qatar is not an unusual destination given the close relations between Ankara and Doha, the visits to Kuwait and Oman had particular significance. In Kuwait and Oman, Erdogan reciprocated the visits of Kuwait Emir Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah and Sultan Haitham bin Tariq to Turkiye last year. The Kuwait i emir's visit came as part of a regional tour and was his first to a non-Arab country. Sultan Haitham's visit to Turkiye was the first by an Omani sultan in nearly 40 years. In both visits, which had significant political and diplomatic weight, several agreements were signed and they certainly opened a new page in these too nations to both reciprocate and solidify their evolving ties. As an observer of Turkish-Gulf restions, I would argue that Turkish policy-makers acknowledge that Ankara's relations with Kuwait and Oman have yet to reach their full strategic potential. There is an understanding that each Gulf state has diverse interests and visions, which has led Ankara to develop distinct agendas with them. It is clear there is significant political will at the leadership level, which is crucial when it comes to the personalized nature of Turkish-Gulf relations. However, the rapidly changing regional dynamics, as well as the ongoing economic transformations is the Gulf states, are significantly affecting the pace of Turkish-Gulf ries.

On July 19, 1947, the All-Jammu and Kashmir Muslim Conference, representing the majority by Muslim population, passed a resolution favoring accession to Pakistan. Pakistan's position on Kashmir is grounded in international law, not territorial ambition. It views the dispute as the unfinished agenda of Partition — a moral and legal issue stemming from India's deflance of UN resolutions. Islamabad continues to call for a peaceful resolution through dialogue and UN-supervised mechanisms. While Pakistan's diplomatic bandwidth is often limited by regional crises, its stance remains consistent: a plebiscite must decide Kashmir's future. This is not a demand for secession but for self-determination, the same principle that underpine the UN Charter. Kashmir today stands as both a wound and a warning, a test of whether international law still carries weight in an era of strategic convenience. The moral arc of history may bend toward justice, but only if nations act upon their obligations.

The United Nations has mechanisms, precedents, and moral authority. What it lacks is the will to enforce them. As global attention shifts from Gaza to Ultraine, from Tawn to Telran, the voices of eight million Kashmiris remain drowned in silence. Yet stilence does not erase struggle.
